


## What is EDAM?

EDAM is an ontology about data management & analysis in life sciences. Ontologies define **standard terminologies** and **relationships** between concepts. Those concepts are used to **annotate resources**: they are semantic metadata. Standard annotations increase the **findability & interoperability** of digital resources.



## Take-home

- EDAM is an ontology about data analysis
- Increases findability & interoperability
- Developed in a participatory manner
- Extends beyond life sciences

genomic concepts for FAIR genomic tracks [coming soon]


## Continuous integration

## Annotating resources

- Numerous content providers use EDAM annotations
- Those resources are interoperable



## Mapping concepts

- Concepts can be visualized with **EDAM popovers** navigator extension
- **EDAM map** allows **text mining** concepts in scientific articles or web resources



## Navigating the ontology

- The **EDAM browser** allows to **navigate current and past versions**
- Suggestions for terms or attributes can be made using GitHub issues
