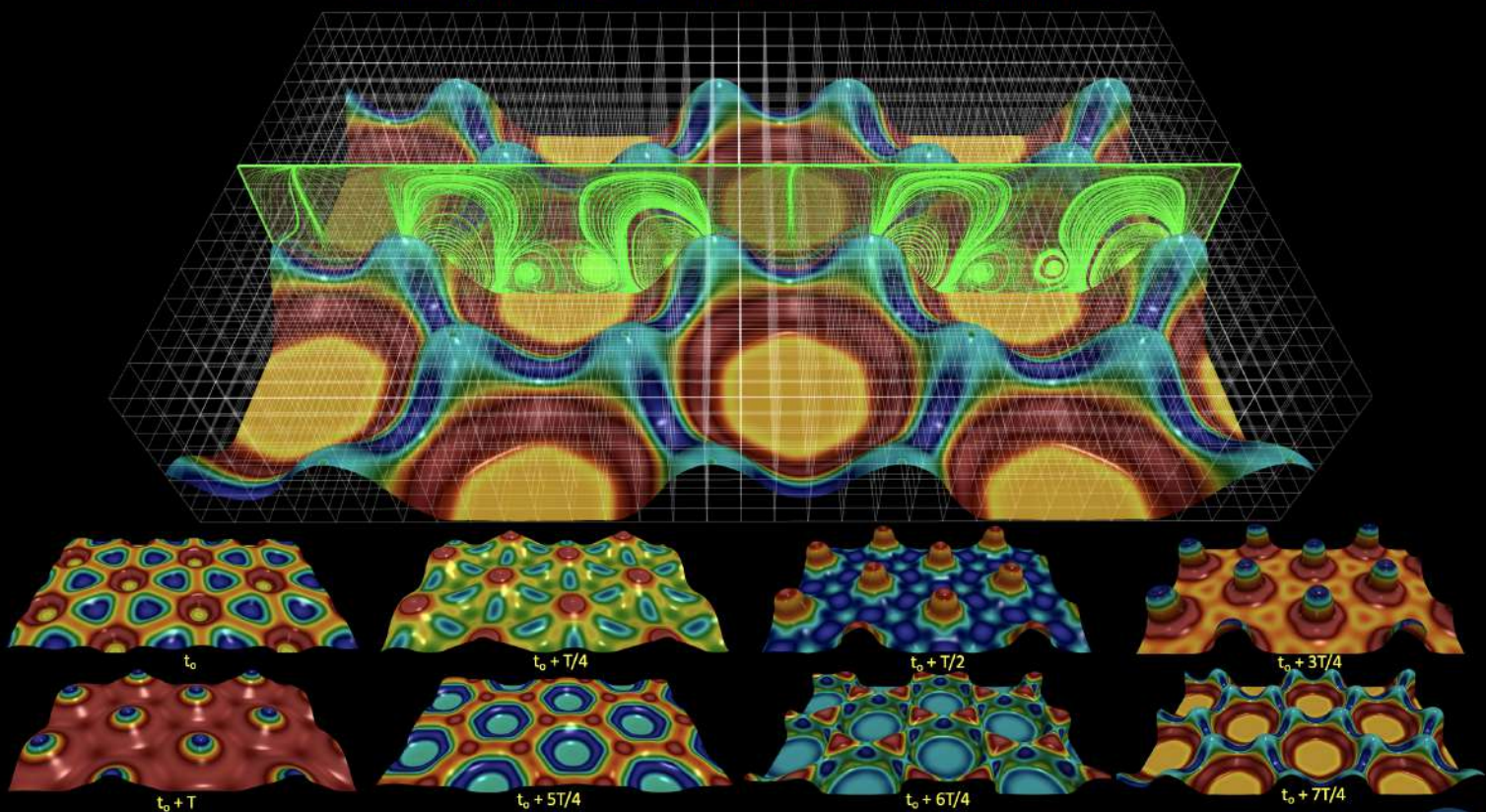

Three-dimensional Faraday waves in double minimum hexagonal domain

Parallel Direct Numerical Simulation of three-dimensional dynamical patterns of Faraday waves in a double minimum hexagonal domain. Forcing frequency 12 Hz and amplitude 3.875 g, height ratio 5.25, density ratio 0.7, kinematic viscosity ratio 4 and surface tension 0.035 N/m. The entire domain is decomposed into 4096 subdomains (32 x 16 x 8). 32 x 32 x 32 is the local resolution per subdomain. 1024 x 512 x 256 is the global resolution. This work was performed using high-performance computing resources provided by the Institut du Développement et des ressources en Informatique Scientifique (IDRIS) of the CNRS.
