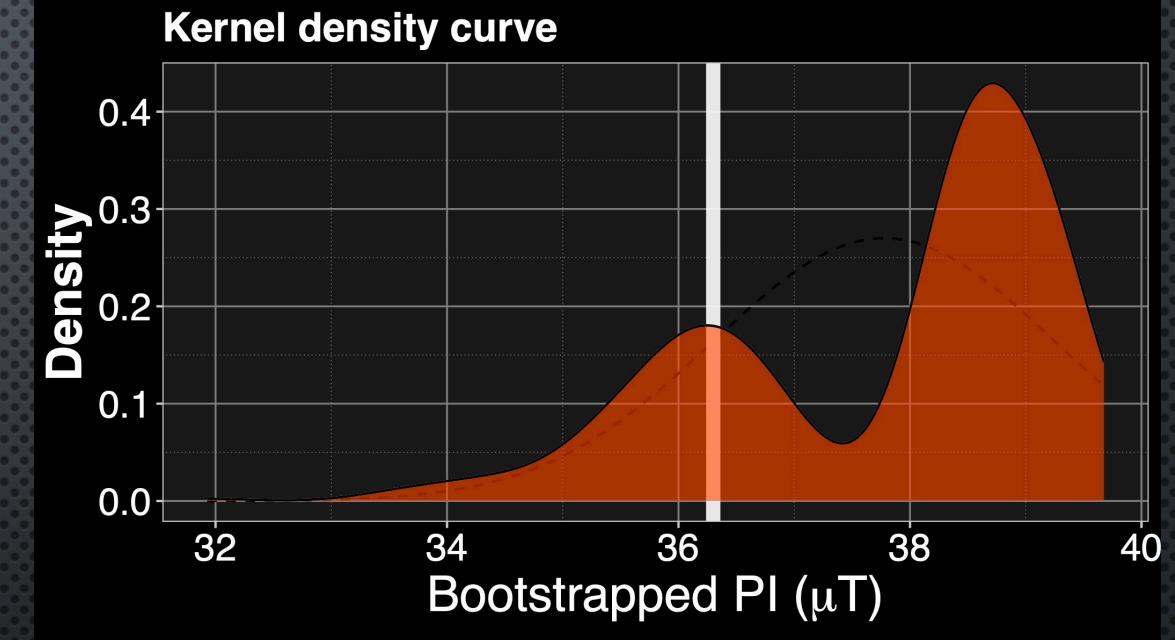
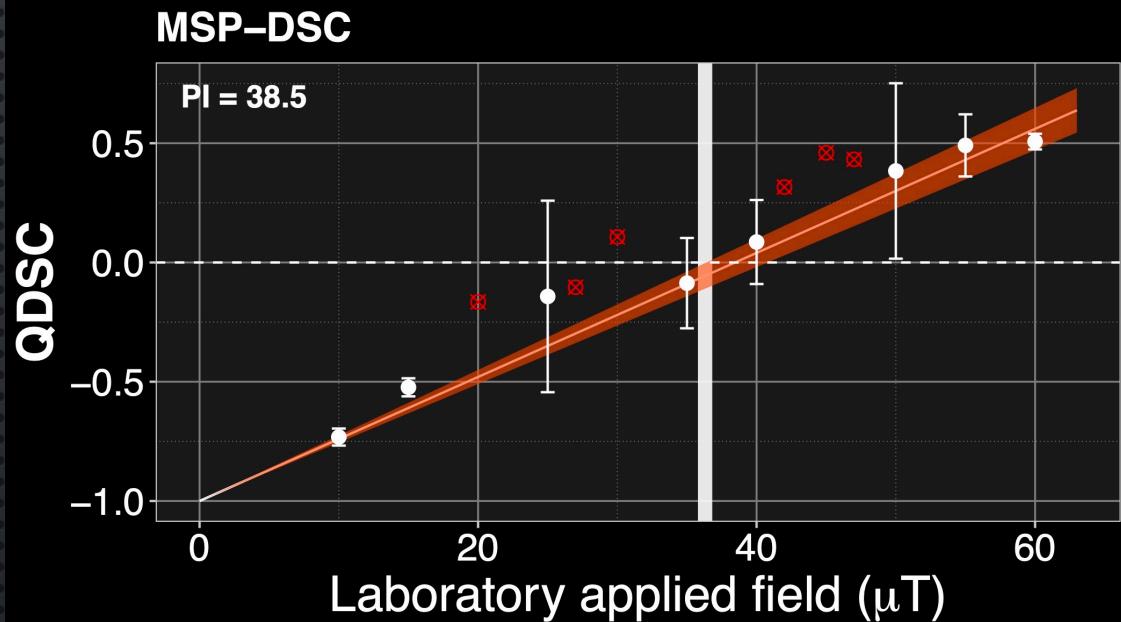
Three test lava flows : Rock magnetic properties.

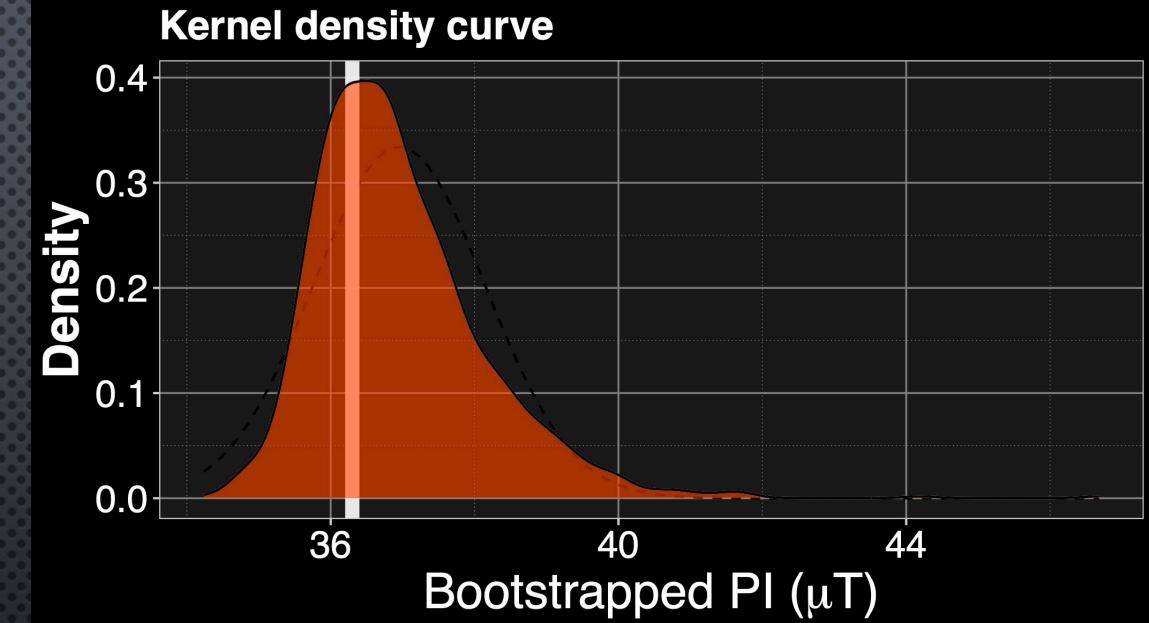
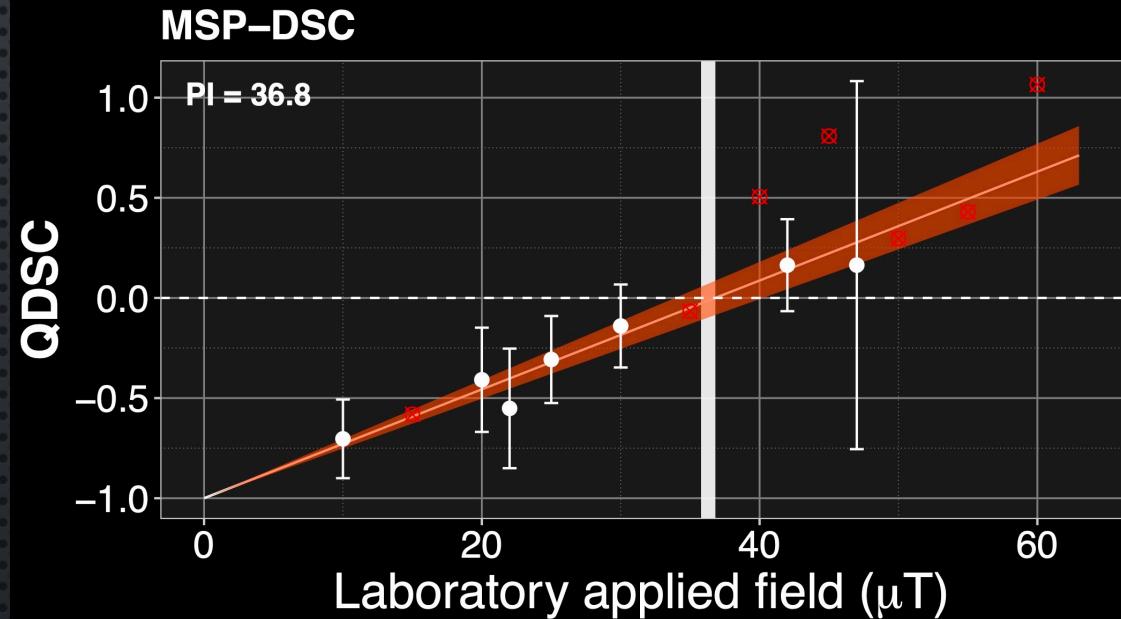


Réunion 2002 : IGRF 36.3 μT

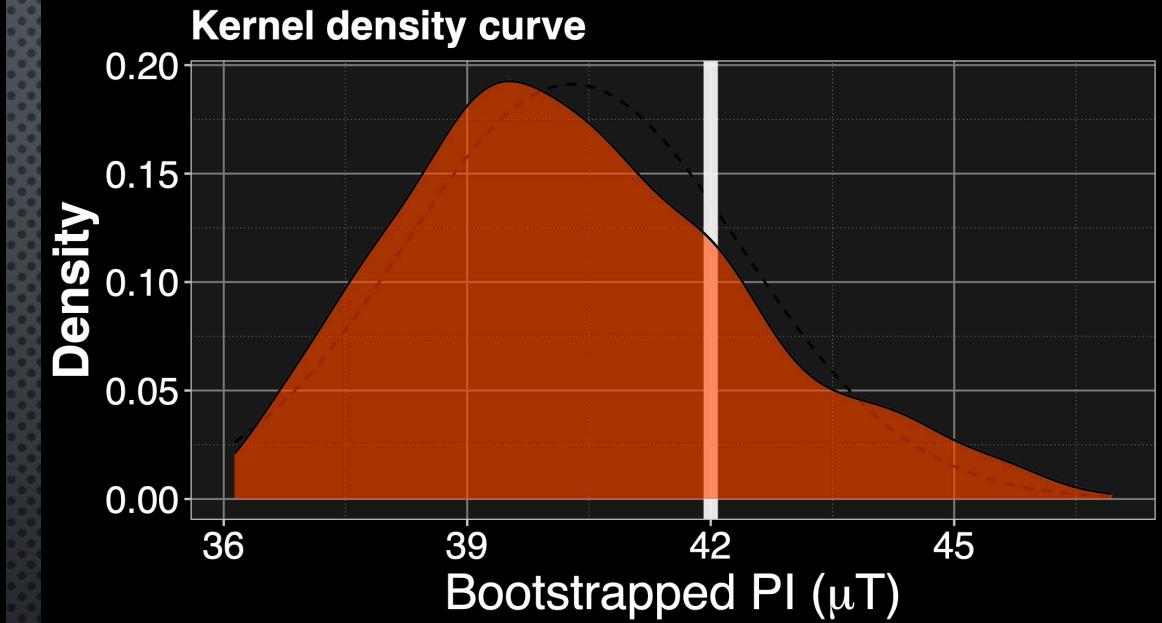
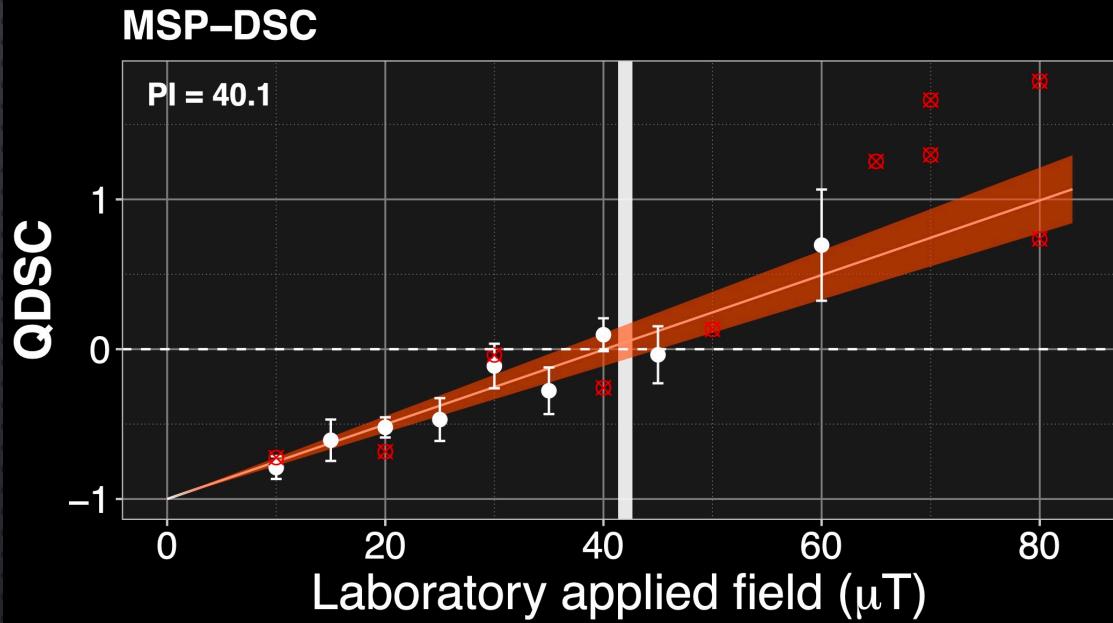


Réunion 2007 : IGRF 36.6 μT

PI = 40 [35.9 – 44.0] confidence interval @ 68%

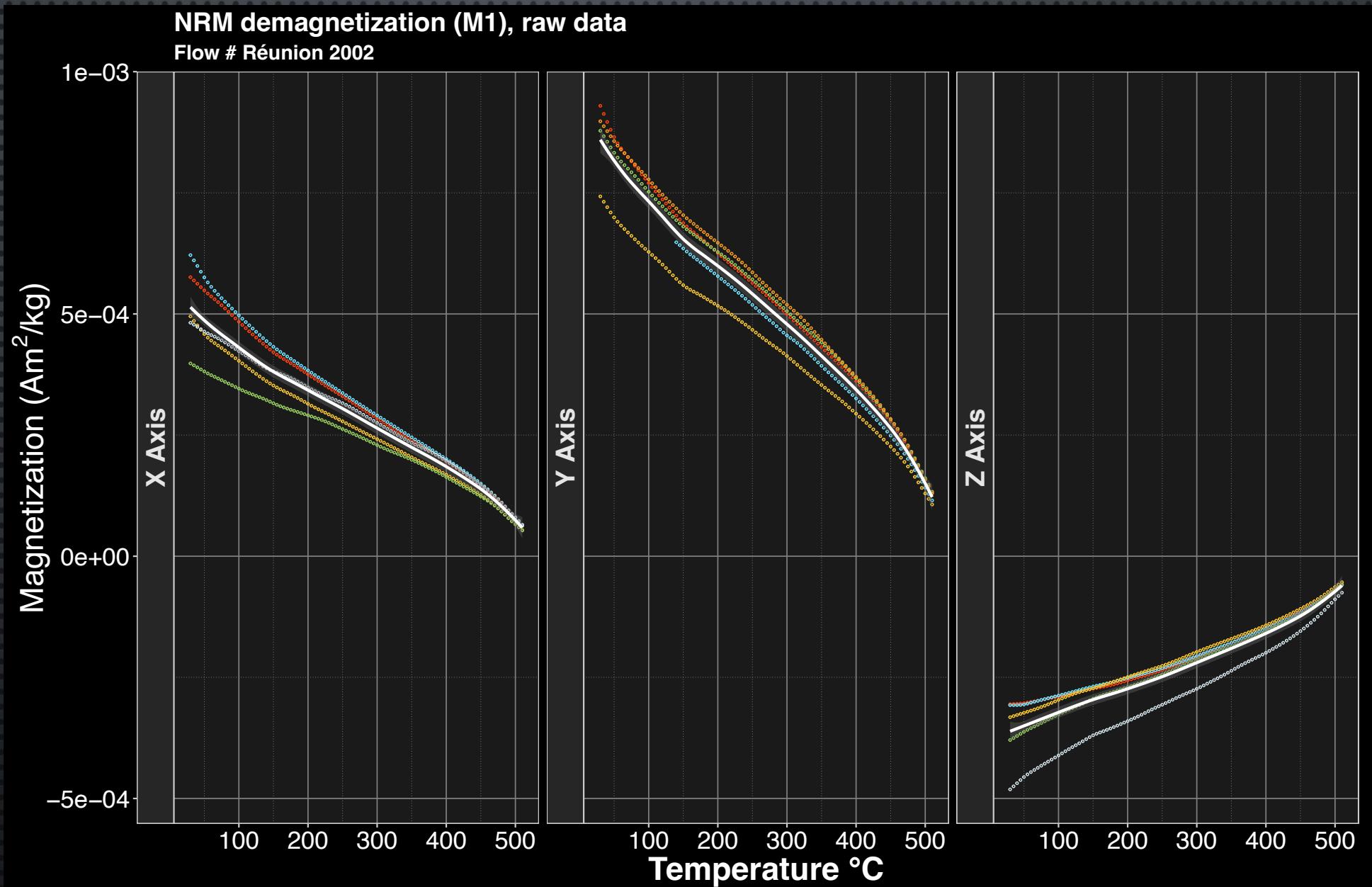

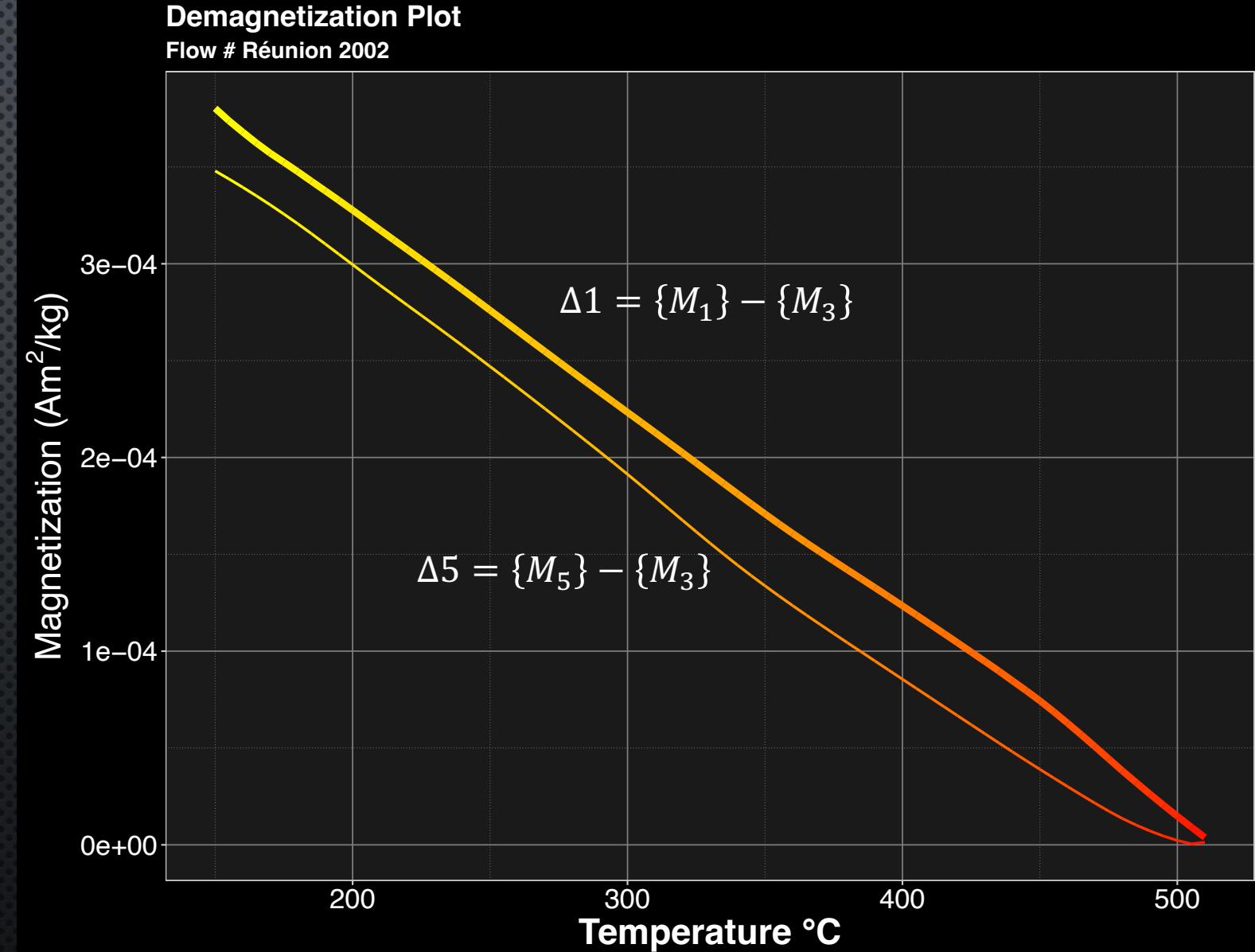
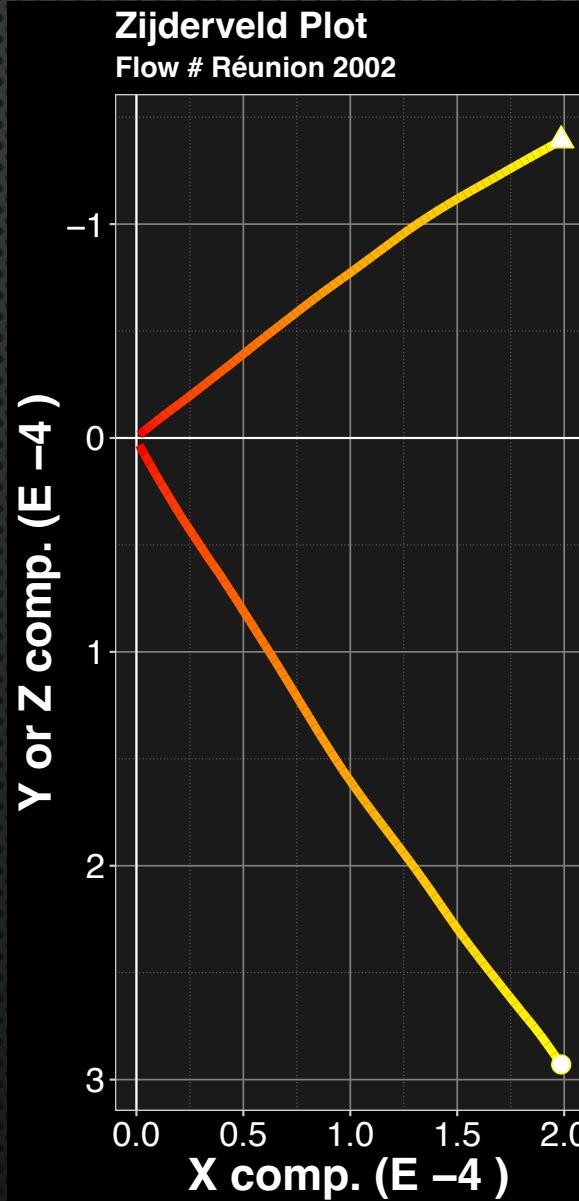
pTRM demagnetization (M5), raw data

Triaxe paleointensity results

$$R'T_i = H_{lab} \cdot \frac{\Delta 1'T_i}{\Delta 5'T_i}$$

where :

$$\Delta 1'T_i = \{M_1[T_1] - M_1[T_i]\} - \{M_3[T_1] - M_3[T_i]\}$$

$$\Delta 5'T_i = \{M_5[T_1] - M_5[T_i]\} - \{M_3[T_1] - M_3[T_i]\}$$

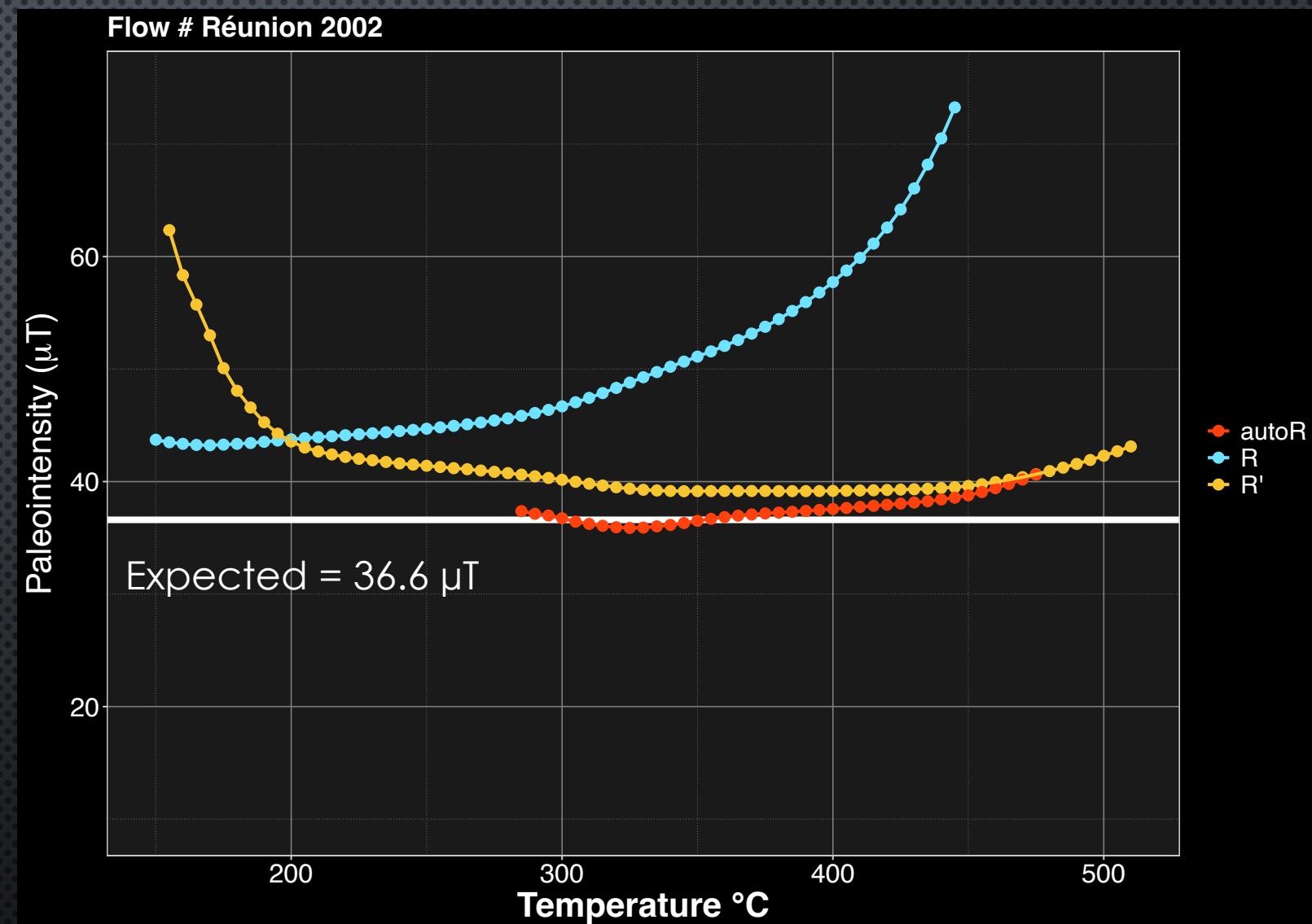

Key points

To Remember :

- i. Determining paleointensity from volcanic records remains challenging.
- ii. Devices and protocols that process a single sample at a time enable experimental conditions to be fine-tuned as quickly as possible.
- iii. The MSP-DSC protocol appears to be the most suitable for lava flows.
- iv. Further work is planned on the development of a hybrid Triaxe - MSP protocol.
