> Context

- Consumers do expect more natural, **minimally processed**, of high sensorial quality, nutritionally interesting, and healthy food products (Battacchi et al., 2020; Roman et al., 2017).
- The ever-increasing demand of consumers for plant-based diets, including foods containing plant-based proteins of nutritional interest and lipids rich in poly-unsaturated fatty acids (PUFA; mainly n-3 FA) and other bioactive compounds, is in the spotlight.

Oilseeds are among the most promising sustainable plant-based food sources: contain proteins and oil bodies (oleosomes, lipid droplets)

Oil bodies (OBs) are lipid-based nature-assembled colloidal structures, such as LDL in egg yolk and milk fat globules.

OBs synthetised by plants could therefore be further valorized in human diet, for example in dressings, sauces, dips, beverages, desserts, in plant-based emulsion products such as mayonnaise (Nikiforidis et al., 2014; Romero-Guzman et al., 2020) and in complex food systems such as fermented products.

- **1.** Essential to find and characterize new sources of plant nutrients
- 2. The current lack of understanding of the microstructure and surface properties of OBs in response to changes in pH and mineral environment, associated to the physical stability of the emulsion poses a significant barrier to the development of OBs-based new food products.

> Context

Growing interest in the last decade for hemp (Cannabis Sativa L.)

*Hemp cultivation has a low environmental impact and is adapted to mild climates

*Whole hemp can be valorized and provides hemp seeds of nutritional interest and health benefits (Farinon et al.,

2020; Rupasinghe et al., 2020; Sorrentino, 2021)



The objectives of this work were :

-to use **minimal processing** including aqueous extraction and grinding to recover OBs from hemp seeds

-to characterize the lipid composition of natural hemp seed OBs

-to examine their microstructure,

-to **determine the impact of pH and minerals** (various NaCl and CaCl₂ concentrations) on their surface properties and the physical stability of the emulsions.

-to determine the impact of homogenization on the physical stability of hemp seed extracts for long-time storage (not presented here)

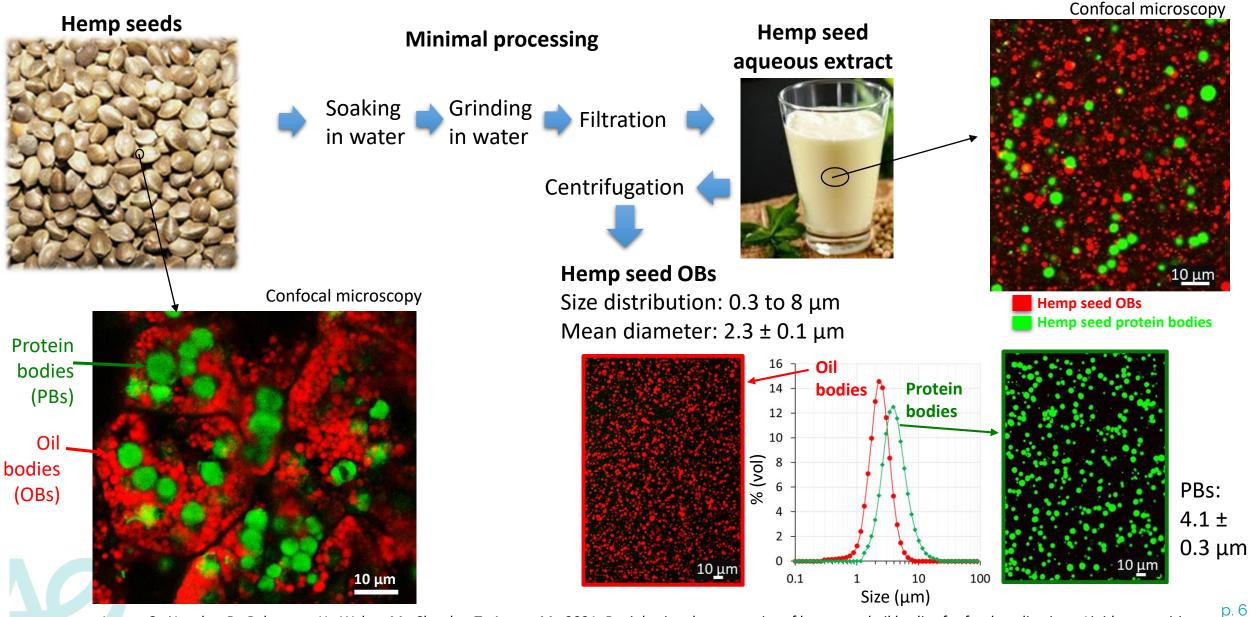

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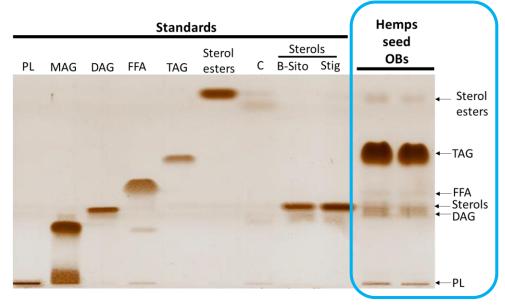

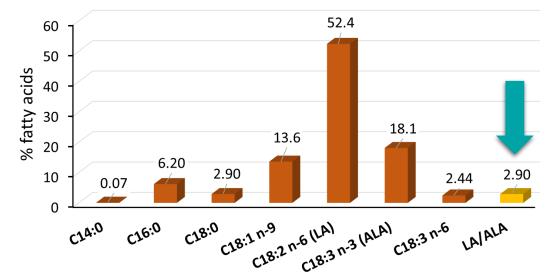


Lipid content: 33.6 ± 0.5 g of total lipids/100 g of seeds

Main lipid classes (HPTLC)



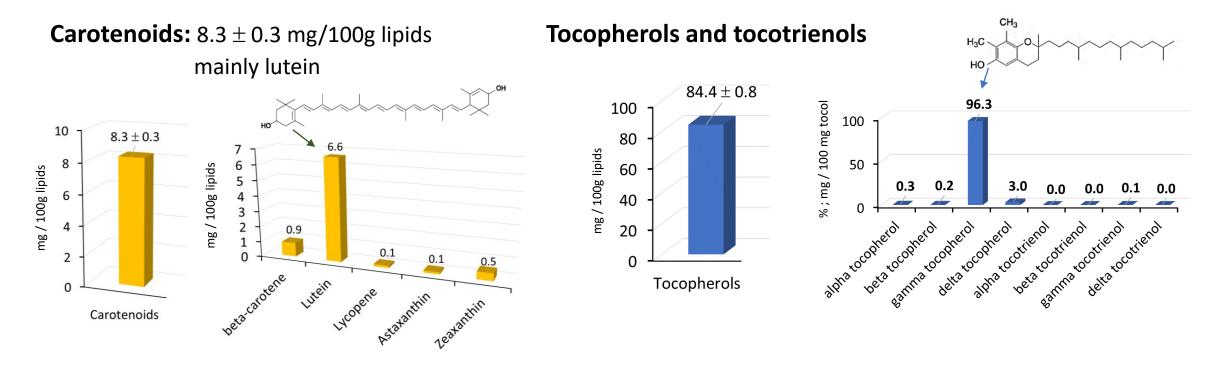
- Mainly TAG (~ 95% of lipids)
- Fatty acid composition (GC)



PUFAs of the oil amounted to **72.9%** of the total of FAs linoleic acid (C18:2n-6; LA), α-linolenic acid (C18:3n-3; ALA)

The hemp seed OBs deliver the essential PUFAs n-6 and n-3 in the proportion 3:1 that is the best ratio recommended by medical research and the most advanced theories in the field of nutrition.

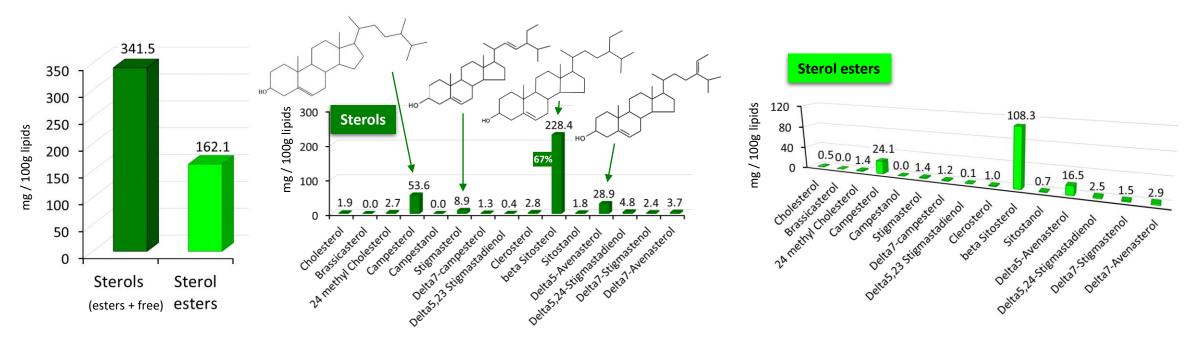
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➔ Natural protection against oxidation

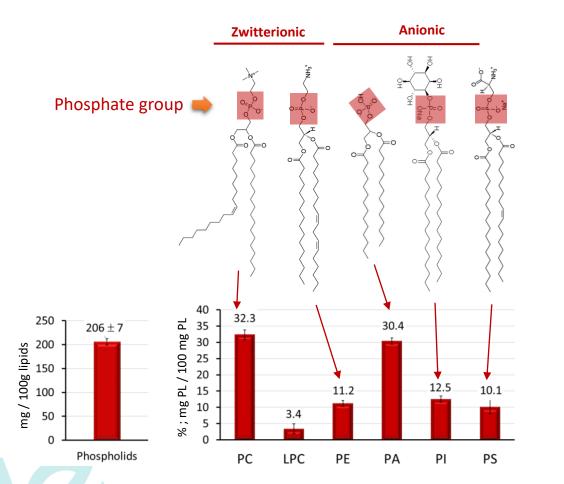
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Sterols: 341.5 mg/100g lipids; mainly β -sitosterol; about 50% sterol esters



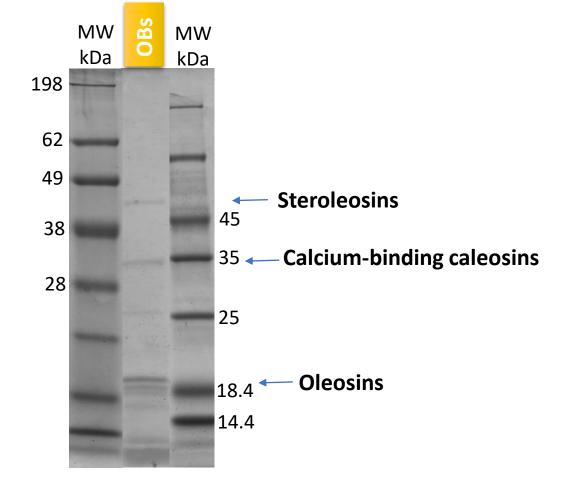
→ Diversity of sterols
→ High amount of sterols

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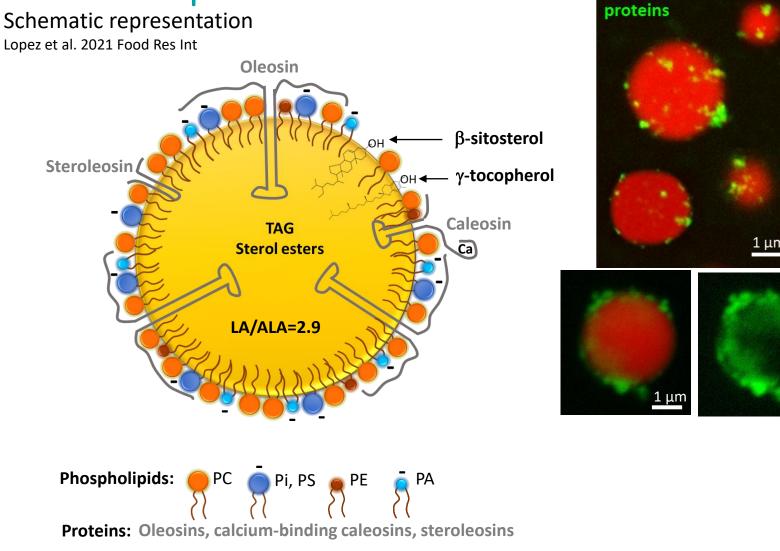
Phospholipids: zwitterionic and anionic



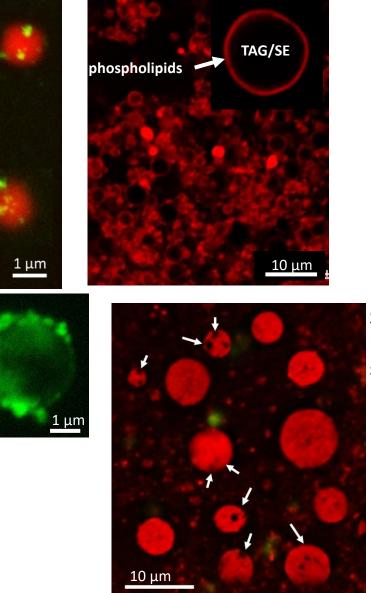

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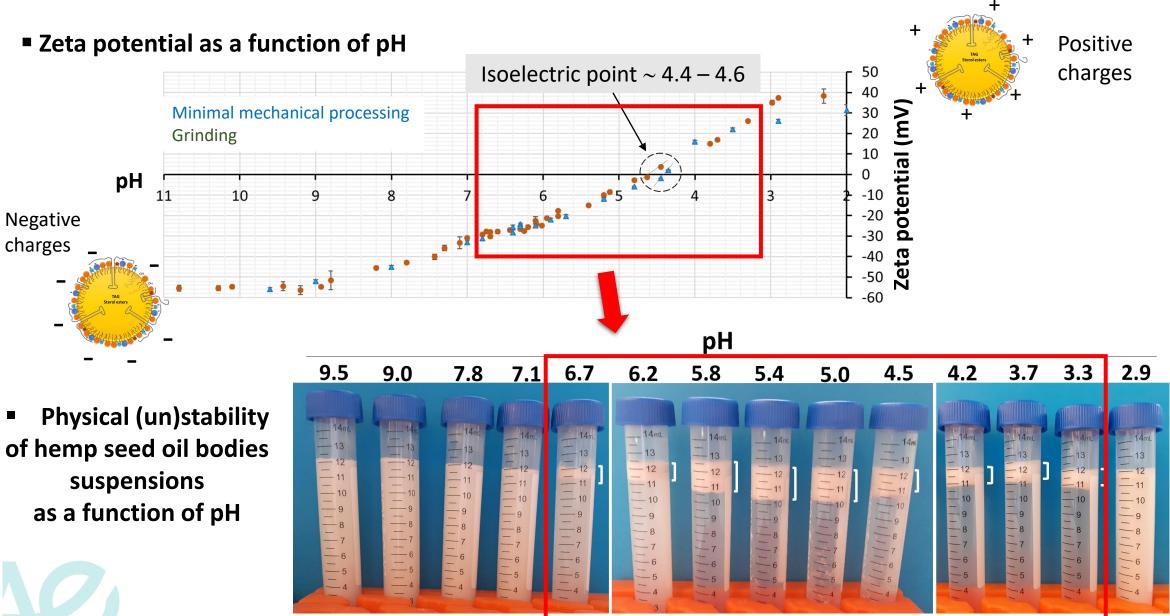
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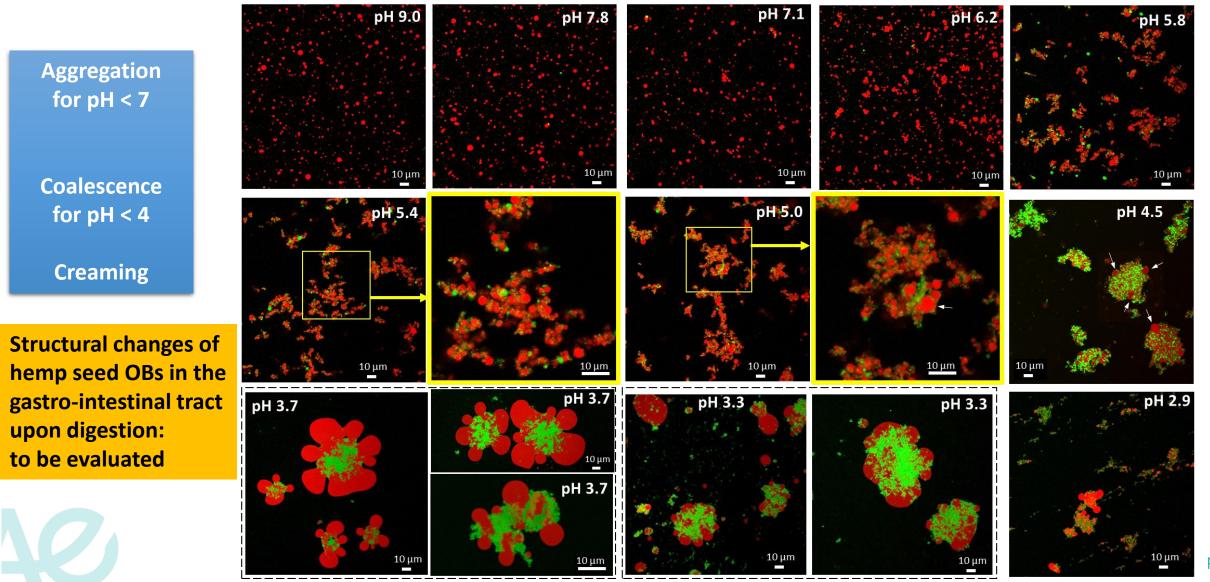


Hemp seed OBs in stress environment: impact of pH



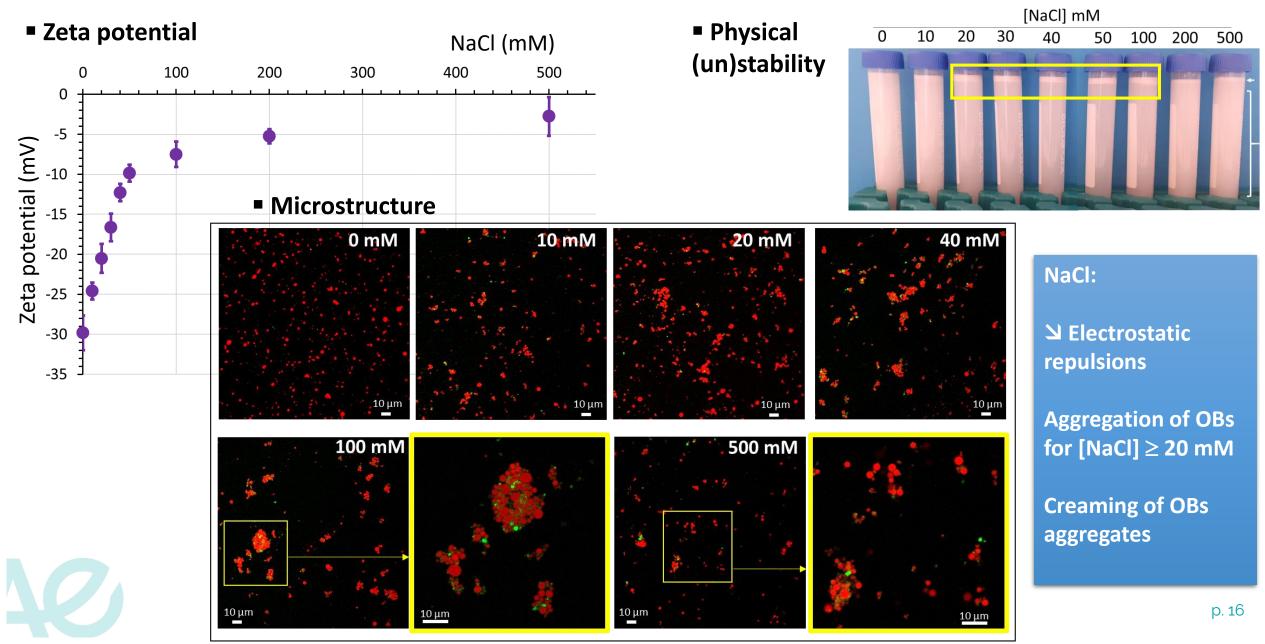
Hemp seed OBs in stress environment: <u>impact of pH</u>

Microstructure as a function of pH

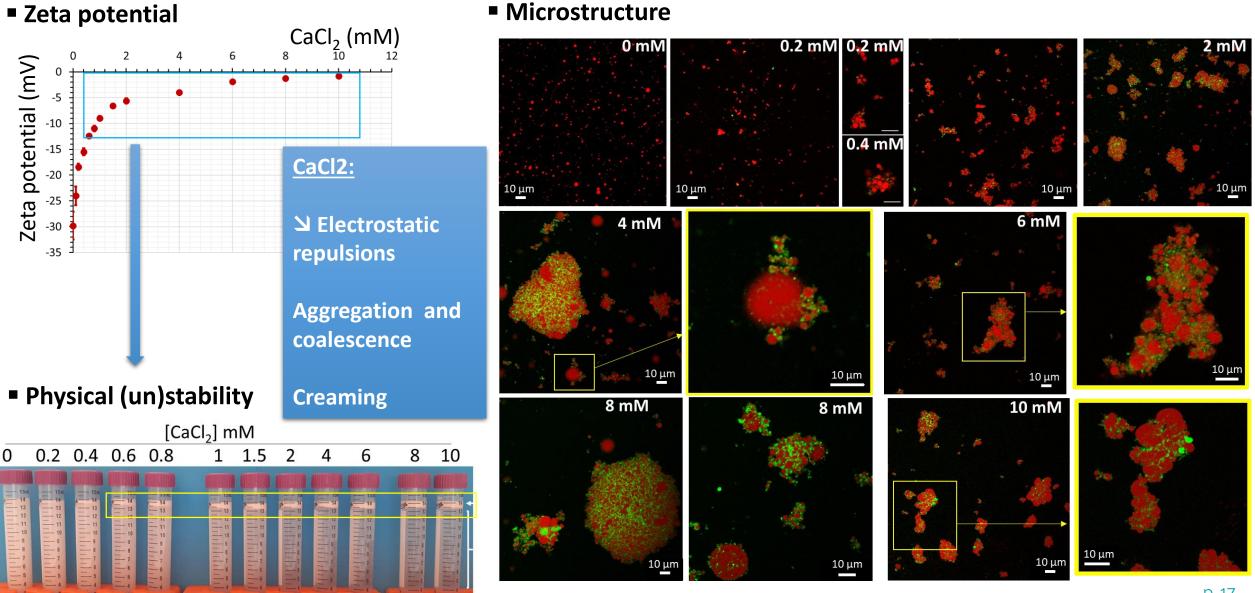


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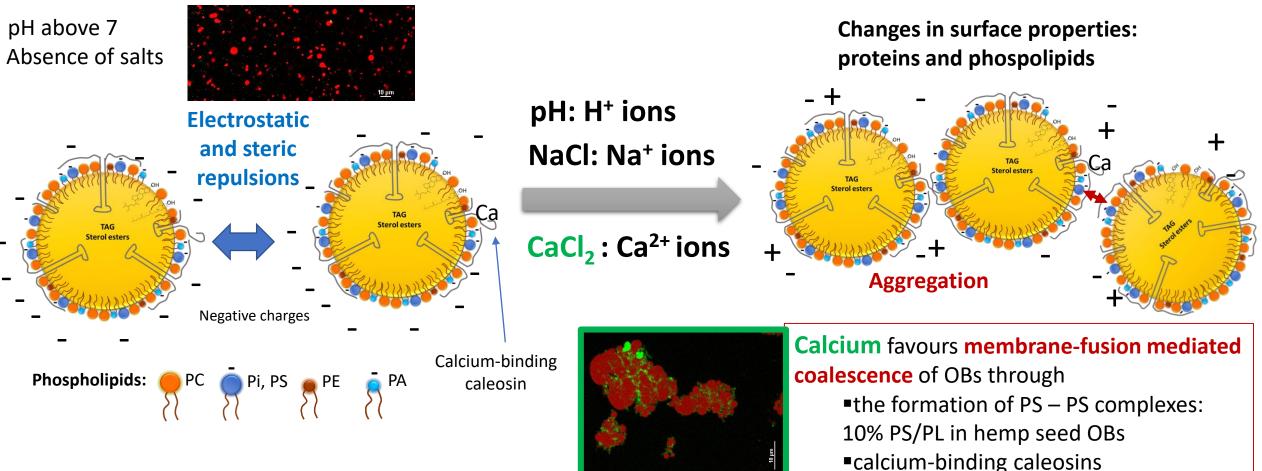
Hemp seed OBs in stress environment: impact of NaCl

> Hemp seed OBs in stress environment: interpretations



The physical unstability of OBs induced by cations (pH, Na⁺, Ca²⁺) should be considered for -extraction from the seeds and purification -food applications



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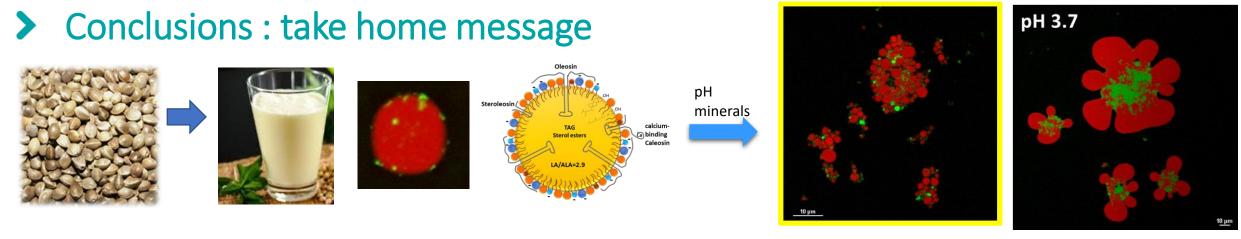
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1./ The extraction of hemp seed OBs can be performed by minimal processing, including soaking of the seeds, grinding, filtration and centrifugation

The valorization of full hemp seed aqueous extracts, containing both the OBs and the protein bodies, should be performed.

2./ Hemp seed OBs are interesting nutritional sources of **fatty acids** with a well-balanced LA/ALA ratio (LA/ALA = 2.9) but also of other bioactive compounds: **carotenoids (mainly lutein)**, **phytosterols**, **and antioxydant molecules (**γ**-tocopherol)**

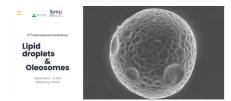
3./ The mean diameter of HSOBs was 2.3 \pm 0.1 μ m with an isoelectric point in the range of pH 4.4 to 4.6.

4./ Hemp seed OBs are highly sensitive to ions !

The composition of their surface (mainly the proteins and phospholipids) governs their physical stability/unstability. Decreasing the pH and the addition of salts induce aggregation of OBs.

Calcium induce both aggregation and membrane-fusion mediated coalescence of hemp seed OBs by involving probably the anionic phospholipids together with membrane proteins.

This study will contribute to extend the range of novel food products and designed emulsions containing hemp seed OBs. p. 20



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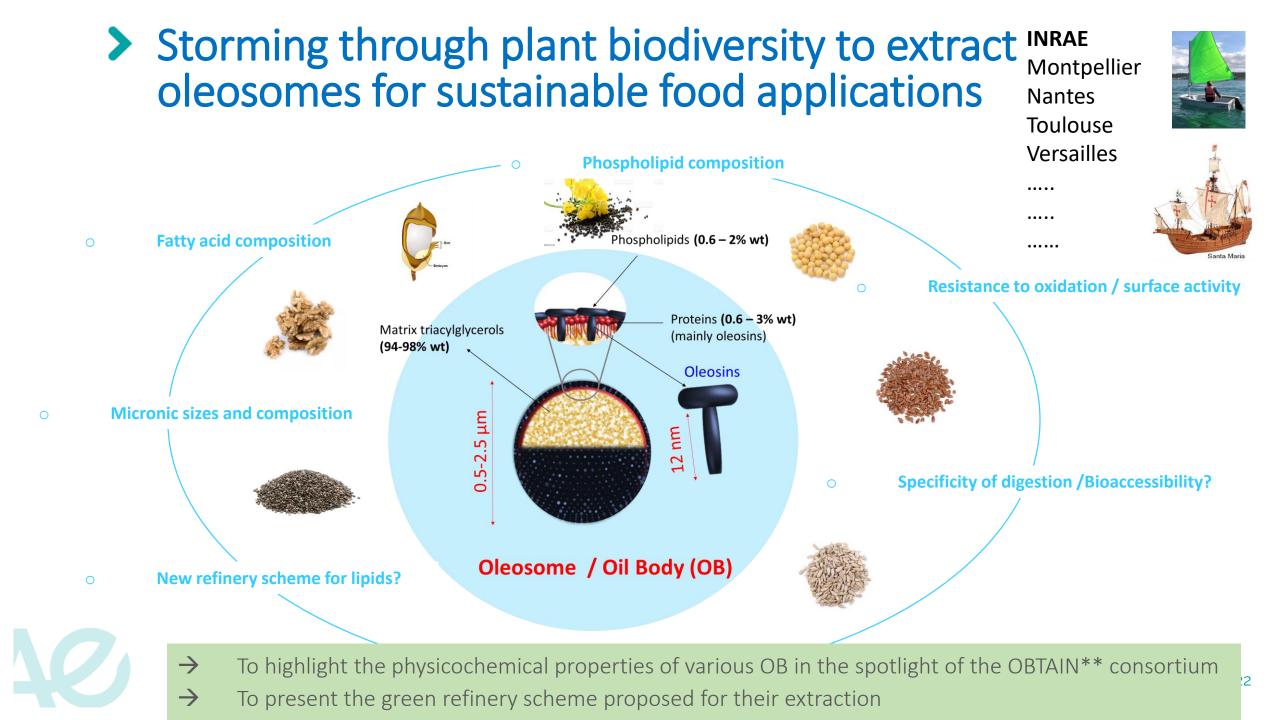
