Memory impairments belong to symptoms of schizophrenia which are not alleviated by antipsychotic drugs

→ Serotonergic subtype 6 receptors (5-HT₆-R) are an interesting target to improve current treatment:

- localized in regions involved in schizophrenia such as hippocampus
- reverse memory deficit by selective blockade (SB-271046) [1]

→ N-methyl-D-aspartate subtype of glutamate receptors (NMDA-R):

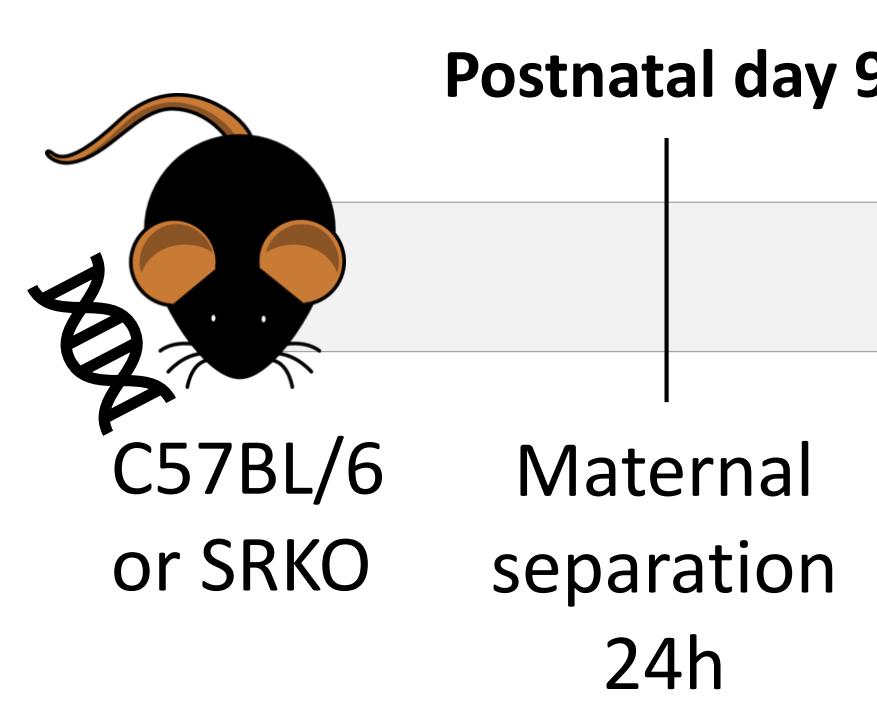
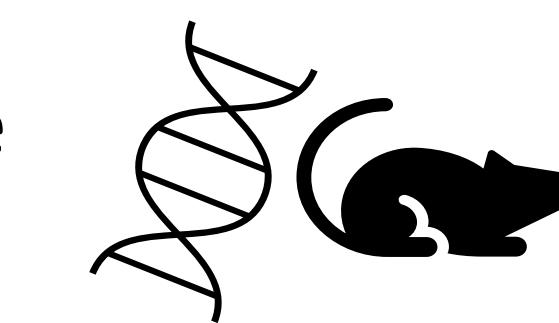
- are key regulators of memory processes
- have crucial role in the physiopathology of schizophrenia [2]

AIMS

Assess **memory deficit** in a 2-hit model and investigate the effect of a 5-HT₆-R antagonist (SB-271046) on basal NMDA-R activation

2-hit mouse model

(SRKO) [3]

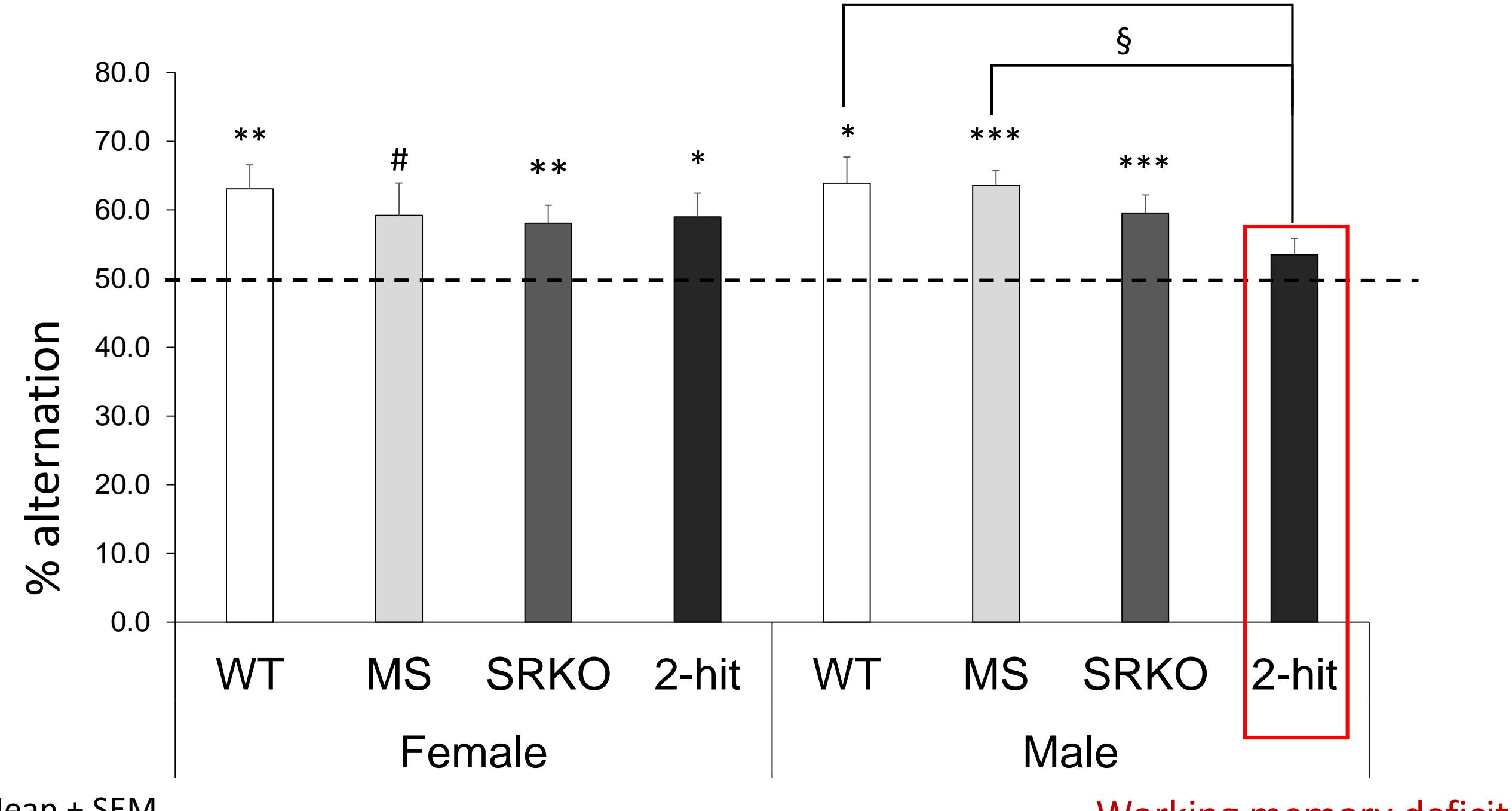

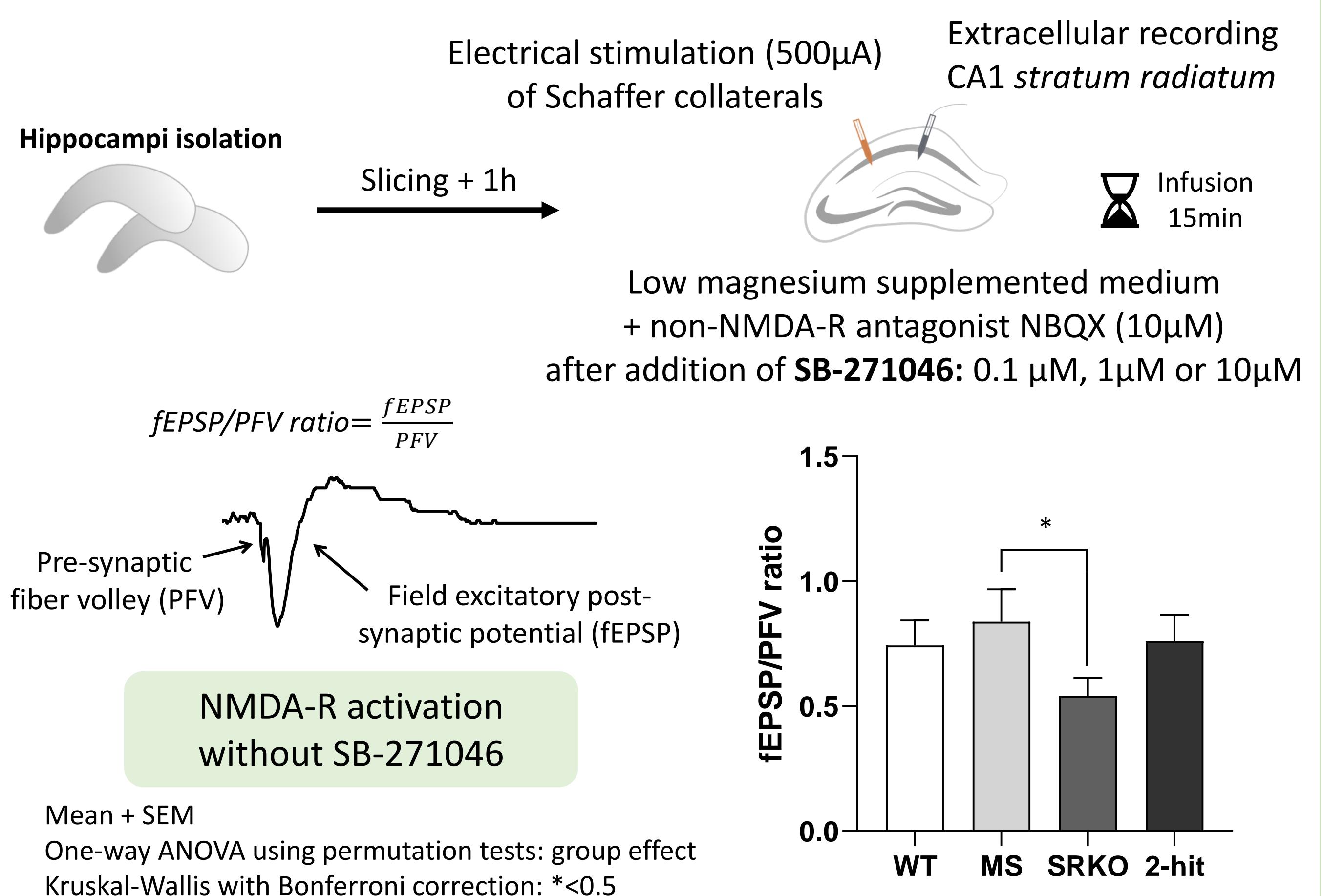

 Successive entries in 3 different arms was considered as an alternation

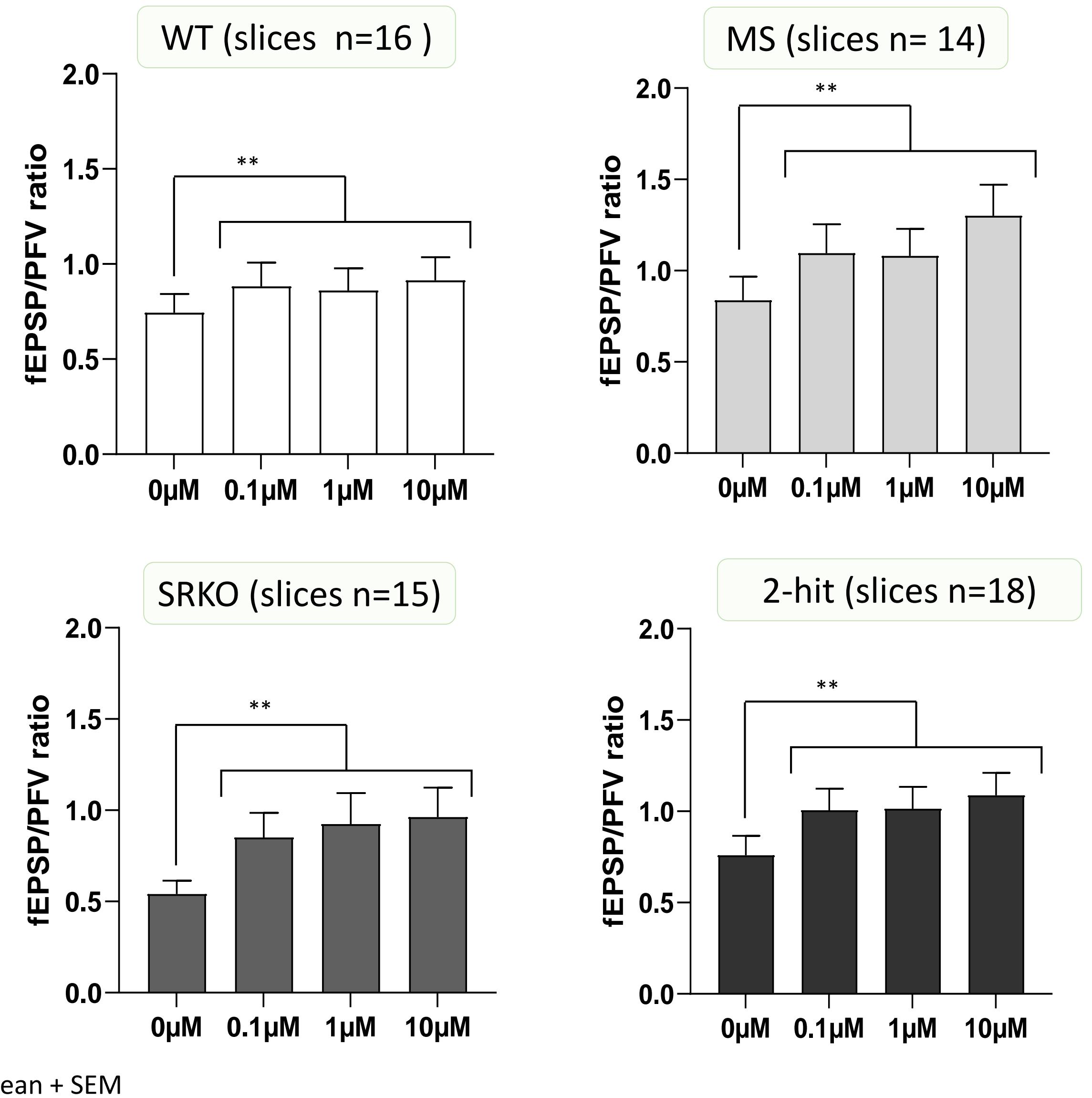
$$\% \text{ alternation} = \frac{\text{number of alternations}}{\text{total arm entries}} - 2 * 100$$

TAKE HOME MESSAGE

The combination between genetic x environmental factor induces **working memory deficit** in 2-hit male mice. This is not accompanied with **deficit in basal NMDA-R activation** in 2-hit male mice.

We are now investigating the expression of synaptic plasticity (long term potentiation, LTP) which requires more intense NMDA-R activation, along with other memory functions (object/place discrimination).

5-HT₆-R antagonist SB-271046 whatever the dose **increases NMDA-R activation in all groups**. This increase could prevent working memory deficits and possible LTP dysregulation in 2-hit mice.
