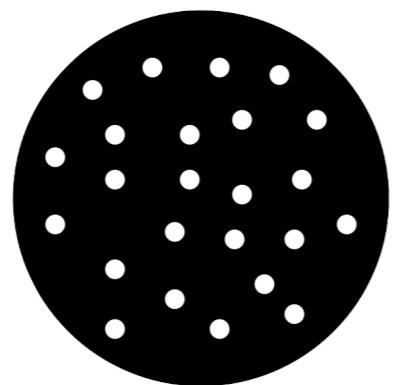
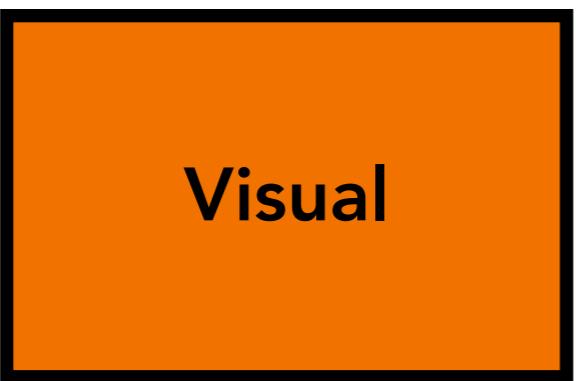
- Q1. Which regions in the brain are motion-selective in vision and touch?
