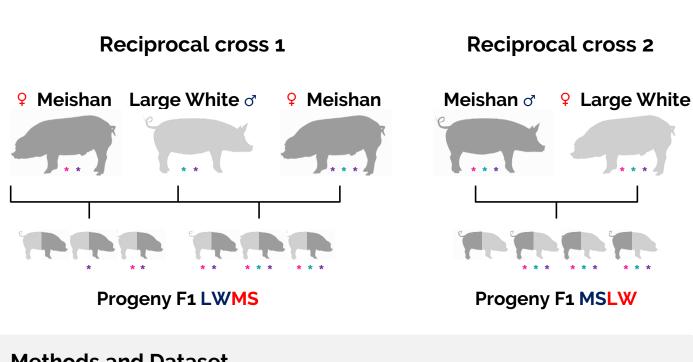

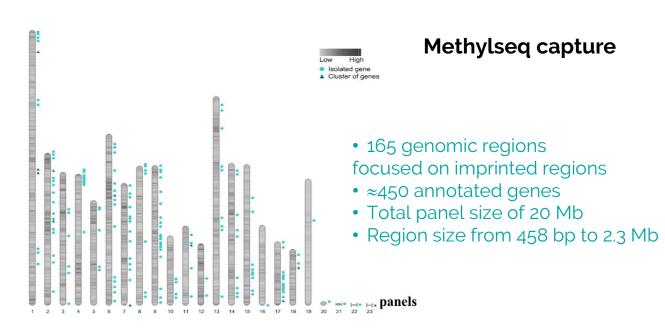

### ONT enables straightforward parental origin of methylation identification

- Comparison of methylseq capture [1] and ONT [2] to enlarge the identification of parental-specific methylation (Figure 1)

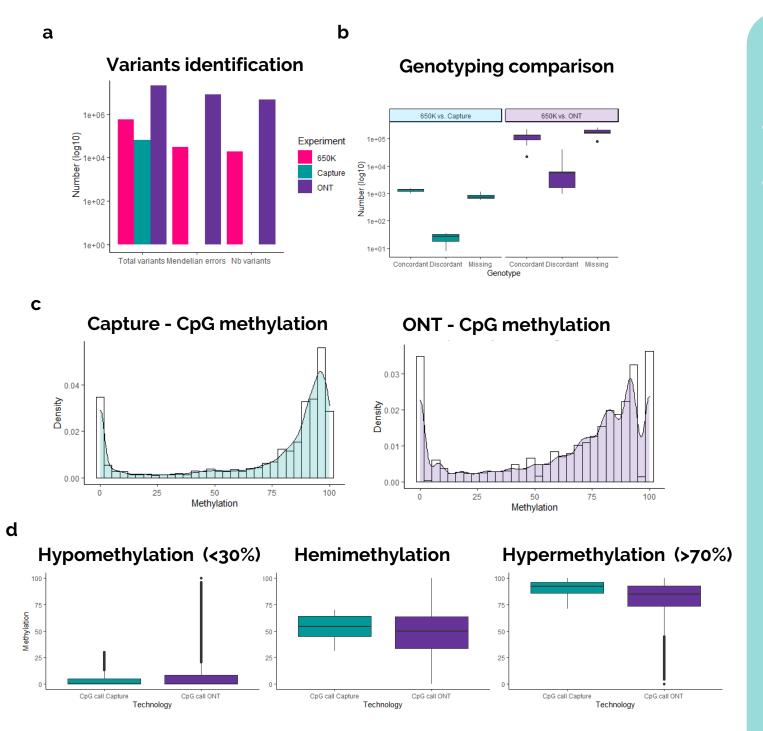


Figure 2: Evaluation of variant and hemimethylation callings from ONT. a, b. Comparisons of common genotypes between the high density SNP array, methylseq capture and ONT whole genome have been performed. c, d. Comparisons of methylation status between common CpG between methylseq capture and ONT whole genome have been analysed. The mean coverage of ONT whole genome sequencing was 40X suggesting that this coverage seemed sufficient to identify both relevant genotypes and hemimethylation pattern to tag parental differentially methylated regions such as Imprinting control Regions (ICR).

- Variants calling are concordant between methylseg capture and ONT (Figure 2a-b)
- DNA methylation, especially hemimethylation, are highly correlated between methylseq capture and ONT (Figure 2c-d)





#### **Methods and Dataset**

- 650k genotyping n=11/15 Blood
- \* Methylseq capture n=9/15Blood and semen Short reads sequencing Long reads sequencing
- \* ONT whole genome n=13/15Blood

Figure 1: Schematic overview of the strategy, Reciprocal crosses between Large White and Meishan pigs have been produced (n=15) to unambigously discriminate the parental phase of variants. Different genotyping methods have been used including the Affymetrix® Axiom Porcine Genotyping Array (Axiom\_PigHDv1) and variant calling from both methylseq capture and ONT. DNA methylation status has been analysed from either methylseq capture or ONT. Methylseq capture is focused on 165 genomic regions expected to carry imprinted genes based on orthologous comparisons with human and mouse data. Coloured stars represent which technology have been used with high density SNP array (pink), methylseq capture (green) and ONT (purple), respectively.

## Molecular signature of genomic imprinting

- ONT identifies simultaneously both haplotypes and methylation
- Parental-specific methylation identification from ONT requires high **depth sequencing** for variant calling and hemimethylation targeting
