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Benefits of intraoral cobotic scanning in the dental CAD/CAM chain





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Introduction

- In the last years, the modernisation of the digital impression has been made possible thanks to digital intra-oral scanners (IOS) and additive manufacturing machines, which are increasingly used in dentistry, and enable the quality of dental care to be improved.
- **STL files** obtained with IOS are the **first step** in digital manufacture of dental prostheses.
- Effective patient care are reflected in precision, accuracy and fidelity of CAD files [1-2].
- Many factors are involved, including the practitioner [3].

Objectives

- Define a repeatable and reproducible experimental measurement protocol with the cobot.
- **Programming** the cobot to teach the practitioner the scanning gesture.
- Carrying out a test campaign.
- In vitro experiments:

Experiment 1: Scanning for an entire dental with spheres on the second molars and first premolars.

Experiment 2: Scanning for an entire dental arch.

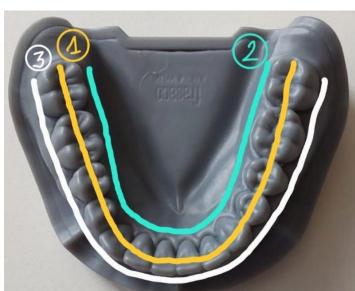
- Creation of the trajectory on Solidworks.

Using only the wireless side with its standard tip.

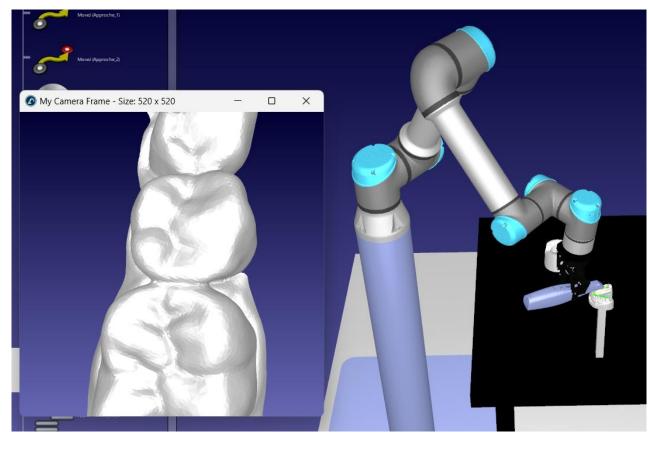

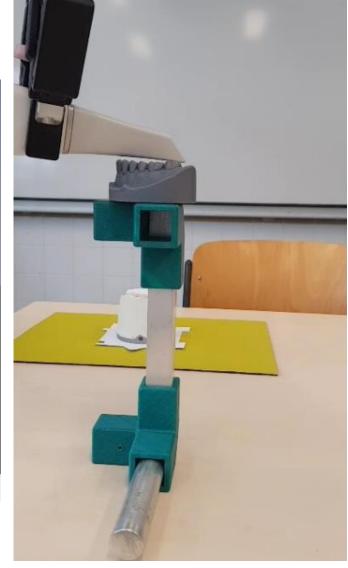




Results
