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Degeneration of families of projective hypersurfaces and Hodge conjecture

Abstract

We prove by induction on dimension the Hodge conjecture for smooth complex projective varieties. Let X be a smooth complex projective variety. Then X is birational to a possibly singular projective hypersurface, hence to a smooth projective variety E_0 which is a component of a normal crossing divisor $E = \bigcup_{i=0}^r E_i \subset Y$ which is the singular fiber of a pencil $f: Y \to \mathbb{A}^1$ of smooth projective hypersurfaces. Using the smooth hypersurface case ([5] theorem 1), the nearby cycle functor on mixed Hodge module with rational de Rham factor and the induction hypothesis, we prove that a Hodge class of E_0 is absolute Hodge, more precisely the locus of Hodge classes inside the algebraic vector bundle given the De Rham cohomology of the rational deformation of E_0 is defined over \mathbb{Q} . By [4] theorem 4, we get the Hodge conjecture for E_0 . By the induction hypothesis we also have the Hodge conjecture for X.

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1 Introduction

The main result of this article is an inductive proof of the Hodge conjecture using the results of [4] and [5]. More precisely, assuming the Hodge conjecture for smooth projective varieties of dimension less or equal to d-1, the property of satisfying the Hodge conjecture for connected smooth projective varieties of dimension d is a birational invariant (proposition 1). On the other hand, if X is a connected smooth projective variety of dimension d, then X is birational to a possibly singular hypersurface $Y_0 \subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}}$, hence there exists (see proposition 2) a family of smooth projective hypersurfaces over $\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}\setminus 0$ which degenerate at 0 into a normal crossing divisor with one component birational to X, that is we have a morphism of complex algebraic varieties $f_X: Y \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}$ with

- Y a smooth complex algebraic variety, f_X flat projective,
- $Y_s:=f_X^{-1}(s)\subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}}$ for $s\in \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}\setminus\{0\}$ are smooth projective hypersurfaces,

• $f_X = f_X' \circ \epsilon$, $f_X' : Y' \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}$ is a generic pencil of hypersurface passing through $Y_0 := f_X^{'-1}(0) \subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}}$, $\epsilon : (Y, E) \to (Y', Y_0)$ is a desingularization of the pair (Y', Y_0) with $E := f_X^{-1}(0) = \epsilon^{-1}(Y_0) = \bigcup_{i=0}^r E_i \subset Y$ is a normal crossing divisor, and E_0 is birational to X.

Assuming the Hodge conjecture for smooth projective varieties of dimension less or equal to d-1, we then prove the Hodge conjecture for the E_i , more specifically for E_0 as follows: We consider its canonical rational deformation $\tilde{f}_X: \mathcal{Y} \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{O}} \times S$ with

- \mathcal{Y} a smooth algebraic variety over \mathbb{Q} , $S \subset \mathbb{A}^s_{\mathbb{Q}}$ an open subset, \tilde{f}_X flat projective, $Y = \tilde{f}_X^{-1}(\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{Q}} \times \{t\})$, $f_X = \tilde{f}_X \times_S \{t\}$, with $t \in S(\mathbb{C})$
- $\tilde{f}_X = \tilde{f}_X' \circ \epsilon$, $f_X' : \mathcal{Y}' \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{Q}} \times S$ is the corresponding family of hypersurfaces, $\epsilon : (\mathcal{Y}, \mathcal{E}) \to (\mathcal{Y}', \mathcal{Y}_0)$ is the corresponding desingularization over \mathbb{Q} ,
- $\mathcal{E} = \bigcup_{i=0}^r \mathcal{E}_i := \tilde{f}_X^{-1}(\{0\} \times S) \subset \mathcal{Y}$ is a normal crossing divisor, $\tilde{f}_{X,0} : \mathcal{E}_I := \cap_{i \in I} \mathcal{E}_i \to S$ smooth projective for each $I \subset [0, \dots, r], \ \mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C},t} = E$,
- $\tilde{f}_X \times_{\mathbb{A}^1} (\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) : \mathcal{Y}^o \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{O}} \setminus \{0\}$ has fibers which are smooth projective hypersurfaces.

Let $p \in \mathbb{Z}$. By the hard Lefchetz theorem on $H^*(E_0)$, we may assume that $2p \leq d$. We then have then a morphism of mixed Hodge module over S (in fact of geometric variation of mixed Hodge structures over S) given by the specialization map

$$Sp_{\mathcal{E}/\tilde{f}_X}: E^{2p}_{Hdg}(\mathcal{E}/S) \to H^{2p}\psi_0 E_{Hdg}(\mathcal{Y}^o/((\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{Q}} \setminus \{0\}) \times S)),$$

whose de Rham part are morphism of filtered vector bundle over S with Gauss-Manin connexion defined over \mathbb{Q} , and whose kernel of the part supported on \mathcal{E}_0 is supported a closed subset $\mathcal{F} \subset \mathcal{E}_0$ with $\operatorname{codim}(\mathcal{F}_{t'},\mathcal{E}_{0,t'})=1$ for all $t'\in S(\mathbb{C})$. The fact that the kernel is supported on a closed subset of codimension one on fibers follows from the fact that $H^{2p-1}(Y_s,\mathbb{Q})=0=H^{2p-1}_{Y_0}(Y)$, by the weak Lefchetz theorem since Y_s and Y_0 are projective hypersurfaces $(2p\leq d)$. Consider the exact sequence of variation of mixed Hodge structure over S

$$0 \to W_{2p-2}E^{2p}_{Hda}(\mathcal{E}/S) \to E^{2p}_{Hda}(\mathcal{E}/S) \xrightarrow{(i_i^*)_{0 \le i \le r} := q} \bigoplus_{i=0}^r E^{2p}_{Hda}(\mathcal{E}_i/S) \to 0.$$

It induces the exact sequence of presheaves on $S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}$,

$$HL^{2p,p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}) \xrightarrow{q} \oplus_{i=0}^{r} HL^{2p,p}(\mathcal{E}_{i,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}) \xrightarrow{e} J(W_{2p-2}E_{Hdg}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})) := \operatorname{Ext}^{1}(\mathbb{Q}_{S}^{Hdg}, W_{2p-2}E_{Hdg}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})) \xrightarrow{\iota} \operatorname{Ext}^{1}(\mathbb{Q}_{S}^{Hdg}, E_{Hdg}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}))$$

where $HL^{2p,p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$, $HL^{2p,p}(\mathcal{E}_{i,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{i,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ are the locus of Hodge classes. Let $\lambda \in F^pH^{2p}(E_0^{an},\mathbb{Q})$, where we recall $E_0 = \mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C},t}$. Consider then

- $\tilde{\lambda} \in H^{2p}(E^{an}, \mathbb{Q})$, such that $q(\tilde{\lambda}) = \lambda$, and $\tilde{\lambda} := Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}) \in Sp_{E/f_X}(H^{2p}(E^{an}, \mathbb{Q}))$,
- $\tilde{\lambda}_F \in F^p H^{2p}(E^{an}, \mathbb{C})$, such that $q(\tilde{\lambda}_F) = \lambda$,
- $e_{\lambda} := \tilde{\lambda} \tilde{\lambda}_F \in W_{2p-2}H^{2p}(E^{an}, \mathbb{C}), \ e_{\lambda} \in \Gamma(\tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, \pi^{*mod}E^{2p,an}_{DR}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}))^{\nabla}$ the corresponding section where $\pi_S : \tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}} \to S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}$ is the universal covering, and

$$\bar{e_{\lambda}} := [e_{\lambda}] \in \Gamma(\tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, \pi^{*mod}E^{2p,an}_{DR}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})/F^{p} \oplus \mathbb{Q})^{\nabla}.$$

The locus of Hodge classes passing through λ inside the De Rham vector bundle of $\tilde{f}_X \circ i_{E_0} : \mathcal{E}_0 \to S$ is thus by the above exact sequence an union of two components

$$\mathbb{V}_{S}^{p}(\lambda) := \mathbb{V}_{S}(\lambda) \cap F^{p} E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}) = q(\mathbb{V}_{S}^{p}(\tilde{\lambda})) \cup \mathbb{V}_{V(\tilde{e_{\lambda}})}(\lambda) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}),$$

where

- $\mathbb{V}_S(\lambda) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}), \ \mathbb{V}_S(\tilde{\lambda}) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}), \ \mathbb{V}_{V(\tilde{e}(\lambda))}(\lambda) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ are the flat leaves, e.g. $\mathbb{V}_S(\lambda) := \pi_S(\lambda \times \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an})$ where $\pi_S : H^{2p}(E^{an}, \mathbb{C}) \times \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an} \to E_{DR}^{2p,an}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is the morphism induced by the universal covering $\pi_S : \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an} \to S_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}$,
- $V(\bar{e_{\lambda}}) := \pi_S(V(\tilde{e}(\lambda))) \subset S_{\mathbb{C}}$, where $V(\bar{e_{\lambda}}) \subset \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}$ is the zero locus of $\bar{e_{\lambda}}$,
- $q := q \otimes \mathbb{C} : E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}) \to E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is the quotient map.

Now,

• if $Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}) = 0$, assuming the Hodge conjecture for smooth projective varieties of dimension less or equal to d-1, $\mathbb{V}_S^p(\tilde{\lambda}) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is an algebraic subvariety defined over $\bar{\mathbb{Q}}$ and its Galois conjugate are also components of the locus of Hodge classes, if $Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}) \neq 0$, by [5] theorem 1, the Hodge conjecture holds for projective hypersurfaces, hence

$$Sp_{\mathcal{E}/\tilde{f}_X}(\mathbb{V}^p_S(\tilde{\lambda})) = \mathbb{V}^p_S(Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda})) = \overline{\mathbb{V}^p_{(\mathbb{A}^1\backslash 0)\times S}(Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}))} \cap p^{-1}(0\times S_{\mathbb{C}}) \subset E^{2p}_{DR,V_0}(\mathcal{Y}_{\mathbb{C}}/(\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}\times S_{\mathbb{C}}))$$

is an algebraic subvariety defined over $\bar{\mathbb{Q}}$ and its Galois conjugate are also components of the locus of Hodge classes, where the equality follows from [6] lemma 2.11,

• if $Sp_{E/f_X}(e_{\lambda}) = 0$, $Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}) = Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}_F)$ and for $t' \in \tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}$, $e_{\lambda}(t') = 0$ if and only if $e(\tilde{\lambda}_{t'}) = 0$ if and only if $Sp_{\mathcal{E}_{t'}/(\tilde{f}_X)_{t'}}(\tilde{\lambda}_{t'})$ is a Hodge class, if $Sp_{E/f_X}(e_{\lambda}) \neq 0$, then considering the restrictions of

$$Sp_{E/f_X}(e_{\lambda}) \in \Gamma(\tilde{G}_m \times \tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, \pi^{*mod}_{S,G_m} E_{DR}(\mathcal{Y}^o_{\mathbb{C}}/((\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \backslash 0) \times S_{\mathbb{C}}))^{an})^{\nabla}$$

to Lefchetz pencils $\pi_{S,G_m}^{-1}(L) \subset \tilde{G}_m \times \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}, L \subset \overline{((\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) \times S)_{\mathbb{C}}} = \mathbb{P}(l_X)$, where $\mathbb{P}(l_X)$ is the space of hypersurface over degree $l_X = deg(\mathbb{Q}(X)/\mathbb{Q}(x_1, \cdots, x_d))$ (for the equality we may assume that X is not defined over \mathbb{Q} and that $l_X > 1$), we see that $V(\bar{e_\lambda}) = \emptyset$.

Hence, $\mathbb{V}_{S}^{p}(\lambda) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{0\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is an algebraic subvariety defined over \mathbb{Q} and its Galois conjugate are also components of the locus of Hodge classes. By [4] theorem 4, we get

$$\lambda = [Z] \in H^{2p}(E_0^{an}, \mathbb{Q}), \ Z \in \mathcal{Z}^p(E_0).$$

We recall the key point is that since $\mathbb{V}^p_S(\lambda) \subset E^{2p}_{DR}(\mathcal{E}_{0\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is an algebraic subvariety defined over $\bar{\mathbb{Q}}$ and its Galois conjugate are also components of the locus of Hodge classes, we have for each $\theta \in Aut(\mathbb{C}, \mathbb{Q})$,

$$\theta(\lambda) \in Gal(\bar{\mathbb{Q}}, \mathbb{Q})(\mathbb{V}^p_S(\lambda)_{\theta}) \subset E^{2p}_{DR}(\mathcal{E}_{0\mathbb{C}, \theta}/S_{\mathbb{C}, \theta}),$$

which implies that $\theta(\lambda) \in H^{2p}(E_{0,\theta}^{an}, \mathbb{Q}) \subset H^{2p}(E_{0,\theta}^{an}, \mathbb{C})$, that is $\lambda \in H^{2p}(E_0^{an}, \mathbb{Q})$ is absolute Hodge and we apply [4] corollary 1. Since $p \in \mathbb{Z}$ and $\lambda \in F^pH^{2p}(E_0^{an}, \mathbb{Q})$ are arbitrary, this proves the Hodge conjecture for E_0 . Since X is birational to E_0 , the Hodge conjecture for E_0 and the induction hypothesis implies the Hodge conjecture for X.

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2 Preliminaries and notations

2.1 Notations

- Denote by Top the category of topological spaces and RTop the category of ringed spaces.
- Denote by Cat the category of small categories and RCat the category of ringed topos.
- For $S \in \text{Cat}$ and $X \in S$, we denote $S/X \in \text{Cat}$ the category whose objects are Y/X := (Y, f) with $Y \in S$ and $f: Y \to X$ is a morphism in S, and whose morphisms Hom((Y', f'), (Y, f)) consists of $g: Y' \to Y$ in S such that $f \circ g = f'$.

- Let $(S, O_S) \in RC$ a ringed topos with topology τ . For $F \in C_{O_S}(S)$, we denote by $k : F \to E_{\tau}(F)$ the canonical flasque resolution in $C_{O_S}(S)$ (see [3]). In particular for $X \in S$, $H^*(X, E_{\tau}(F)) \xrightarrow{\sim}$ $\mathbb{H}_{\tau}^*(X,F)$.
- For $f: \mathcal{S}' \to \mathcal{S}$ a morphism with $\mathcal{S}, \mathcal{S}' \in RCat$, endowed with topology τ and τ' respectively, we denote for $F \in C_{O_S}(\mathcal{S})$ and each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$,
 - $-f^* := H^j\Gamma(\mathcal{S}, k \circ \operatorname{ad}(f^*, f_*)(F)) : \mathbb{H}^j(\mathcal{S}, F) \to \mathbb{H}^j(\mathcal{S}', f^*F),$
 - $-f^* := H^j\Gamma(\mathcal{S}, k \circ \operatorname{ad}(f^{*mod}, f_*)(F)) : \mathbb{H}^j(\mathcal{S}, F) \to \mathbb{H}^j(\mathcal{S}', f^{*mod}F),$

the canonical maps.

- For $m:A\to B,\ A,B\in C(\mathcal{A}),\ \mathcal{A}$ an additive category, we denote $c(A):\operatorname{Cone}(m:A\to B)\to A[1]$ and $c(B): B \to \operatorname{Cone}(m: A \to B)$ the canonical maps.
- Denote by Sch ⊂ RTop the subcategory of schemes (the morphisms are the morphisms of locally ringed spaces). We denote by PSch \subset Sch the full subcategory of proper schemes. For a field k, we consider Sch /k := Sch / Spec k the category of schemes over Spec k. The objects are $X := (X, a_X)$ with $X \in Sch$ and $a_X : X \to Spec k$ a morphism and the morphisms are the morphisms of schemes $f: X' \to X$ such that $f \circ a_{X'} = a_X$. We then denote by
 - $-\operatorname{Var}(k) = \operatorname{Sch}^{ft}/k \subset \operatorname{Sch}/k$ the full subcategory consisting of algebraic varieties over k, i.e. schemes of finite type over k,
 - $\operatorname{PVar}(k) \subset \operatorname{QPVar}(k) \subset \operatorname{Var}(k)$ the full subcategories consisting of quasi-projective varieties and projective varieties respectively,
 - $-\operatorname{PSmVar}(k) \subset \operatorname{SmVar}(k) \subset \operatorname{Var}(k), \operatorname{PSmVar}(k) := \operatorname{PVar}(k) \cap \operatorname{SmVar}(k), \text{ the full subcategories}$ consisting of smooth varieties and smooth projective varieties respectively.
- Denote by $AnSp(\mathbb{C}) \subset RTop$ the subcategory of analytic spaces over \mathbb{C} , and by $AnSm(\mathbb{C}) \subset AnSp(\mathbb{C})$ the full subcategory of smooth analytic spaces (i.e. complex analytic manifold).
- For $X \in Var(k)$ and $X = \bigcup_{i \in I} X_i$ with $i_i : X_i \hookrightarrow X$ closed embeddings, we denote $X_{\bullet} \in X$ $\operatorname{Fun}(\Delta,\operatorname{Var}(k))$ the associated simplicial space, with for $J\subset I$, $i_{IJ}:X_I:=\cap_{i\in I}X_i\hookrightarrow X_J:=\cap_{i\in J}X_i$ the closed embedding.
- Let $(X, O_X) \in \text{RTop}$. We consider its De Rham complex $\Omega_X^{\bullet} := DR(X)(O_X)$.
 - Let $X \in Sch$. Considering its De Rham complex $\Omega_X^{\bullet} := DR(X)(O_X)$, we have for $j \in \mathbb{Z}$ its De Rham cohomology $H_{DR}^{j}(X) := \mathbb{H}^{j}(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}).$
 - Let $X \in Var(k)$. Considering its De Rham complex $\Omega_X^{\bullet} := \Omega_{X/k}^{\bullet} := DR(X/k)(O_X)$, we have for $j \in \mathbb{Z}$ its De Rham cohomology $H^j_{DR}(X) := \mathbb{H}^j(X, \Omega_X^{\bullet})$. The differentials of $\Omega_X^{\bullet} := \Omega_{X/k}^{\bullet}$ are by definition k-linear, thus $H_{DR}^j(X) := \mathbb{H}^j(X, \Omega_X^{\bullet})$ has a structure of a k vector space.
 - Let $X \in \text{AnSp}(\mathbb{C})$. Considering its De Rham complex $\Omega_X^{\bullet} := DR(X)(O_X)$, we have for $j \in \mathbb{Z}$ its De Rham cohomology $H^j_{DR}(X) := \mathbb{H}^j(X, \Omega_X^{\bullet}).$
- For $Y \in \text{Var}(\mathbb{Q})$ and $X = V(I) = V(f_1, \dots, f_r) \subset Y_{\mathbb{C}}$, we consider $\mathcal{X} = V(\tilde{I}) = V(\tilde{f}_1, \dots, \tilde{f}_r) \subset V(\tilde{f}_1, \dots, \tilde{f}_r)$ $Y \times \mathbb{A}^s_{\mathbb{O}}$ the canonical rational deformation, where

if
$$f = \sum_{I \subset [1, \dots, d]^n} a_I x_1^{n_1} \cdots x_n^{n_n} \in \mathbb{C}[x_1, \dots, x_n],$$

$$\tilde{f} = \sum_{I \subset [1, \dots, d]^n} a_I x_1^{n_1} \cdots x_n^{n_n} \in \mathbb{Q}[(a_I)_{I \subset [1, \dots, d]^n}, x_1, \dots, x_n].$$

$$\tilde{f} = \sum_{I \subset [1, \dots, d]^n} a_I x_1^{n_1} \cdots x_n^{n_n} \in \mathbb{Q}[(a_I)_{I \subset [1, \dots, d]^n}, x_1, \dots, x_n].$$

- For $X \in \operatorname{AnSp}(\mathbb{C})$, we denote $\alpha(X) : \mathbb{C}_X \to \Omega_X^{\bullet}$ the embedding in C(X). For $X \in \operatorname{AnSm}(\mathbb{C})$, $\alpha(X) : \mathbb{C}_X \to \Omega_X^{\bullet}$ is an equivalence usu local by Poincare lemma.
- We denote $\mathbb{I}^n := [0,1]^n \in \text{Diff}(\mathbb{R})$ (with boundary). For $X \in \text{Top}$ and R a ring, we consider its singular cochain complex

$$C^*_{\mathrm{sing}}(X,R) := (\mathbb{Z} \operatorname{Hom}_{\mathrm{Top}}(\mathbb{I}^*,X)^{\vee}) \otimes R$$

and for $l \in \mathbb{Z}$ its singular cohomology $H^l_{\text{sing}}(X,R) := H^n C^*_{\text{sing}}(X,R)$. For $f: X' \to X$ a continuous map with $X, X' \in \text{Top}$, we have the canonical map of complexes

$$f^*: C^*_{\operatorname{sing}}(X,R) \to C^*_{\operatorname{sing}}(X,R), \sigma \mapsto f^*\sigma := (\gamma \mapsto \sigma(f \circ \gamma)).$$

In particular, we get by functoriality the complex

$$C_{X R \operatorname{sing}}^* \in C_R(X), (U \subset X) \mapsto C_{\operatorname{sing}}^*(U, R)$$

We recall that

- For $X \in \text{Top}$ locally contractible, e.g. $X \in \text{CW}$, and R a ring, the inclusion in $C_R(X)$ $c_X : R_X \to C^*_{X,R \text{sing}}$ is by definition an equivalence top local and that we get by the small chain theorem, for all $l \in \mathbb{Z}$, an isomorphism $H^l c_X : H^l(X, R_X) \xrightarrow{\sim} H^l_{\text{sing}}(X, R)$.
- For $X \in \text{Diff}(\mathbb{R})$, the restriction map

$$r_X: \mathbb{Z}\operatorname{Hom}_{\operatorname{Diff}(\mathbb{R})}(\mathbb{I}^*, X)^{\vee} \to C^*_{\operatorname{sing}}(X, R), \ w \mapsto w: (\phi \mapsto w(\phi))$$

is a quasi-isomorphism by Whitney approximation theorem.

• Let $S \in \text{AnSm}(\mathbb{C})$ and $L \in \text{Shv}(S)$ a local system. Consider $E := L \otimes O_S \in \text{Vect}_{\mathcal{D}}(S)$ the corresponding holomorphic vector bundle with integrable connection ∇ . Let $\pi_S : \tilde{S} \to S$ be the universal covering. Consider the canonical fiber

$$L_0 := \Gamma(\tilde{S}, \pi_S^* L) = \Gamma(\tilde{S}, \pi_S^{*mod} E)^{\nabla}.$$

For $\lambda \in L_0$, we will consider the flat leaf

$$\mathbb{V}_S(\lambda) := \pi_S(\lambda \times \tilde{S}) \subset E, \ \pi_S : L_0 \times \tilde{S} \to E, \ \pi_S(\nu, z) := (\nu(z), \pi_S(z)).$$

Note that for $t \in S$, $\mathbb{V}_S(\lambda) \cap p_S^{-1}(t) = \pi_1(S,t)(\lambda)$ is the orbit of λ under the monodromy action, where $p_S : E \to S$ is the projection.

2.2 Birational projective varieties and Hodge conjecture

In this subsection, we recall that assuming the Hodge conjecture for smooth projective varieties of dimension less or equal to d-1, the property of satisfying the Hodge conjecture for connected smooth projective varieties of dimension d is a birational invariant:

- **Proposition 1.** (i) Let $X \in \mathrm{PSmVar}(\mathbb{C})$ connected of dimension d. Let $\epsilon : \tilde{X}_Z \to X$ be the blow up of X along a smooth closed subvariety $Z \subset X$. Assume the Hodge conjecture hold for smooth complex projective varieties of dimension less or equal to d-1. Then the Hodge conjecture hold for X if and only if it hold for \tilde{X}_Z .
- (ii) Let $X, X' \in PSmVar(\mathbb{C})$ connected of dimension d. Assume the Hodge conjecture hold for smooth complex projective varieties of dimension less or equal to d-1. If X is birational to X', then the Hodge conjecture hold for X if and only if it hold for X'

Proof. (i): Follows from the fact that

$$(\epsilon^*, \bigoplus_{l=1}^c i_{E*}((-).h^{l-1})) : H^k(X, \mathbb{Q}) \oplus \bigoplus_{l=1}^c H^{k-2l}(E, \mathbb{Q}) \to H^k(\tilde{X}_Z, \mathbb{Q})$$

is an isomorphism of Hodge structures for each $k \in \mathbb{Z}$, where $c = \operatorname{codim}(Z, X)$, $i_E : E \hookrightarrow \tilde{X}_Z$ is the closed embedding, $\epsilon_{|E} : E \to Z$ being a projective vector bundle.

(ii):Follows from (i) since if $\pi: X^o \to X'$ is a birational map, $X^o \subset X$ being an open subset, then X is connected to X' by a sequence of blow up of smooth projective varieties with smooth center by [1]. \square

2.3 A family of smooth projective hypersurfaces associated to a smooth projective variety

In this subsection, we recall that given a smooth complex projective variety X, there exists a family of smooth complex projective hypersurfaces which degenerates into a normal crossing divisor with one irreducible component birational to X.

Proposition 2. Let $X \in PSmVar(\mathbb{C})$ connected of dimension d. Then there exists a family of smooth projective hypersurfaces $f_X : Y \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}$ with

- $Y \in \operatorname{SmVar}(\mathbb{C})$, f_X flat projective,
- $Y_s := f_X^{-1}(s) \subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}}$ for $s \in \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \setminus 0$ are smooth projective hypersurfaces,
- $E := f_X^{-1}(0) = \bigcup_{i=0}^r E_i = \epsilon^{-1}(Y_0) \subset Y$ is a normal crossing divisor, where $Y_0 \subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}}$ is a possibly singular hypersurface birational to X, $\epsilon : (Y, E) \to (Y', Y_0)$ a desingularization, and E_0 is birational to X.

Proof. See [2] lemma 1.5.8. It use the fact that X is birational to a possibly singular projective hypersurface Y_0 and consider the desingularization of a generic pencil $f_X': Y' = V(f) \subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}} \times \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}$ passing through Y_0 and $f_X = f_X' \circ \epsilon$.

2.4 The nearby cycle functor and the specialization map

Recall from [3] that for $k \subset \mathbb{C}$ a subfield and $S \in \text{Var}(k)$ quasi-projective, and $l: S \hookrightarrow \tilde{S}$ a closed embedding with $\tilde{S} \in \text{SmVar}(k)$, we have the full subcategory

$$\iota: MHM_{k,gm}(S) \hookrightarrow \mathrm{PSh}_{\mathcal{D}fil,S}(\tilde{S}) \times_I P(S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}})$$

consisting of geometric mixed Hodge module whose De Rham part is defined over k, where, using the fact that the V-filtration is defined over k, $\mathrm{PSh}_{\mathcal{D}(1,0)fil,S}(\tilde{S}) \times_I P_{fil}(S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}})$ is the category

- whose objects are $((M, F, W), (K, W), \alpha)$ where (M, F, W) is a filtered $D_{\tilde{S}}$ module supported on S, where $l: S \hookrightarrow \tilde{S}$ is a closed embedding and $\tilde{S} \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$, (K, W) is a filtered Perverse sheaf on $S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}$, and $\alpha: l_*(K, W) \otimes \mathbb{C} \to DR(\tilde{S})((M, W)^{an})$ is an isomorphism in $D_{fil}(\tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}})$.
- whose morphism between $((M, F, W), (K, W), \alpha)$ and $((M', F, W), (K', W), \alpha')$, are couples of morphisms $(\phi : (M, F, W) \to (M', F, W), \psi : (K, W) \to (K', W))$ such that $\phi \circ \alpha = \alpha' \circ \psi$.

Then, by [3], we get for $S \in \text{Var}(k)$ quasi-projective and $l: S \hookrightarrow \tilde{S}$ is a closed embedding with $\tilde{S} \in \text{SmVar}(k)$ an embedding

$$\iota: D(MHM_{k,gm}(S)) \hookrightarrow D_{\mathcal{D}fil,S}(\tilde{S}) \times_I D(S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}})$$

consisting of mixed Hodge module whose De Rham part is defined over k, where $D_{\mathcal{D}(1,0)fil,S}(\tilde{S}) \times_I D_{fil,c}(S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}})$ is the category

- whose objects are $((M, F, W), (K, W), \alpha)$ where (M, F, W) is a complex of filtered $D_{\tilde{S}}$ module supported on S, (K, W) is a filtered complex of presheaves on $S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}$ whose cohomology are constructible sheaves, and $\alpha: l_*(K, W) \otimes \mathbb{C} \to DR(\tilde{S})((M, W)^{an})$ is an isomorphism in $D_{fil}(\tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}})$.
- whose morphism are given in [3],

We have then the six functors formalism:

$$D(MHM_{k,gm}(-)): \operatorname{Var}(k) \mapsto \operatorname{TriCat}, \ S \mapsto D(MHM_{k,gm}(S)), \ (f: T \to S) \mapsto (f^*, f_*): D(MHM_{k,gm}(S)) \to D(MHM_{k,gm}(T)), \ (f_!, f_!): D(MHM_{k,gm}(T)) \to D(MHM_{k,gm}(S))$$
 and for $D \subset S$ a (Cartier) divisor the nearby cycle functor

$$\psi_D: D(MHM_{k,gm}(S)) \to D(MHM_{k,gm}(D)),$$

 $\psi_D((M, F, W), (K, W), \alpha) := (\psi_D(M, F, W), \psi_D(K, W), \psi_D(\alpha)).$

For $T \in Var(k)$ and $\epsilon_{\bullet} : T_{\bullet} \to T$ a desingularization with $T_{\bullet} \in Fun(\Delta, SmVar(k))$, we have

$$\mathbb{Z}_T^{Hdg} := a_T^{*Hdg} \mathbb{Z}^{Hdg} = (\epsilon_{\bullet *} E_{zar}(O_{T_{\bullet}}, F, W), \epsilon_{\bullet *} E_{usu}(\mathbb{Z}_{T_{\bullet}^{an}}, W), \alpha(T_{\bullet}))$$

For $f: X \to S$ a projective morphism with $X, S \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$, we denote

$$E_{Hdg}(X/S) := f_* \mathbb{Z}_X^{Hdg} := (\int f(O_X, F), Rf_* \mathbb{Z}_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}}, f_* \alpha(X)) \in D(MHM_{k,gm}(S)).$$

For $f: X \hookrightarrow \mathbb{P}^N \times S \xrightarrow{p} S$ a projective morphism with $X, S \in \text{Var}(k)$, S smooth, we denote

$$E_{Hdg}(X/S) := f_* \mathbb{Z}_X^{Hdg} := (\int_p \Gamma_X^{Hdg}(O_{\mathbb{P}^N \times S}, F), Rf_* \mathbb{Z}_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}}, f_* \alpha(X)) \in D(MHM_{k,gm}(S)).$$

We then have the specialization map:

Definition-Proposition 1. Let k be field of characteristic zero.

(i) Let
$$f': X' \to \mathbb{A}^1_k \times S$$
 be a projective morphism with $X, S \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$. Assume that $-f^o := f \otimes_{\mathbb{A}^1} (\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) : X^o \to (\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) \times S$ is smooth $-X_0 := f^{-1}(0 \times S) \subset X'$. We have by definition $X^o = X' \setminus X_0$.

We have then, see [3], the distinguished triangles in $D(MHM_{k,gm}(X_0))$

$$\begin{split} \mathbb{Z}_{X_0}^{Hdg} &:= i_{X_0}^* \mathbb{Z}_{X'}^{Hdg} \xrightarrow{sp_{X_0/X}} \psi_{X_0} \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}^{Hdg} := \left(\psi_{X_0}(O_{X'}, F), \psi_{X_0} \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}, \Phi_{X_0} \alpha(X') \right) \\ &\xrightarrow{c(\psi_{X_0} \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}^{Hdg})} \phi_E \mathbb{Z}_{X_o}^{Hdg} := \operatorname{Cone}(sp_{E/X}) \xrightarrow{c(\mathbb{Z}_{X_0}^{Hdg})} \mathbb{Z}_{X_0}^{Hdg} [1]. \end{split}$$

Applying the functor $(f' \circ i_{X_0})_*$, we obtain the generalized distinguished triangle in $D(MHM_{k,gm}(S))$

$$E_{Hdg}(X_{0}/S) \xrightarrow{sp_{X_{0}/f'}:=(f'\circ i_{X_{0}})_{*}sp_{X_{0}/X}}$$

$$(f'\circ i_{X_{0}})_{*}(\psi_{X_{0}}\mathbb{Z}_{X^{o}}^{Hdg}) = \psi_{0}E_{Hdg}(X^{o}/((\mathbb{A}^{1}\setminus 0)\times S)) \xrightarrow{(f'\circ i_{X_{0}})_{*}c(\Phi_{X_{0}}\mathbb{Z}_{X^{o}}^{Hdg})}$$

$$(f'\circ i_{X_{0}})_{*}(\phi_{X_{0}}\mathbb{Z}_{X^{o}}^{Hdg}) = \phi_{0}E_{Hdg}(X^{o}/((\mathbb{A}^{1}\setminus 0)\times S)) \xrightarrow{(f'\circ i_{X_{0}})_{*}c(\mathbb{Z}_{X}^{Hdg})} E_{Hdg}(X_{0}/S)[1]$$

(i)' If for each $t \in S(\mathbb{C})$, $H^{k-1}(X'_{(s,t)}, \mathbb{Q}) = 0$ for $s \in \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \setminus 0$ and $H^{k-1}_{X_0}(X'_{\mathbb{A}^1 \times t}, \mathbb{Q}) = 0$, then the induced map on cohomology

$$sp_{X_0/f'}: E^k_{Hdg}(X_0/S) \to H^k\Phi_0E_{Hdg}(X^o/((\mathbb{A}^1\backslash 0)\times S))$$

is injective.

- (ii) Let $f: X \to \mathbb{A}^1_k \times S$ be a projective morphism with $X, S \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$. Assume that
 - $-f^o := f \otimes_{\mathbb{A}^1} (\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) : X^o \to (\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) \times S \text{ is smooth}$
 - $-E:=f^{-1}(0\times S)=\cup_{i=0}^r E_i\subset X$ is a normal crossing divisor and that for $I\subset [0,\ldots r],$ $f_{0,I}:=f_{\mid E_I}:E_I:=\cap_{i\in I} E_i\to S$ are smooth. We have by definition $X^o=X\backslash E$.

Denote for $I \subset J \subset [0, ...r]$, $i_{JI} : E_J \hookrightarrow E_I$ and $i_I : E_I \hookrightarrow E$, $i_E : E \hookrightarrow X$ the closed embeddings. In this particular case, c.f. [8], the distinguished triangle in $D(MHM_{k,qm}(E))$ given in (i) become

$$\begin{split} \mathbb{Z}_E^{Hdg} &:= i_E^* \mathbb{Z}_X^{Hdg} = ((i_{\bullet *} \Omega_{E \bullet}^{\bullet}, F, W), (\mathbb{Z}_{E \bullet}, W), \alpha(E_{\bullet})) \xrightarrow{sp_{E/X}} \\ \psi_E \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}^{Hdg} &= ((i_E^{*mod} \Omega_{X/\mathbb{A}^1 \times S}^{\bullet} (\log E), F, W), \Phi_E \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}, \Phi_E \alpha(X)) \xrightarrow{c(\psi_E \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}^{Hdg})} \\ \phi_E \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}^{Hdg} &:= \operatorname{Cone}(sp_{E/X}) \xrightarrow{c(\mathbb{Z}_E^{Hdg})} \mathbb{Z}_E^{Hdg}[1]. \end{split}$$

Applying the functor $(f \circ i_E)_*$, we obtain the generalized distinguished triangle in $D(MHM_{k,gm}(S))$

$$E_{Hdg}(E/S) \xrightarrow{sp_{E/f}:=(f \circ i_E)_* sp_{E/X}} (f \circ i_E)_* (\psi_E \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}^{Hdg}) = \psi_0 E_{Hdg}(X^o/((\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) \times S))$$

$$\xrightarrow{(f \circ i_E)_* c(\psi_E \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}^{Hdg})} (f \circ i_E)_* (\phi_E \mathbb{Z}_{X^o}^{Hdg}) = \phi_0 E_{Hdg}(X^o/((\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) \times S)) \xrightarrow{(f \circ i_E)_* c(\mathbb{Z}_{X}^{Hdg})} E_{Hdg}(E/S)[1].$$

If $f = f' \circ \epsilon$ where $\epsilon : (X, E) \to (X', X_0)$ is a desingularization, we have $sp_{X_0/X'} = sp_{E/X} \circ \epsilon^*$.

Proof. (i)':Follows from the exact sequence

$$\cdots \to H^{l}_{X_{0,t}}(X'_{\mathbb{A}^{1}\times t},\mathbb{Q}) \to \mathbb{H}^{l}(X_{0,t},\phi_{0}\mathbb{Z}_{X^{o}_{(\mathbb{A}^{1}\setminus 0)\times t}}) \xrightarrow{V} \mathbb{H}^{l}(X_{0,t},\psi_{0}\mathbb{Z}_{X^{o}_{(\mathbb{A}^{1}\setminus 0)\times t}}) \to H^{l+1}_{X_{0,t}}(X'_{\mathbb{A}^{1}\times t},\mathbb{Q}) \to \cdots$$
given in [8].

3 Hodge conjecture for smooth projective varieties

Theorem 1. Let $X \in \mathrm{PSmVar}(\mathbb{C})$. Then Hodge conjecture hold for X. That is, if $p \in \mathbb{Z}$ and $\lambda \in F^pH^{2p}(X^{an},\mathbb{Q})$, $\lambda = [Z]$ with $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^p(X)$.

Proof. The Hodge conjecture is true for curves and surfaces. Assume that the Hodge conjecture is true for smooth projective varieties of dimension less or equal to d-1. Let $X \in \mathrm{PSmVar}(\mathbb{C})$ of dimension d. Up to split X into its connected components, we may assume that X is connected of dimension d. Then X is birationnal to a possibly singular hypersurface $Y_0 \subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}}$. Consider by proposition 2 a family of smooth projective hypersurfaces over $\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}\setminus 0$ which degenerate at 0 into a normal crossing divisor with one component birational to X, that is a projective morphism in $\mathrm{Var}(\mathbb{C})$ $f_X: Y = V(I) \subset \mathbb{P}^N_{\mathbb{C}} \times \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}$ with

- $Y \in \operatorname{SmVar}(\mathbb{C})$, f_X flat projective.
- $Y_s:=f_X^{-1}(s)\subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}}$ for $s\in \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}\backslash 0$ are smooth projective hypersurfaces
- $f_X = f_X' \circ \epsilon$, $f_X' : Y' = V(f) \subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}} \times \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}$ is a generic pencil of hypersurface passing through $Y_0 := f_X'^{-1}(0) \subset \mathbb{P}^{d+1}_{\mathbb{C}}$ which is birational to X, $\epsilon : (Y, E) \to (Y', Y_0)$ is a desingularization of the pair (Y', Y_0) with $E := f_X^{-1}(0) = \epsilon^{-1}(Y_0) = \bigcup_{i=0}^r E_i \subset Y$ is a normal crossing divisor, and E_0 is birational to X,

and its canonical rational deformation $\tilde{f}_X: \mathcal{Y} = V(\tilde{I}) \subset \mathbb{P}^N_{\mathbb{Q}} \times \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{Q}} \times S \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{Q}} \times S$ with

• $\mathcal{Y} \in \operatorname{SmVar}(\mathbb{Q})$, $S \subset \mathbb{A}^r_{\mathbb{Q}}$ an open subset, \tilde{f}_X flat projective, $Y = \tilde{f}_X^{-1}(\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{Q}} \times \{t\})$, $f_X = \tilde{f}_X \times_S \{t\}$, with $t \in S(\mathbb{C})$,

- $\tilde{f}_X = \tilde{f}_X' \circ \epsilon$, with $\tilde{f}_X' : \mathcal{Y}' = V(\tilde{f}) \subset \mathbb{P}_{\mathbb{Q}}^{d+1} \times \mathbb{A}_{\mathbb{Q}}^1 \times S \to \mathbb{A}_{\mathbb{Q}}^1 \times S$ the corresponding family of hypersurfaces and $\epsilon : (\mathcal{Y}, \mathcal{E}) \to (\mathcal{Y}', \mathcal{Y}_0)$ the corresponding desingularization over \mathbb{Q} ,
- $\mathcal{E} = \bigcup_{i=0}^{s} \mathcal{E}_i := \tilde{f}_X^{-1}(\{0\} \times S) \subset \mathcal{Y}$ is a normal crossing divisor, $\tilde{f}_{X,0} : \mathcal{E}_I := \cap_{i \in I} \mathcal{E}_i \to S$ smooth projective for each $I \subset [0, \dots, s], \mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C},t} = E$,
- $\tilde{f}_X \times_{\mathbb{A}^1} (\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) : \mathcal{Y}^o \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{O}} \setminus 0$ has fibers which are smooth projective hypersurfaces.

We have by definition the commutative diagram in $SmVar(\mathbb{Q})$

$$\begin{array}{c|c} \mathcal{Y}^o & \xrightarrow{j} & \mathcal{Y} \longleftarrow i\varepsilon & \mathcal{E} \\ \tilde{f}_X^o & & & & \int \tilde{f}_X & & & \int \tilde{f}_{X,0} \\ \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{O}} \setminus \{0\} \times S & \xrightarrow{j \times I_S} & & \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{O}} \times S \longleftarrow i_0 \times I_S & & \{0\} \times S \end{array}$$

whose squares are cartesian, j the open embedding and $i_{\mathcal{E}}$ the closed embedding. Denote for $I \subset [0, \ldots, s]$, $i_I : \mathcal{E}_I \hookrightarrow \mathcal{E}$ and for $I \subset J \subset [0, \ldots, s]$, $i_{JI} : \mathcal{E}_J \to \mathcal{E}_I$ the closed embeddings. Then, $i_{\bullet} : \mathcal{E}_{\bullet} \to \mathcal{E}$ in $\operatorname{Fun}(\Delta, \operatorname{Var}(\mathbb{Q}))$ is a simplicial resolution with $\mathcal{E}_{\bullet} \in \operatorname{Fun}(\Delta, \operatorname{SmVar}(\mathbb{Q}))$. We have then

$$E_{Hdg}(\mathcal{E}/S) := (\tilde{f}_X \circ i_{\bullet *} E_{zar}(\Omega^{\bullet}_{\mathcal{E}_{\bullet}/S}, F_b, W), (\tilde{f}_X \circ i_{\bullet *} E_{usu}(\mathbb{Q}_{\mathcal{E}_{\bullet}^{an}}, W)), \tilde{f} \circ i_{\bullet *} \alpha(\mathcal{E}_{\bullet})) \in D(MHM_{\mathbb{Q}, gm}(S))$$

Then, definition-proposition 1 applied to $\tilde{f}'_X: \mathcal{Y}' \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{Q}} \times S$ gives the distinguish in $D(MHM_{\mathbb{Q},gm}(S))$,

$$E_{Hdg}(\mathcal{Y}_0/S) \xrightarrow{Sp_{\mathcal{Y}_0/\tilde{f}_X} := (\tilde{f}_X' \circ i_{\mathcal{Y}_0})_* sp_{\mathcal{Y}_0/\mathcal{Y}}} \psi_0 E_{Hdg}(\mathcal{Y}^o/((\mathbb{A}^1 \backslash 0) \times S))$$

$$\xrightarrow{(\tilde{f}_X' \circ i_{\mathcal{Y}_0}) c(\Phi_{\mathcal{Y}_0} \mathbb{Z}_{\mathcal{Y}^o}^{Hdg})}} \phi_0 E_{Hdg}(\mathcal{Y}^o/((\mathbb{A}^1 \backslash 0) \times S)) \xrightarrow{(\tilde{f}_X' \circ i_{\mathcal{Y}_0})_* c(\mathbb{Z}_{\mathcal{Y}_0}^{Hdg})} E_{Hdg}(\mathcal{Y}_0/S)[1]$$

and definition-proposition 1 applied to $\tilde{f}_X: \mathcal{Y} \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{Q}} \times S$ gives the distinguish in $D(MHM_{\mathbb{Q},gm}(S))$,

and $Sp_{\mathcal{E}/\tilde{f}_X} \circ \epsilon^* = Sp_{\mathcal{Y}_0/\tilde{f}_X'}$. Let $p \in \mathbb{Z}$. By the hard Lefchetz theorem on $H^*(E_0)$, we may assume that $2p \leq d$. Taking the cohomology to this distinguish triangle, we get in particular, for each $p \in \mathbb{Z}$, the maps in $MHM_{\mathbb{Q},qm}(S)$

- $Sp_{\mathcal{E}/\tilde{f}_{\mathcal{X}}}: E^{2p}_{Hdg}(\mathcal{E}/S) \to H^{2p}\psi_0 E_{Hdg}(\mathcal{Y}^o/((\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{O}} \setminus 0) \times S)).$

The map $Sp_{\mathcal{Y}_0/\tilde{f}_X}$ is injective by definition-proposition 1(i)' and the weak Lefchetz theorem since for $t' \in S(\mathbb{C})$ and $s \in \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \setminus 0$, $\mathcal{Y}_{(s,t')}$ and $\mathcal{Y}_{0,t'}$ are projective hypersurfaces. For $\lambda \in H^{2p}(\mathcal{E}^{an}_{0,\mathbb{C},t'},\mathbb{Q})$, $t' \in S(\mathbb{C})$, we consider $\pi_S : \tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}} \to S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}$ the universal covering in $AnSm(\mathbb{C})$ and

the flat leaf induced by the universal covering (see section 2.1) and

which is an algebraic variety by [6]. Note that $\mathbb{V}^p_S(\lambda) \subset HL^{p,2p}(\mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is the union of the irreducible components passing through λ . Similarly, for $\eta \in H^{2p}(\mathcal{E}^{an}_{\mathbb{C},t'},\mathbb{Q})$, $t' \in S(\mathbb{C})$, we consider $\pi_S : \tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}} \to S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}$ the universal covering in $\mathrm{AnSm}(\mathbb{C})$ and

extend to a filtered vector bundle

such that

$$\alpha \in H^{2p}(\mathcal{Y}^{an}_{(s,t')},\mathbb{Q}) = \mathbb{H}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}^{an}_{t'},\psi_0 R \tilde{f}_{X*} \mathbb{Q}_{\mathcal{Y}^o}), (s,t') \in (\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \backslash 0) \times S_{\mathbb{C}}$$

we consider

• $\pi_{S,G_m} = \pi_S \times \pi_{G_m} : \tilde{G}_m \times \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an} \to (\mathbb{A}_{\mathbb{C}}^1 \setminus 0) \times S_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}$ the universal covering in AnSm(\mathbb{C}) and

$$\mathbb{V}_{(\mathbb{A}^1\backslash 0)\times S}(\alpha) := \pi_{S,G_m}(\alpha\times \tilde{G}_m\times \tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}) \subset E^{2p,an}_{DR}(\mathcal{Y}^o_{\mathbb{C}}/(\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}}\backslash 0)\times S_{\mathbb{C}})$$

the flat leaf (see section 2.1) and

$$\mathbb{V}_{S}^{p}(\alpha) := \mathbb{V}_{S}(\alpha) \cap F^{p}H^{2p}\psi_{0}E_{DR}(\mathcal{Y}_{\mathbb{C}}^{o}/((\mathbb{A}_{\mathbb{C}}^{1}\backslash 0)\times S_{\mathbb{C}}))^{an} \subset H^{2p}\psi_{0}E_{DR}(\mathcal{Y}_{\mathbb{C}}^{o}/((\mathbb{A}_{\mathbb{C}}^{1}\backslash 0)\times S_{\mathbb{C}}))^{an}.$$

Consider the exact sequence of variation of mixed Hodge structure over S

where $HL^{2p,p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$, $HL^{2p,p}(\mathcal{E}_{i,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{i,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ are the locus of Hodge classes. Let $\lambda \in F^pH^{2p}(E_0^{an},\mathbb{Q})$, where we recall $E_0 = \mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C},t}$. Consider then

- $\tilde{\lambda} \in H^{2p}(E^{an}, \mathbb{Q})$, such that $q(\tilde{\lambda}) = \lambda$, and $\tilde{\lambda} := Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}) \in Sp_{E/f_X}(H^{2p}(E^{an}, \mathbb{Q}))$,
- $\tilde{\lambda}_F \in F^p H^{2p}(E^{an}, \mathbb{C})$, such that $q(\tilde{\lambda}_F) = \lambda$,
- $e_{\lambda} := \tilde{\lambda} \tilde{\lambda}_F \in W_{2p-2}H^{2p}(E^{an}, \mathbb{C}), \ e_{\lambda} \in \Gamma(\tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, \pi^{*mod}E^{2p,an}_{DR}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}))^{\nabla}$ the corresponding section where $\pi_S : \tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}} \to S^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}$ is the universal covering, and

$$\bar{e_{\lambda}} := [e_{\lambda}] \in \Gamma(\tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}, \pi^{*mod} E_{DR}^{2p,an} (\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})/F^p \oplus \mathbb{Q})^{\nabla}.$$

The locus of Hodge classes passing through λ is then an union of two components

where

- $\mathbb{V}_{V(\bar{e_{\lambda}})}(\lambda) = \pi_S(\lambda \times V(\bar{e_{\lambda}})) \subset E_{DR}^{2p,an}(\mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is the flat leaf, where $\pi_S : H^{2p}(E^{an},\mathbb{C}) \times \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an} \to E_{DR}^{2p,an}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is the morphism induced by the universal covering $\pi_S : \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an} \to S_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}$,
- $V(\bar{e_{\lambda}}) := \pi_S(V(\bar{e_{\lambda}})) \subset S_{\mathbb{C}}$, where $V(\bar{e_{\lambda}}) \subset \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}$ is the zero locus of $\bar{e_{\lambda}}$,
- $q := q \otimes \mathbb{C} : E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}}) \to E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{0,\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is the quotient map.

Indeed, let $\lambda_{t'} \in \mathbb{V}_S(\lambda)$, $t' \in \tilde{S}_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}$. If $\lambda_{t'} \in \mathbb{V}_S^p(\lambda)$, then $\iota(e(\lambda_{t'})) = 0$. If $\lambda_{t'} \in \mathbb{V}_S^p(\lambda) \setminus q(\mathbb{V}_S^p(\tilde{\lambda}))$, then

Hence $\lambda_{t'} \in \mathbb{V}_{S}^{p}(\lambda) \backslash q(\mathbb{V}_{S}^{p}(\tilde{\lambda}))$

$$[e_{\lambda}(t')] = \iota(e(\lambda_{t'})) = 0 \in H^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{\pi(t')}, \mathbb{C})/(F^p \oplus \mathbb{Q}).$$

Now,

• if $Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}) = 0$, since $Sp_{\mathcal{E}/\tilde{f}_X} \circ \epsilon^* = Sp_{\mathcal{Y}_0/\tilde{f}_X'}$ and $Sp_{\mathcal{Y}_0/\tilde{f}_X'}$ is injective, we have $\tilde{\lambda}_{t'} = k_{t*}\tilde{\lambda}_{t'}$ with $\tilde{\lambda}_{t'} \in F^pH^{2p}_{\mathcal{F}_{C,t'}}(\mathcal{E}^{an}_{\mathbb{C},t'},\mathbb{Q})$, where $k: \mathcal{F} \to \mathcal{E}$ is the exceptional locus of $\epsilon: \mathcal{E}_0 \to \mathcal{Y}_0$ (note that $\epsilon^*: H^{2p}(\mathcal{Y}^{an}_{0,t'},\mathbb{Q}) \to H^{2p}(\mathcal{E}^{an}_{0,t'},\mathbb{Q})$ is injective by Poincare Lefchetz duality), hence, assuming the Hodge conjecture for smooth projective varieties of dimension less or equal to d-1, $\mathbb{V}^p_S(\tilde{\lambda}) \subset E^{2p}_{DR}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is defined over \mathbb{Q} and its Galois conjugates are also components of the locus of Hodge classes, if $Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}) \neq 0$, we have,

where $p: E^{2p}_{DR,V_0}(\mathcal{Y}_{\mathbb{C}}/(\mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \times S_{\mathbb{C}})) \to \mathbb{A}^1_{\mathbb{C}} \times S_{\mathbb{C}}$ is the projection (the first equality is obvious since $Sp_{\mathcal{E}/\tilde{f}_X}$ is a morphism of variation of mixed Hodge structures over S, whereas for the second equality the inclusion \supset follows from [6] lemma 2.11 which state the invariance of $\tilde{\lambda}$ under the monodromy

but by [5] theorem 1, the Hodge conjecture holds for projective hypersurfaces hence

is defined over $\bar{\mathbb{Q}}$ and its Galois conjugates are also components of the locus of Hodge classes, hence $\mathbb{V}^p_S(\tilde{\lambda}) \subset E^{2p}_{DR}(\mathcal{E}_{\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is defined over $\bar{\mathbb{Q}}$ and its Galois conjugates are also components of the locus of Hodge classes,

• if $Sp_{E/f_X}(e_{\lambda}) = 0$, $Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}) = Sp_{E/f_X}(\tilde{\lambda}_F)$ and for $t' \in \tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}$, $\bar{e_{\lambda}}(t') = 0$ if and only if $e(\tilde{\lambda}_{t'}) = 0$ if and only if $Sp_{\mathcal{E}_{t'}/(\tilde{f_X})_{t'}}(\tilde{\lambda}_{t'})$ is a Hodge class, if $Sp_{E/f_X}(e_{\lambda}) \neq 0$, consider

we may assume that X is not defined over $\overline{\mathbb{Q}}$ (overwise Y_0 is defined over $\overline{\mathbb{Q}}$ and S is a finite $\underline{\text{set}}$, we may also assume that X is not rationnal i.e. $l_X = deg(\mathbb{Q}(X)/\mathbb{Q}(x_1, \dots, x_d)) > 1$, then $\overline{((\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) \times S)_{\mathbb{C}}} = \mathbb{P}(l_X)$ where $\mathbb{P}(l_X)$ is the space of hypersurface over degree l_X , consider then a Lefchetz pencil $L \subset \overline{((\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) \times S)_{\mathbb{C}}} = \mathbb{P}(l_X)$ and denote $L^o := L \cap (\mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0) \times S)_{\mathbb{C}}$, we have the factorization $\pi_L : \tilde{L}^o \xrightarrow{i_L} \pi_{S,G_m}^{-1}(L) \xrightarrow{\pi_{S,G_m}} L$ of the universal covering of L^o and consider

$$\widehat{Sp_{E/f_X}(e_\lambda)_{|\tilde{L}^o}} \in \Gamma(L^o, E_{DR}^{2p}(\tilde{Y}'_{L^o}/L^o)), \ u \in \tilde{L}^o \mapsto \widehat{Sp_{E/f_X}(e_\lambda)}(u) := e^{2i\pi Nu} Sp_{E/f_X}(e_\lambda)(u),$$

for $u \in \tilde{L}^o$, if $Sp_{E/f_X}(e_\lambda)(u) = 0 \in H^{2p}(\mathcal{Y}_u, \mathbb{C})/(F^p \oplus \mathbb{Q})$ then $\widehat{Sp_{E/f_X}(e_\lambda)}_{|\tilde{L}^o}(u) = 0 \in H^{2p}(\mathcal{Y}_u, \mathbb{C})/(F^{p+1} \oplus \mathbb{Q})$, consider

$$[\widehat{Sp_{E/f_X}(e_\lambda)}_{|\tilde{L}^o}] \in \Gamma(L^o, E_{DR}^{2p}(\tilde{Y}'_{L^o}/L^o)/F^{p+1} \oplus Q),$$

since $H^{2p+1}(\mathcal{Y}'_L,\mathbb{Q})_{pr}=0$ as $\mathcal{Y}'_L=\mathbb{P}^{\tilde{N}}_{B(L)}$ is the blow up of \mathbb{P}^N in the base locus of L, we get $H^1(L^o,R^{2p}(\tilde{f}_X)_{|L*}\mathbb{Q})=0$, hence

$$[Sp_{E/f_X}(e_{\lambda})_{|\tilde{L}^o}] \in H^{2p}(\mathcal{Y}'_L, \mathbb{C})/(F^{p+1} \oplus \mathbb{Q})$$

is a constant which is non zero by the irreducibility of the monodromy representation, hence $V([Sp_{E/f_X}(e_{\lambda})]) \cap i_L(\tilde{L}^o) = \emptyset$, hence $V(\bar{e_{\lambda}}) = \emptyset$ since $\tilde{G}_m \times \tilde{S}^{an}_{\mathbb{C}} = \bigcup_{L \subset \mathbb{P}(l_X)} i_L(\tilde{L}^o)$.

Hence $\mathbb{V}_{S}^{p}(\lambda) \subset E_{DR}^{2p}(\mathcal{E}_{0\mathbb{C}}/S_{\mathbb{C}})$ is defined over $\bar{\mathbb{Q}}$ and its Galois conjugates are also components of the locus of Hodge classes. Thus, by [4] theorem 4,

$$\lambda = [Z] \in H^{2p}(E_0^{an}, \mathbb{Q}), \text{ with } Z \in \mathcal{Z}^p(E_0).$$

Since $p \in \mathbb{Z}$ and $\lambda \in F^pH^{2p}(E_0^{an},\mathbb{Q})$ are arbitrary, the Hodge conjecture holds for E_0 . Proposition 1(ii) and the fact that the Hodge conjecture is true for smooth projective varieties of dimension less or equal to d-1 by induction hypothesis then implies that Hodge conjecture holds for X, since X is birational to E_0 and $X, E_0 \in \mathrm{PSmVar}(\mathbb{C})$ are connected of dimension d.

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
