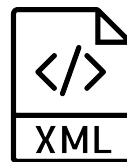

What is TEI Publisher ?

TEI Publisher is ...

- ❑ a platform based on eXist-db, a database management system based on **XML technology**
- ❑ an **easy-to-use tool** to publish TEI XML files or other types of XML
- ❑ a ***prêt-à-porter application*** customizable with few tweaks



What can TEI Publisher do ...

- ❑ ... as the **main instance**?
 - ❑ Presentation of various **XML files, ODDs and templates** to observe the extent of the tool
 - ❑ **Playground area** to upload your own files and test the ODDs/templates to see what fits best
 - ❑ **Annotation area** to discover how to annotate (named entities or other) some already existing files or files you uploaded yourself
- ❑ ... as the **tool** that generates an application?
 - ❑ **Customized ODD and templates** to display your XML files exactly as you want
 - ❑ **Documentation or additional information** in HTML or Markdown format
 - ❑ PDF or EPUB **export** of the XML files

How does TEI Publisher work?

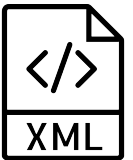
Ensuring sustainability and ease of use: a solid and fixed code base

- ❑ A specific and unique folder for the XML files
- ❑ Some **untouchable** files
 - ❑ To guarantee the update of new releases
- ❑ Some **automatically updated** files
 - ❑ Taking into account the changes made in the ODD
- ❑ Some files for **enhancing** your application
 - ❑ Multilingualism, design, search, etc.
- ❑ **Two main elements** for a great display
 - ❑ Reproducing the XML tree as it is encoded: **ODD transformation**
 - ❑ Managing the information to display: **HTML Templates**

Providing documents: TEI XML compatible and more

- ❑ Main type of documents: **TEI XML files**
 - ❑ **Text Encoding Initiative (TEI)** → Standard for the representation of texts in a digital format, in particular in the field of humanities and linguistics
 - ❑ Tagging rules for the encoding of texts according to the type of text and the information given
 - ❑ Opportunity to have multiple layers of content (named entities, critical notes, old and modern versions, original/translation, etc.)
- ❑ Other types of documents
 - ❑ **DocBook XML** (ex: TEI Publisher documentation)
 - ❑ **DOCX** (with an automatic conversion to TEI)

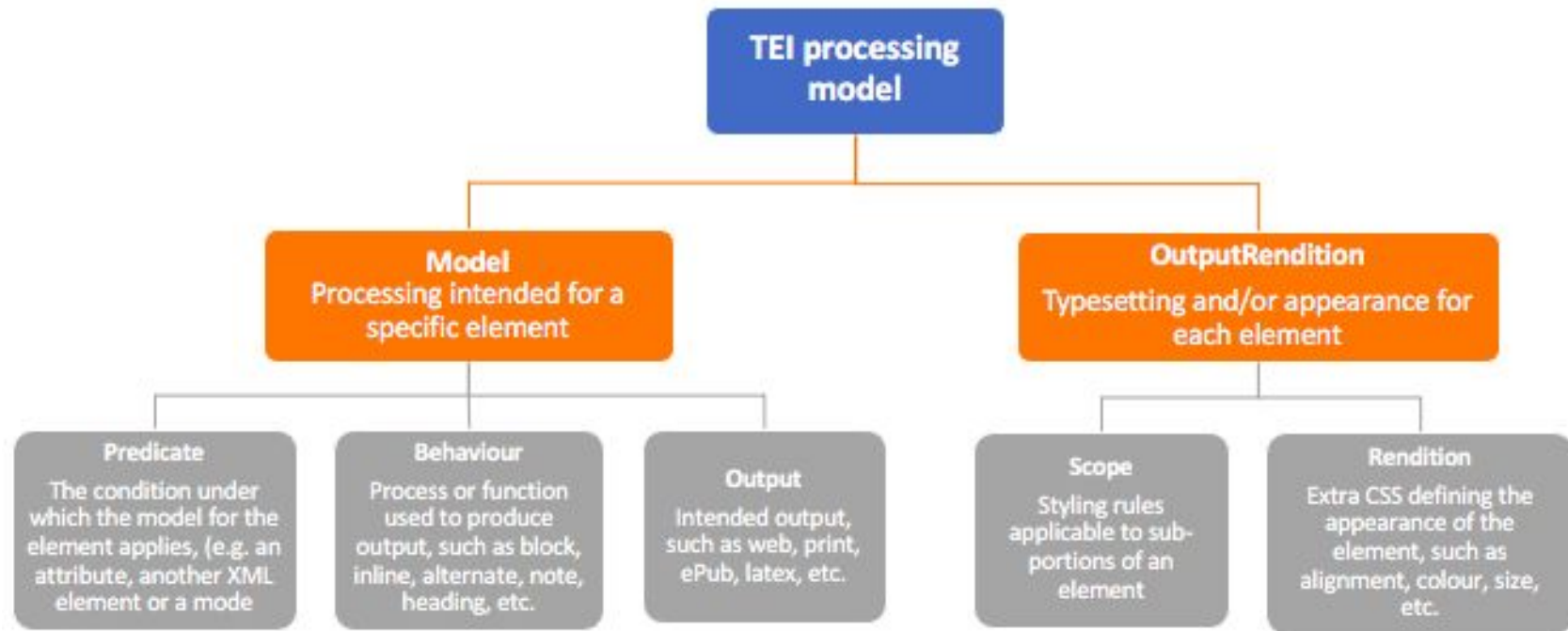


Reproducing the XML tree as it is encoded: ODD transformation

The **TEI Processing Model** suggests how a given element may be transformed to produce one or more outputs

Three key elements to the transformation

- ❑ **Predicate** → For multiple displays of a single element, it allows you to **specify** a situation for the element (place in the tree, attribute, mode, etc.)
- ❑ **Behaviour** → Defines the way to **interpret** the element (block, heading, inline, etc.)
 - ❑ Web-component → Specific to TEI Publisher to produce interactivity in the HTML
- ❑ **Rendition** → Defines the **CSS style** wanted for the element (alignment, colour, decoration, size, weight, etc.)

Managing the information to display: HTML Templates

The **HTML template** can go from a very simple page (only the transformed XML is displayed) to a page offering multiple options of content

- ❑ **Modes**
 - ❑ **Different displays** for a single element
 - ❑ Created with the “**Predicate**” in the ODD and declared in the HTML
- ❑ **Panels**
 - ❑ **Multiple content** at the same time → text, index, notes, facsimile, etc.
 - ❑ Allows to show at the same time **several layers** of the encoding
- ❑ **Toolbar**
 - ❑ Access to **extra content** such as table of content, metadata, licence, citation, etc.
 - ❑ Transformation of the content of the **<teiHeader>**
