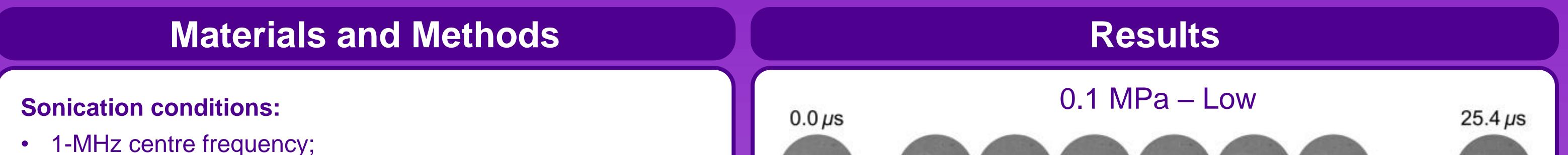

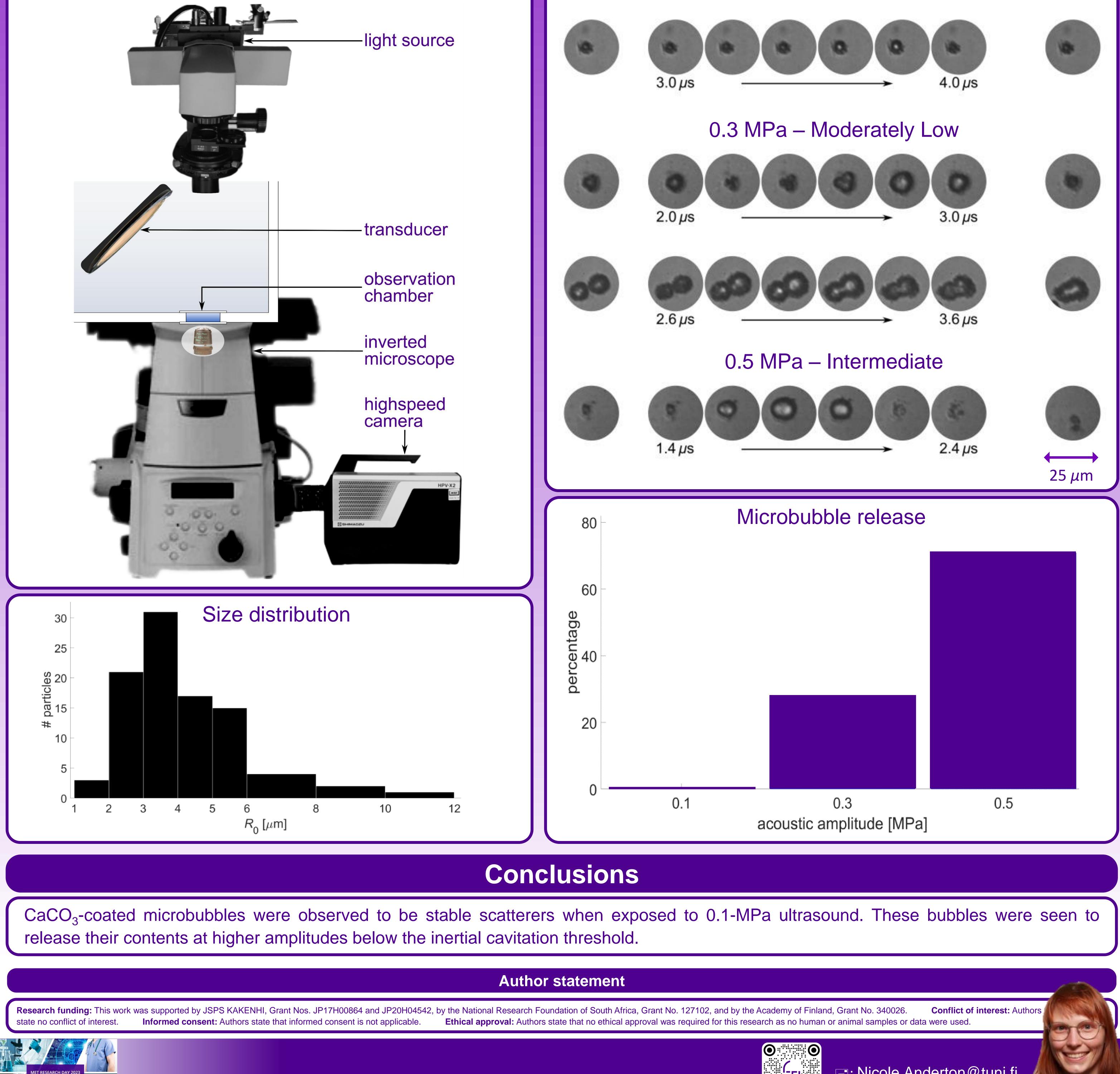
Theranostic agents are materials that act both as tracers during diagnostic imaging and as vehicles carrying and releasing therapeutics during treatment. Ultrasound-triggered theranostic agents comprise shell-encapsulated microbubbles that pulsate during low-amplitude sonication and release their payload upon higher-amplitude sonication. High-amplitude sonication may be undesirable due to unwanted side effects related to inertial cavitation. However, low-amplitude release from microbubbles typically requires thin encapsulating shells, which in turn may be permanently disrupted under diagnostic imaging conditions. The purpose of this study was to investigate a novel microbubble agent with thick shells composed of calcium carbonate.

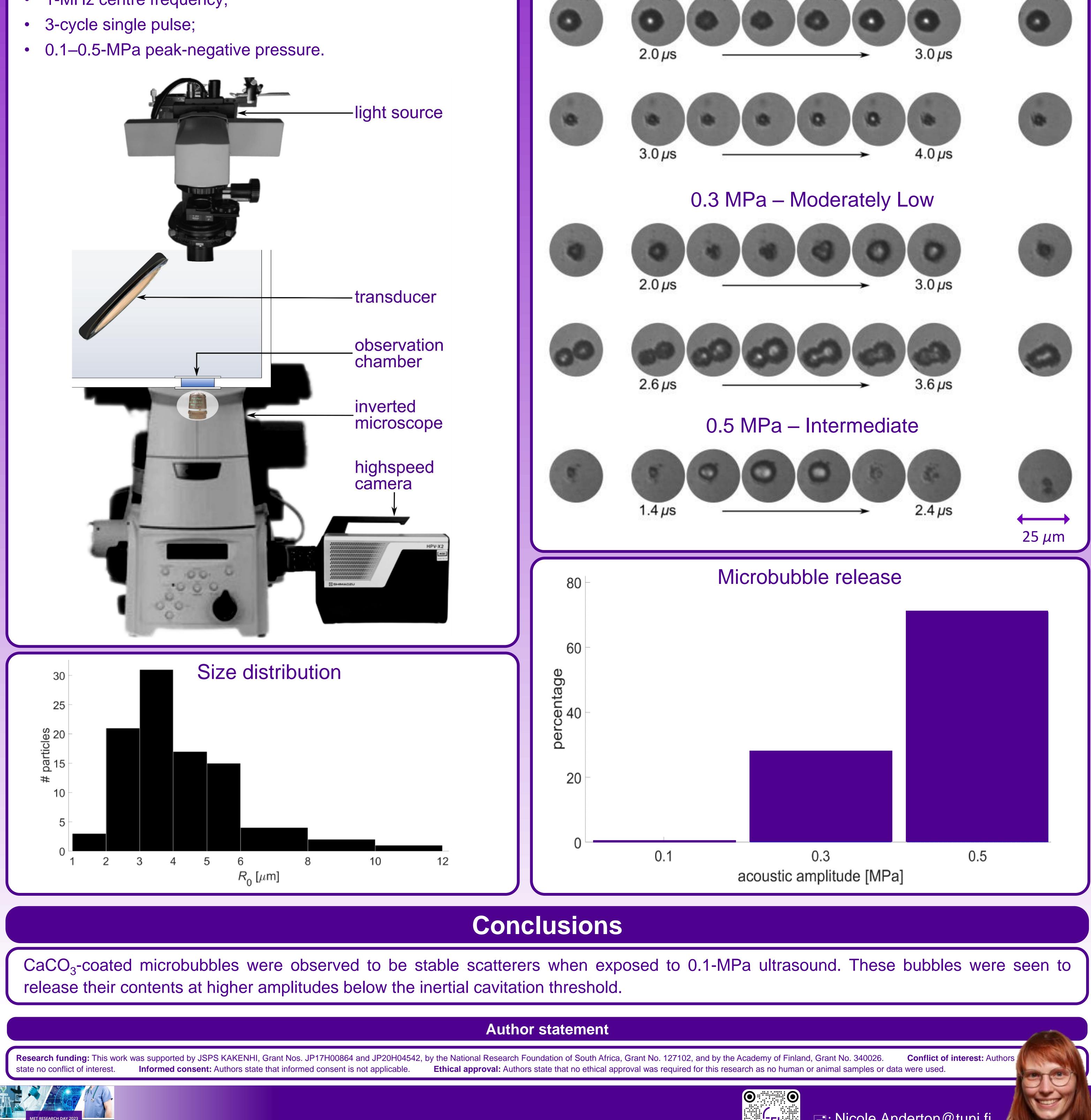
