The use of a high energy X-rays generator has recently been proposed to performed TID testing [1]

The results showed a gap in **cobalt-60** and high energy X-rays





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NMOS transistors for the four investigated irradiation conditions

 \hookrightarrow The gap is reduced when high energy photons is used and when the X generator is filtered with lead

Conclusion

For all the investigated devices, no particular difference between the several irradiation conditions were observed. This means that a high energy X-rays irradiation with a lead filter leads to the same degradation as 60-Co irradiation for the investigated MOS capacitors. This lack of gap between X-ray and Cobalt irradiations is explained by the structure of the studied components. Indeed, the MOS capacitors were manufactured with only one thin aluminum layer on the top of the oxide.

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
