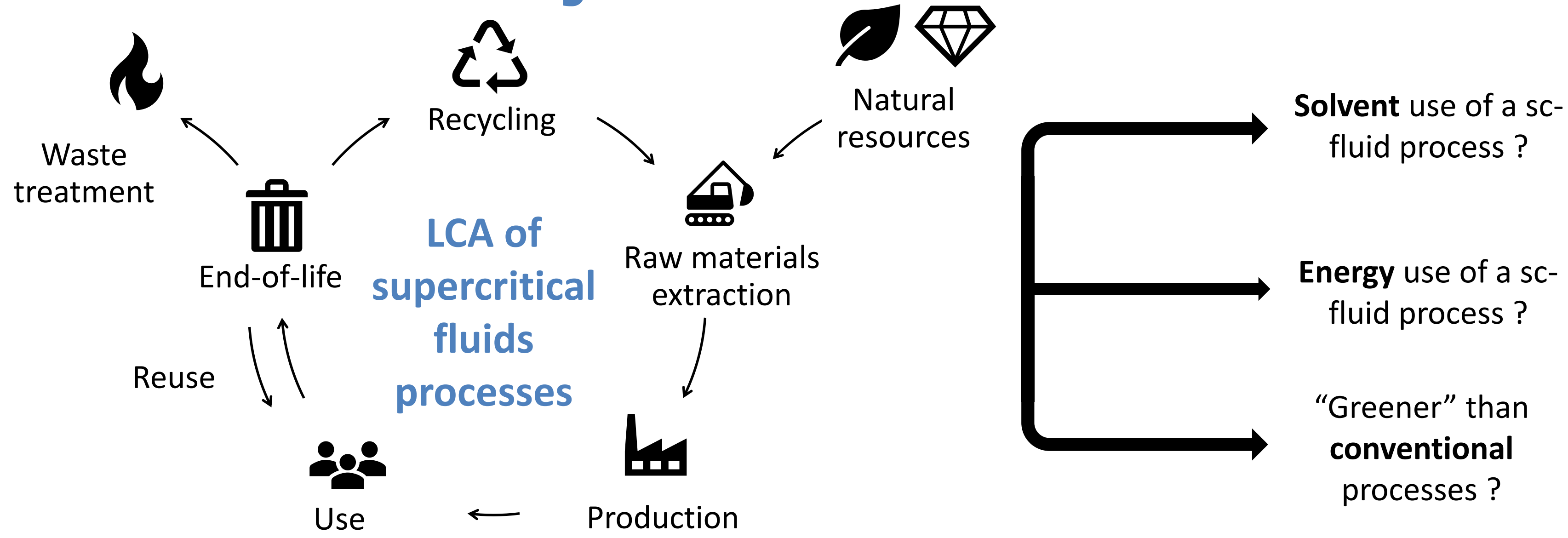

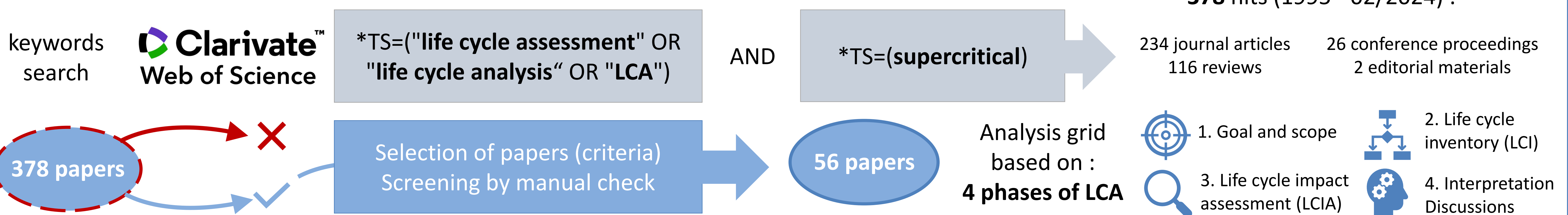


Objectives :

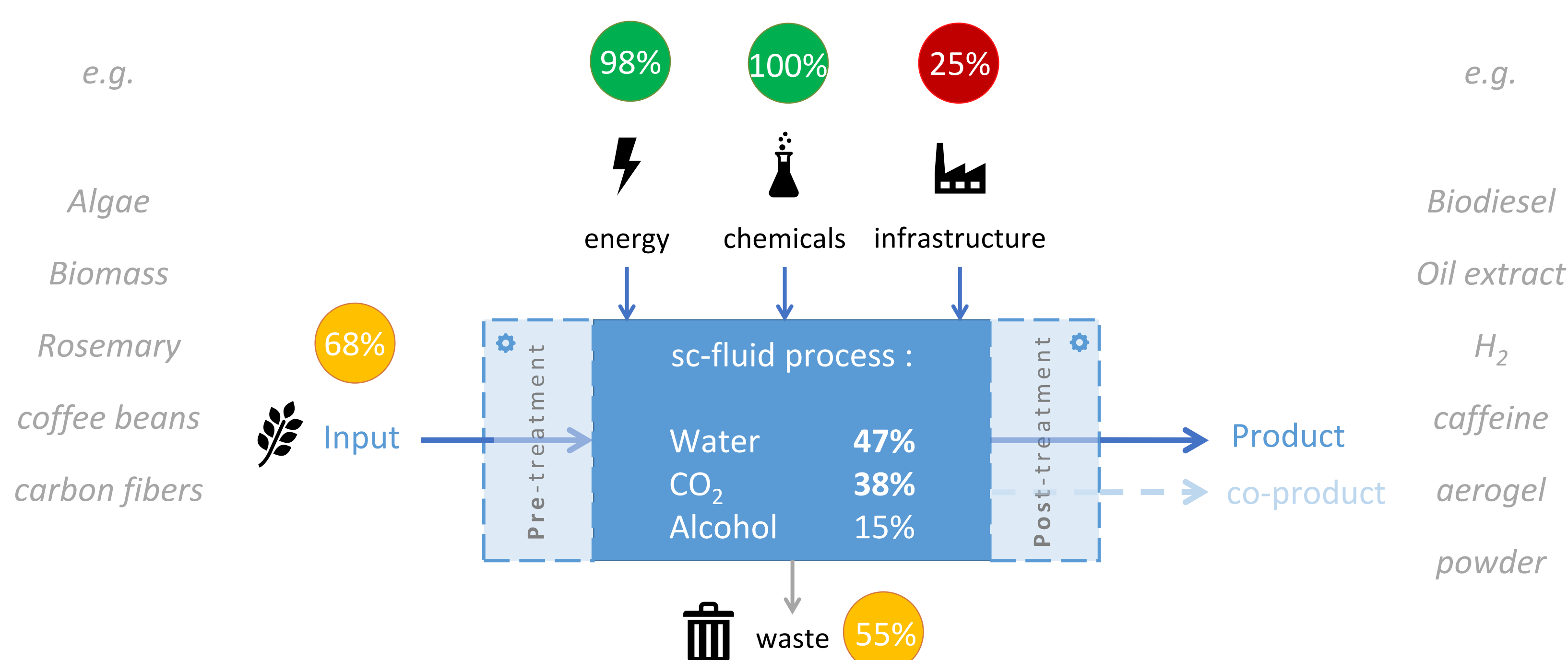
