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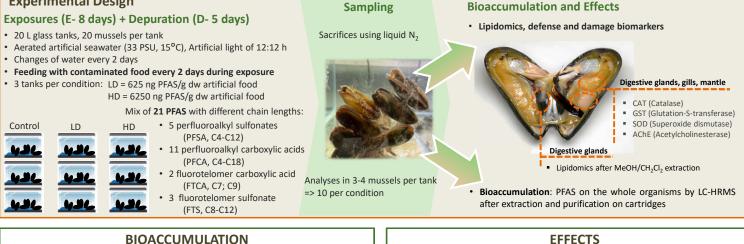
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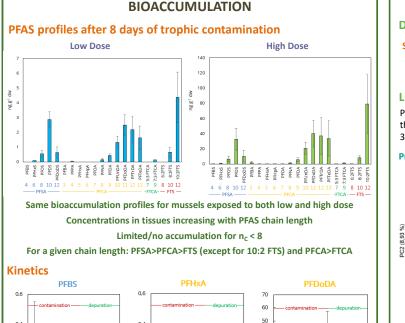
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Introduction

Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are a family of non-naturally occurring chemicals, regrouping more than 4000 non-naturally compounds. They have been in the spotlight for the last two decades over reports of their ubiquitous presence in the environment and especially in oceans. Combined evidence for their persistence, bioaccumulative and toxic properties have led to the ban of specific compounds (e.g. PFOS, long-chain PFCAs) but a large number of precursor compounds of unknown environmental behavior remains in use. Despite their properties, there is still a dramatic lack of knowledge on the exposure of biota to PFAS and on their subsequent bioaccumulation and potential toxic effects.

Defense and Damage Biomarkers

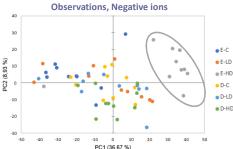
Significant increases of SOD and GST activities in the digestive glands of mussels exposed to PFAS compared to controls, recovered after the depuration phase

No effect on CAT and AChE activities

Lipidomics

Processing of FIA-HRMS data with MZmine2 to obtain a matrix of the intensity of the signal of all observed positive and negative ions of each sample, higher than 3xblanks

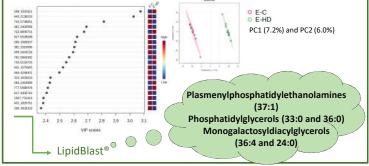
Principal Component Analysis (PCA, unsupervised analysis)



The mussels exposed to the highest dose during 8 days are grouped and separated from the others

Partial Least-Squares Discriminant Analysis (PLS-DA, supervised analysis) Mussels from control (E-C) and tanks contaminated with the highest dose (E-HD)





Bioaccumulation of the PFAS in mussels after alimentary exposures depending on the dose and the FPAS chain length Conclusions Bioaccumulation and depuration phases observed during the kinetic analysis The exposure of mussels to PFAS lead to oxidative stress (increase of GST and SOD activities in the digestive glands) Impairments of the lipidome of the mussels exposed to the highest dose of PFAS compared to controls and determination of some putative lipid structures by the non-targeted lipidomic approach applied to negative ions detected in FIA-HPLC/MS
