## Introduction

Polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) are synthetic molecules widely used in various industrial sectors in France during the 20th century. These persistent organic pollutants (POPs), are now present in the human diet and bioaccumulate in fatty tissues of living organisms. Their toxicity for humans and environment is well known.

### Current sample preparation methods for PCBs analysis in meat (e.g. Soxhlet, microwave-assisted extraction, ASE) are often long and tedious.

# Sentinel project strategy

Objective: To strengthen the current food chemical safety monitoring system by developing high-throughput, sensitive and cost-effective screening tools for PCBs surveillance in meat

1/ Increase the efficiency of regulatory inspections by health authorities 2/ Facilitate industrial self-control tools 3/ Monitor chemical contaminants at sub-

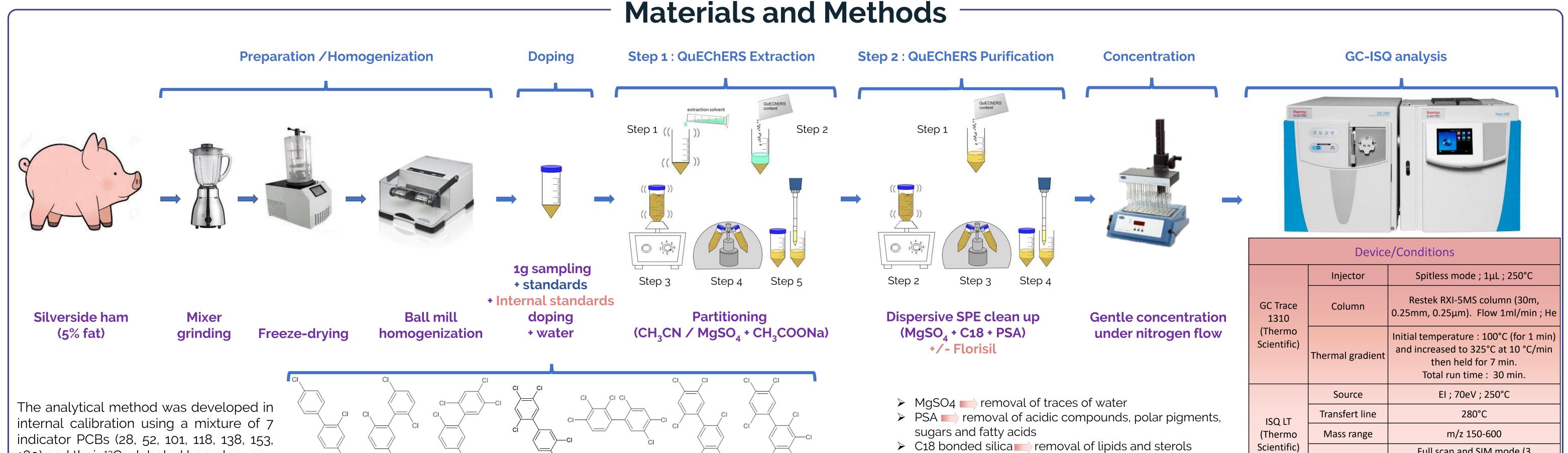

The objective of this work, carried out in the frame of the SENTINEL ANR program (ANR-19-CE21-0011), was to develop a simple and fast method using QuEChERs to overcome traditional PCBs extraction methods from meat, allowing to improve the GC/MS analysis throughput and to reduce solvent consumption.

# Conclusion

- > Main QuEChERS parameters (solvents, salt concentrations, contact time, temperature...) have been tested for the extraction step. Several conditions have also been tested for the purification part using dSPE and dSPE + Florisil. Alternative tests are currently conducted using LLE (Hexane, AcOEt) for extraction or using SPE for purification, in order to reduce interfering materials and improve the performance of the analytical method.
- > Once validated this method will be transposed to high resolution mass spectrometric detection enabling to strengthen the current food chemical safety monitoring system with the aim to use this method for PCBs determination at sub-regulatory levels by further gaining both detection selectivity and sensitivity.
