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Dongxiang-English glossary 东乡语英语对照初稿

Second draft (03/10/2023)

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(CNRS - EHESS - INALCO)

This glossary is based on the vocabulary of the "Dongxiang short stories (with gloss and annotations) vol.1: (dunxian kielien 东乡语小故事 喃喃 때 harm) 喃喃 () (hal-04015834)(Lefort 2023), which is based on the Teaching material of the bilingual experimental class of Narisi Primary school in the Dongxiang Autonomous County (Dōngxiāngzú zìzhìxiàn nàlēisì xiǎoxué shuāngyǔ jiàoxué shíyànbān shìyòng jiàocái 东乡族自治县那勒寺小学双语教学实验班试用教材).

The entries of the glossary are organized in 3 columns: the first column is the Dongxiang entry, the second column is the word's grammatical category, the third column comprises the English translations and explanations. Etymology and notes are presented in brackets.

For the Dongxiang words, I have used the *Dunxian pinyin* based on the *Dongxiang-Chinese dictionary*¹; for standard Chinese, I have used the Chinese pinyin (without tones) and simplified characters. For words of Mongolic origin, I have used the reconstructions and transcriptions of the *Etymological dictionary of Mongolic languages*² (EDML - 2015) and Nugteren's *Mongolic Phonology and the Qinghai-Gansu Languages* (2011)³; these words are preceded by an asterisk. Because the EDML does not cite its sources, I have labelled the words as 'old Mongolian' and have considered them as reconstructions. I have included both forms found in the EDML (2015) and Nugteren (2011) whenever the forms proposed in the two sources do not match. When available, I have also included the closest form of the Middle Mongolian word (the *Secret history of Mongols, Huayiyiyu, Muqaddimat al-Adab*⁴) based on Nugteren (2011). Khalkha Mongolian transcriptions in Uyghur script ⁵ are based on the *New Mongolian-Chinese Dictionary* (1998)⁶. When available, I have also included references in Linxia Chinese which the transcriptions of the *Linxià fāngyán* 临夏方言[The Linxia Dialect⁷]. When only 'Chinese' is mentioned in the etymology section, this means the source is a Chinese variety, but the exact
