## 1 Adsorption isotherms

In addition to Langmuir isotherm, the following adsorption models were tested to evaluate the model that best fits the surface coverage data:

Temkin isotherm

$$K_{ads} C = e^{f\theta} \quad (1)$$

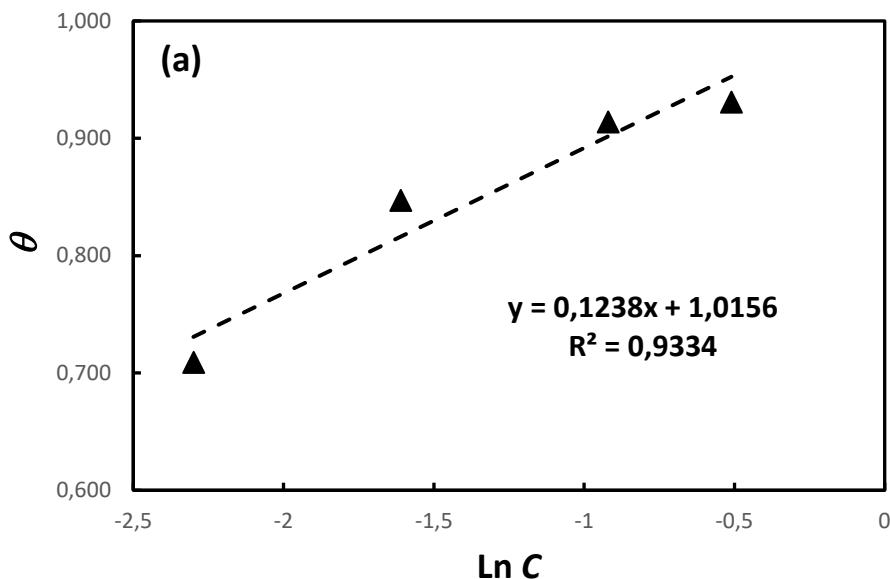
Freundlich isotherm

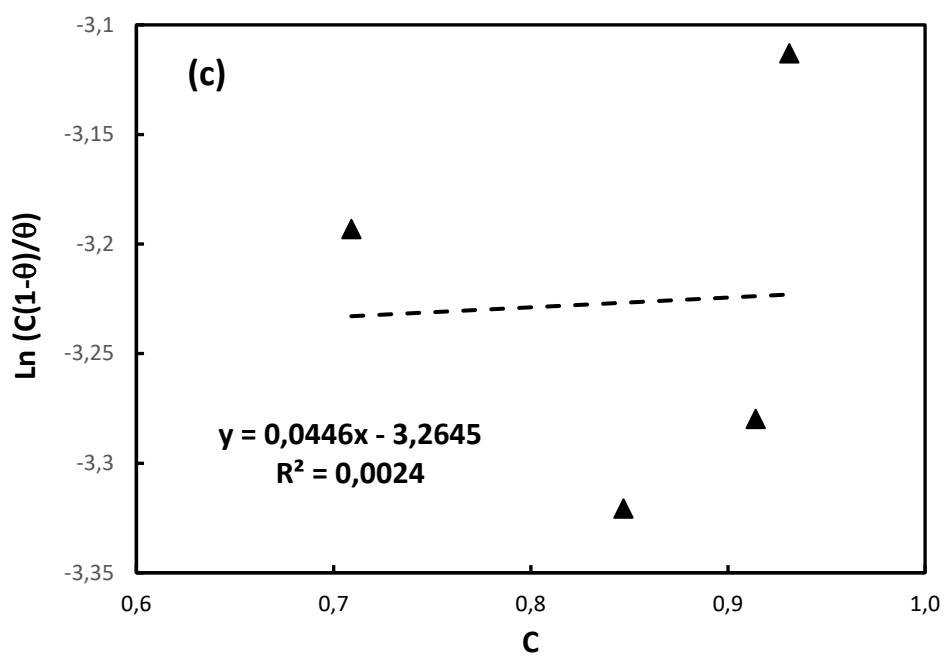
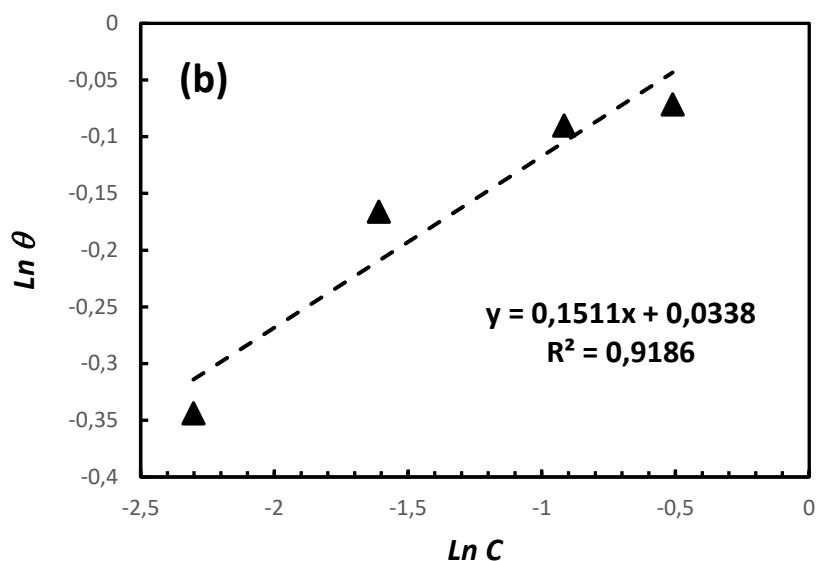
$$K_{ads} C^{\frac{1}{n}} = \theta \quad (2)$$

Frumkin isotherm

$$K_{ads} C = \frac{\theta}{1-\theta} e^{f\theta} \quad (3)$$

Where  $K_{ads}$  is the adsorption equilibrium constant (in L/g),  $C$  the mass concentration,  $f$  the molecular interaction parameter between corrosion inhibitor molecules and  $n$  the Freundlich empirical constant.

## 2- Actual free energy of adsorption for natural extracts

The molar concentration of the active inhibitor molecule,  $c$  is given by Equation (4),

$$c = \frac{xC}{M_{inh}} \quad (4)$$

where  $x$  is the weight fraction of the active inhibitor in the natural extract,  $C$  is the mass concentration (in g/L) of the natural extract and  $M_{inh}$  is the molecular weight of the inhibitor.

The adsorptive equilibrium constant ( $K_{ads,1}$ ) in L g<sup>-1</sup> is thus related to the adsorptive equilibrium constant ( $K_{ads,2}$ ) in L mol<sup>-1</sup> through Equation (5) :

$$K_{ads,2} = \frac{M_{inh}}{x} K_{ads,1} \quad (5)$$

The free adsorption enthalpies defined from the mass or molar concentrations are given in Equation (6) and (7), respectively :

$$\Delta G_{ads,1}^0 = -RT \ln(K_{ads,1} C_{H_2O}) \quad (6)$$

$$\Delta G_{ads,2}^0 = -RT \ln(K_{ads,2} c_{H_2O}) \quad (7)$$

with  $C_{H_2O} = M_{H_2O} c_{H_2O}$

To compare the relative values of  $\Delta G_{ads,1}^0$  and  $\Delta G_{ads,2}^0$  it is sufficient to compare the exponential terms:

$$\frac{K_{ads,2} C_{H_2O}}{K_{ads,1} C_{H_2O}} = \frac{M_{inh}}{M_{H_2O} x}$$

we can anticipate that  $K_{ads,2} C_{H_2O}$  will be greater than  $K_{ads,1} C_{H_2O}$  and therefore that  $\Delta G_{ads,2}^0$  will be more negative than  $\Delta G_{ads,1}^0$  given that  $M_{inh} > M_{H_2O}$  and  $x < 1$ .

The actual free energy of adsorption is more negative than the value calculated from mass concentrations of the aqueous extract of AHA (-25.3 kJ.mol<sup>-1</sup>). A simple calculation based on isofraxidin as the only active compound in the extract and present at 10% by mass in the extract conducted by example at a  $\Delta G_{ads,2}^0$  value of -37.2 kJ mol<sup>-1</sup>.
