- Absorption spectra of PVT-118 (a) show two peaks at 295 nm (assigned to the).(poly(vinyl) chain) and 366 nm (assigned to the triazole groups)
- 366 nm peak is a good marker because PVT-118 interacts with SWCNT through the triazole groups by π -stacking
