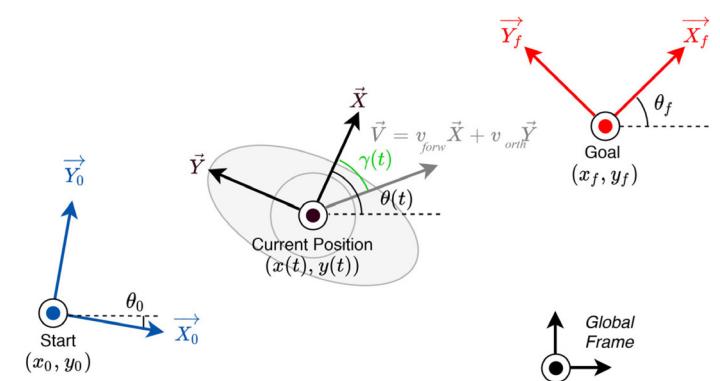
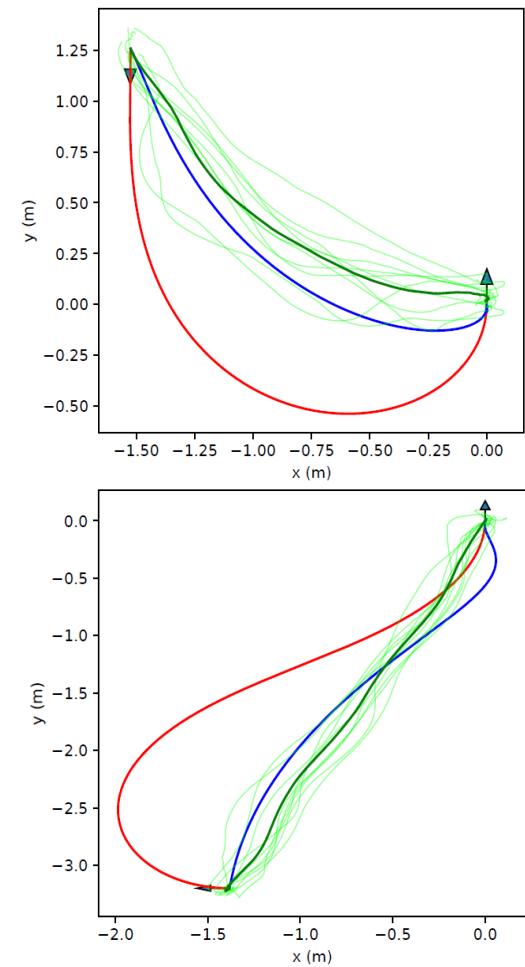
- > Linear distance  $d_{xy}$

# Reduced problem

- > Study of human-like trajectory models:
  - Implementation of 2 human-like trajectory models:
    - Clothoids curves<sup>1</sup>
    - Optimal Control (OC) model<sup>2</sup>
  - Comparison with the measurements

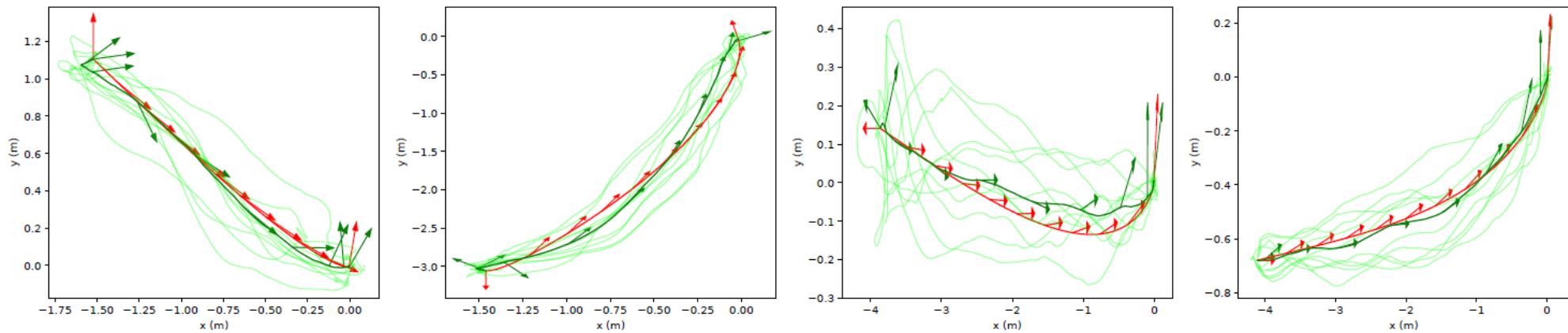

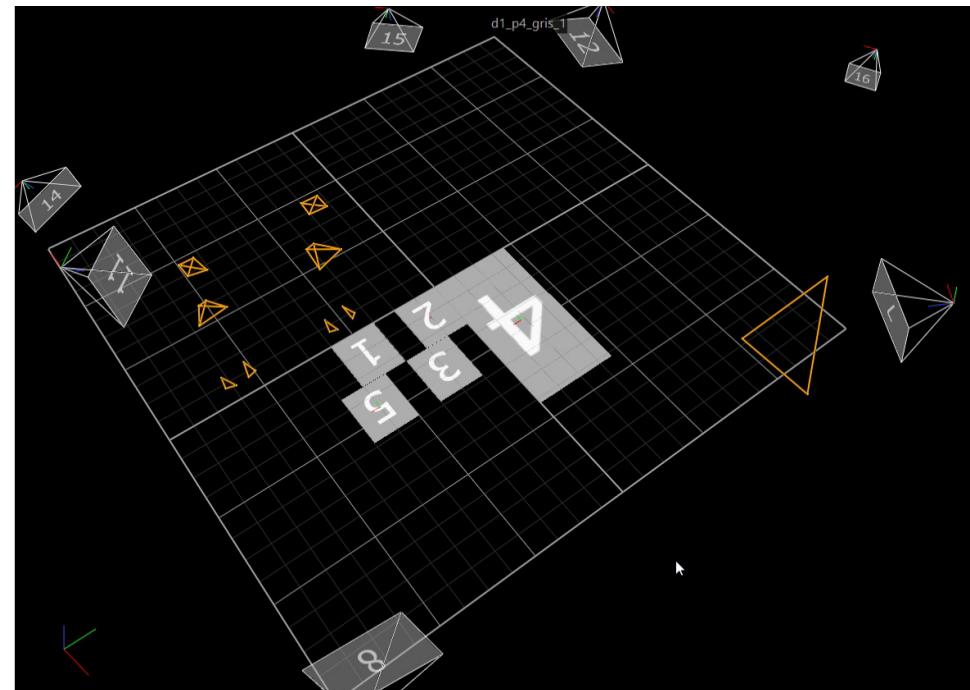
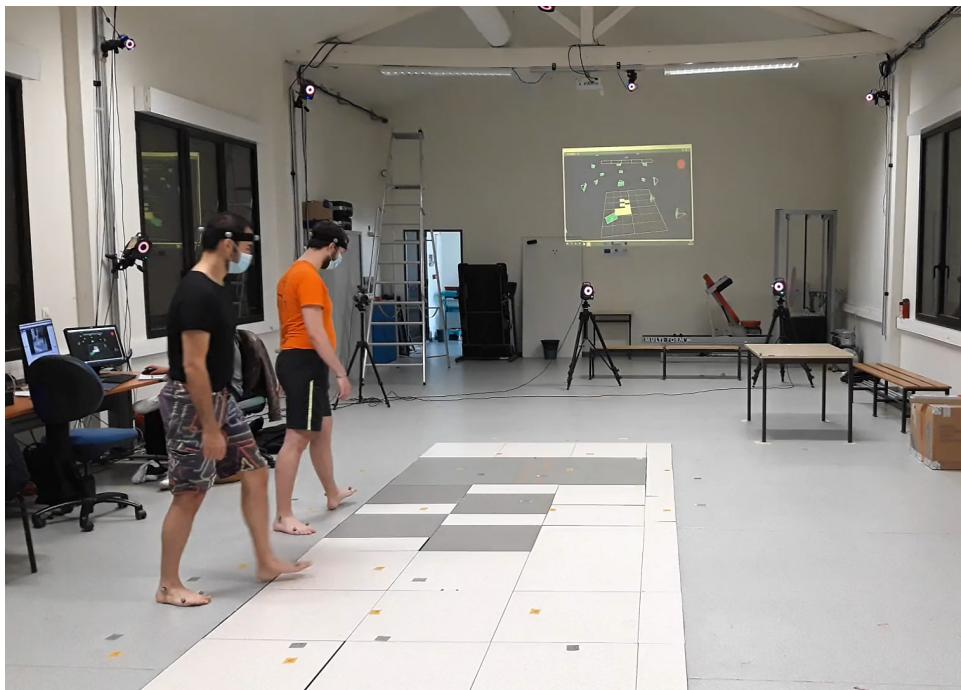
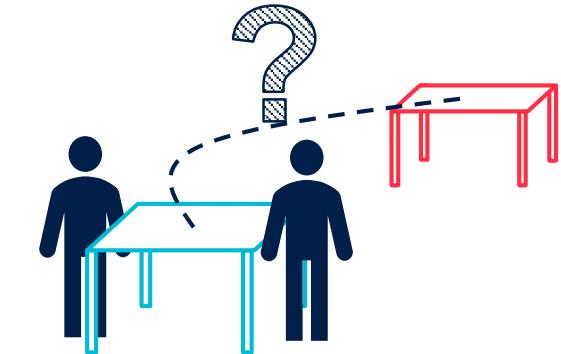
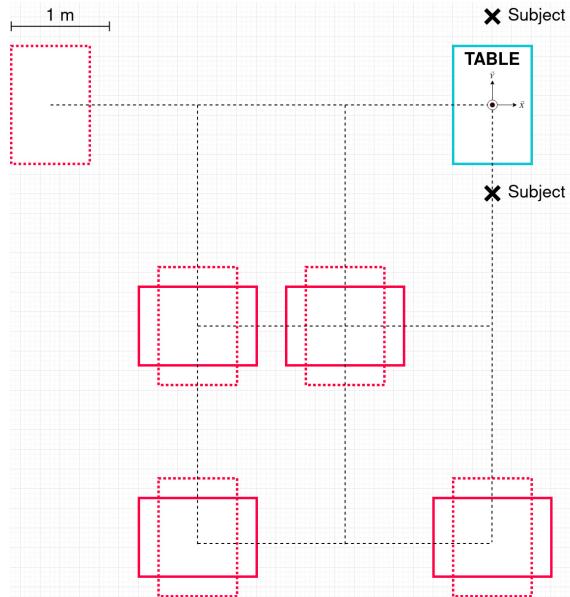
# Reduced problem

- Results:
  - Linear distance  $\approx 7,7$  cm
  - Angular distance  $\approx 21,2^\circ$
  - **Homogeneous results** whatever the initial orientation or the initial distance to the goal are (*ANOVA test*)

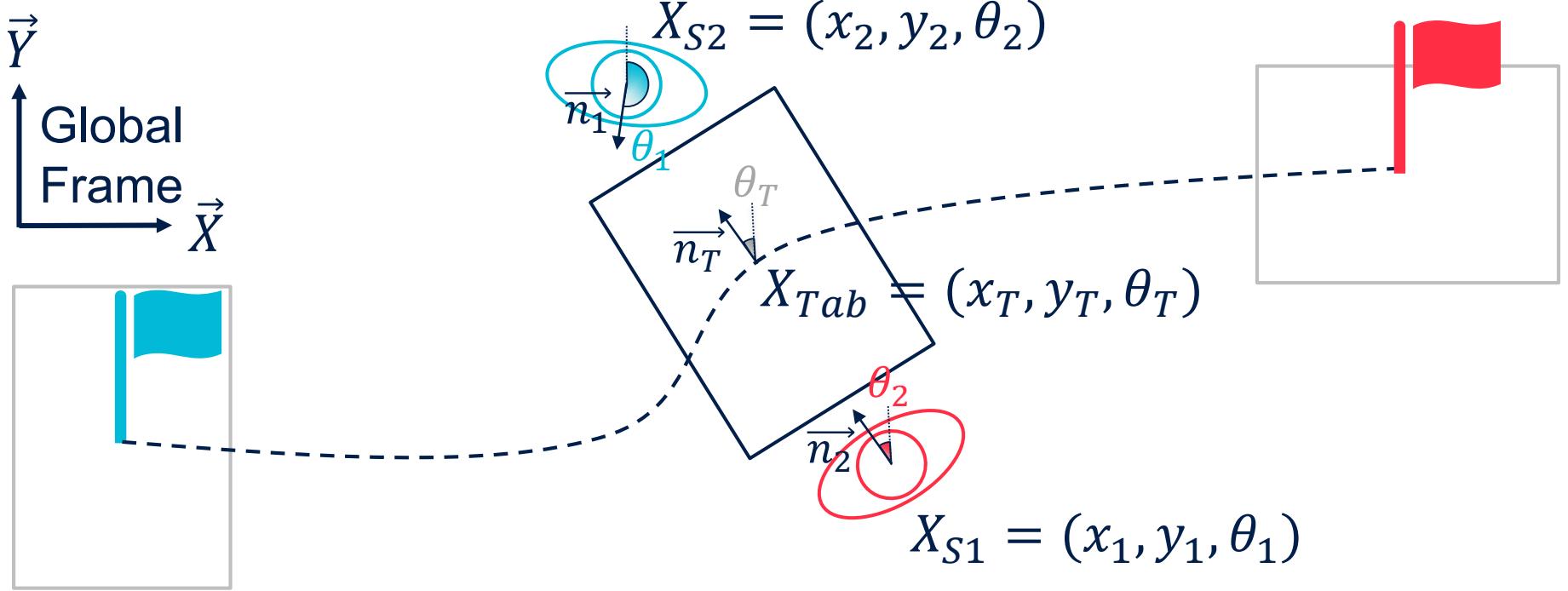

- > Positions and orientations of the subjects' **Center of Mass** recorded using a ***Motion Capture*** system

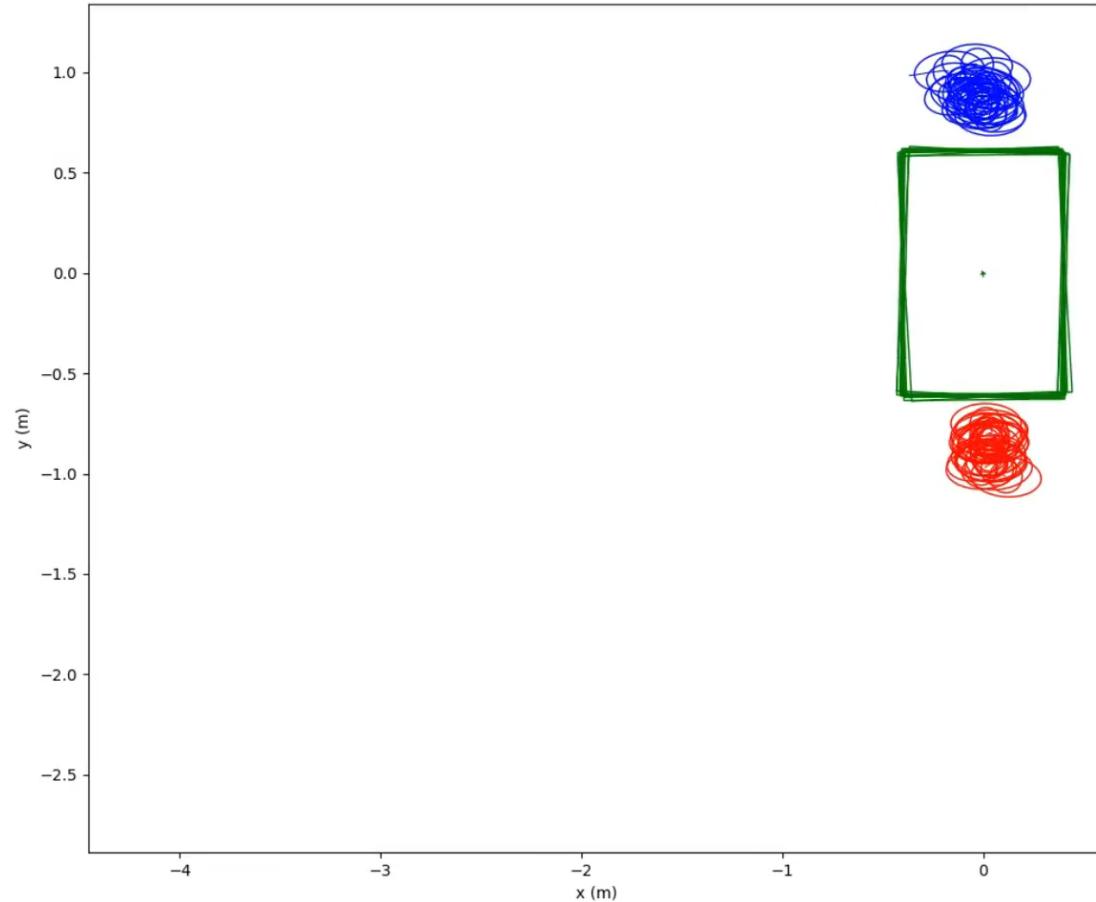

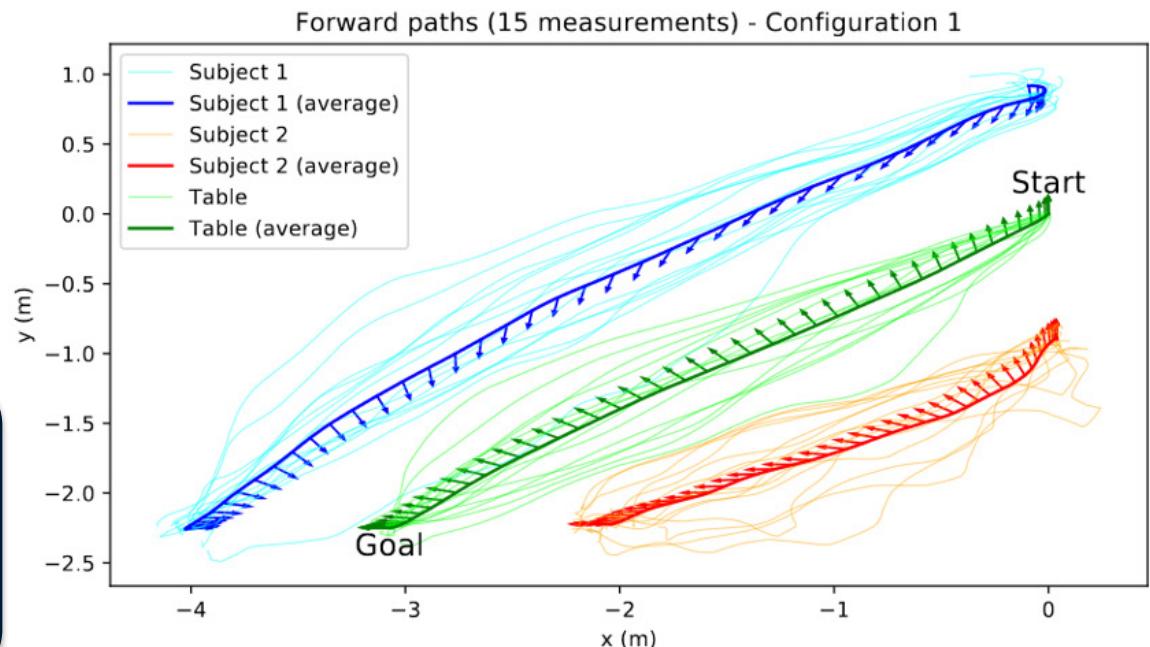
- > Great range of behaviour:
  - Different configurations



$d_{xy} \approx 20 \pm 14 \text{ cm}$   
 $d_\theta \approx 11 \pm 8^\circ$   
 Max:  $d_{xy} \approx 128 \text{ cm}$  &  $d_\theta \approx 60^\circ$



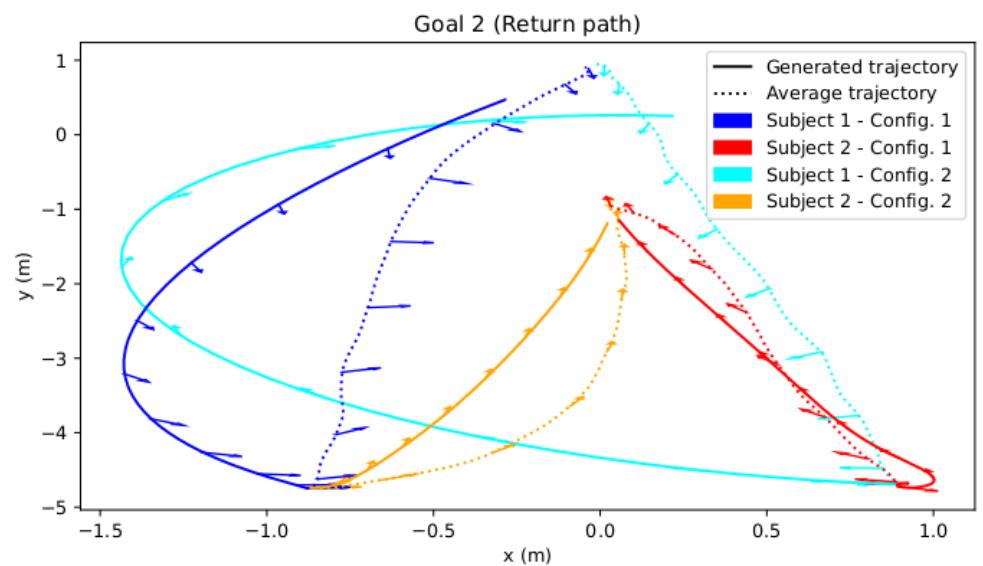
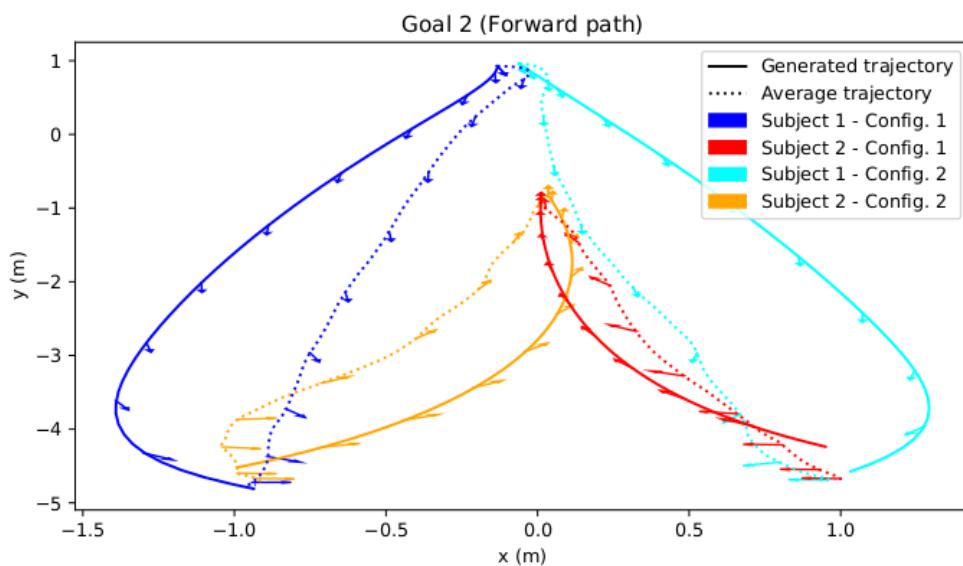

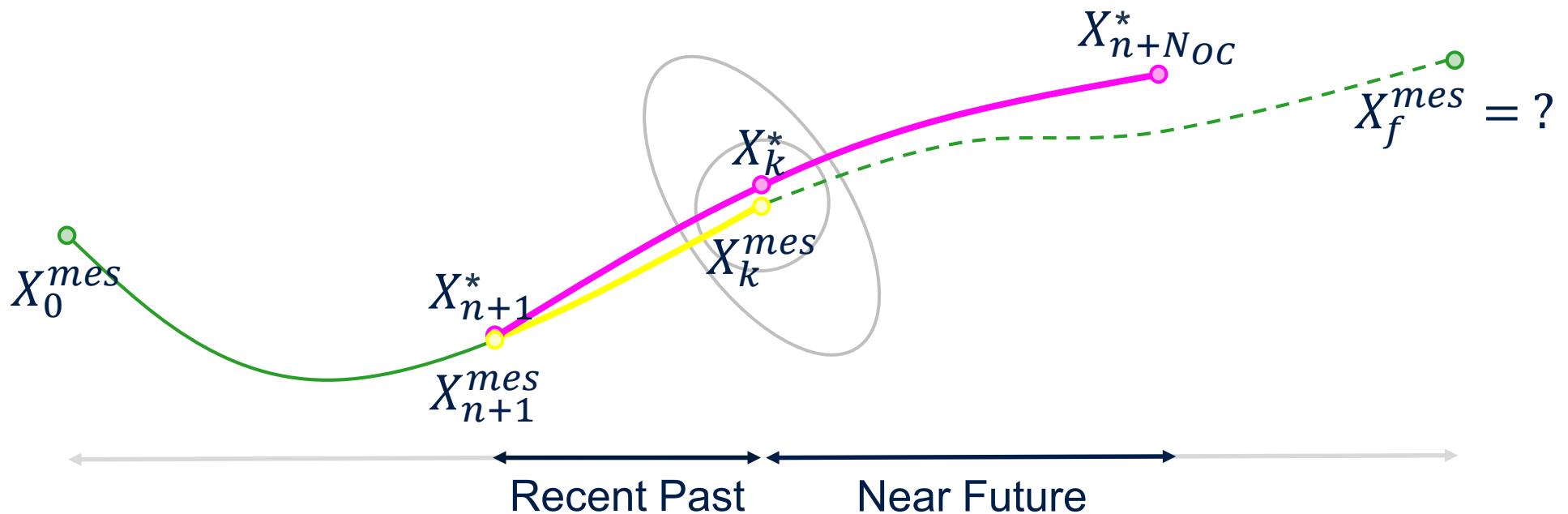
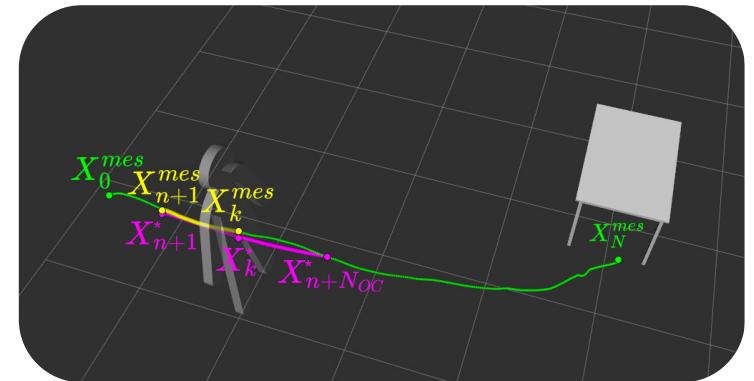
# Prediction process



- We need a personalised pro-active behavior

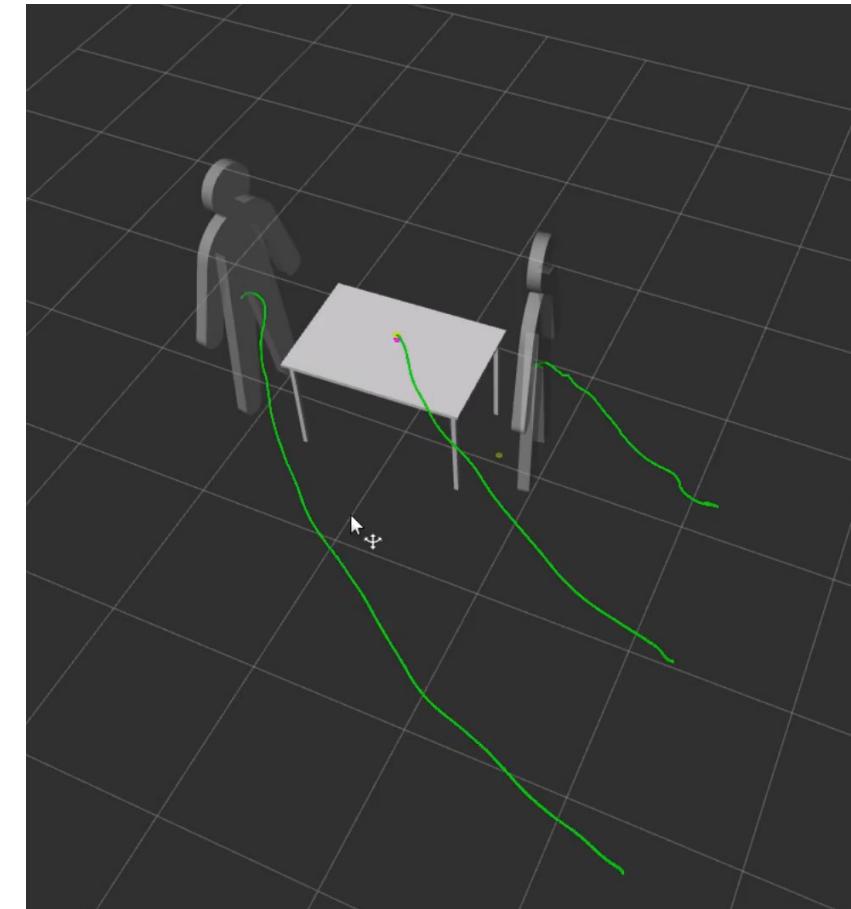
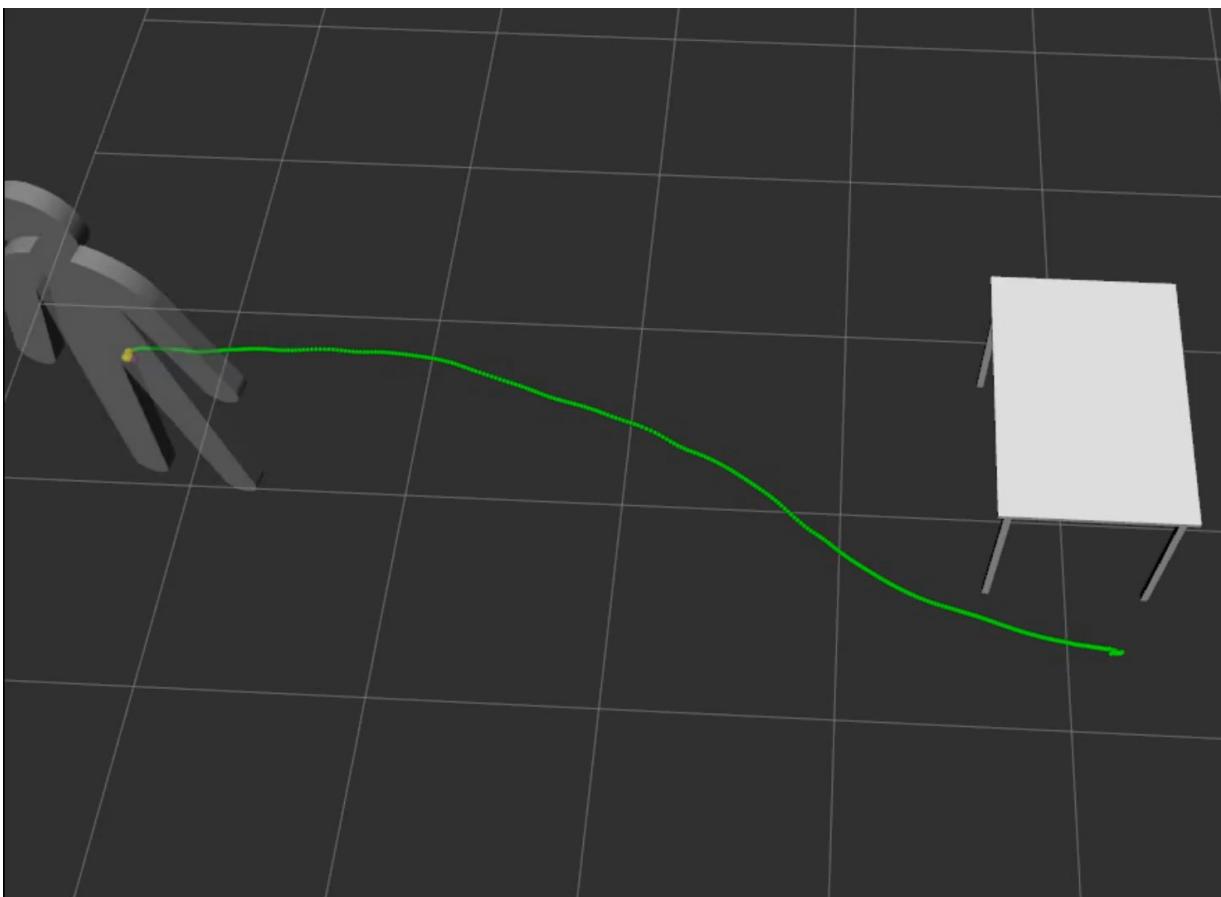
# Prediction process

- The human trajectory is recorded in real time
- The prediction process:
  - Input: the last  $N_0$  measurements
  - Output: trajectory of size  $N_{OC} > N_0$
  - $n = k - N_0 - 1$

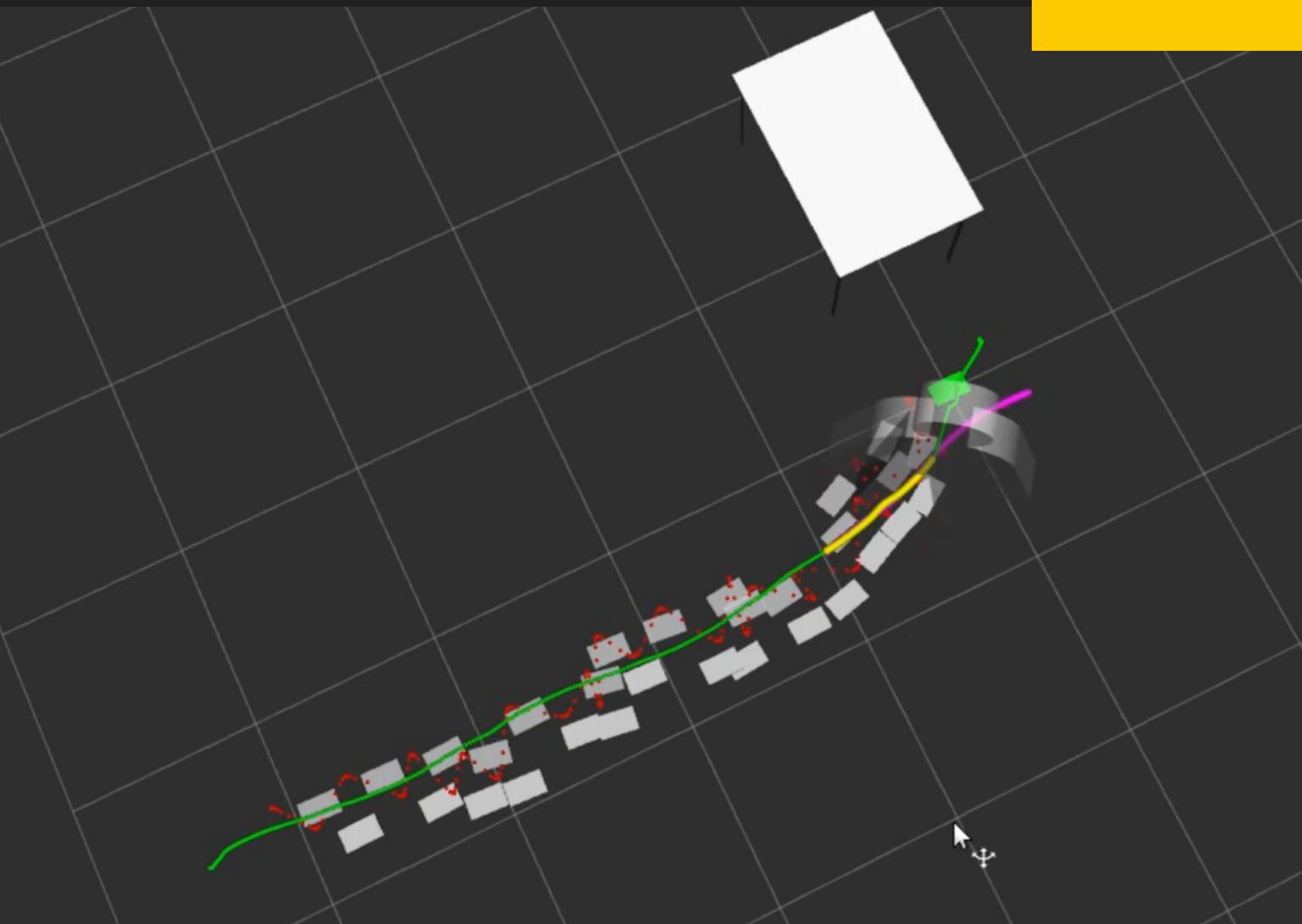


# Prediction process

- Tested for all the measured trajectories with different parameters
- Computation of the **linear, angular** and **predicted distance**:
  - Better results for the prediction of the table's trajectories
  - Accuracy and predicted distance **depend on  $N_0$  and  $N_{oc}$**

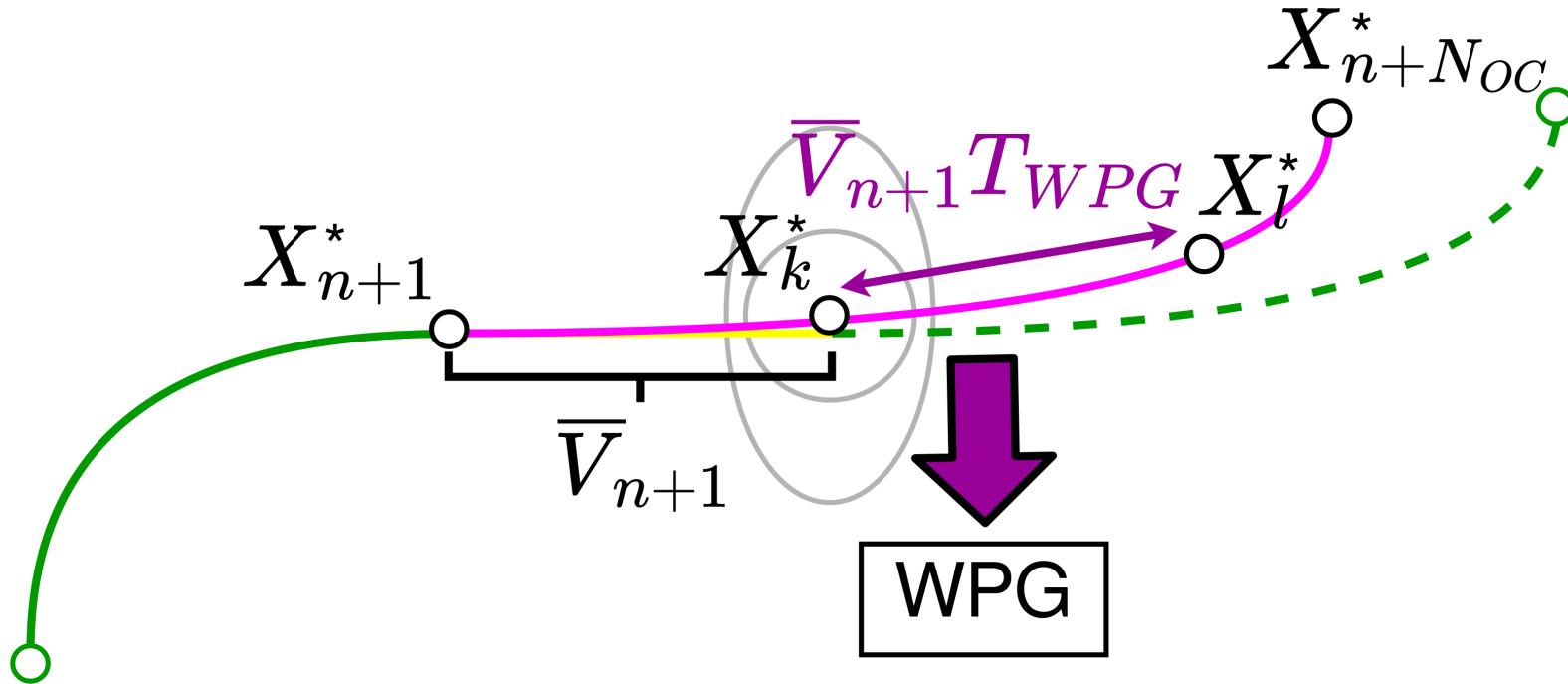
