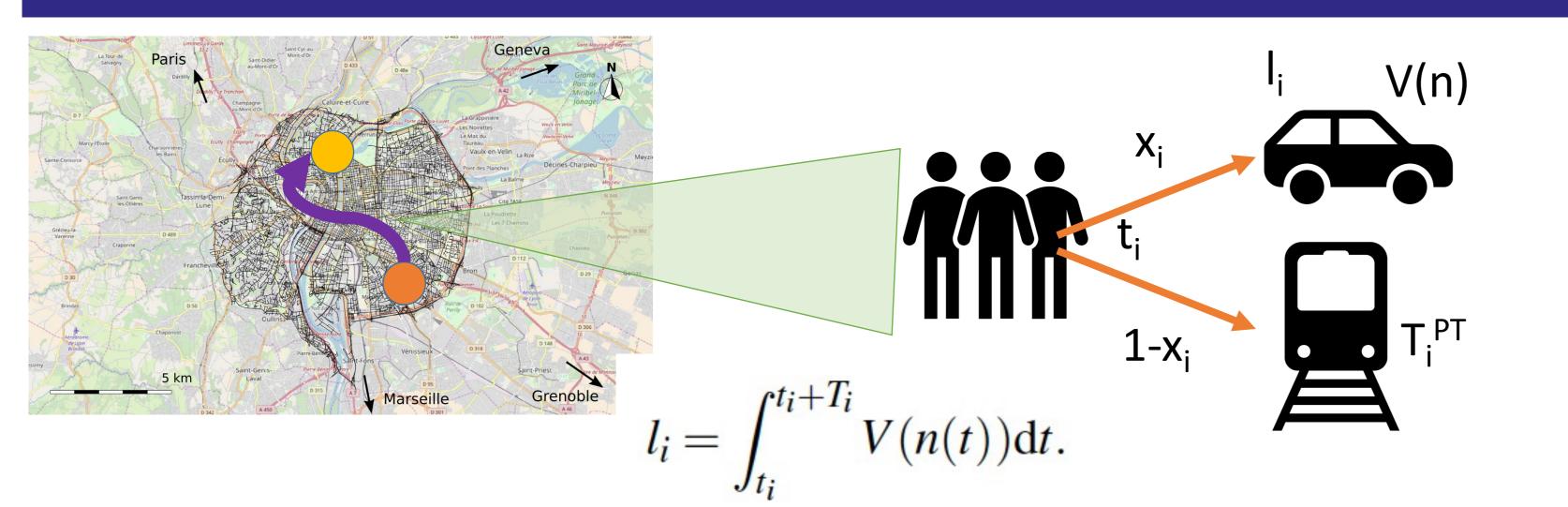

An iterative quadratic optimization based on travel times linearization

- Travel costs perception

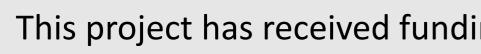

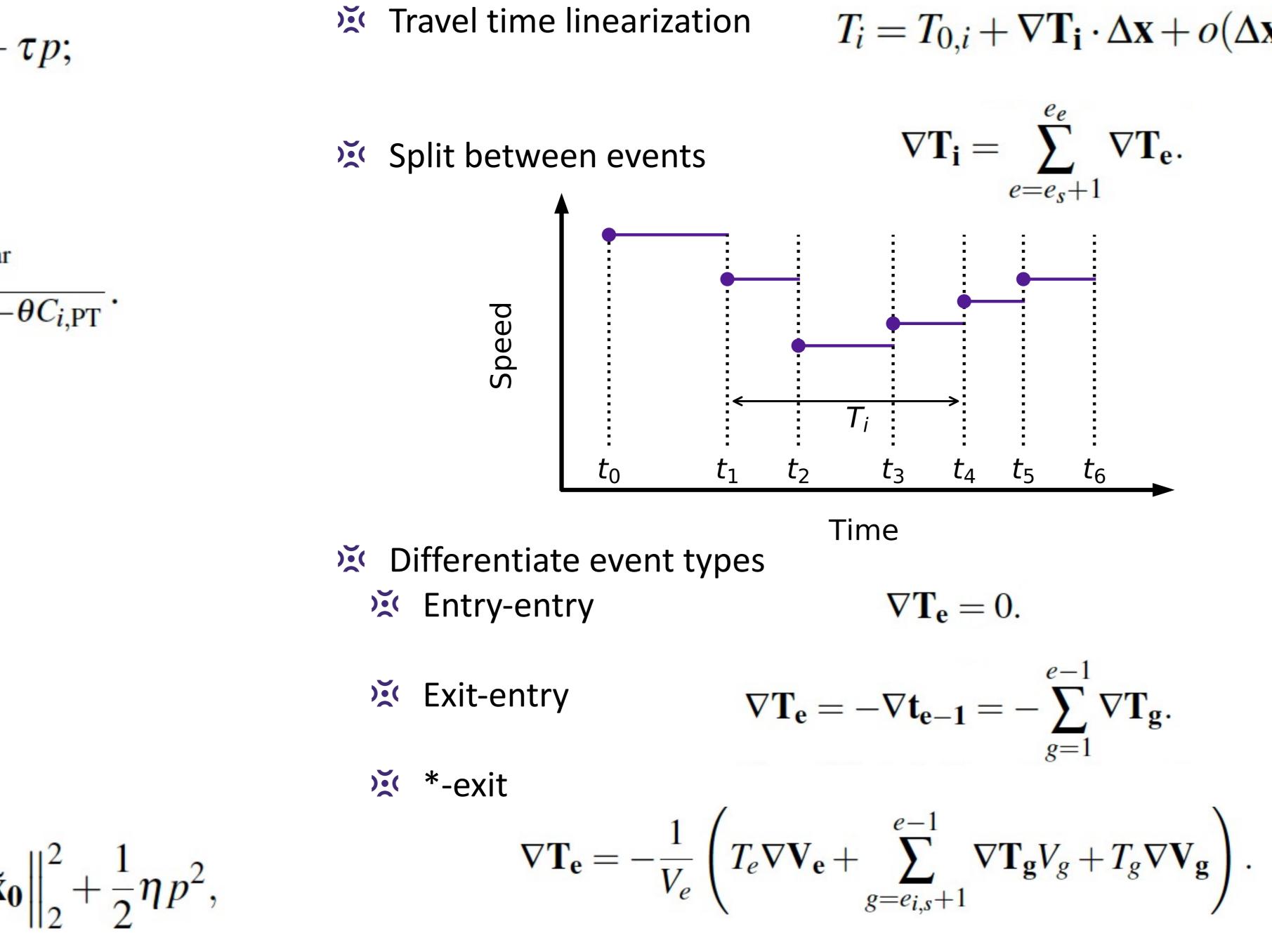
Motivation

X We implement a Tradable Credit Scheme (TCS) to foster modal shift from personal cars to public transportation (PT) to reduce congestion

X We use the trip-based MFD framework to represent the congestion. It accounts for the departure time and trip length of each traveler. The

Model description and assumptions

- fixed.
- time T^{PT} depends on the PT operations (timetables).
- the PT, and can trade them on a market.
- Offer and demand determine credit price p.



X For each group i, departure time t_i and travel distance l_i are

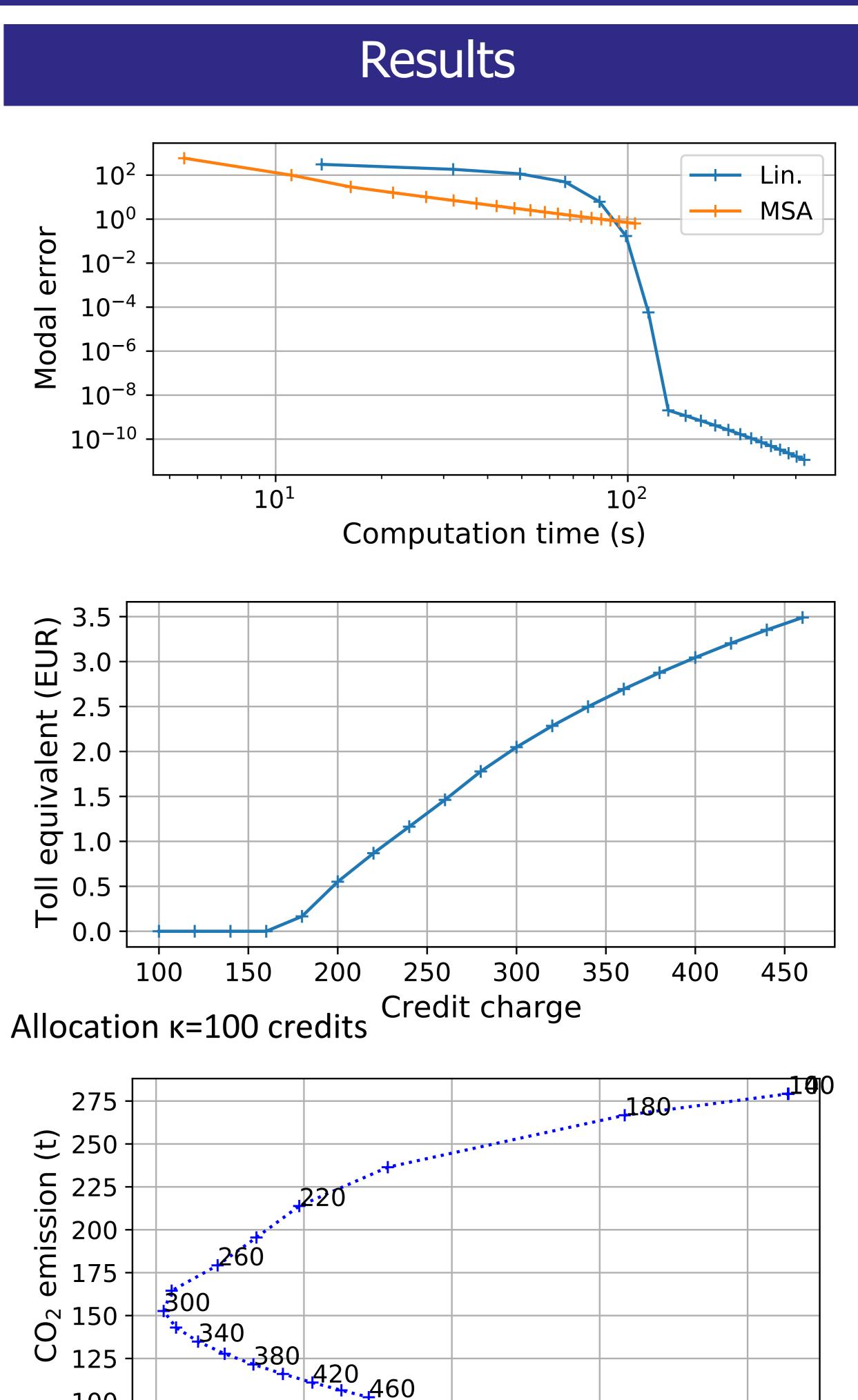

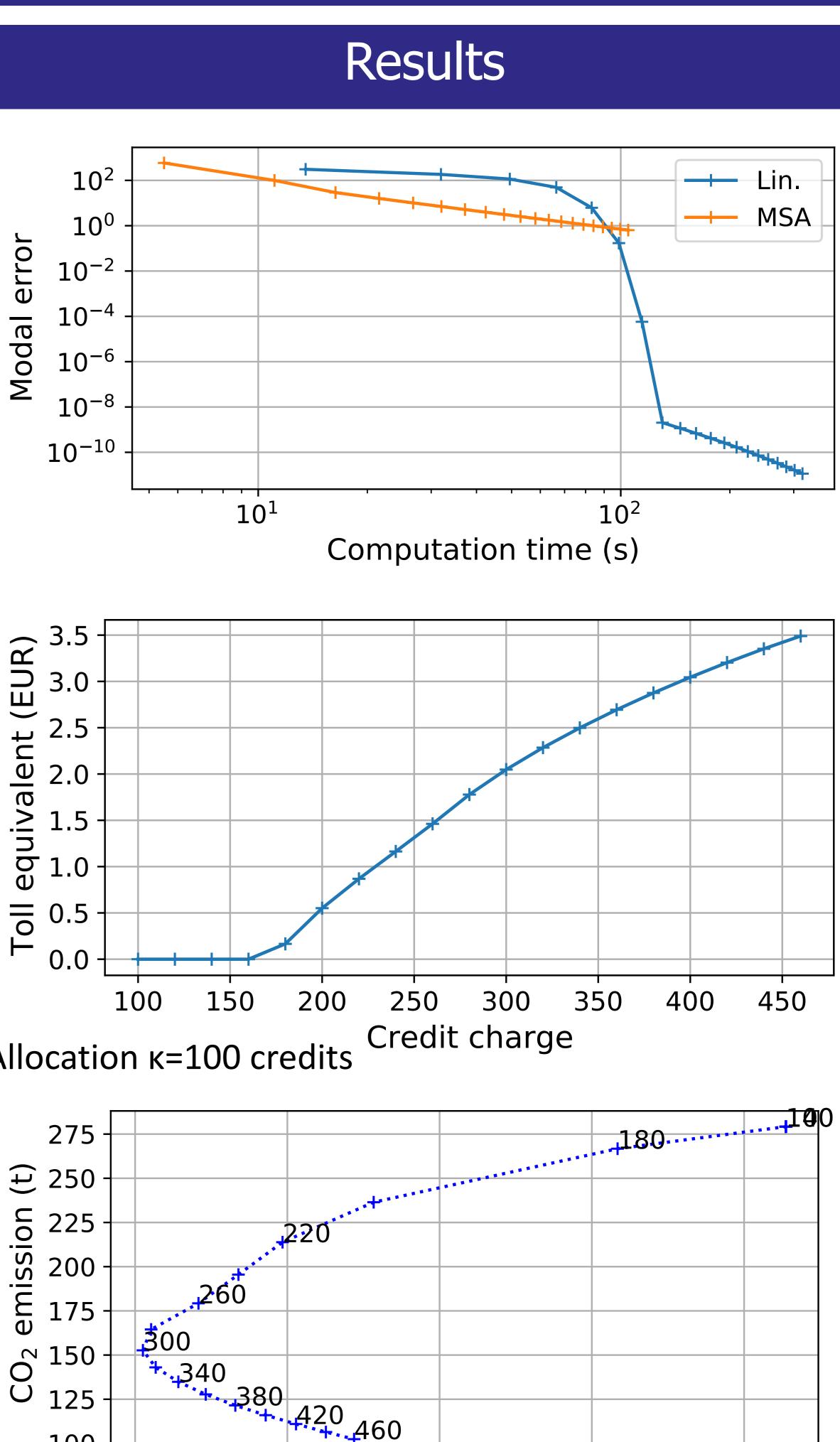
City model: one reservoir with trip-based MFD.

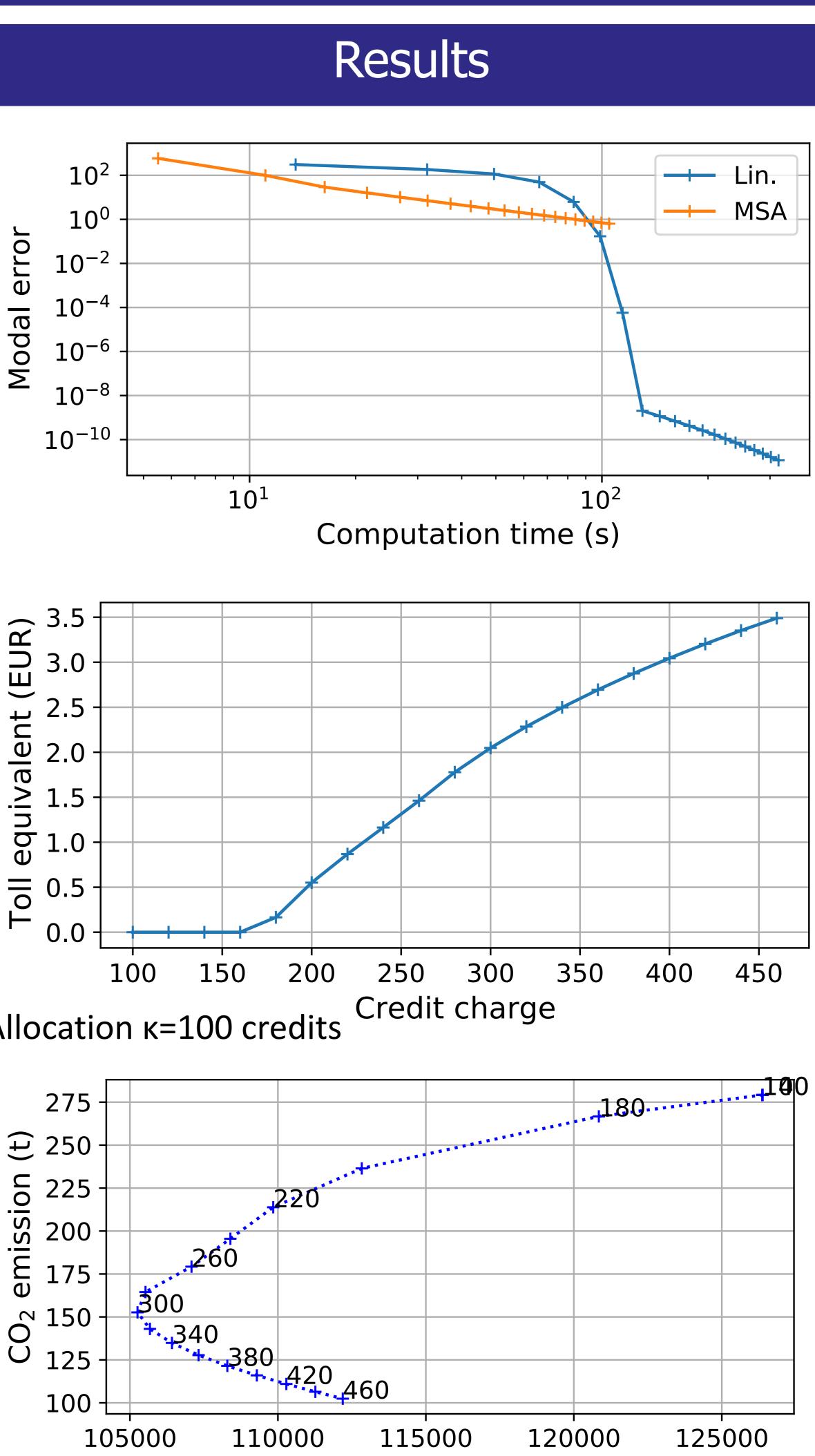

Conclusion

TCS improves total travel time by about 15% and carbon emission by around 45%.

From a methodological point of view, iterative quadratic optimization based on travel times linearization reaches better precision than MSA.
