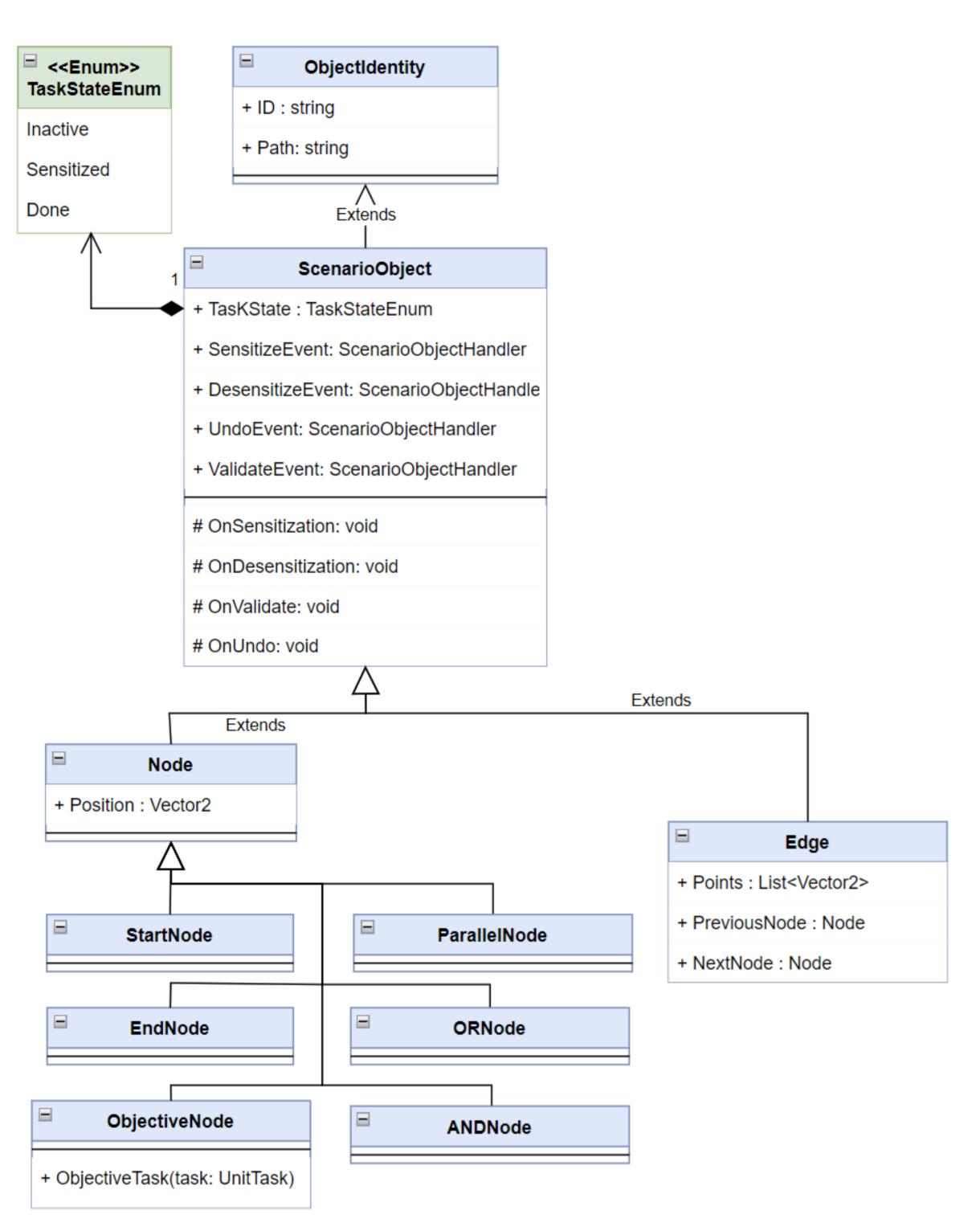

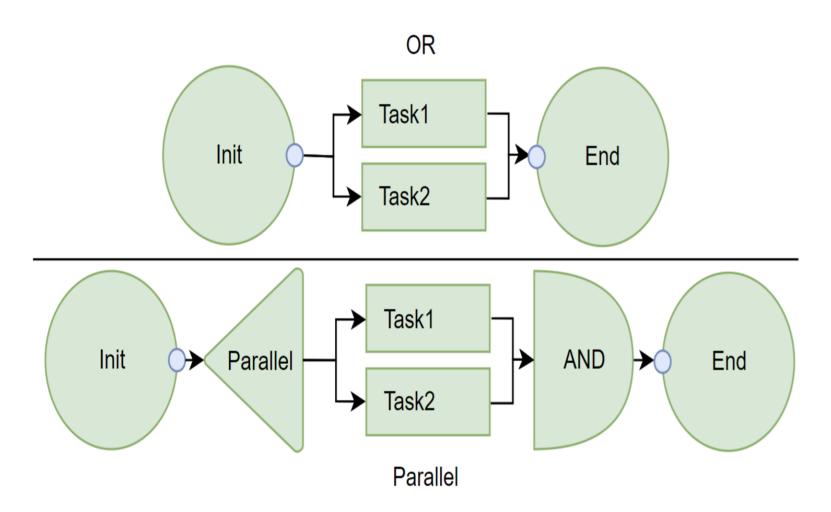

**Context and problematic**: XR-interfaced digital twins have become more frequent the last few years. However, authoring training scenarios using these environments for both virtual and augmented realities is still a complex task asking for specific technical skills. As a module for the VR authoring framework INTERVALES, NEURONES intends to allow business experts to create easily complex scenarios with multiple autonomous or human agents thanks to a no-code approach.

## **NEURONE** scenarios architecture



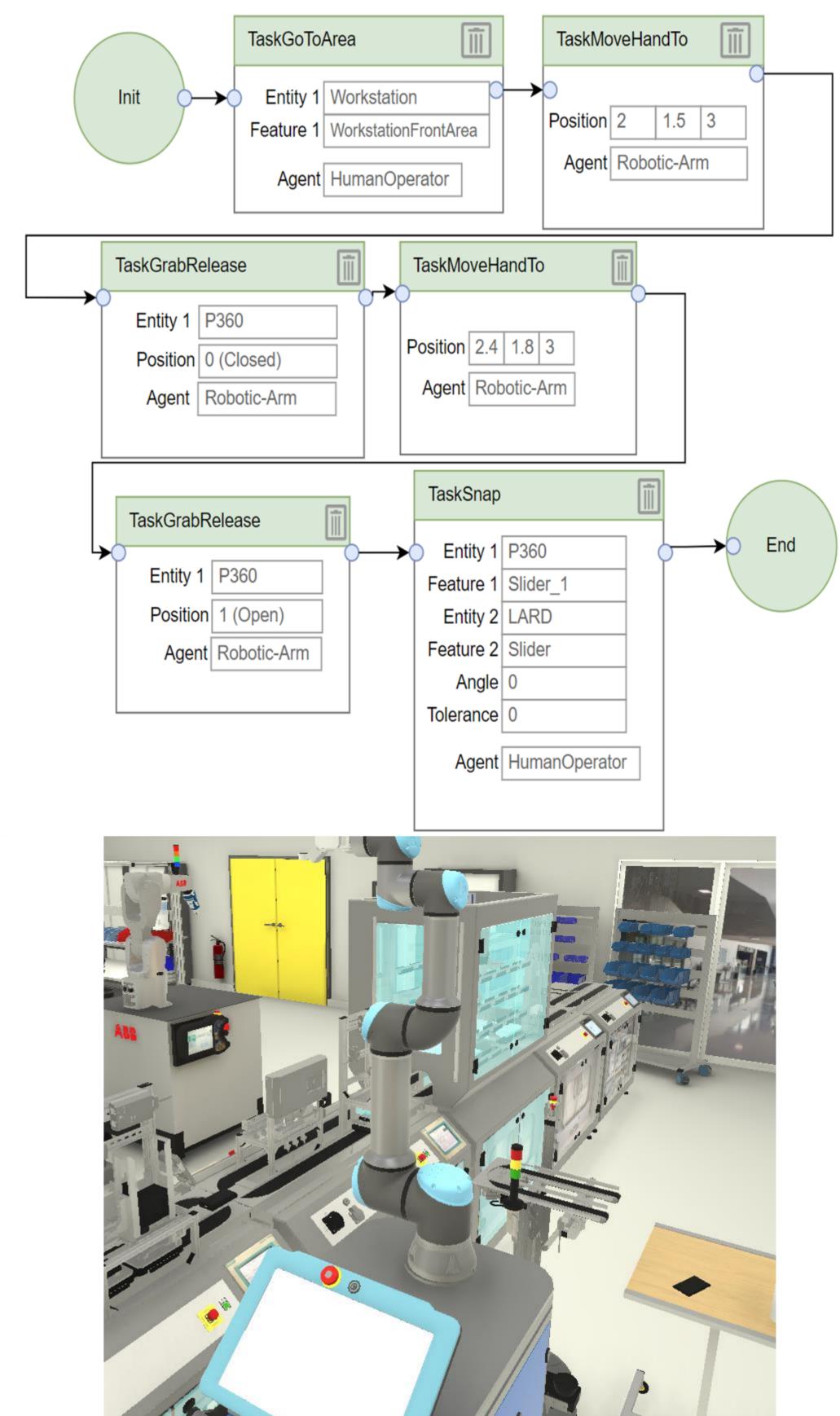
OR and PARALLEL nodes principle
