Conclusion and discussion

- outperform (HI) for $5 \leq N \leq 25$.
- (LI), (WLS) and (HI) look similar for the non-smooth functions F_i , $i \leq 3$. • (LI) and (WLS) look similar for the very smooth function F_4 , and they
- For $1 \le N \le 4$, (WLS) reduces to (HI), because the chosen weight has the degree of accuracy 4N - 1 (it is the optimal one).
- More generally, (WLS) can be solved efficiently by a few iterations of suitable iterative solvers, due to the structure of the normal matrix.
- For instance, compromises between (HI) and (WLS) have been achieved using truncated Neumann series.
- Perspectives include the use of fast spherical transforms [6] to reduce the computational cost.
