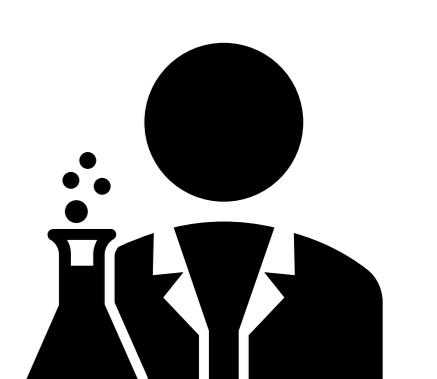

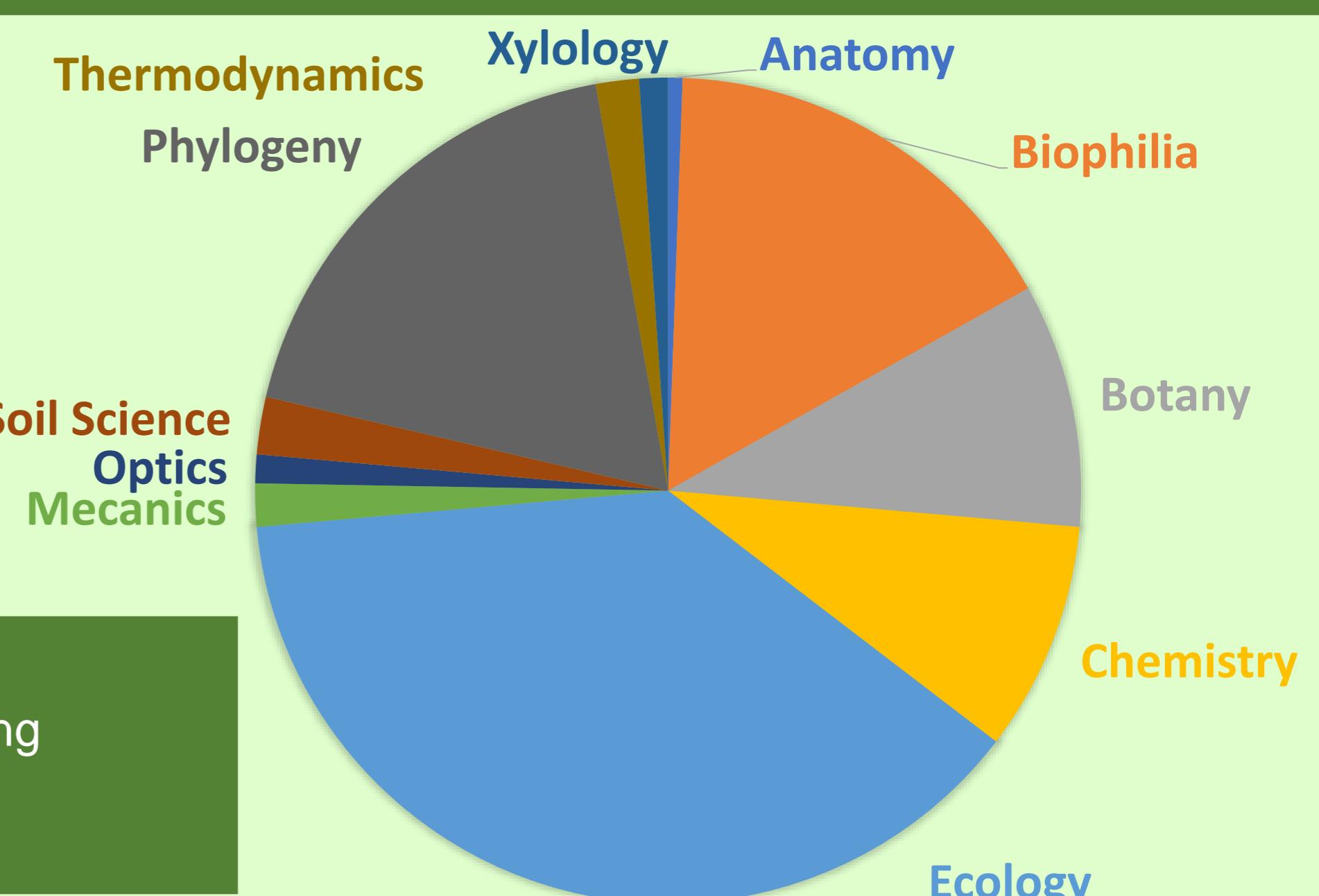

Why doing research in Science Education in Forest School context?

- Nature-deficit disorder (Louv, 2005)
- Nature enhances learning (Kuo et al., 2019)
- Nature experiences, nature connectedness (Léna, 2021)
- Environmental knowledge and connectedness to nature are related to ecological behaviour (Otto & Pensini, 2017)
- "Éducation par et dans la nature" [Education by and within nature] (Boelen & Nicolas, 2023)

Framework and methods

Praxeology (Chevallard, 1999)

- Learning: what? how?
- Praxis: tasks, types of tasks and techniques (used to perform the task)
- Logos: scientific justification and explanation of praxis
- Praxeology shapes learning in all human activities

Relationships with the living world (Dell'Angelo-Sauvage, 2009)

- Affective criteria: physical contact, rejection, relationships
- Practical criteria
- Cognitive criteria: observing, questioning, using knowledge
- Impassivity or apathy of children
- Other criteria: aesthetics, legal, moral, imaginary, cultural, spiritual...

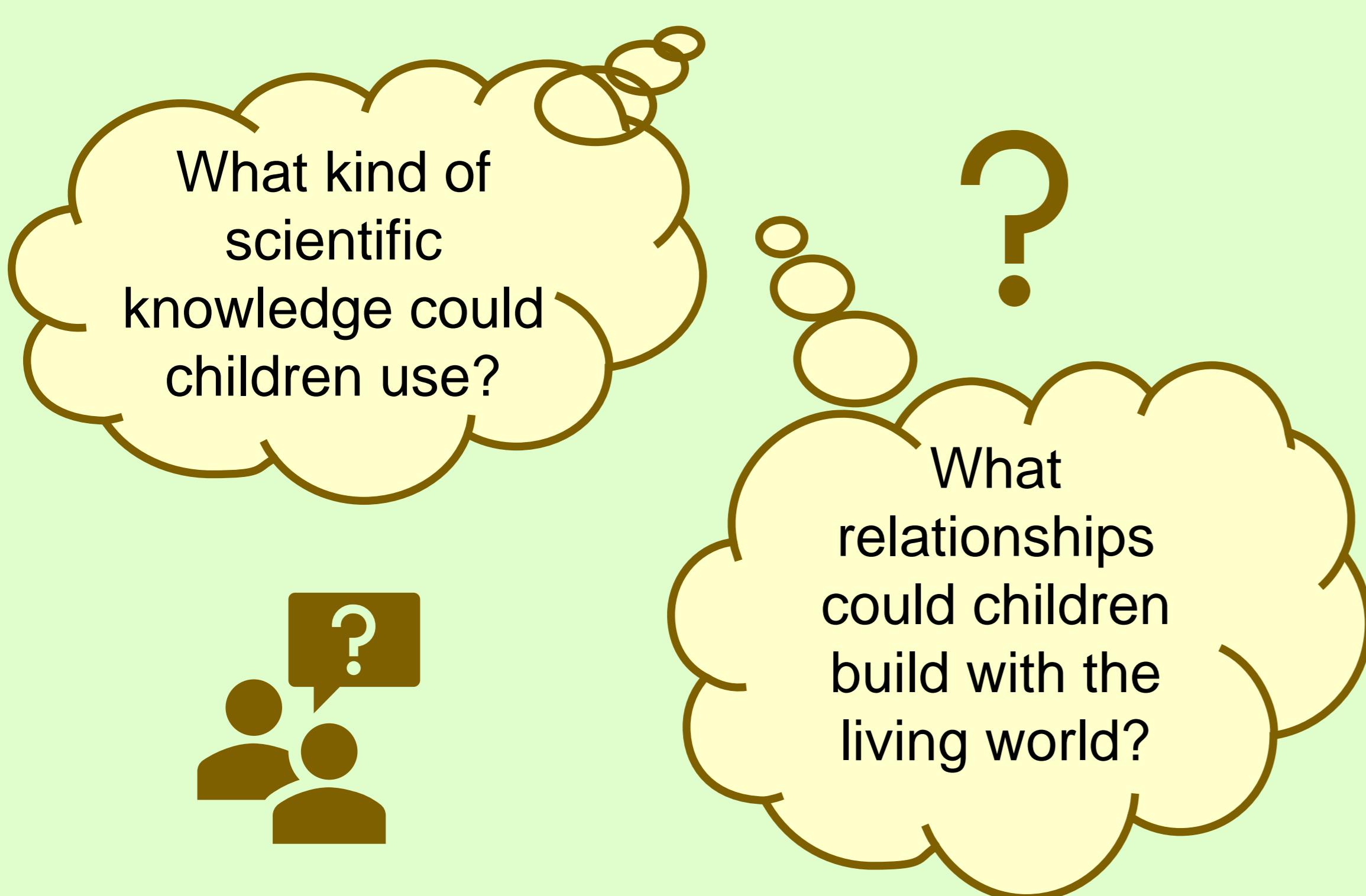

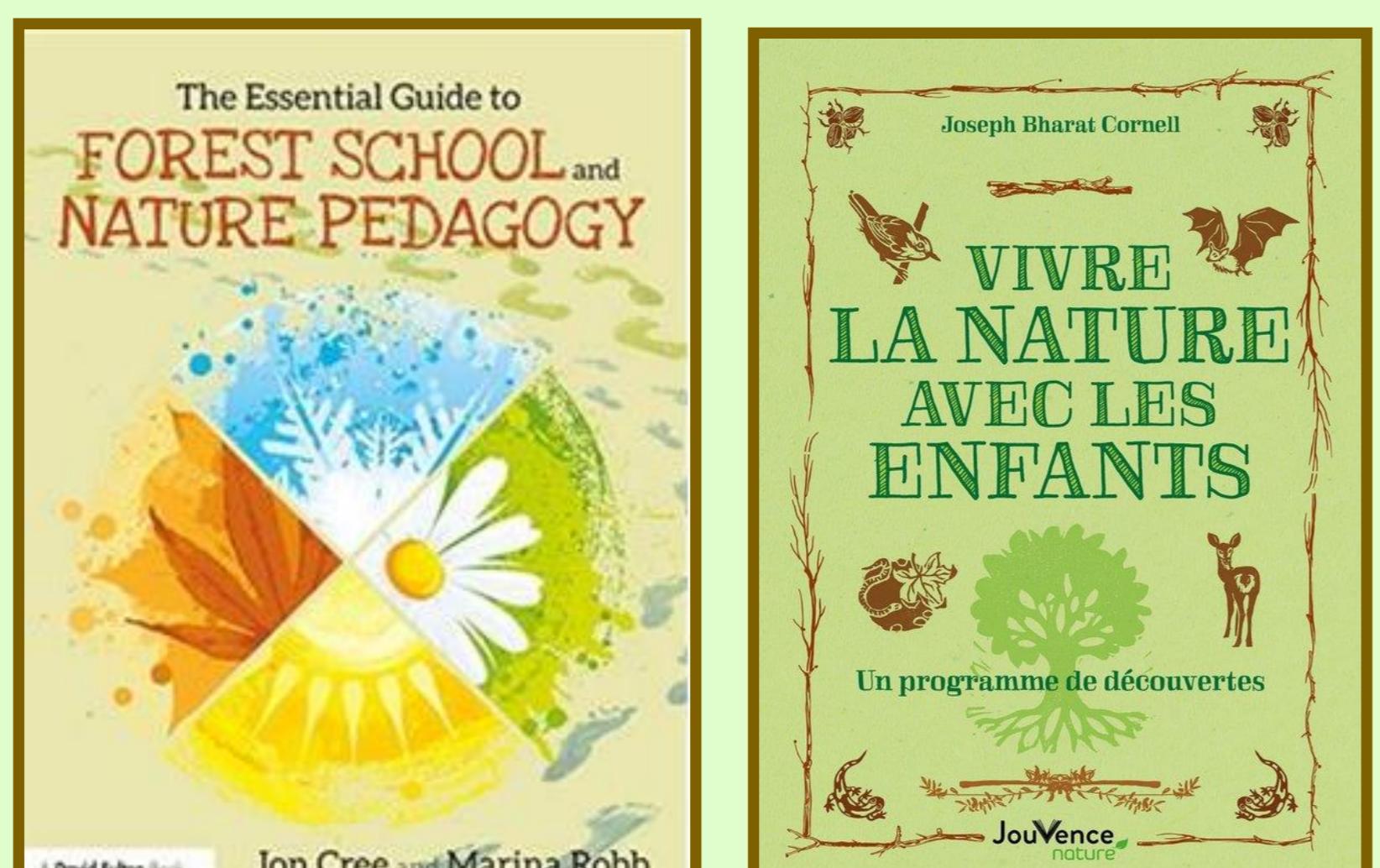
Choosing a location to build the worm hotel (film 3)

Relationships with nature and the living world

- Affective criteria: choosing a location, modelling the mud, taking the worm in one's hands, crying
- Practical criteria: building
- Cognitive criteria: using knowledge about worms
- Imaginary criteria: inventing a life for worms

Conclusion

- Children may build scientific knowledge in botany, ecology, soil science and phylogeny
- The affective register is the most commonly used
- Other kinds of relationships: cognitive, practical and imaginary
- Issues for practitioners: recognising situations that are potentially rich in scientific knowledge and knowing how to nurture them
- Issues for schools: providing an encounter with nature before introducing scientific knowledge
