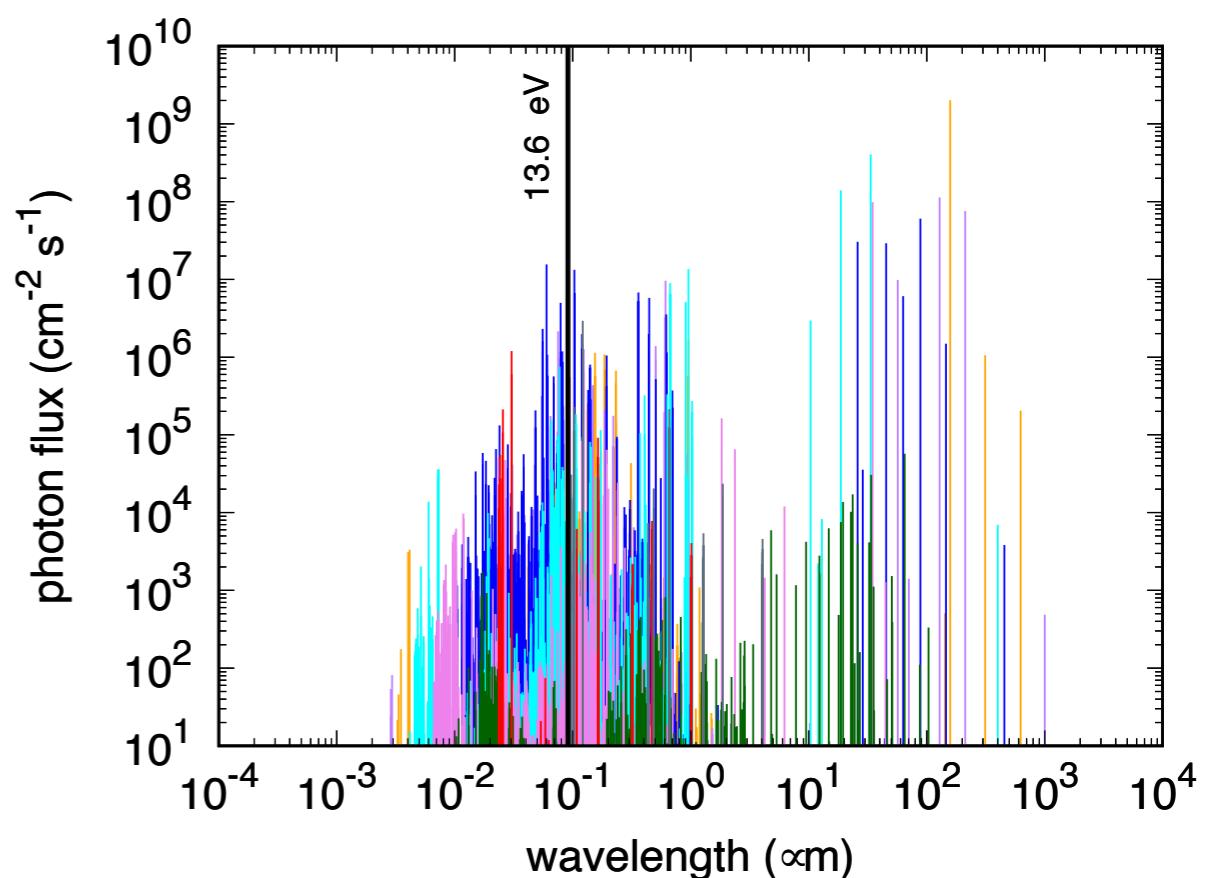
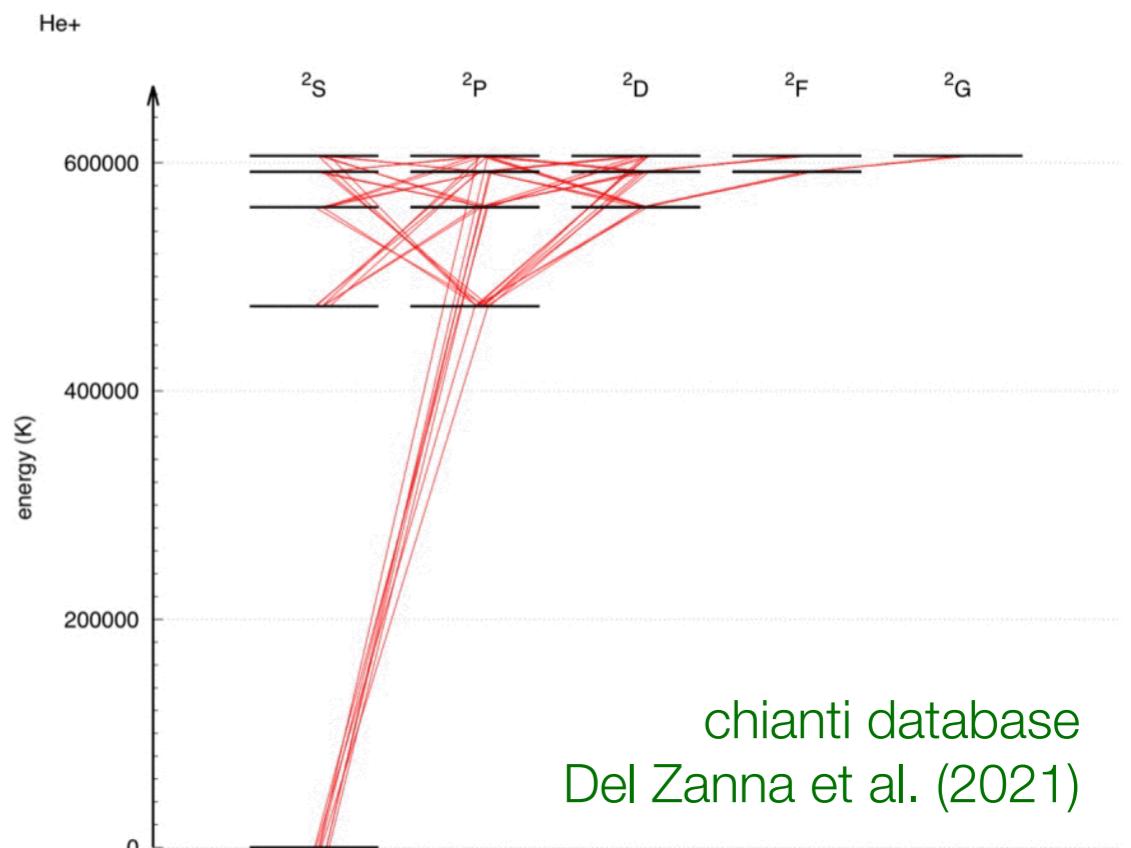
Paris-Durham shock code

- feedback on shock chemistry

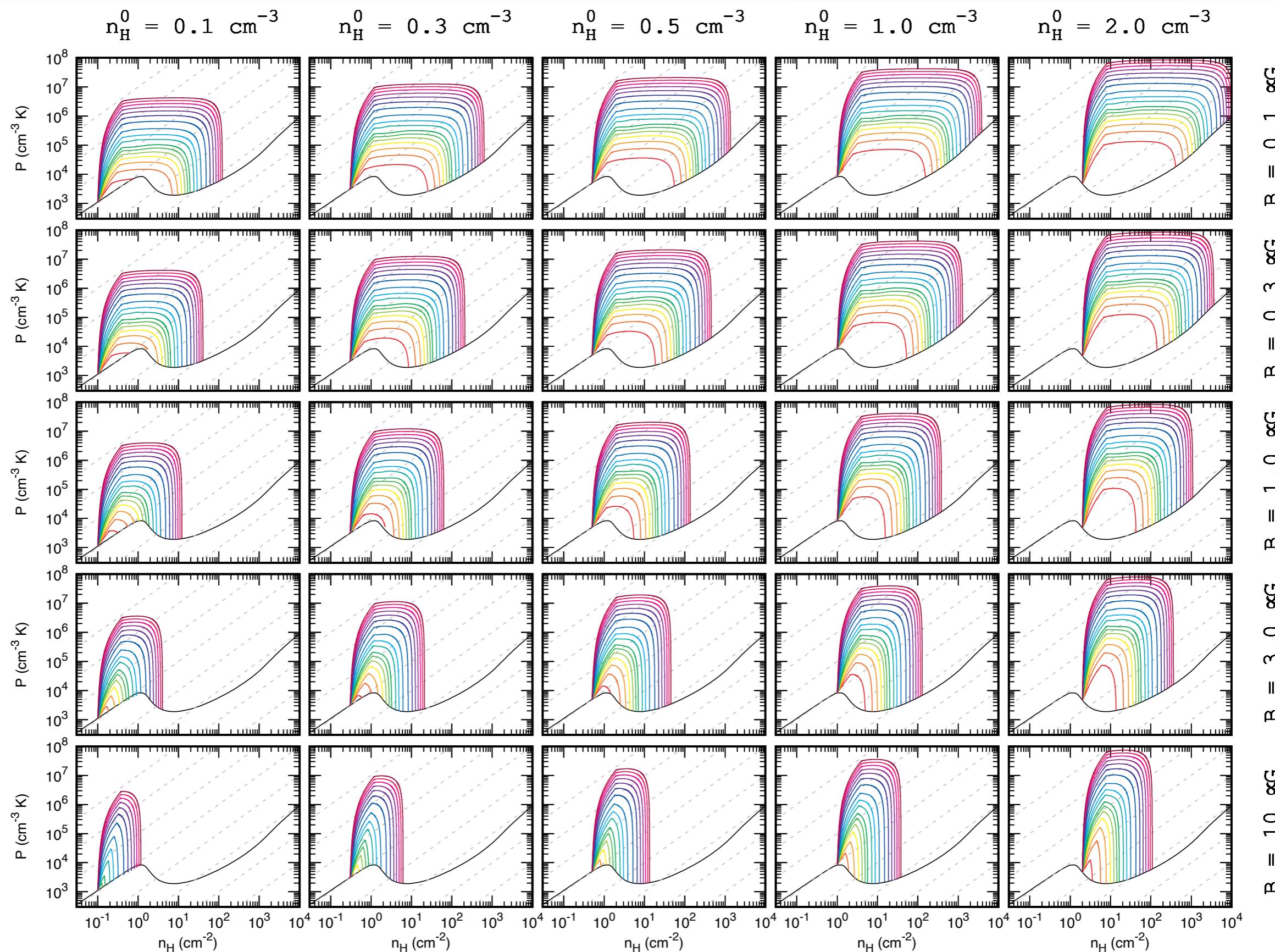

- iterative scheme

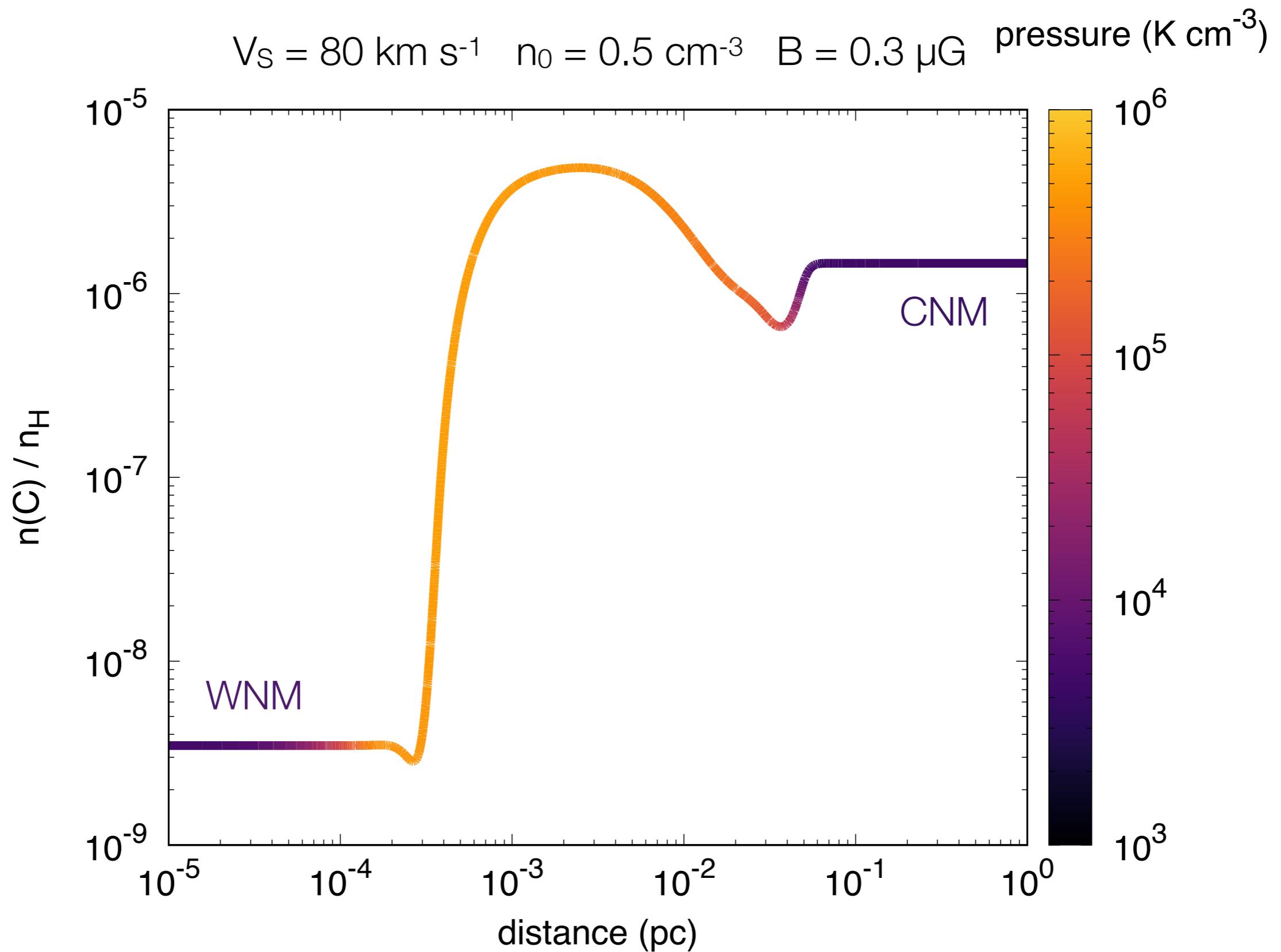


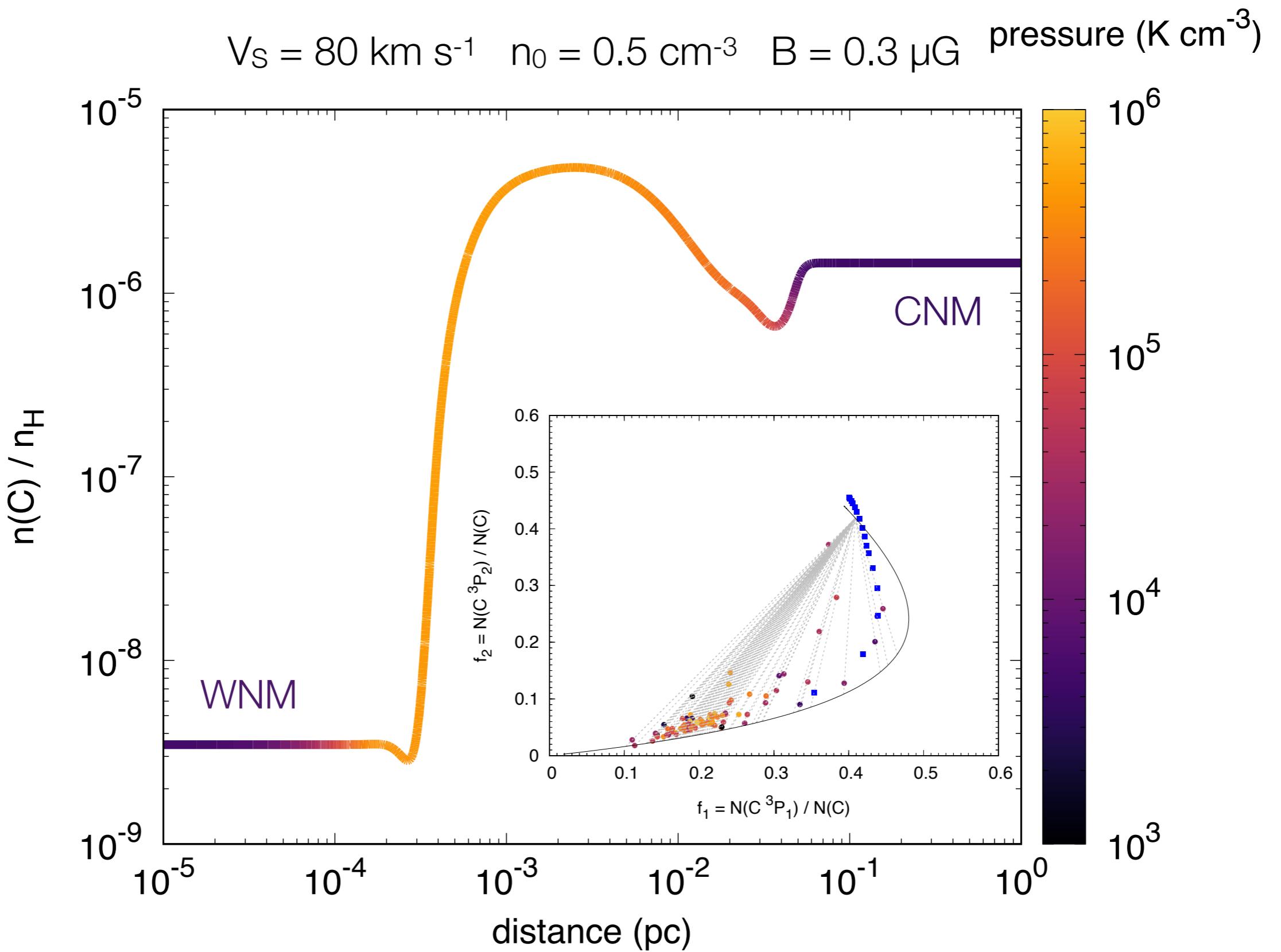
shock velocity up to 500 km s^{-1}

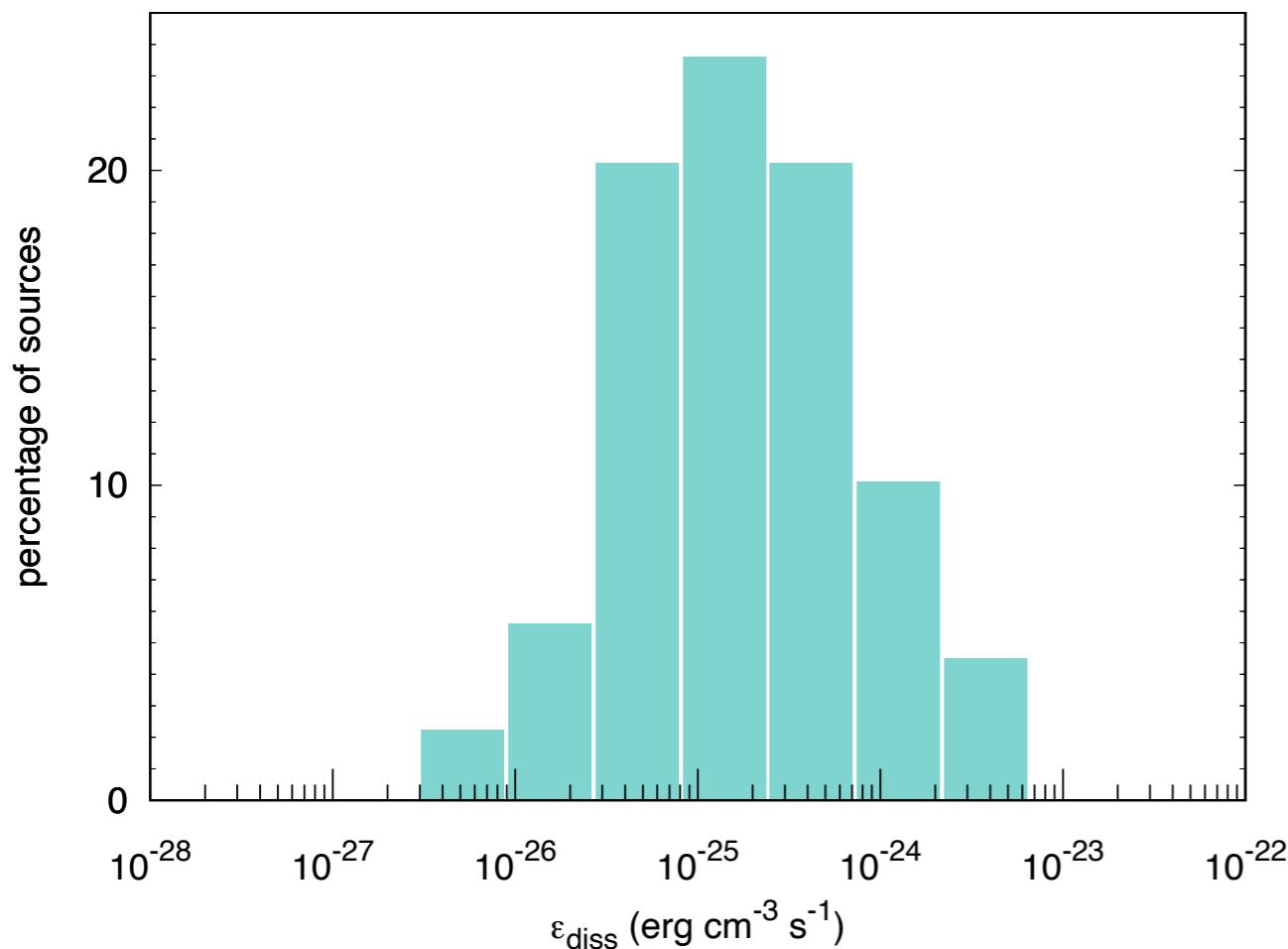




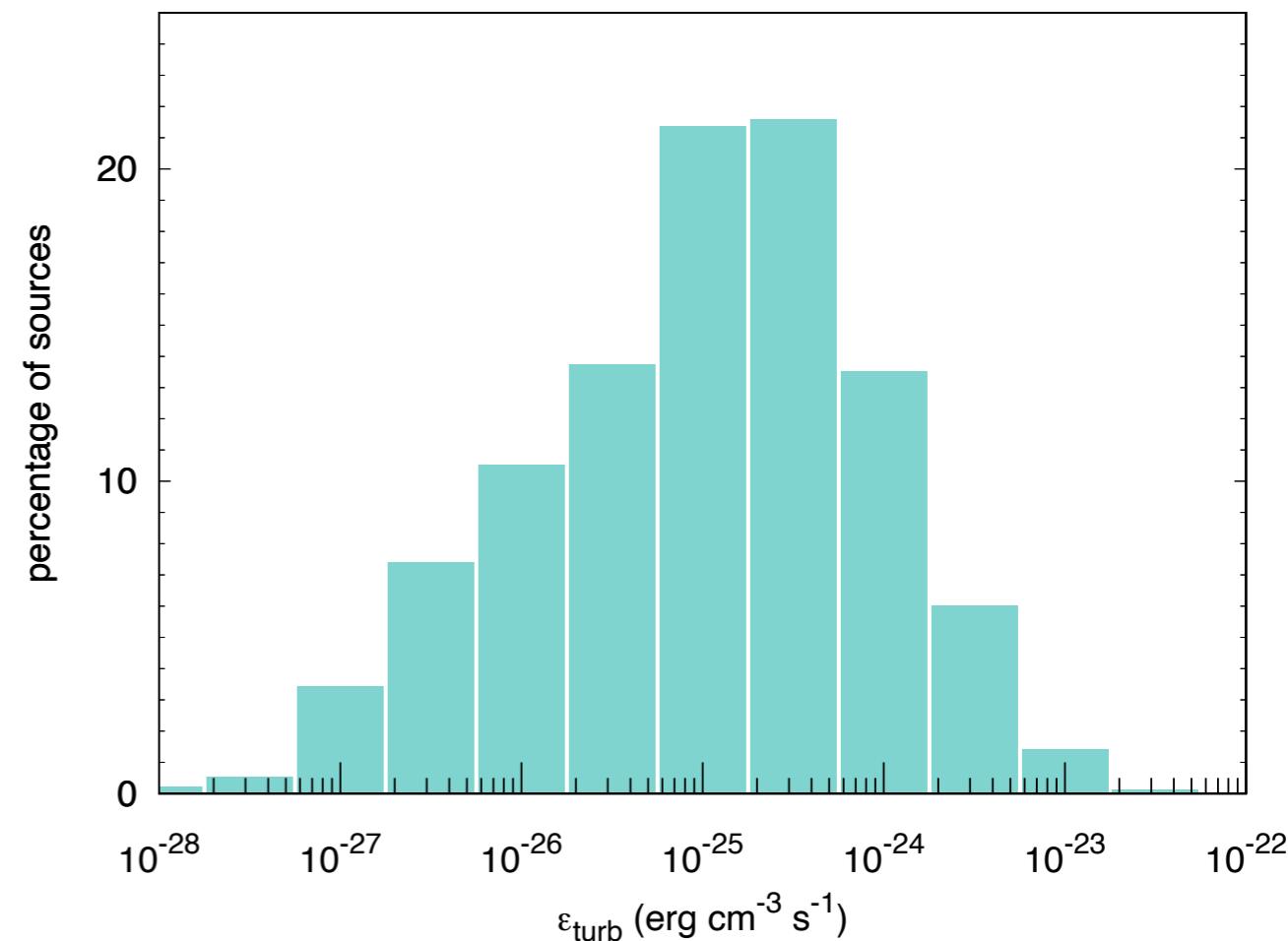


background sources in Jenkins & Tripp sample are OB stars

dissipation rate in WNM

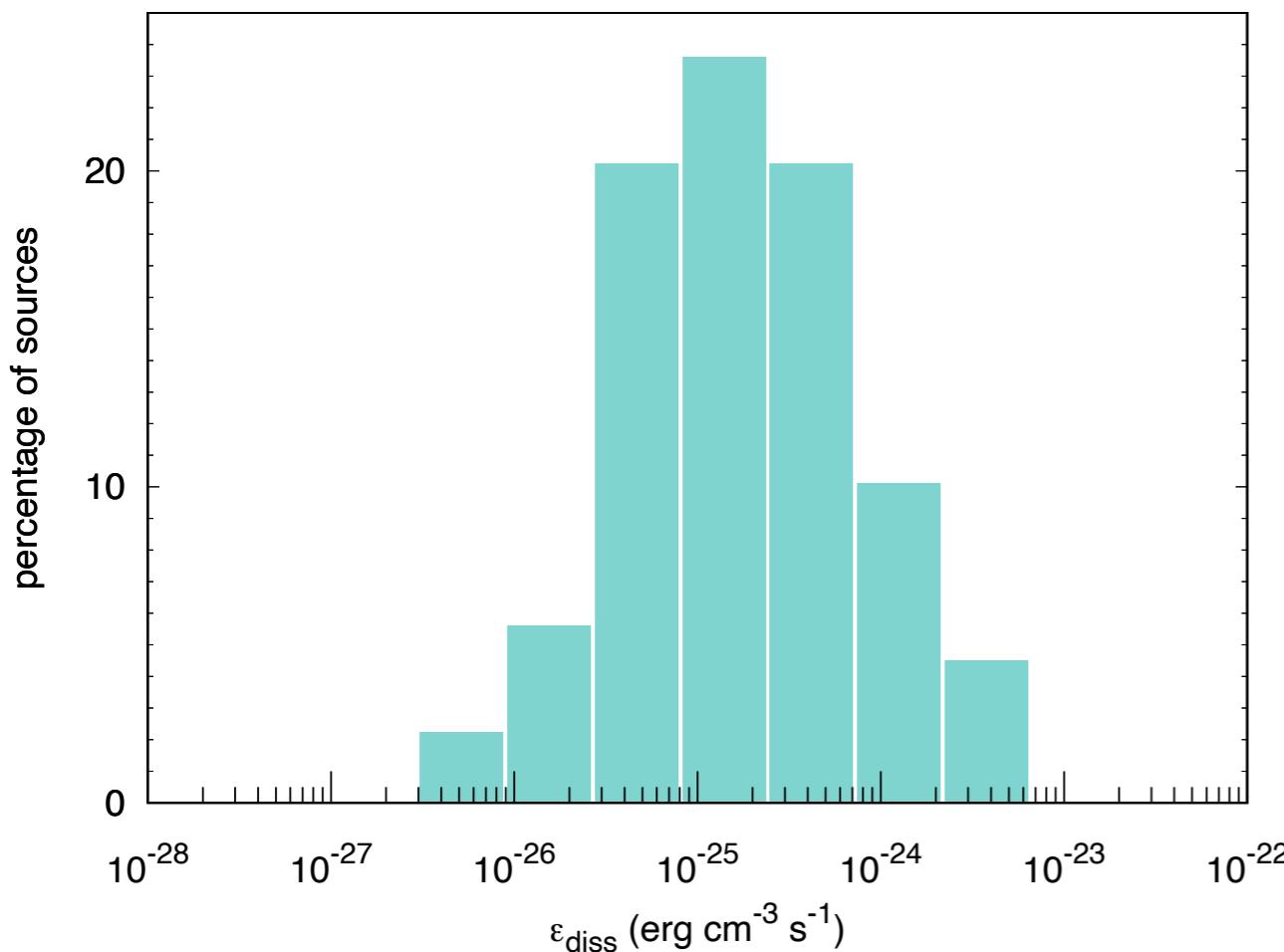


turbulent transfer rate in CNM

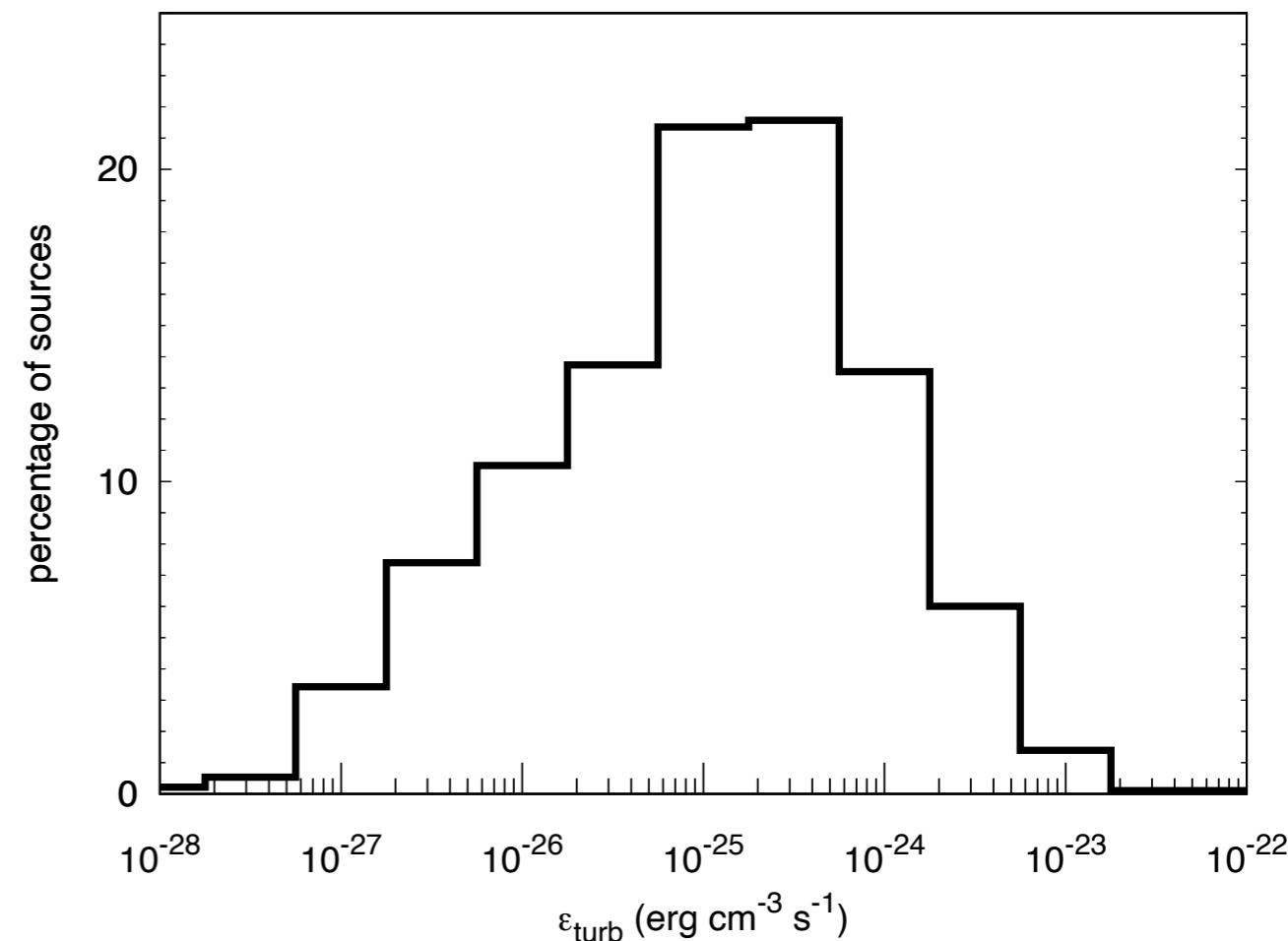
