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Self-assembly of Si-based particles for infrared-active metamaterials

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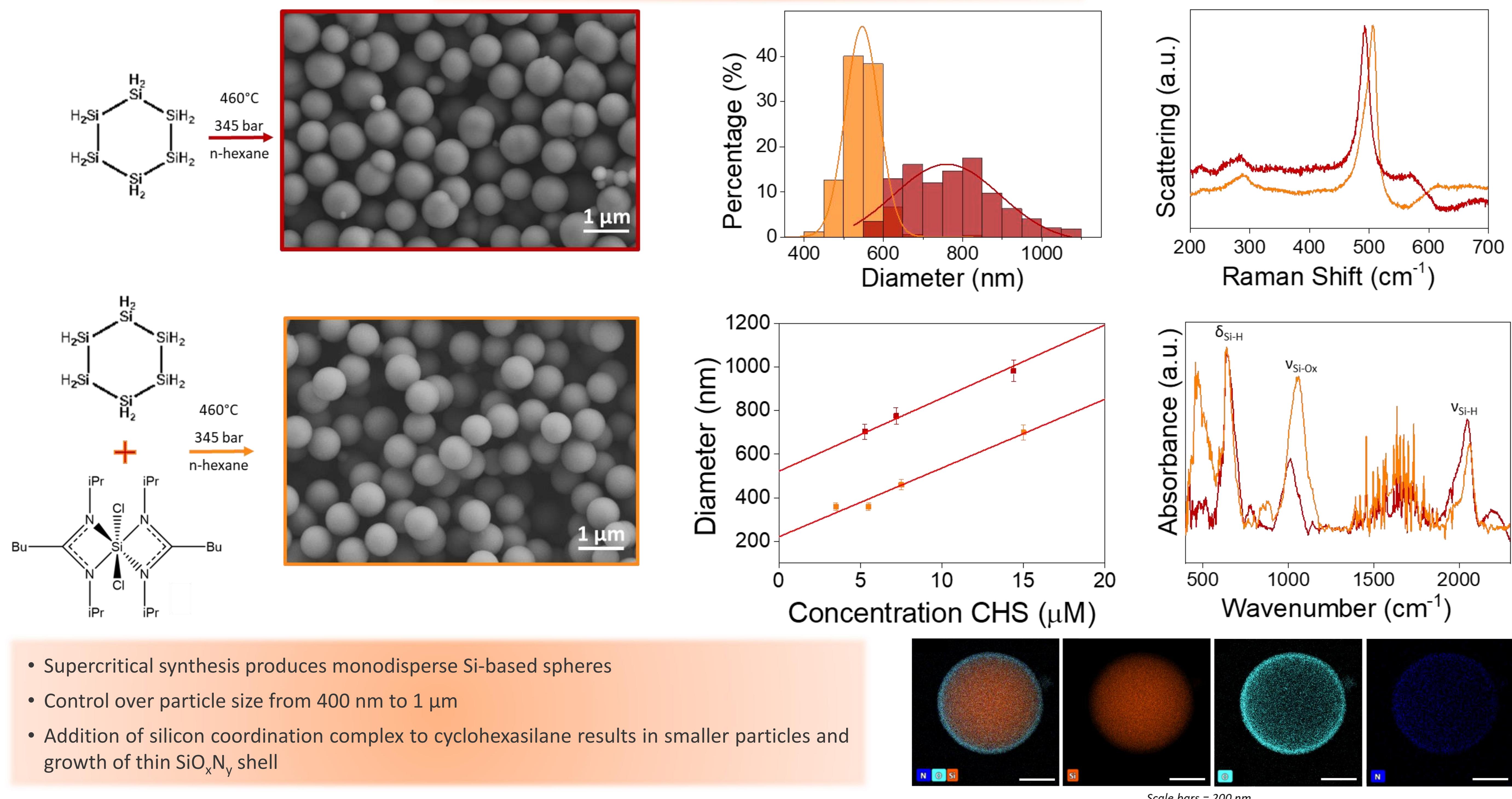
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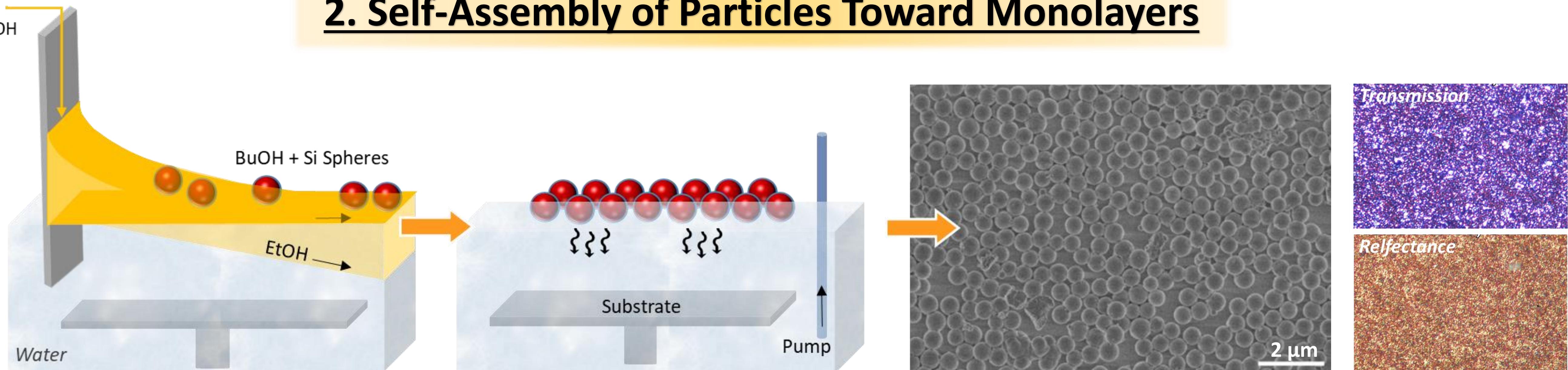
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Context: Si-based particles are synthesized from cyclohexasilane and a silicon coordination complex in supercritical hexane, a synthesis route which produces monodisperse spheres with control over particle size. A solution-based self-assembly method deposits the particles into a close-packed monolayer and optical properties are measured. Mie Theory calculations of single particles are compared to ellipsometry measurements of films of particle assemblies. We demonstrate that this material, synthesized from an entirely bottom-up approach, has high quality factor resonance in the near-IR with magnetic permeability $\mu \neq 1$.

1. Supercritical Synthesis of Si Particles

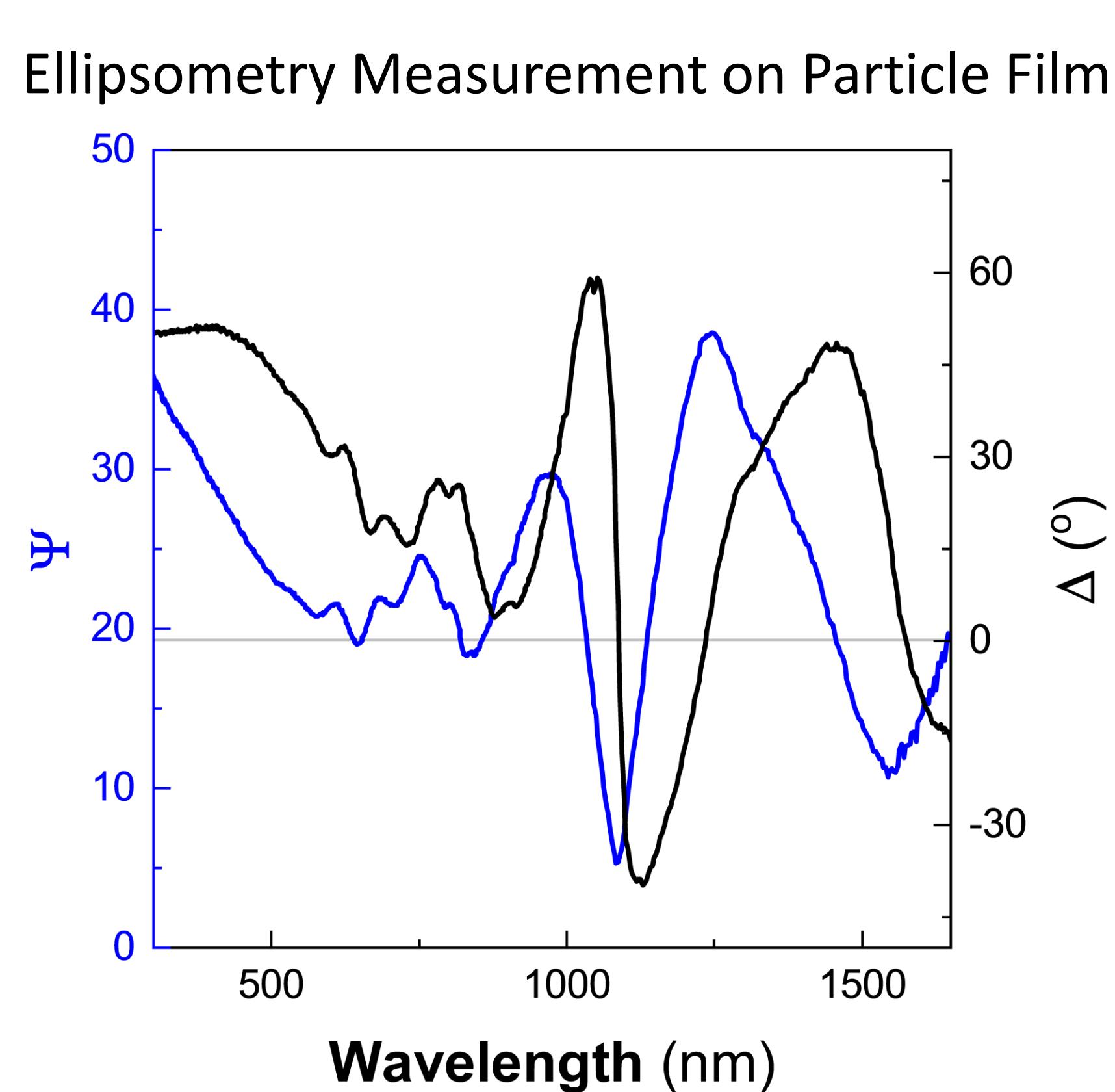
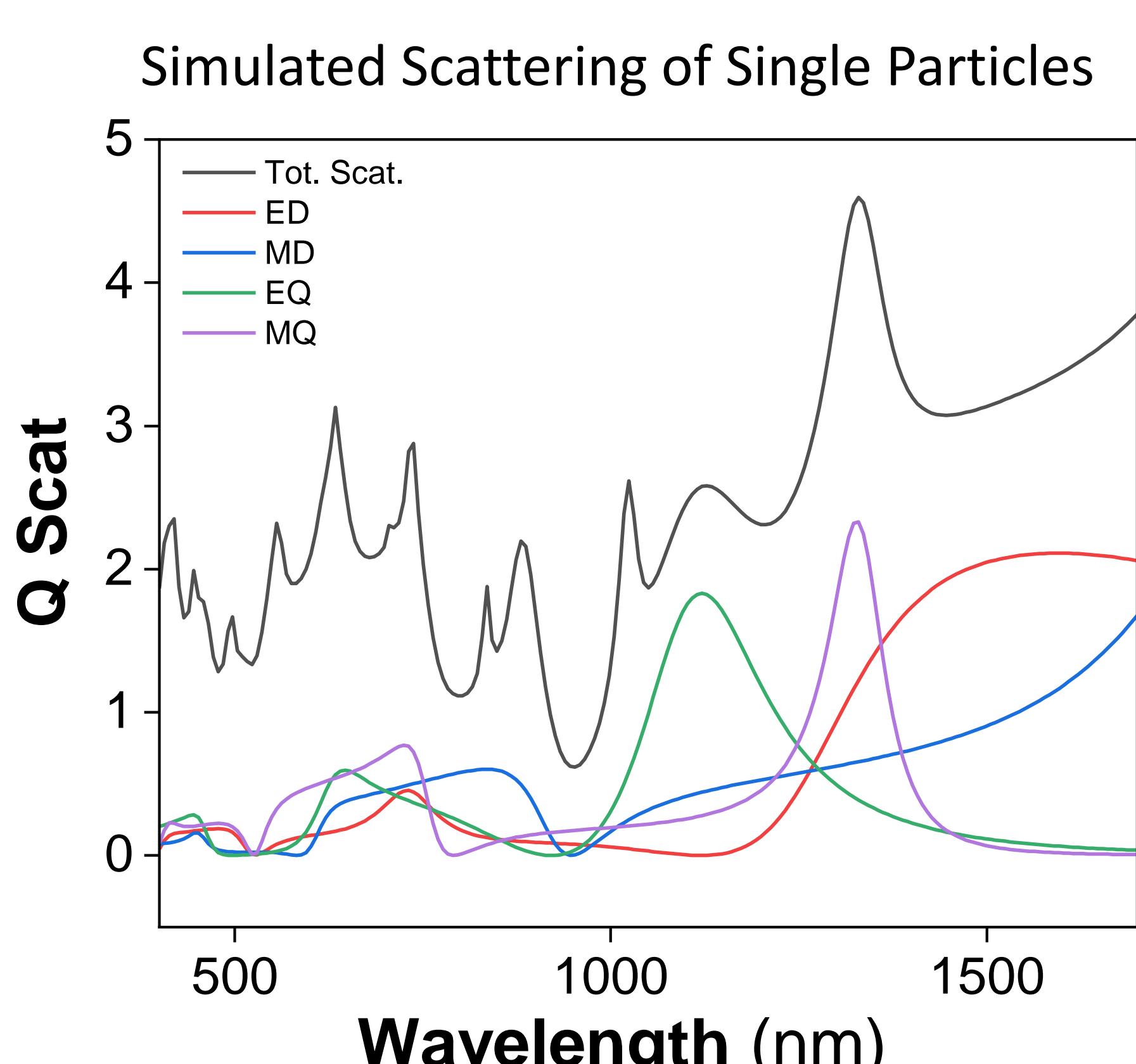


2. Self-Assembly of Particles Toward Monolayers



- Assembly method effective for large areas (1 cm²)
- Produces closely-packed particles - silica shell serves as spacer between resonators
- Films transmit purple light, while red light is reflected

3. Optical Characterization



Key Points:

- Intense resonances observed at near-IR wavelengths
- Resonances are not quenched when particles are assembled
- Metamaterial with high quality factor magnetic resonance (Q)
