

#### Schéma MPFA symétrique pour le problème de Stokes

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## **NAVIER-STOKES EQUATIONS** [1]

Find  $(\mathbf{u}(t), p(t)) \in \mathbf{H}_0^1(\Omega) \times L_0^2(\Omega)$  such that:

 $\begin{cases} \partial_t \mathbf{u} - \nu \Delta \mathbf{u} + (\mathbf{u} \cdot \nabla) \mathbf{u} + \nabla p &= \mathbf{f}(t) \\ \operatorname{div} \mathbf{u} &= 0 \\ \mathbf{u}(0) &= \mathbf{u}_0 \end{cases}$ 

Difficulties: unsteady, 3D, non linear, constrained.

- **u**: velocity of the fluid
- **f**: volumic external sources
- $\nu$ : kinematic viscosity
- *p*: pressure / fluid density

#### Stokes problem:

Find  $(\mathbf{u}, p) \in \mathbf{H}_0^1(\Omega) \times L_0^2(\Omega)$  such that:

 $\begin{cases} -\nu \Delta \mathbf{u} + \nabla p = \mathbf{f} \\ \operatorname{div} \mathbf{u} = 0 \end{cases}$ 

### TIME STEPPING SCHEME (SEMI-IMPLICIT CASE) [2]

Find  $(\underline{U}^{m+1}, \underline{P}^{m+1})$  such that:

 $\delta t^{-1}M(\underline{U}^{m+1} - \underline{U}^m) + K\underline{U}^{m+1} + L(\underline{U}^m)\underline{U}^{m+1} - B^T\underline{P}^{m+1} = \underline{F}^{m+1} \text{ and } B\underline{U}^{m+1} = 0.$ 

## **SPURIOUS VELOCITIES** [3]

**Non-conforming discretization**  $\mathbf{P}_{nc}^1/P^0$ :

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**Prediction step:** Find  $\underline{U}^*$  such that

$$(M + K + L(\underline{U}^m))\underline{U}^* = \underline{F}^{m+1} + \delta t^{-1}M\underline{U}^m + B^T\underline{P}^m \quad \text{GMRES}$$

**Pressure solver step:** Find  $\delta P$  such that

$$BM^{-1}B^{T}\delta\underline{P} = -\delta t^{-1}B\underline{U}^{*}, \quad \text{Cholesky or PCG}$$
$$\underline{P}^{m+1} = \underline{P}^{m} + \delta\underline{P}$$

**Correction step:** Find  $\underline{U}^{m+1}$  such that

$$\delta t^{-1}M \underline{U}^{m+1} = \delta t^{-1}M \underline{U}^* + B^T \delta \underline{P}$$
 direct computation

The mass matrix M is diagonal.

Relaxed Courant-Friedrichs-Levy condition vs explicit case.

## MULTIPLE POINTS FLUX APPROX. [7]

- Scheme for gradient: approached by  $G_h$
- Add auxiliary unknowns  $(p_F)_{F \in K_S}$  (2 per edges).

• Evaluate 
$$G_h(p_T)$$
,  $p_T = \mathbb{1}_T$ . Modify  $B$ .

$$G_{h}(p_{T})_{|Q_{T'}^{S}|} = \frac{3}{2|T'|} \sum_{F|S \in F} (p_{F} - p_{T}) \mathbf{n}_{F}^{T'}$$

- Continuity conditions to compute  $(p_F)_{F \in Q^S}$ :
- Substitute the  $p_F$  in the system, with  $p_T$  and previous systems.
- Boundary Condition: To eliminate the  $(p_F)_{F \in K^b_C}$  on the boundary, we use Neumann/Dirichlet condition.
- Properties: Applied to the laplacian problem :
  - exact gradient for affine function

- If  $\mathbf{f} = \nabla \varphi$ ,  $(\mathbf{u}, p) = (0, \varphi)$ ,  $\varphi \in P^k$ :  $\|\mathbf{u}_h\|_h \lesssim h^{2d-1}/\nu, \quad \|p-p_h\|_0 \lesssim h^2.$ •  $\mathbf{P}_{nc}^1 - P^0 P^1 P^a$ : too many dof.
- **H**(div)-conforming projection
  - Modify F, M and  $L(\underline{U}^m)$ .

 $Q^S = \bigcup_T Q_T^S$  (in gray, right picture):  $[\boldsymbol{G}_h(p_h)] \cdot \mathbf{n}_F = 0.$ S $p_{F'}$  $p_F$  $\mathbf{n}_{F'}$  $\mathbf{n}_F$  $p_T$ 

- converge with similar assumptions of P1 F.E.M.
- Stokes: Applied MPFA on the pressure gradient with Crouzeix-Raviart element for the velocity :

$$\int_{\Omega} \mathbf{v} \cdot \nabla q \simeq \sum_{T \in \mathcal{T}_h} \sum_{Q \in \mathcal{Q}_h(T)} \int_Q \mathbf{v}_h \cdot \mathbf{G}_h(q_h)$$

MPFA DISCRETIZATION FOR THE GRADIENT OF PRESSURE ON THE NAVIER-STOKES PROBLEM

• System :  

$$\begin{pmatrix} A & G_{int} & G_{bd} \\ D & 0 & 0 \end{pmatrix} \begin{pmatrix} U \\ P_{int} \\ P_{bd} \end{pmatrix} = \begin{pmatrix} RHS \\ 0 \end{pmatrix} \qquad \text{with:} \qquad (A_{\phi})_{FF'} \coloneqq \sum_{K \in \mathcal{T}_h} \int_K \nabla \phi_F \cdot \nabla \phi_{F'}, \qquad (D^{\alpha})_{FT} \coloneqq \sum_{K \in \mathcal{T}_h} \int_K \psi_T^{int} \operatorname{div}(\phi_F e_{\alpha}), \\ (G_{int}^{\alpha})_{TF} \coloneqq \sum_{K \in \mathcal{T}_h} \int_K \phi_F G_h(\psi_T^{int}) \cdot e_{\alpha}, \qquad (G_{bd}^{\alpha})_{fF} \coloneqq \sum_{K \in \mathcal{T}_h} \int_K \phi_F G_h(\psi_f^{bd}) \cdot e_{\alpha}.$$

• Stokes: 1/h = 20, **u** sine function, *p* affine function

- $F \subset \Omega^{\circ}, q_{1} \in P^{1}(T), \int_{F} [\phi_{F} \boldsymbol{e}_{\alpha}] q_{1} = \boldsymbol{0}$ 3. Using approximate Neumann conditions for pressure :  $\int_{f} \boldsymbol{G}_{h}(p_{T}) \cdot \mathbf{n}_{\partial\Omega} = \int_{f} \mathbf{f} \cdot \mathbf{n}_{\partial\Omega}$
- Solutions 1 and 2 impose a mesh restriction. Two different triangles having a face on the Rq: boundary cannot share a face.
