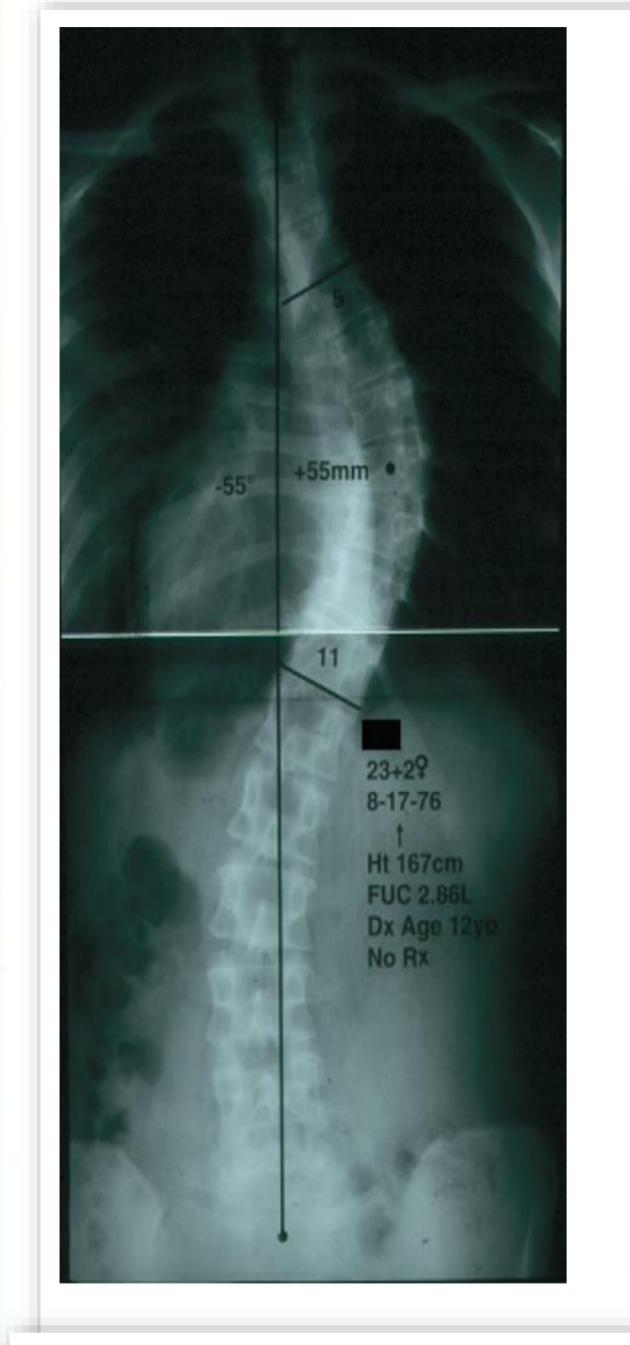

Context

 Scoliosis is a widespread spinal pathology that deforms the spine in all three dimensions and can lead to health

- Early detection can reduce the impact of scoliosis at skeletal maturity. Methods exist for this purpose, but require special knowledge and/or equipment, and have poor repeatability..
- The aim is to offer a simple and effective tool for detecting spinal pathologies, by capturing the movement of the spine and back.

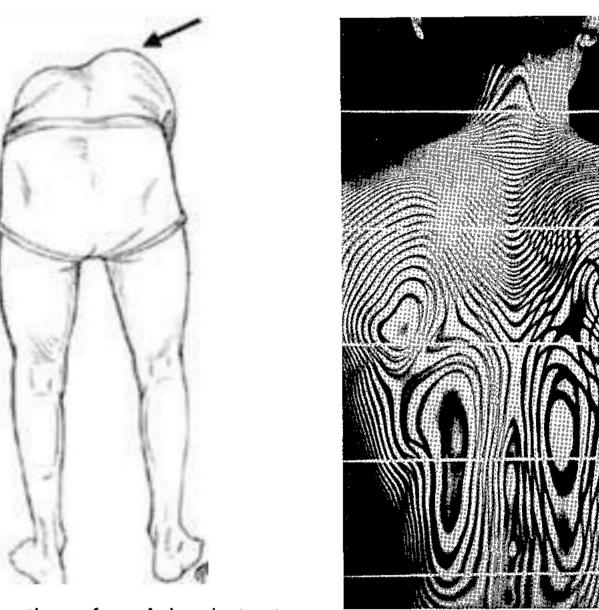
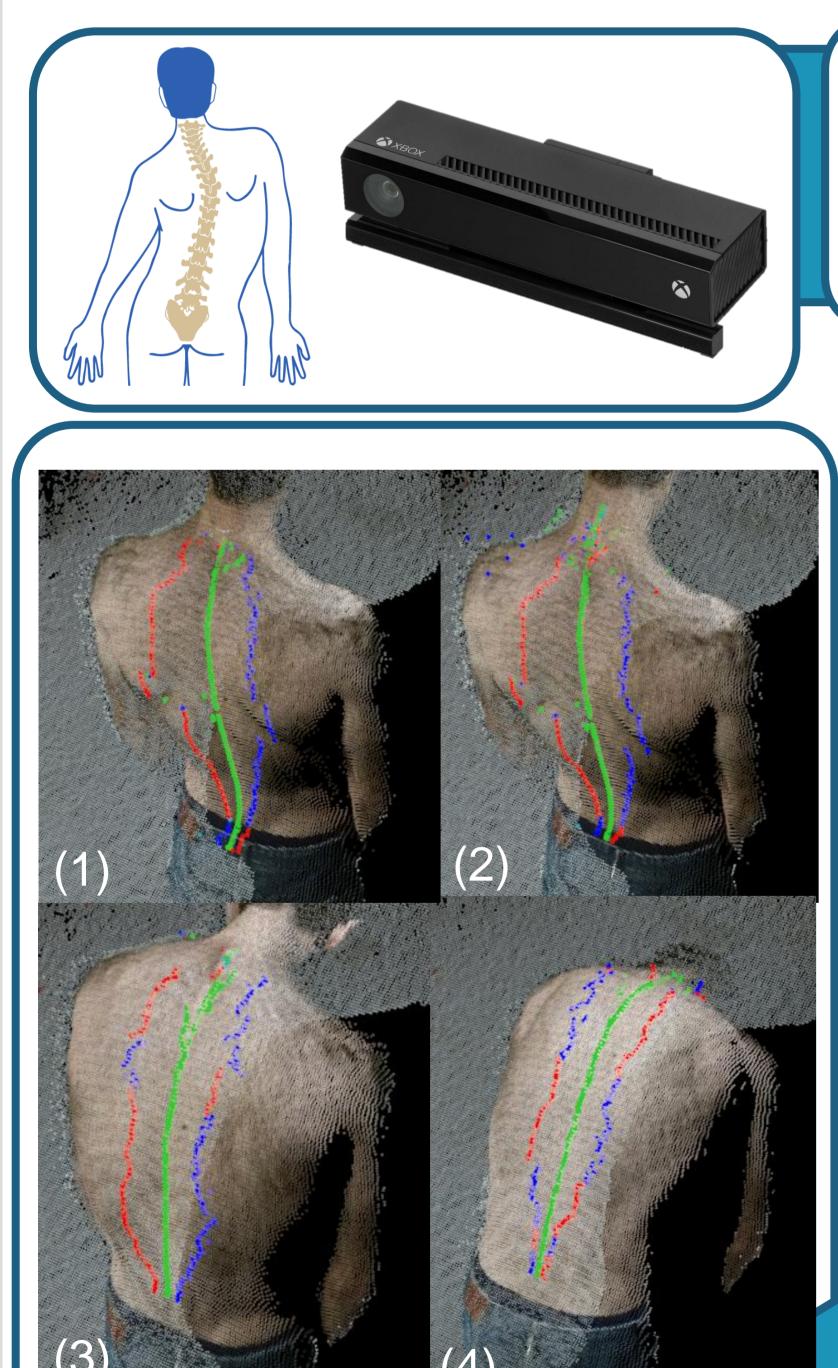


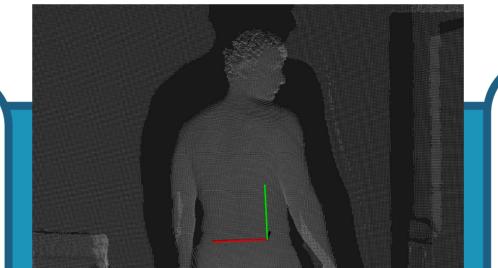
Illustration of an Adam's test, highlighting the gibbosity generated by vertebral rotation.

Results and perspectives

 The scene is filtered to keep only the area of interest

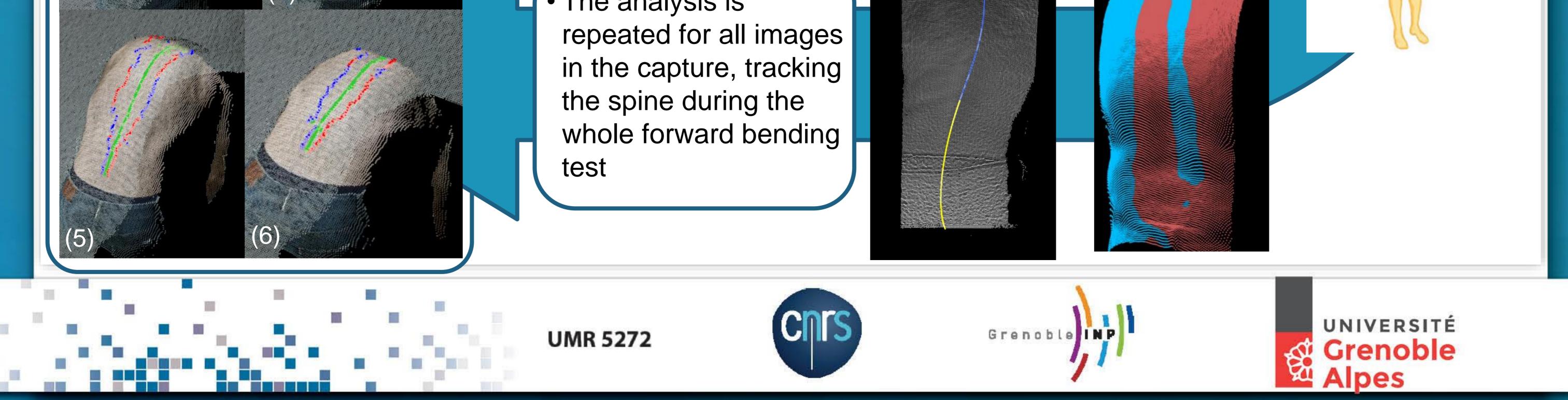


as a point cloud

- The technical solution tracks the spinal column and quantifies its movement, making it possible to follow the evolution of spinal curvatures.
- The technology have been evaluated on 16 healthy patients and on a few scoliotic patients with good results.
- Ideally, this solution should be able to target specific areas of the spine to pinpoint an area of interest more precisely, enabling the evolution of a pathology or therapy to be monitored.

 The spine line is extracted by analyzing crosssections of the patient's back.
