Hydrogenation of carboxylic esters catalyzed by manganese catalysts supported by bidentate NHCphosphine ligands

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1. General information:

All manipulations were carried out using Schlenk techniques under an atmosphere of dry argon or in an argon-filled glovebox (MBraun Unilabplus Eco. Dry and oxygen-free organic solvents (THF, Et₂O, CH₂Cl₂, toluene, pentane) were obtained using LabSolv (Innovative Technology) solvent purification system. Organic solvents used for column chromatography and water were degassed by argon bubbling during 15 min. Deuterated toluene, THF, and CD₂Cl₂ for NMR experiments were degassed prior to use and 2Me-THF for catalytic experiments was distilled and kept over 4Å molecular sieves. Liquid esters and CDCl₃ were passed through a short column of basic alumina, deoxygenated by three freeze-pump-thaw cycles. Column chromatography purification of organic substrates was performed on Organics Ultrapure silica gel (size 40-63 μm), KHBEt₃ was purchased from Aldrich and used as received. *N*-mesitylimidazole,¹ *N*-isopropylimidazole,² imidazo[1,5-a]pyridine,³ 1-(2-chloroethyl)-3chloride,⁴ (2,4,6-trimethylphenyl)-1*H*-imidazolium 1,3-bis(2,4,6-trimethylphenyl)-1Hchloride,⁵ imidazolium 1-[2-(diphenylphosphino)ethyl]-3-(2,4,6-trimethylphenyl)-1Himidazolium chloride L2.HCl,⁴ 1-[2-(diphenylphosphino)ethyl]-3-methyl-1H-imidazolium hexafluorophosphate L3.HPF₆,⁶ 1-[2-(diphenylphosphino)ethyl]-3-isopropyl-1H-imidazolium hexafluorophosphate L4.HPF₆,⁶ [Me₂N(CH₂)₂IMes]PF₆ L7.HPF₆,⁷ complex 7⁷ and complex 1⁸ were prepared according to known methods. All other reagent grade chemicals purchased from commercial sources were used as received. IR spectra in solution were recorded in 0.1 mm CaF₂ cells using a Perkin Elmer Frontier FT-IR spectrometer and given in cm⁻¹. ¹H, ¹³C, ¹⁹F and ³¹P NMR spectra were recorded on Bruker Avance 300, Bruker Avance 400, and Avance III HD 400, and referenced against the residual signals of deuterated solvents (¹H and ¹³C), BF₃.OEt₂ (¹⁹F, external standard) and 85% H₃PO₄ (³¹P, external standard), respectively. When necessary, signal attribution in ¹³C spectra was based on decoupled ¹³C{³¹P, ¹H} and 2D ¹³C-¹H HMQC/HMBC experiments. High-resolution mass spectra (ESI positive mode) were obtained using a Xevo G2 QTof (Waters) spectrometer. Elemental analyses were carried out at the LCC-CNRS (Toulouse) using a Perkin Elmer 2400 series II analyzer. Non-stirred 'Autoclave Maxitech' autoclaves (50 mL) were used for the hydrogenation reactions. For mechanistic studies, Wilmad[®] quick pressure valve NMR tube 5mm diameter with thin wall were used.

Table S3: Optimisation of reaction parameters for complex 2-catalysed hydrogenation of methyl benzoate in 2-Me-THF.

[a] Experimental procedure: An autoclave was loaded with an ester solution (1 mmol) in 2-Me-THF (1 mL) and a solution of **2** (0.5 mol%) which was prepared in 0.5 mL of 2-Me-THF and activated with a borohydride solution (1M in THF for LiHBEt₃ and KHBEt₃, 1M in toluene for NaHBEt₃) for 30 min in that order, then the autoclave was immediately pressurised with hydrogen and kept under stirring for 24 h at 100 °C.

3. Synthesis of ligands:

Synthesis of [Ph₂P(CH₂)₂Im-Mes]OTs (L2.HOTs)

1-[2-(diphenylphosphino)ethyl]-3-(2,4,6-trimethylphenyl)-1*H*-Imidazolium chloride (**L2.HCl**) (934 mg, 2.15 mmol) was dissolved in dichloromethane (20 mL), and then, sodium *p*-toluenesulfonate (625 mg, 3.22 mmol, 1.5 equiv.) was added. The mixture was stirred at room temperature for 3 h and filtered through celite. After concentration under vacuum (c.a. 5 mL), the product was precipitated by addition of diethyl ether (20 mL). The solid was washed with diethyl ether (3 × 20 mL). The resulting product was dried under vacuum to afford **L2.HOTs** as a white powder (1.20 g, 98%).

Synthesis of [PCy₂P(CH₂)₂IMes]Cl (L5.HCl)



To a solution of LiPCy₂ (0.70 mmol in THF (5 mL) was added a solution of 1-(2-chloroethyl)-3-(2,4,6-trimethylphenyl)-1*H*-imidazolium chloride (200 mg, 0.70 mmol) in THF (10 mL) at -78 °C via cannula. The mixture was then stirred at r.t. for 18 h. The solvent was removed under vacuum. Degassed methanol (2 mL) was added and the mixture was stirred for 10 min. The methanol was then removed under vacuum and the residue was crystallized in THF / Et₂O and washed two times with Et₂O to give **L5.HCl** as a white solid (273 mg, 87%). (LiPCy₂ was obtained by deprotonation of HPCy₂ (142 μ L, 0.70 mmol) with 2 equivalents of n-BuLi (2.5 M solution in hexane, 560 μ L, 1.4 mmol) in THF (5 mL) at -78 °C for 30 min).

Synthesis of [PCy₂P(CH₂)₂IMes]OTs (L5.HOTs)

Compound L5.HOTs was prepared following the same method as for the synthesis of L2.HOTs. Starting from compound L5.HCI (500 mg, 1.12 mmol) and NaOTs (325 mg, 1.67 mmol, 1.50 eq), the compound L5.HOTs was obtained as an orange solid (632 mg, 97%) and used without purification in the next step.

Synthesis of [Cl(CH₂)₂IPy]Cl (L6(Cl).HCl)



Imidazo[1,5-a]pyridine (1.50 g, 12.7 mmol) was dissolved in an excess of 1,2-dichloroethane (20 mL, 254.0 mmol, 20 equiv) and the solution was stirred under reflux for two days. 1,2-dichloroethane was then removed under vacuum. The residue was redissolved in dichloromethane. A viscous oil was obtained upon addition of Et₂O. The residue was triturated three times with Et₂O (3 x 15 mL) to afford **L6(Cl).HCl** as a black viscous liquid (2.20 g, 80%).

Synthesis of [Ph₂P(CH₂)₂IPy]Cl (L6.HCl)



2-(2-(Diphenylphosphino)ethyl)-imidazo[1,5-a]pyridinium chloride was synthesized by a method analogous to that for 1-[2-(diphenylphosphino)ethyl]-3-(2,4,6-trimethylphenyl)-1Himidazolium chloride starting from 2-(2-chloroethyl)-imidazo[1,5-a]pyridinium chloride (450 mg, 2.07 mmol). Compound **L6.HCI** was obtained as a dark orange solid (628 mg, 82%).

Synthesis of [Ph₂P(CH₂)₂IPy]OTs (L6.HOTs)



This ligand was prepared starting from **L6.HCI** (265 mg, 0.72 mmol) by following a method to that for the synthesis of **L2.HOTs**. Compound **L6.HOTs** was obtained as an orange solid (354 mg, 97%).

Synthesis of [PyCH₂IMes]PF₆ (L8.HPF₆)



[PyCH₂IMes]PF₆ was synthesized by a method analogous to that for [Me₂N(CH₂)₂IMes]PF₆ **L7.HPF**₆. Mesityl imidazole (500 mg, 2.68 mmol) was added to suspension 2-(chloromethyl)pyridine hydrochloride (2,68 mmol) in 5 ml acetonitrile. The mixture was heated at 90 °C for 30 h. Upon cooling the solvent was removed under vacuum, the oily residue was redissolved in water (10 mL) and neutralized with saturated aqueous sodium carbonate solution till pH = 9. The aqueous solution was then extracted with ethyl acetate (2 x 15 mL) to remove unreacted organic materials. At this point imidazolium salt remains in aqueous phase. The aqueous phase was vigorously stirred with KPF₆ (1.5 equiv.) and extracted with dichloromethane (3 x 20 mL). The organic phase was dried over sodium sulfate, evaporated to dryness to produce **L8.HPF**₆ as a brown oil. **(**680 mg, 60%). The spectroscopic data are in agreement with the one reported in the literature.⁹

4. Synthesis of complexes

General procedure A

To a stirred suspension of the precursor salt **LX.HX** in toluene or THF, a solution of KHMDS (1.1 eq, 0.5 M in toluene) was added at r.t. and then the resulting yellow suspension was sonicated during 5 min and stirred for additional 15 min. [Mn(CO)₅Br] (1 eq.) was added in one portion as a solid inducing a vigorous CO evolution. The resulting orange solution was stirred for 3 h at 60 °C and monitored by IR. After cooling the reaction mixture to r.t., filtration through Celite and evaporation of the solvent under vacuum, the crude product was crystallized in toluene or in a THF /pentane or in a THF / hexane mixture to afford the corresponding complex **CX** as a yellow powder.

Synthesis of [(MnBr(CO)₃(Ph₂P(CH₂)₂-Im-Mes)] (2)



According to general procedure **A**, **L2.HOTs** (500 mg, 0.88 mmol) in toluene (40 mL) afforded complex **2** (490 mg, 90%) as a yellow powder. The crude reaction mixture was purified by column chromatography on basic alumina (eluent: toluene / THF : 2/1 then THF). Single crystals suitable for X-ray diffraction analysis were obtained by slow vapor diffusion of pentane into the solution of complex **2** in THF at r.t.

5. Catalytic hydrogenation of esters catalyzed by complex **2** and characterization of the resulting alcohols.

General procedure B for the hydrogenation reactions

Complex **2** (3.1 mg, 0.005 mmol, 0.5 mol%) was dissolved in 2-Me-THF (0.5 mL) and activated with KHBEt₃ (0.1 mL, 1.0 M in THF, 0.1 mmol, 10 mol%) for 0.5 h. This solution was added to an autoclave previously charged under argon with a solution of ester (1 mmol) in 2-Me-THF (1 mL). Then the autoclave was immediately pressurized with hydrogen (50 bar) and kept under stirring in an oil bath at 100 °C for 24 hours. Once the reactor has cooled down and the hydrogen pressure has been released, the reaction mixture was diluted with ethyl acetate or CH_2Cl_2 (2.0 mL) and filtered through a small pad of silica (2 cm in a Pasteur pipette). The Pasteur pipette was then flushed with an additional volume of ethyl acetate or CH_2Cl_2 . The filtrate was evaporated under vacuum and the crude product was purified by column chromatography on silica (size 60-43 μ m) using pentane/ethyl acetate mixtures as eluent to afford the corresponding alcohols. (Note: for specific conditions, see the main article Scheme 2.)

Study of the reactivity of complex 12

Stability under H_2 of **12** generated in situ in an NMR tube

In an argon-filled glovebox, a solution of complex **2** (12.3 mg, 0.02 mmol) in THF- d_8 (0.5 mL) was filtered through a small pad of celite (2 cm in a Pasteur pipette) and transferred to a Wildmad NMR pressure tube. KHMDS (11.9 mg, 0.06 mmol) was added to the NMR tube, and the ³¹P{¹H} NMR spectrum (Figure S8) was recorded after 15 min at room temperature, showing full conversion to **12**. The NMR tube was pressurized with 4 bars of hydrogen and the reaction was monitored at room temperature by ³¹P{¹H} NMR spectroscopy (Figure S9-11)

Stability of 12 under H_2

In a Schlenk tube, a solution of **12** (50 mg, 0.09 mmol) in THF (5 mL) was prepared under argon. Then, the solution was saturated with H₂ (bubbling of H₂, 1 atm) at room temperature. The solution was stirred under hydrogen atmosphere for an additional 30 minutes. The progress of the reaction was monitored by ³¹P{¹H] NMR using a capillary of C₆D₆ as internal reference.

Hydrogenation of methyl benzoate a1 catalyzed by complex 12 (generated in situ)



Under argon, an autoclave was charged with a solution of methyl benzoate a_1 (124 µL, 1.00 mmol) in 2-Me-THF (1 mL) and a solution of complex **12** previously generated in situ in an NMR tube (**2** (3.1 mg, 0.5 mol%) and KHMDS (3.0 mg, 1.5 mol%) in 0.5 mL THF- d_8). Then the autoclave was immediately pressurized with hydrogen (50 bar) and kept under stirring in an oil bath at 100 °C for 24 h. Once the reactor has cooled down to room temperature and the pressure of hydrogen has been released, the reaction mixture was diluted with CH_2Cl_2 (2.0 mL) and filtered through a small pad of Celite (2 cm in a Pasteur pipette). The Pasteur pipette was then flushed with an additional volume of CH_2Cl_2 . The conversion and yield were determined by ¹H NMR (benzyl alcohol **b**₁ 2% and benzyl benzoate **a**₂ 3%)

Hydrogenation of methyl benzoate a1 catalyzed by complex 12 (isolated complex)

Under argon, an autoclave was charged with a solution of methyl benzoate a_1 (124 µL, 1.00 mmol) in 2-Me-THF (0.5 mL) and a solution of complex **12** (2.7 mg, 0.5 mol%, 1 mL of 2-Me-THF). Then the autoclave was immediately pressurized with hydrogen (50 bar) and kept under stirring in an oil bath at 100 °C for 24 h. Once the reactor has cooled down to room temperature and the pressure of hydrogen has been released, the reaction mixture was diluted with CH₂Cl₂ (2.0 mL) and filtered through a small pad of Celite (2 cm in a Pasteur pipette). The Pasteur pipette was then flushed with an additional volume of DCM. No conversion of methyl benzoate was observed according to the ¹H NMR spectrum.

Reactivity of 2 towards KHBEt₃

In an argon-filled glovebox, a solution of complex **2** (14.3 mg, 0.023 mmol) in THF- d_8 (0.4 mL) was filtered through a small pad of celite (2 cm in a Pasteur pipette) and transferred into a Wildmad NMR pressure tube. KHBEt₃ (1M in THF, 115 µL, 0.115 mmol) was added to the NMR tube, and the reaction was monitored at room temperature by ¹H and ³¹P{¹H} NMR spectroscopy after 30 min (Figure S13-14). Then the mixture was then heated at 60 °C and monitored by ¹H and ³¹P{¹H} NMR spectroscopies after 1h20 (Figures S15-16).

Hydrogenation of methyl benzoate a1 catalyzed by complex 13

Under argon, an autoclave was charged with a solution of methylbenzoate **a1** (124 μ L, 1.00 mmol) in 2-Me-THF (0.5 mL) and a solution of complex **13** (26.9 mg, 5 mol%, 0.5 mL of 2-Me-THF). Then the autoclave was immediately pressurized with hydrogen (50 bar) and kept under stirring in an oil bath at 100 °C for 24 h. Once the reactor has cooled down to room temperature and the pressure of hydrogen has been released, the reaction mixture was diluted with EtOAc (2.0 mL) and filtered through a small pad of Celite (2 cm in a Pasteur pipette). The Pasteur pipette was then flushed with an additional volume of EtOAc. The conversion and yield were determined by ¹H NMR (benzyl alcohol **b1** 3% and benzyl benzoate **a2** 2%) (Figure S17).

Reaction between 13 and acetophenone

In an argon-filled glovebox, a solution of complex **13** (14 mg, 0.026 mmol) in THF- d_8 (0.4 mL) was filtered through a small pad of celite (2 cm in a Pasteur pipette) and transferred to a Wildmad NMR pressure tube. Acetophenone (0.1 mL of a stock solution (15 μ L in 0.5 mL of THF- d_8), 0.026 mmol, 1 equiv.) was added to the NMR tube. The NMR tube was pressurized to 4 bars of H₂ and the mixture stirred at r.t. for 22 h and then was heated at 80 °C in the dark for 24 h. No reaction between **13** and acetophenone was observed after 24 h according to the ¹H NMR spectrum (Figure S18).

Hydrogenation of methyl benzoate in the presence of 13 and KHBEt₃

Under argon, an autoclave was charged with a solution of methyl benzoate (126 μ L, 1 mmol) in 2-Me-THF (0.5 mL) and a solution of **13** (2.8 mg, 0.5 mol%) which was prepared in 2-Me-THF (0.5 mL) and activated with KHBEt₃ (0.1 mL, 1.0 M in THF, 0.1 mmol, 10 mol%) for 30 min at r.t. in this order, then the autoclave was immediately pressurized with hydrogen (50 bar) and kept under stirring in an oil bath at 100 °C for 24 h. Once the reactor has cooled down to room temperature and the pressure of hydrogen has been released, the reaction mixture was diluted with CH₂Cl₂ (2.0 mL) and filtered through a small pad of Celite (2 cm in a Pasteur pipette). The Pasteur pipette was then flushed with an additional volume of CH₂Cl₂. Methyl benzoate was converted in benzyl alcohol in 75% according to the ¹H NMR spectrum (Figure S20).

Hydrogenation of methyl benzoate in the presence of 13 and Me_3NO

Under argon, an autoclave was charged with a solution of methyl benzoate (125 μ L, 1 mmol) in 2-Me-THF (0.5 mL) and a solution of **13** (2.8 mg, 0.5 mol%) which was prepared in 2-Me-THF (0.5 mL) and reacted with Me₃NO (7.5 mg, 10 mol%) for 30 min at r.t. in this order, then the autoclave was immediately pressurized with hydrogen (50 bar) and kept under stirring in an oil bath at 100 °C for 24 h. Once the reactor has cooled down to room temperature and the pressure of hydrogen has been released, the reaction mixture was diluted with EtOAc (2.0 mL) and filtered through a small pad of Celite (2 cm in a Pasteur pipette). The Pasteur pipette was then flushed with an additional volume of EtOAc. No conversion of methyl benzoate was observed according to the ¹H NMR spectrum (Figure S21).

8. Single-crystal X-Ray diffraction

Single crystals suitable for X-ray diffraction were coated with paratone oil and mounted onto the goniometer. The X-ray crystallographic data were obtained at low temperature from diffractometers (Bruker Apex2 (MoKα radiation source) or Oxford-Diffraction Gemini (CuKα)), equipped with an Oxford Cryosystem. The structures have been solved by direct methods using SHELXT or SUPERFLIP and refined by means of least-square procedures on F or F² using CRYSTALS or SHELXL. The scattering factors for all the atoms were used as listed in the International Tables for X-ray Crystallography. Absorption correction was performed using a multi-scan procedure. All non-hydrogen atoms were refined anisotropically excepting for complex 6 (THF molecules were isotropically refined). The H atoms were usually located in a difference map, but those attached to carbon atoms were systematically repositioned geometrically. The H atoms were initially refined with soft restraints on the bond lengths and angles to regularize their geometry and Uiso (H) (in the range 1.2-1.5 times Ueq of the parent atom), after which the positions were refined with riding constraints. Crystallographic information for all the complexes are gathered in Tables S6 and S7; the CIF files are also available from The Cambridge Crystallographic Centre Data (www.ccdc.cam.ac.uk/data request/cif) under the references CCDC-2284587 to 2284596.

9. Computational section

8.1 Full Computational details

All calculations have been performed with the Gaussian 16 suite of programs (revision C01)¹ and a custom script developed in the laboratory was utilized to interface with the xtb software (v. 6.4.1).²

All geometry optimisations were performed with an 2-layered ONIOM³ QM/QM' approach: the high level corresponds to DFT (PBE0⁴ hybrid functional) with a triple-ζ def2-TZVP(-f)⁵ basis set for all atoms, except the Mn center for which a relativistic effective core potential from the Stuttgart group⁶ and its associated basis set have been used. The low level corresponds to the semi-empirical tight-binding GFN2-xTB⁷ method. A recent study has shown that such approach leads to a substantial reduction in computational costs while maintaining a high level of accuracy.⁸ This QM:QM' approach defines here the 'BS1 level'.

The nature of the extrema, as minima or transition states, was confirmed by analytical frequency calculations at the BS1 level. IRC calculations have been performed, followed by geometry optimizations, in order to connect the different minima with their respective transition states. This BS1 level was also used for the statistical mechanics calculations of the thermal and entropic effects which were carried out using the rigid rotor/harmonic oscillator approximation at room temperature and 1 atm.

Single point calculations were carried out with 'BS2 level', which is defined as follows. The same hybrid functional (PBEO) has been used, including the D3BJ Grimme correction for dispersion effects (D3 correction with Becke-Johnson damping)⁹, with a quadruple-zeta def2-QZVPP basis set for all atoms⁵ except the Mn center for which a relativistic effective core potential from the Stuttgart group⁶ and its associated basis set have been used. The solvent effects (THF) were included with the IEFPCM solvation model.¹⁰

The reported Gibbs energies for all species were calculated at 298.15 K and 1 atm as follows:

$$G^{THF,PBE0-D3BJ,BS2} = E_{SCRF}^{THF,PBE0-D3BJ,BS2} + G_{correction}^{gas,PBE0,BS1//GFN2-xTB} + RTln(24.45)$$

The last term is related to the free energy change associated with a standard-state concentration change (vs. an ideal gaz).¹¹

NBO analysis were carried out with the NBO7 program¹² (BS2 level).

Calculations of ¹H NMR shieldings, σ , and related chemical shifts, δ , were performed within the gauge-including atomic orbital (GIAO) framework at the BS2 level.

The ¹H shielding of the reference compound (TMS) has been computed using the same protocol, leading to a value of 31.5 ppm.
