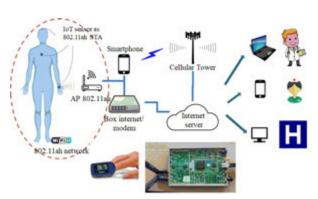

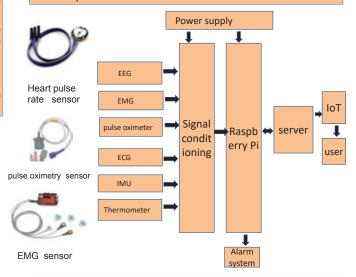






Introduction
