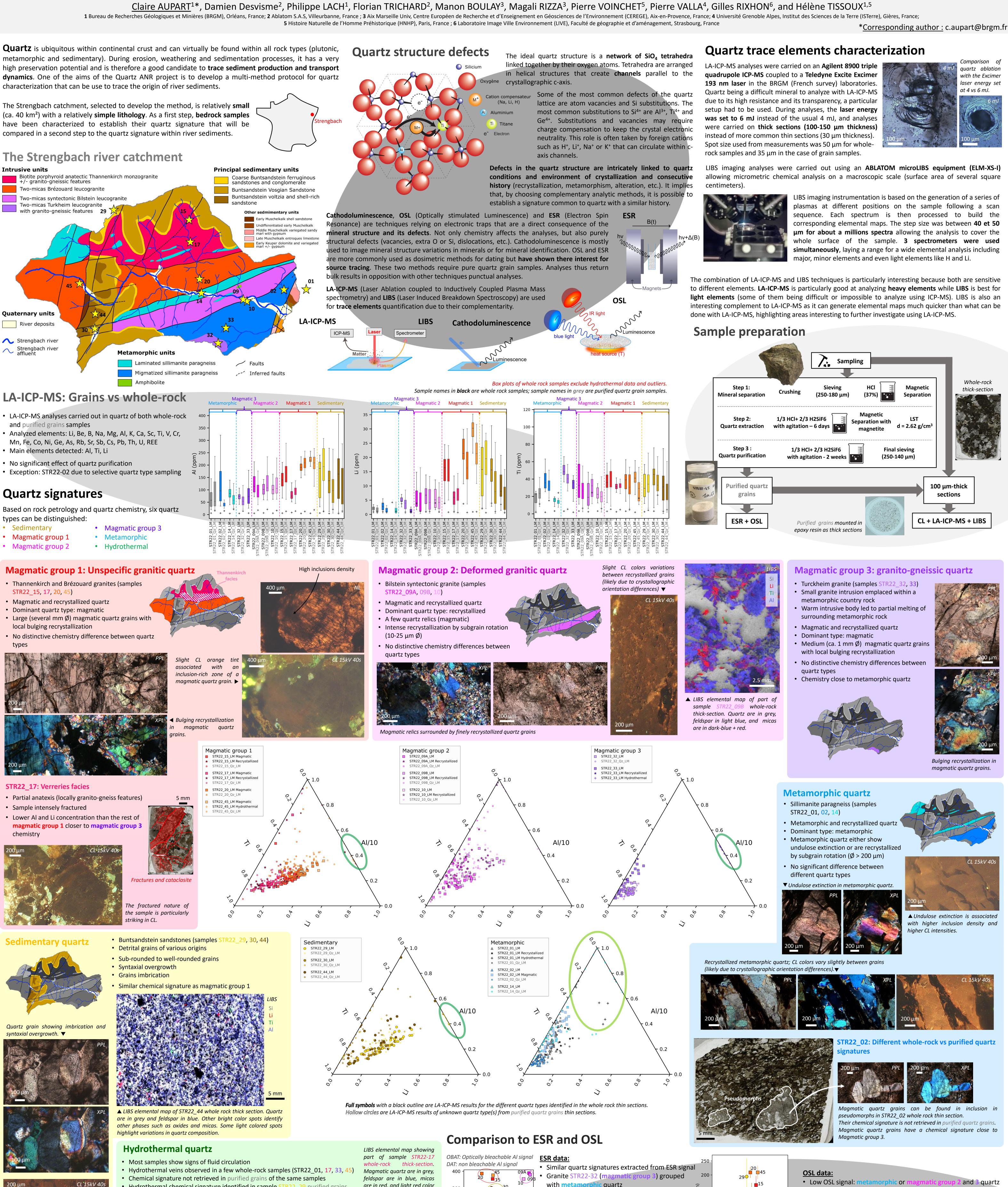

are in red, and light red color

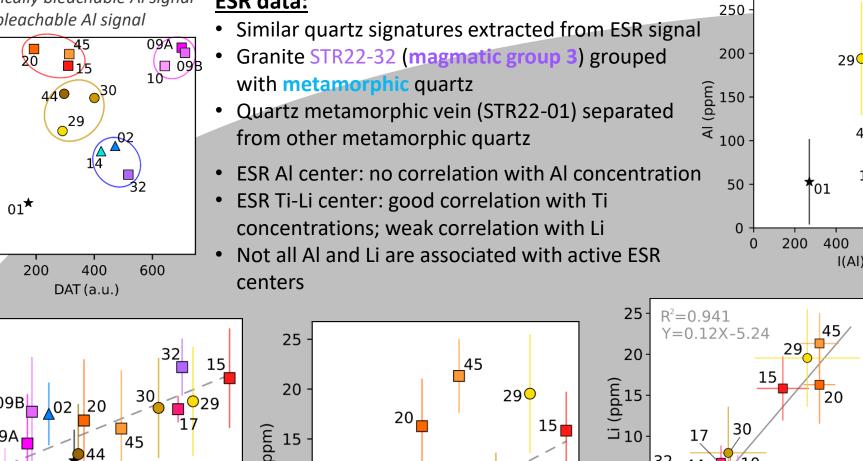

Bright ▲ Comparison of Li and Al LA-ICP-MS colors are associated with feldspar and concentrations from purified grains and from 4000 5000 dark color shades are associated with 1000 2000 3000 hydrothermal quartz in whole-rock samples.

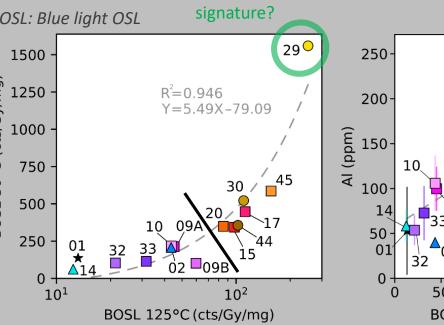
