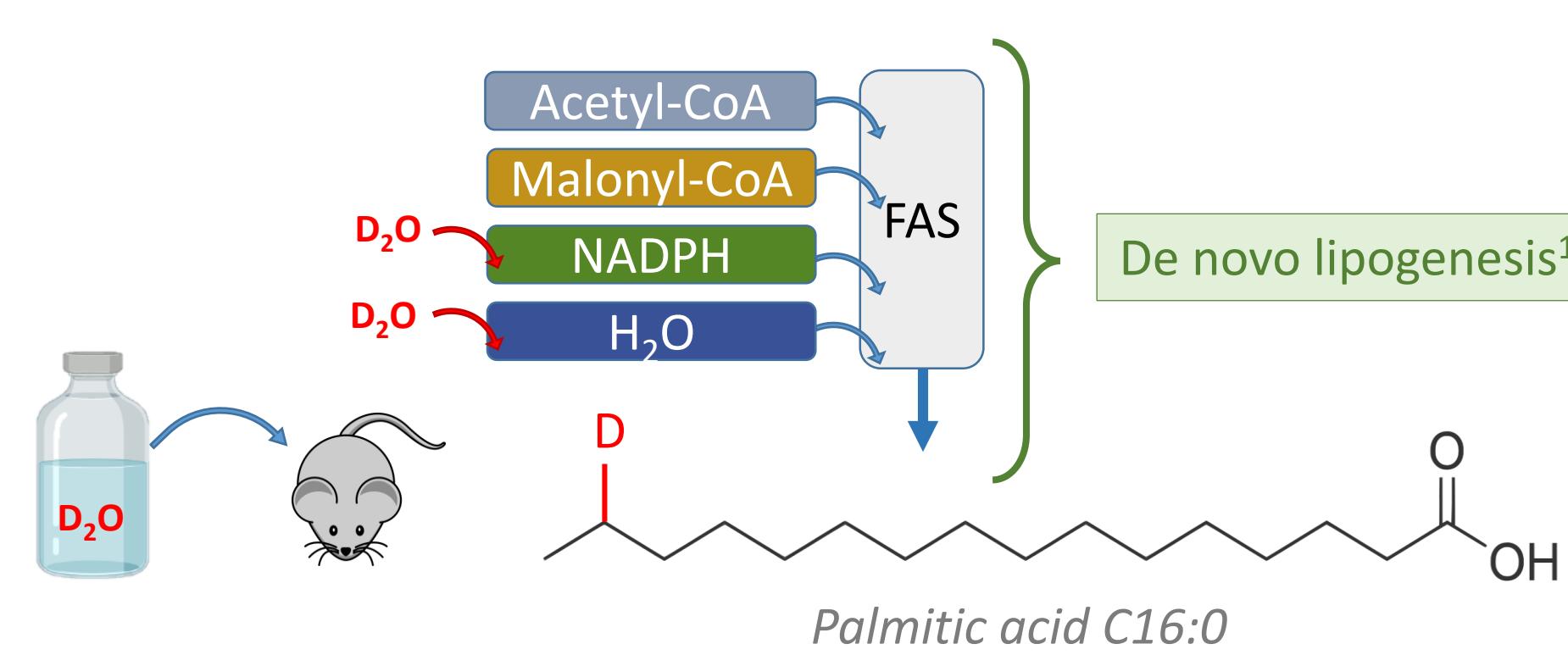

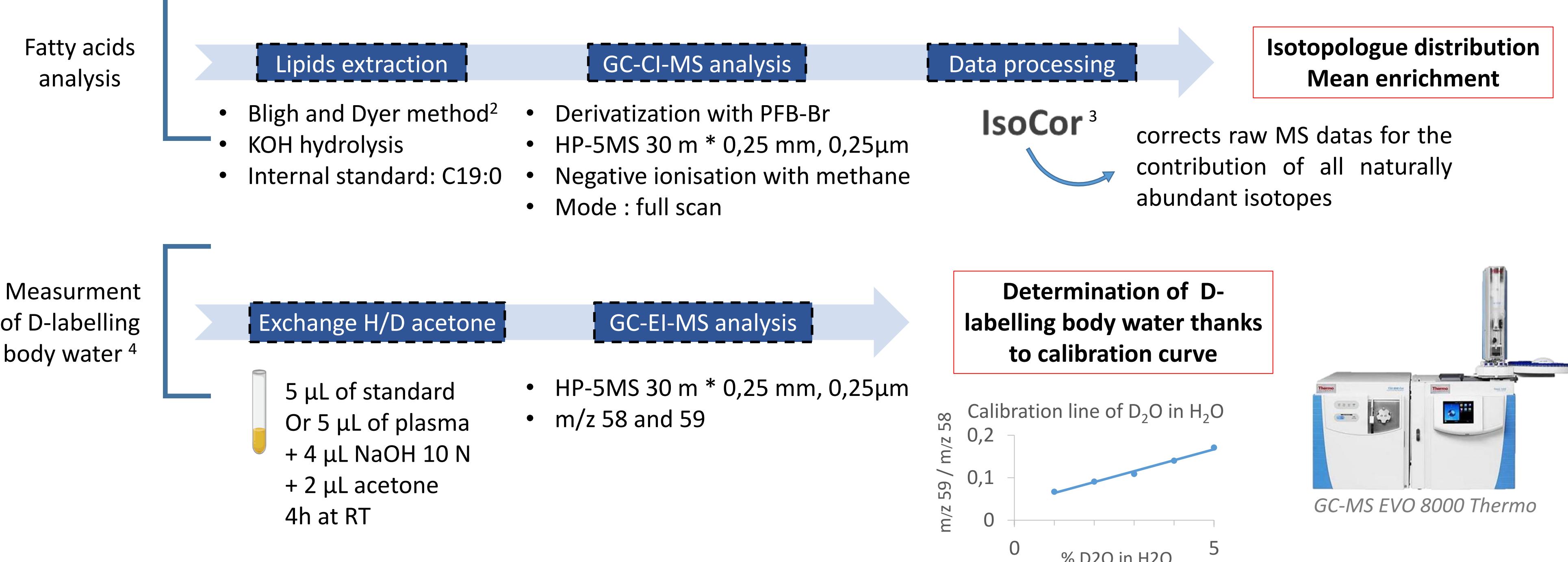

## Context

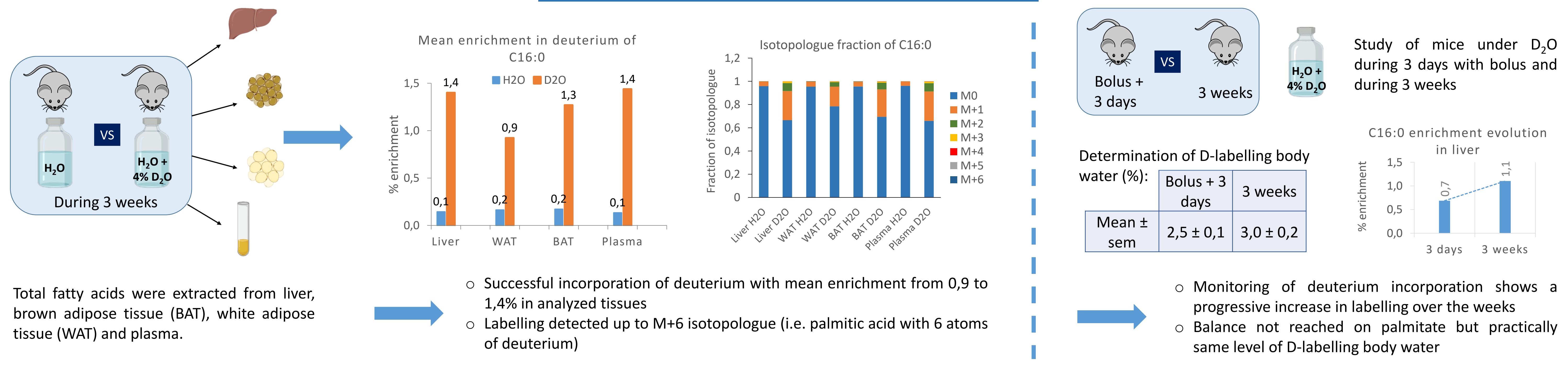
- *De novo* lipogenesis (DNL) = *de novo* synthesis of fatty acids, can be altered in a large number of human diseases such as obesity, diabetes but also cancer.
- Quantification of DNL = understand and characterize the mechanisms involved in these pathologies.
- Several non-invasive methods using deuterated water ( $D_2O$ ) to determine lipogenic flux: bolus of  $D_2O$ , prolonged administration.



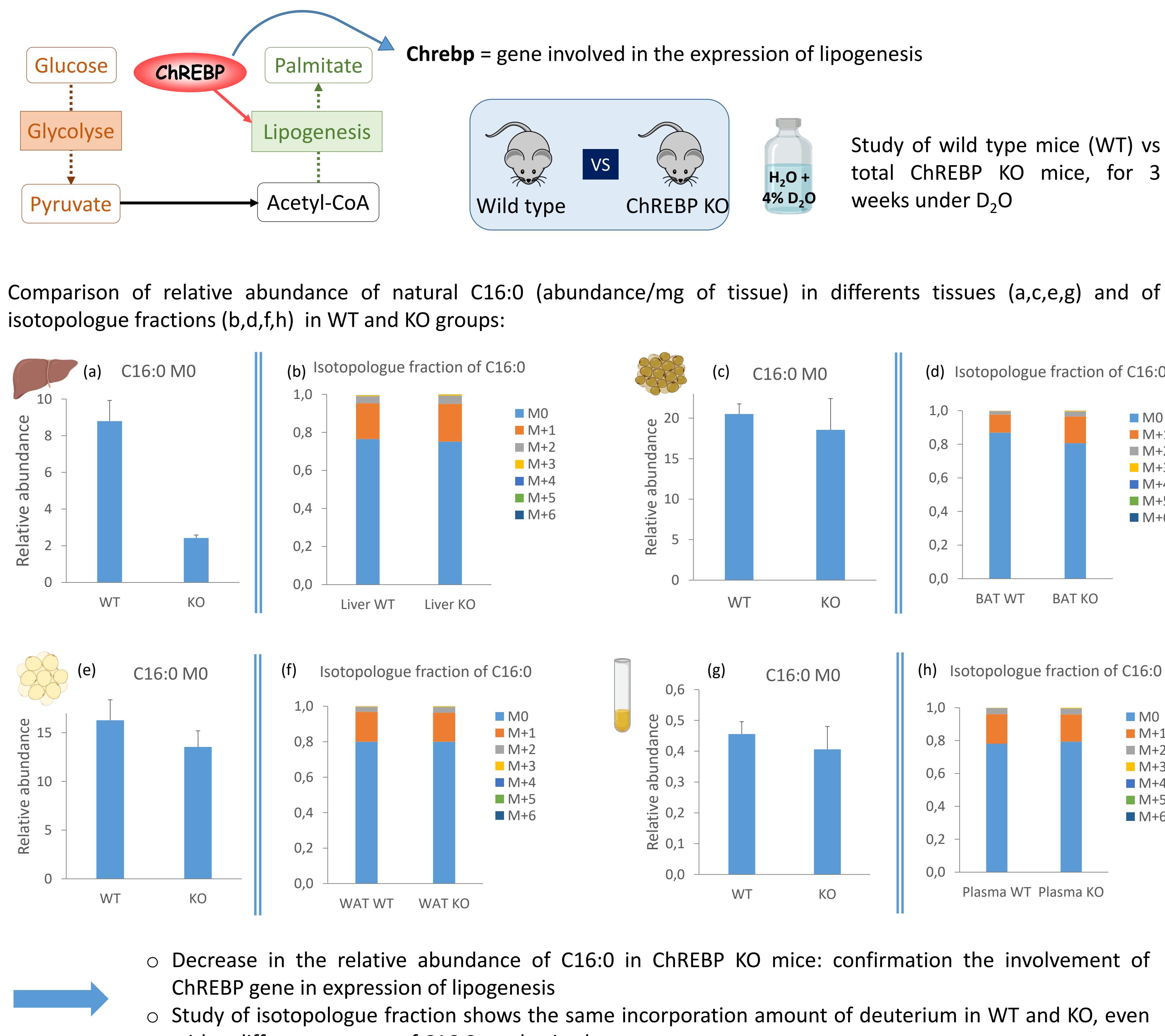

## Confirmation of deuterium incorporation



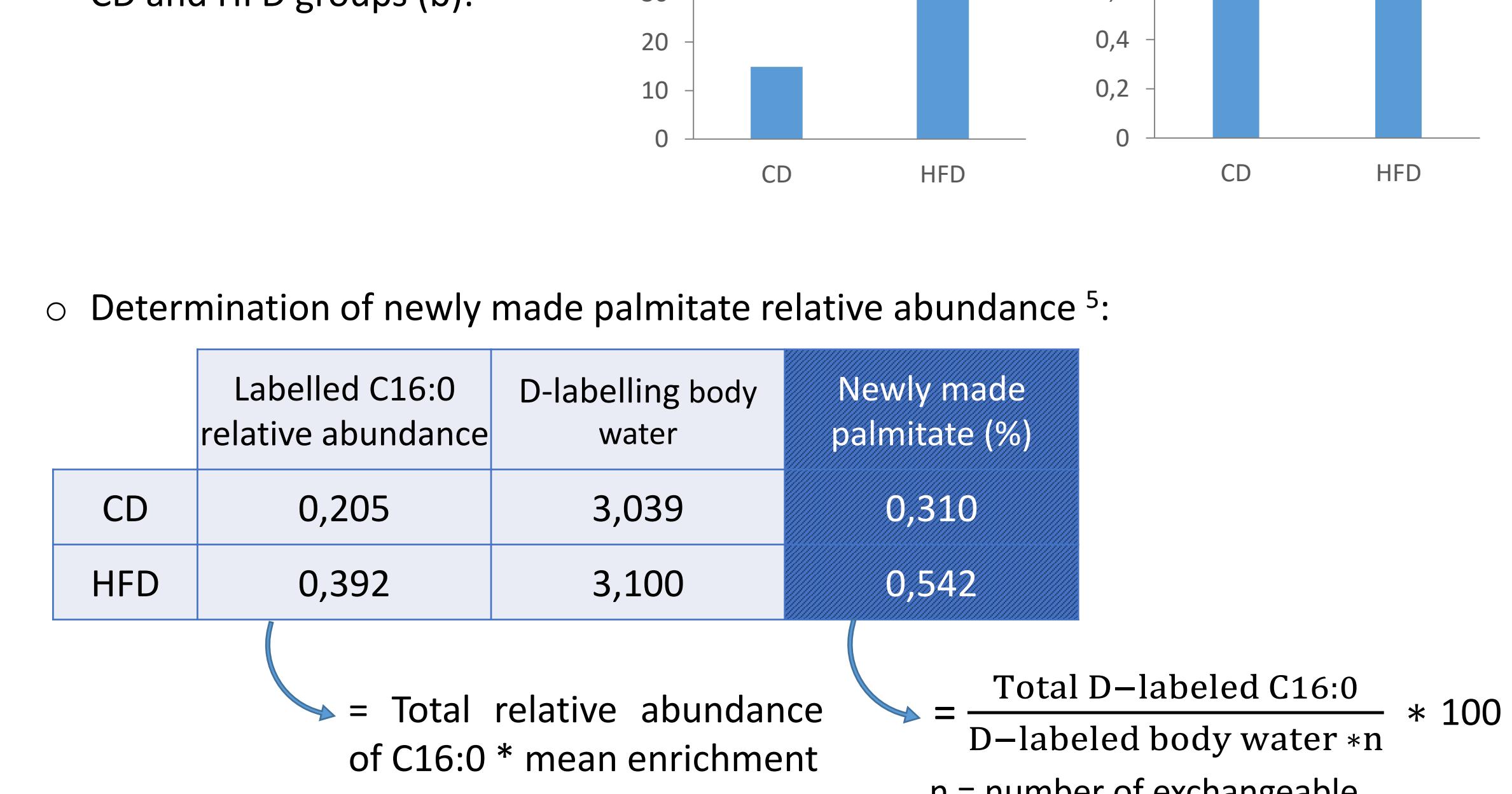
## Application to mice with a lipogenesis defect



## Application to a physiopathological model of obesity

Study of mice fed with chow diet (CD) vs high fat diet (HFD), study during 3 weeks under 4% D2O

- Comparison of relative abundance of natural C16:0 in liver (a) and deuterium enrichment in CD and HFD groups (b):



- Determination of newly made palmitate relative abundance<sup>5</sup>:

$$\text{Newly made palmitate} (\%) = \frac{\text{Total relative abundance of C16:0} * \text{mean enrichment}}{\text{Total D-labeled C16:0} / \text{D-labeled body water} * n}$$

n = number of exchangeable hydrogens, which is assumed to be 22

$$= \text{Total relative abundance of C16:0} * \text{mean enrichment}$$

$$= \text{Total D-labeled C16:0} / \text{D-labeled body water} * n$$

$$n = \text{number of exchangeable hydrogens, which is assumed to be 22}$$

- In high fat diet conditions, relative abundance of C16:0 is increased as expected
- Results confirm by the determination of newly made palmitate: more palmitate synthesized in HFD mice

## Conclusion and perspectives

- Implementation of a workflow that allows the incorporation of deuterium during the synthesis of palmitate
- First results show an mean enrichment around 1% under 3 weeks in various tissues and mice models
- To deepen the model, it will be interesting to study the mean enrichment during a bolus of  $D_2O$  to see on the very short term conditions, as well as on 6 weeks, to determine the time necessary to reach the equilibrium.
