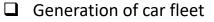
The modeling chain : LandUse transport interaction model



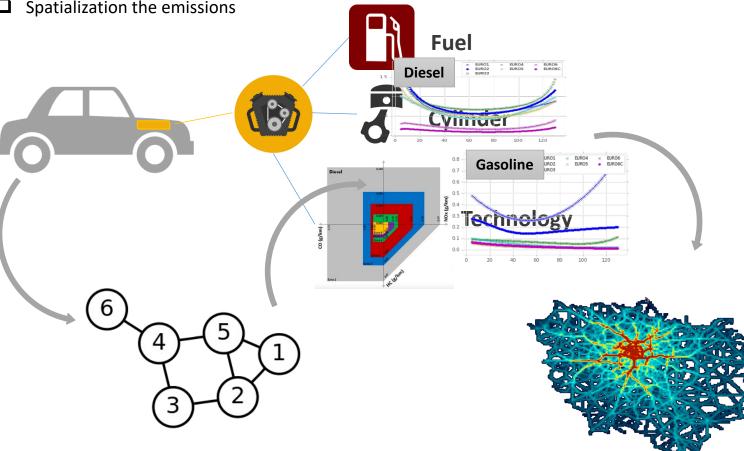


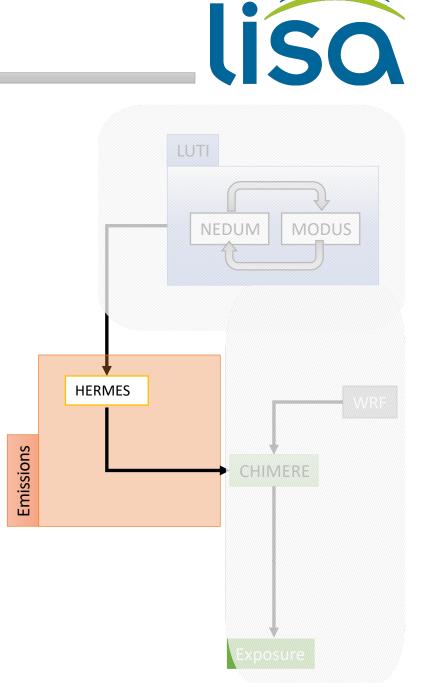

- Generation of the path (Dijsktra algorithm of shortest path Graph theory)
- Calculate hot and cold start emissions NOx, NMVOC, CO, PM (COPERT methodology)
- Spatialization the emissions

- No modal split



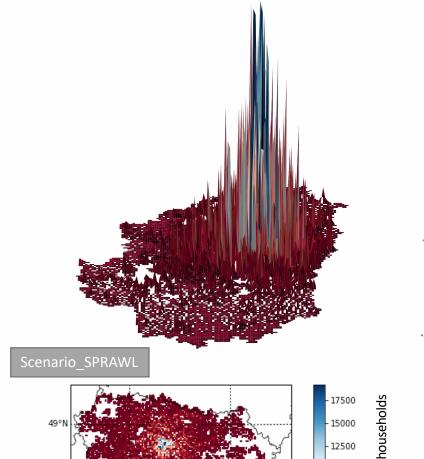

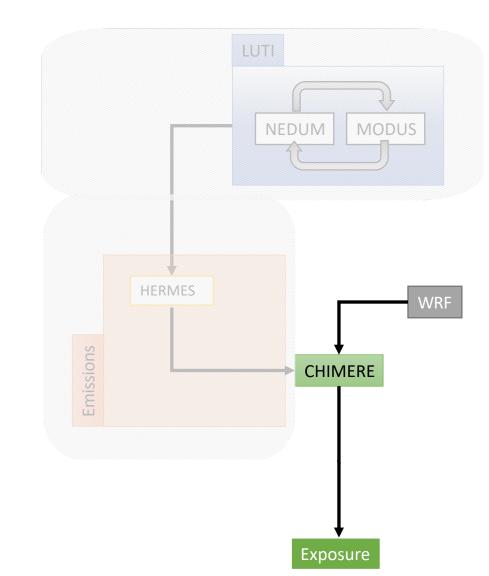

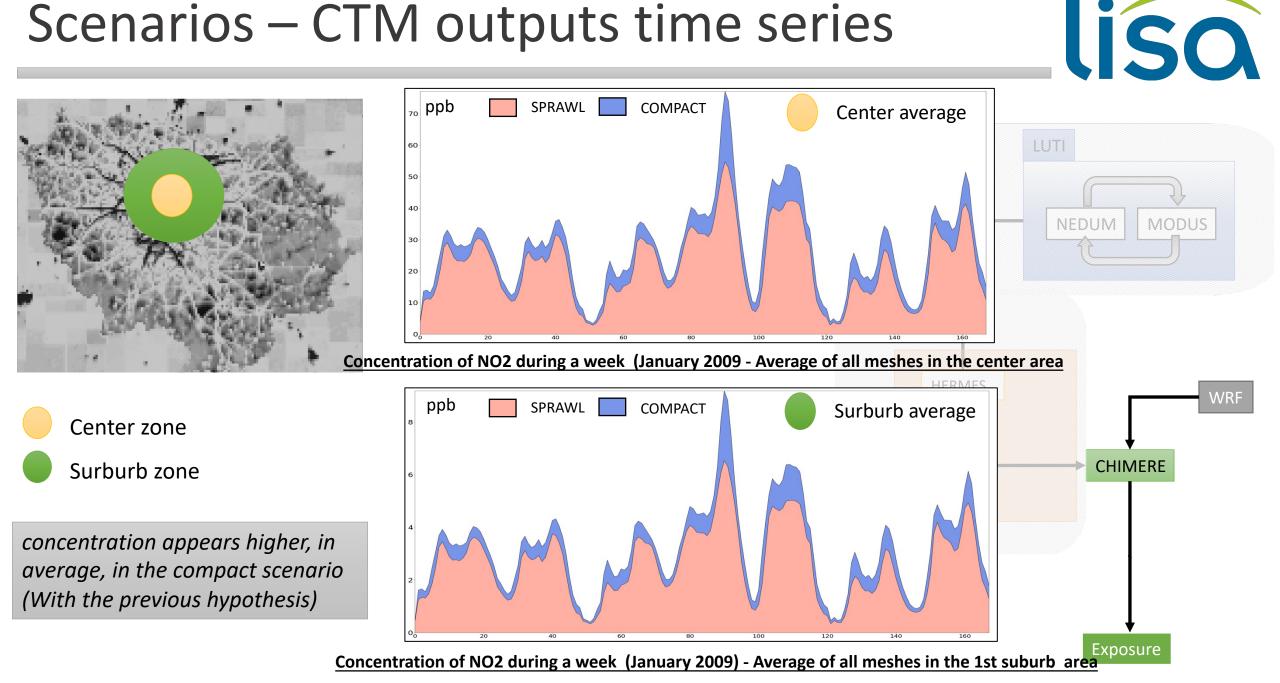
