

Poverty, decadence and suffering in one part of the earth are a silent breeding ground for problems that will end up affecting the entire planet." This sentiment aligns closely with Thanh's emphasis on the interconnectedness of global issues and the need for compassionate solutions.

Empathy and sharing, as discussed by Thanh, are crucial for building compassionate communities. behave selfishly, leading to Nash Equilibrium outcomes where each party maximizes its own reward, assuming every other party does the same.

Practical problems with the Nash Equilibrium include the prisoner's dilemma and the tragedy of unmanaged commons. In the prisoner's dilemma, two individuals acting in their own self-interest produce an outcome that is sub-optimal for both. The tragedy of the commons occurs when individuals, acting independently according to their own self-interest, ultimately deplete a shared resource, even when it's clear that it's not in anyone's long-term interest for this to happen.

An alternative concept, the Berge equilibrium, relates more closely to compassion. In a Berge equilibrium, each player chooses a strategy that maximizes the payoffs of all the other players – and this is rational assuming others do the same. This concept aligns with an idea of compassion, where individuals consider the well-being of others in their decision-making process.

The Berge equilibrium can potentially resolve the practical problems associated with the Nash equilibrium. In the prisoner's dilemma, if both prisoners acted compassionately (in line with the Berge equilibrium), they would both choose to remain silent so as to avoid hurting the other player, resulting in the best outcome for both. Similarly, in the tragedy of the commons, if all individuals acted with compassion towards others and future generations, they would sustainably manage the shared resource, ensuring its long-term viability.

Thus, Thanh's emphasis on compassion in addressing global issues finds resonance not only in various cultural and philosophical traditions but also in economic theory, offering a potential pathway to more cooperative and sustainable outcomes.
