**Context:** The lack of reliable data for monitoring environmental dynamics limits the performance of hydrological models.

**Main objective:** Improve runoffs simulation using time series of environmental data from climate-environment co-evolution

**Specific objective:** Analyze the climate-environment co-evolution in the Nakanbé nested watersheds, West African Sahel

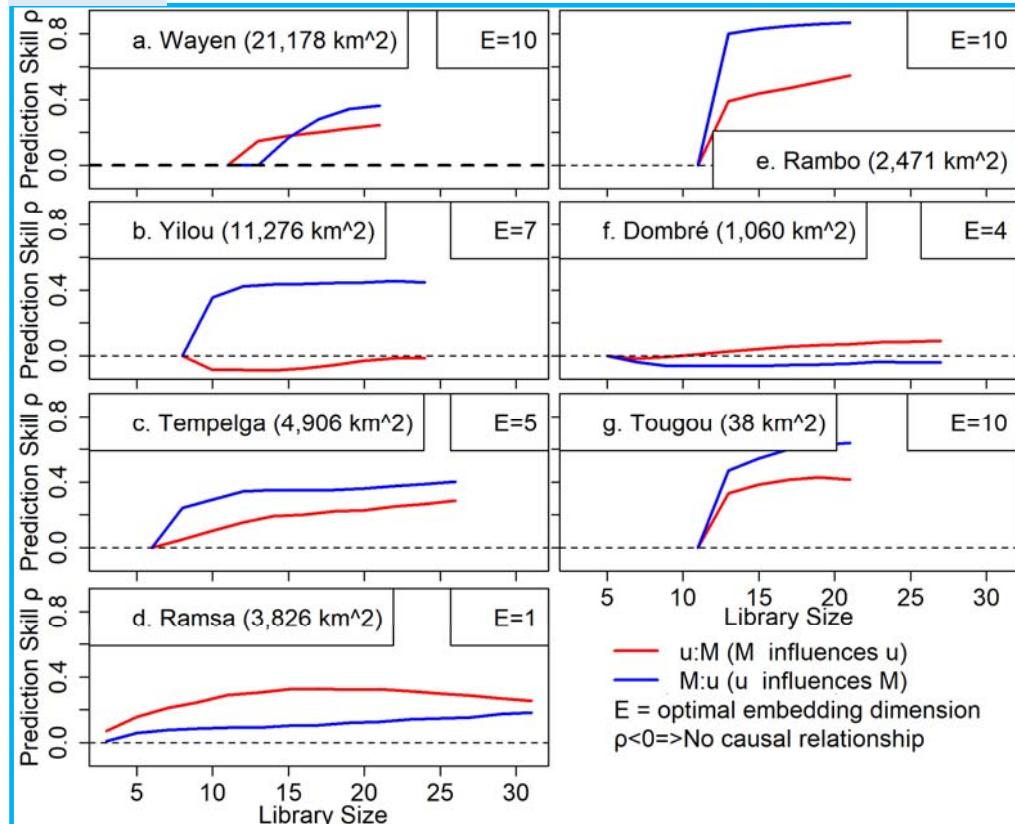
