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# **Cerium titanates: An unexplored class of UV-visible** light active photoanodes for water splitting

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## Introduction

Photoelectrochemical water splitting is hoped to become a competitive source of green hydrogen, but there is still a need to discover novel photoelectrode materials [1]. Cerium titanates, especially CeTi<sub>2</sub>O<sub>6</sub> brannerite, have drawn interest due to their photocatalytic activity [2] and thermochemical hydrogen production potential [3].



We propose to describe the photoelectronic properties of  $CeTi_2O_6$  for a potential use in photoelectrochemical water splitting.

- Photoelectrochemical measurements were performed with a homemade cell under a Xe arc lamp illumination (approx. 1 sun irradiance)
  - Chopped light linear sweep voltammetry (LSV) Scan rate: 20 mV. s<sup>-1</sup> 2s ON/OFF

#### **Materials and methods**

Thin films were prepared by spin-coating of a precursor solution and subsequent annealing at 700°C

#### **Brannerite structure**

- GIXRD confirmed the successful synthesis of pure  $CeTi_2O_6$  brannerite  $\Im$ thin films at a lower temperature than usually reported
- The Brannerite family crystallises in a monoclinic Bravais lattice and belongs to the space group C/2m



- Transmittance UV-Vis was used to determine the band gap (Eg):  $\alpha_{\text{Film}} = \frac{1}{d_{\text{Film}}} \cdot \left( \ln \left( \frac{1}{T} \right) - \alpha_{\text{FTO}} \cdot d_{\text{FTO}} \right)$  $\alpha_{\rm Film} \cdot \mathbf{E} = \mathbf{A} \cdot (\mathbf{E} - \mathbf{E}_{\mathbf{g}})^2$
- An indirect band gap of about 3.1 eV was found with the Tauc plot



## Surface cerium states

XPS of the Ce3d region showed lacksquarethat 40% of surface cerium ions were in the non-stoichiometric a valency +III





## **Photoelectrochemical behaviour**

- $CeTi_2O_6$  thin films produced a promising photo-current vs. NHE) and photovoltage (1.74 V)

## **Conclusions and prospects**

- A new type of photoelectrode suitable for the oxygen evolution reaction has been proposed and showed promising photoelectrochemical properties
- The band structure and alignment is yet to be determined for further optimisation of the materials' performances
- Upon these results, the addition of surface electrocatalysts and matrix alloyants will be considered
