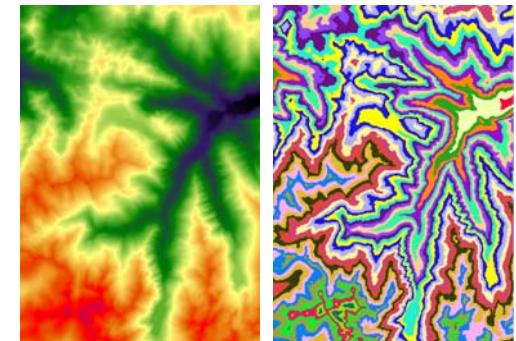
# Vicdessos

- Assess the degree of probability of LUCC by combining the uncertainties related to the model's parameters and the prospective scenarios



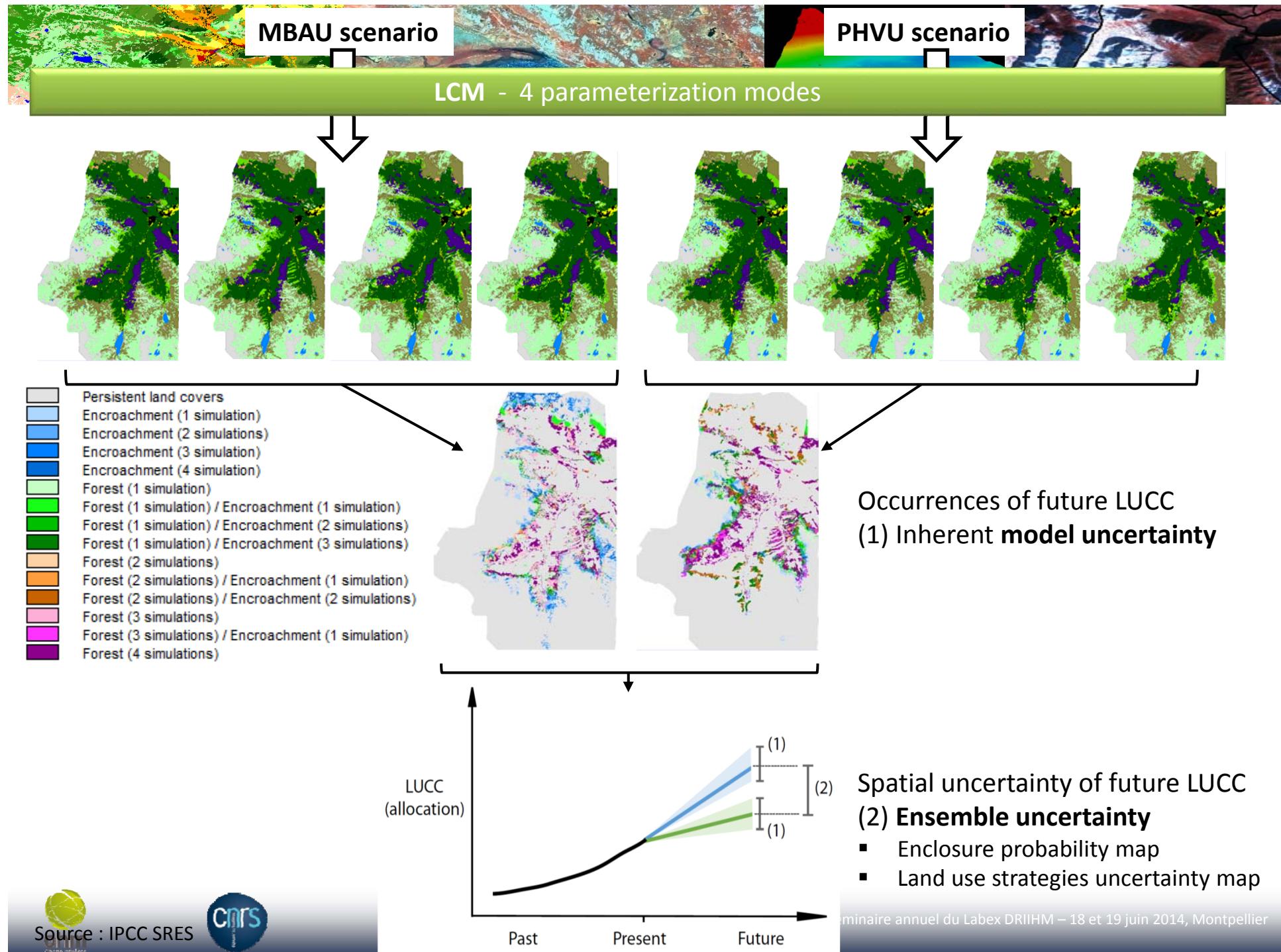

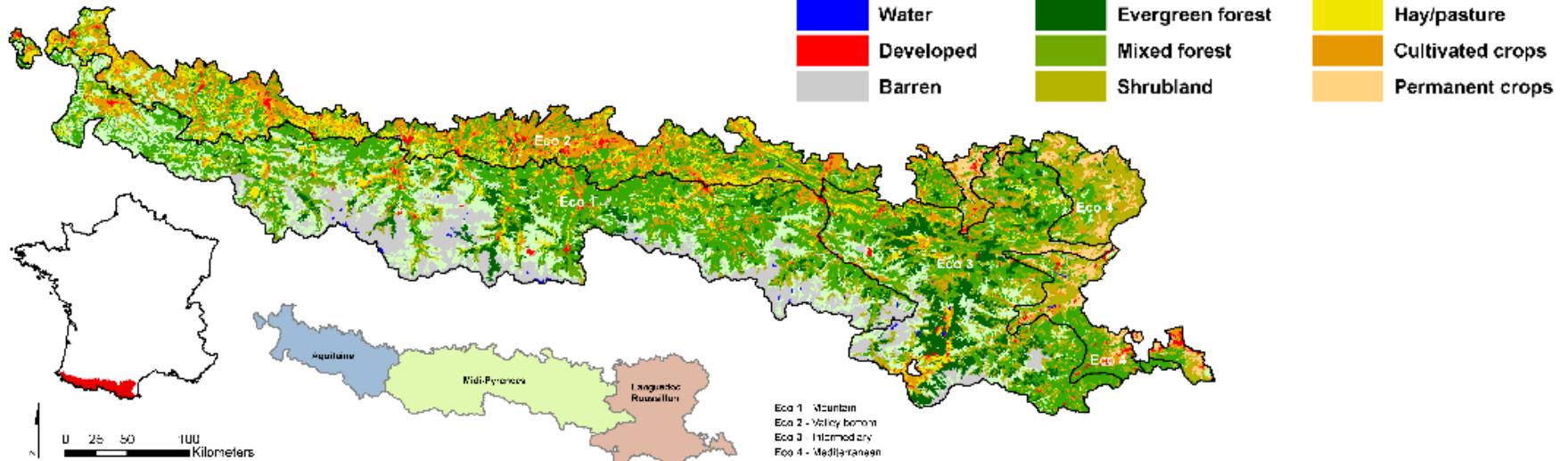


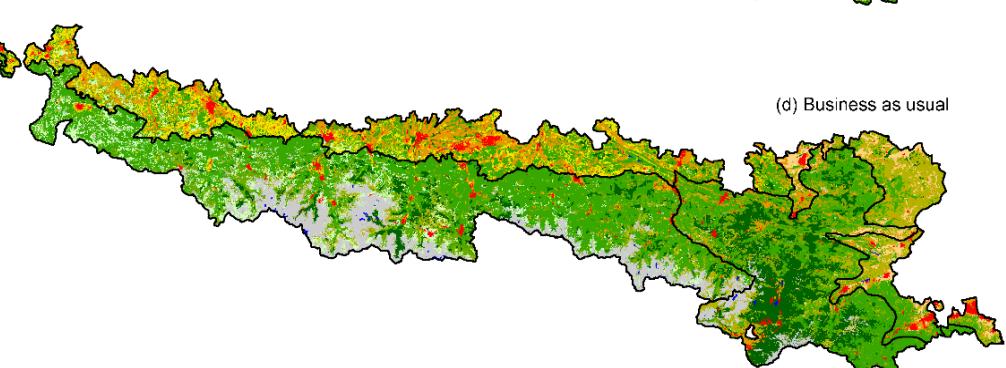
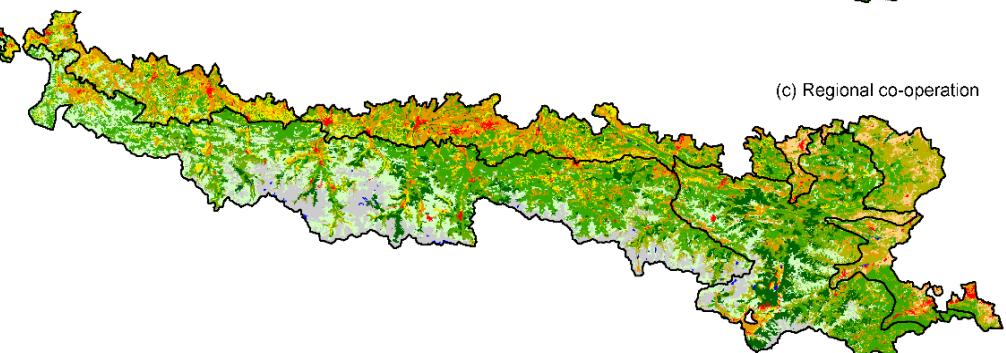
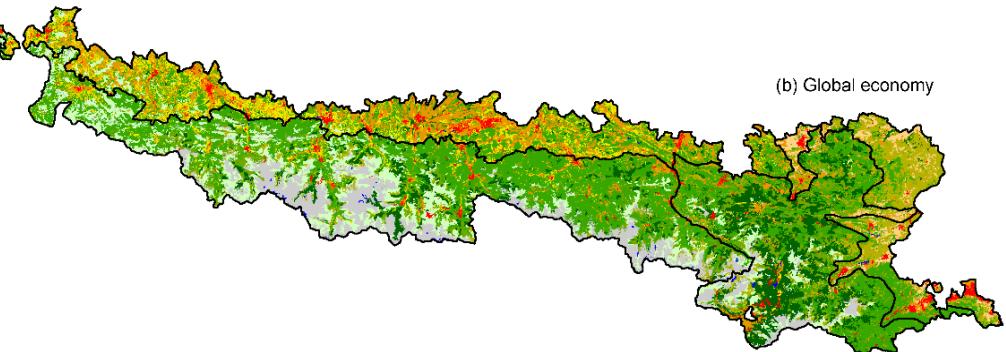
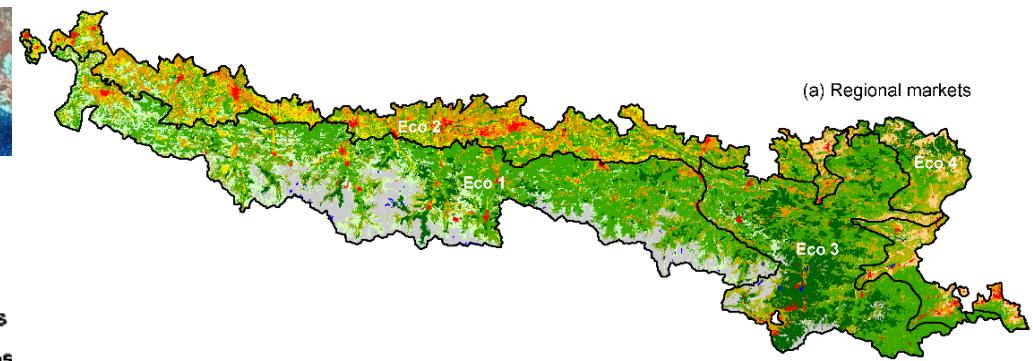
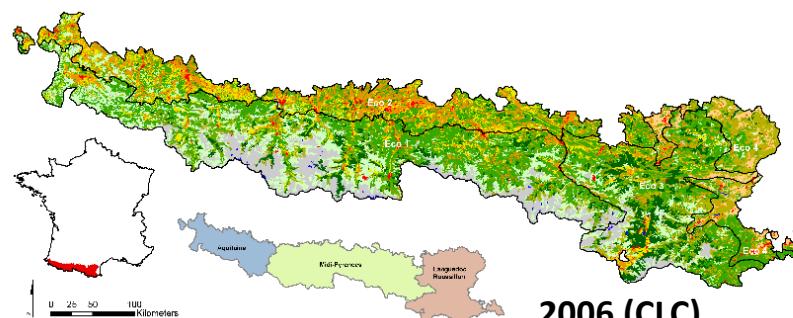
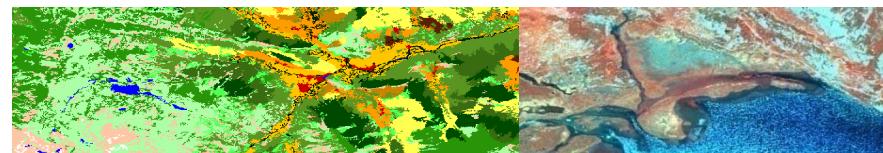
Land use strategies uncertainty map

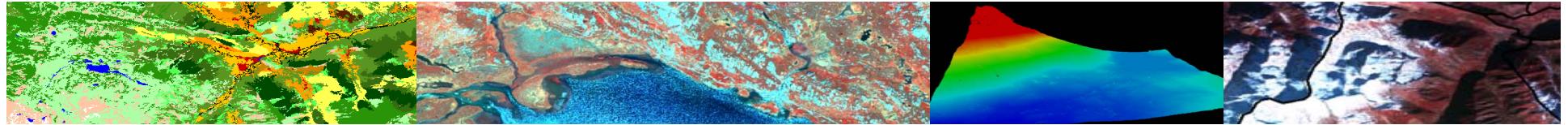




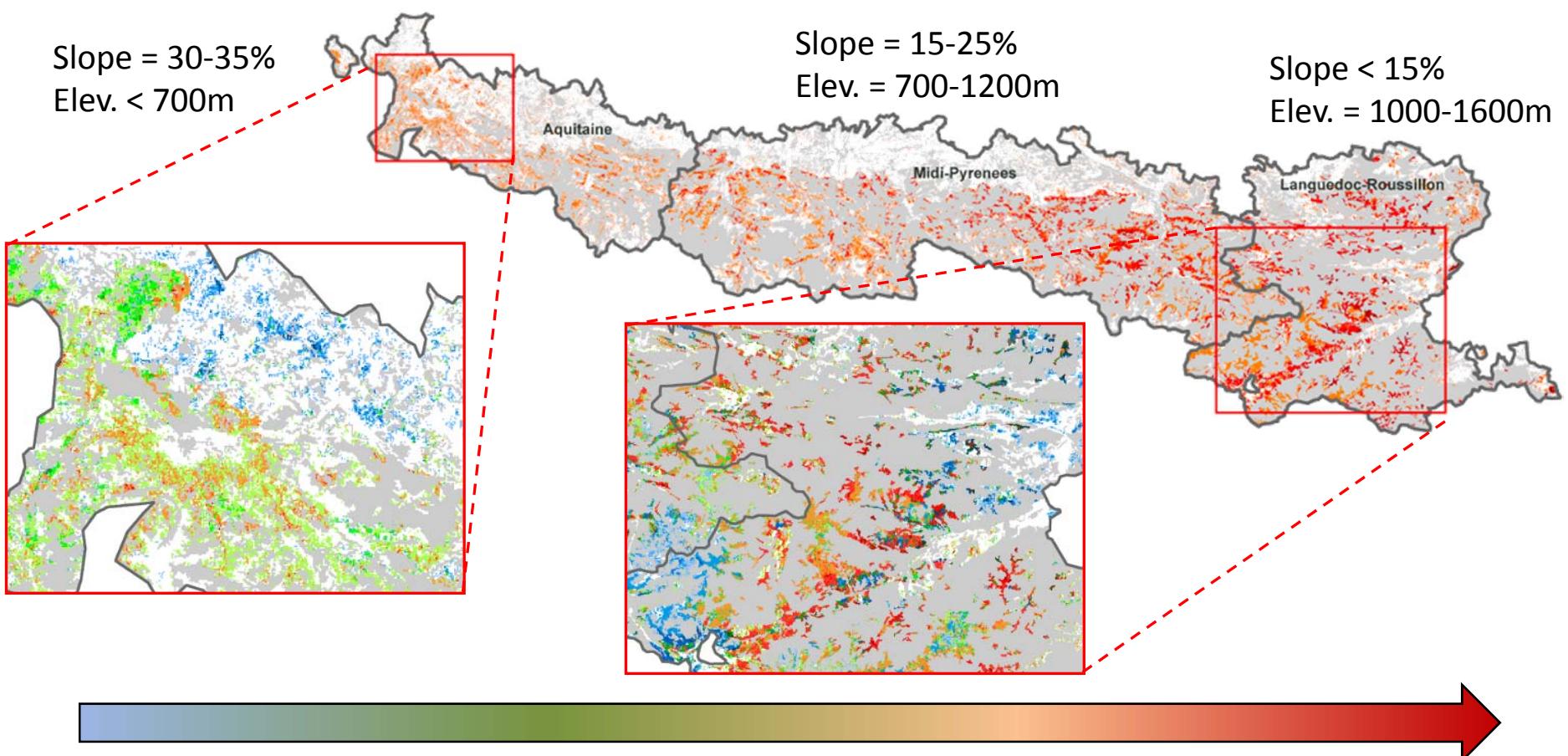

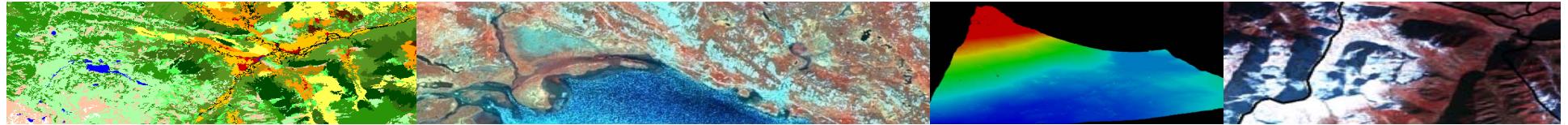






- Areas subjected to **encroachment and reforestation** dynamics in all scenarios
- **Highest rates** : productivity highly dependent on **socio-economic context + environmental and climatic conditions**

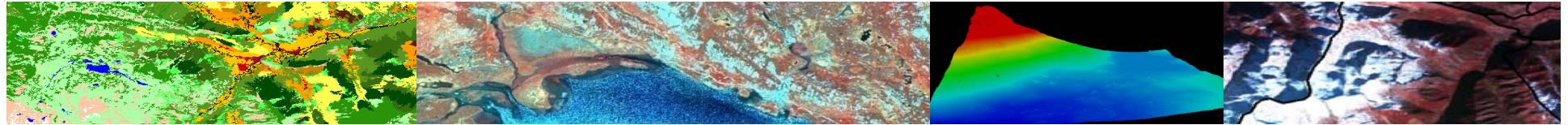

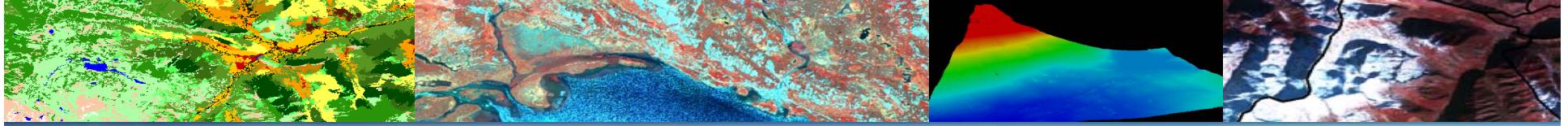
