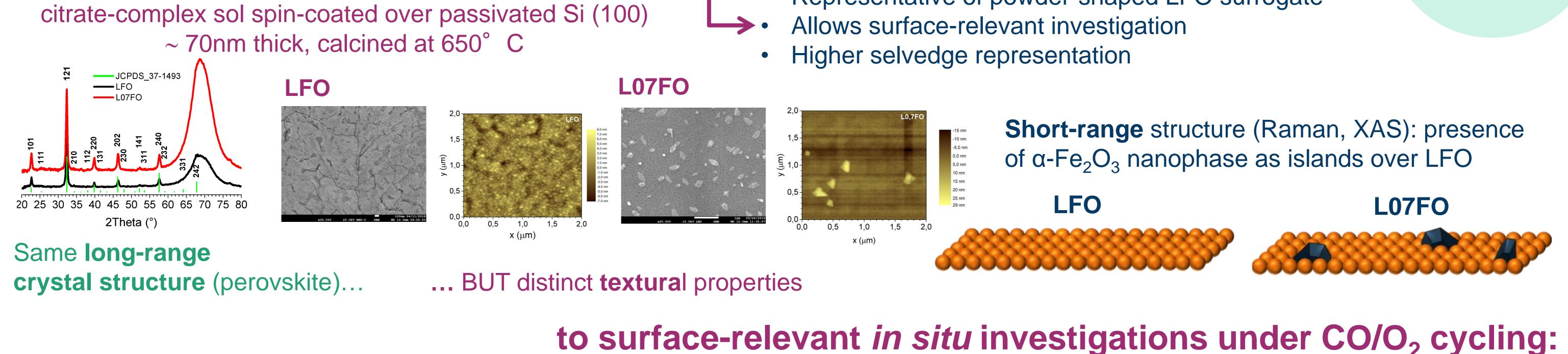
Abstract. LaFeO₃-based mixed oxides of mostly ABO₃ perovskite structure are promising materials for key surface redox processes, such as three-way catalysis (TWC) or oxygen reduction at solid oxide fuel cell (SOFC) cathode. By taking advantage of the versatility of the perovskite structure, it is possible to prepare modified oxides with drastically increased performances as compared to the parent LaFeO₃. Here, we explore the effect of La deficiency on the dynamics of selvedge under model redox excitation. We show here the results of a unique combination of sample- and technique-based strategies to explore the surface / subsurface dynamics of La_{0.7}FeO₃ at the right place, in proper time and under redox-relevant conditions.

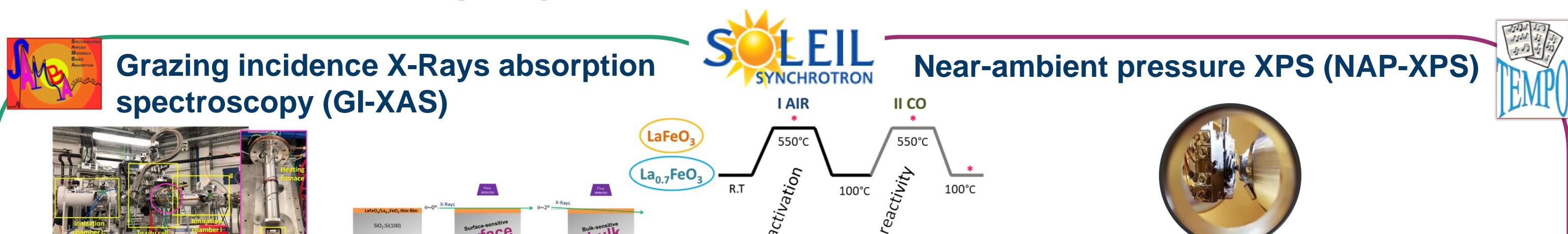
Model oxide thin films of LaFeO₃ vs. $La_{0.7}FeO_3$

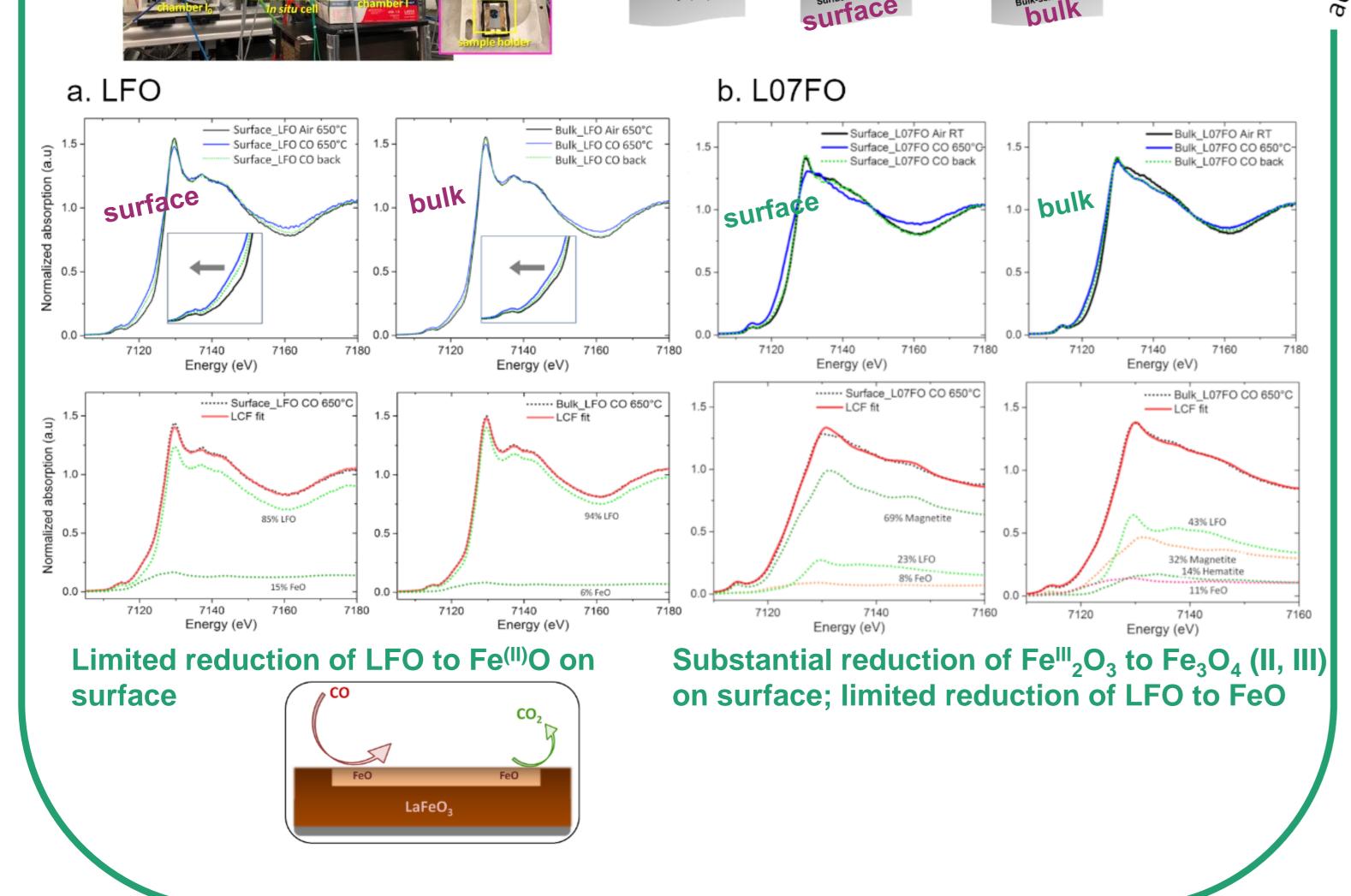
Representative of powder-shaped LFO surrogate

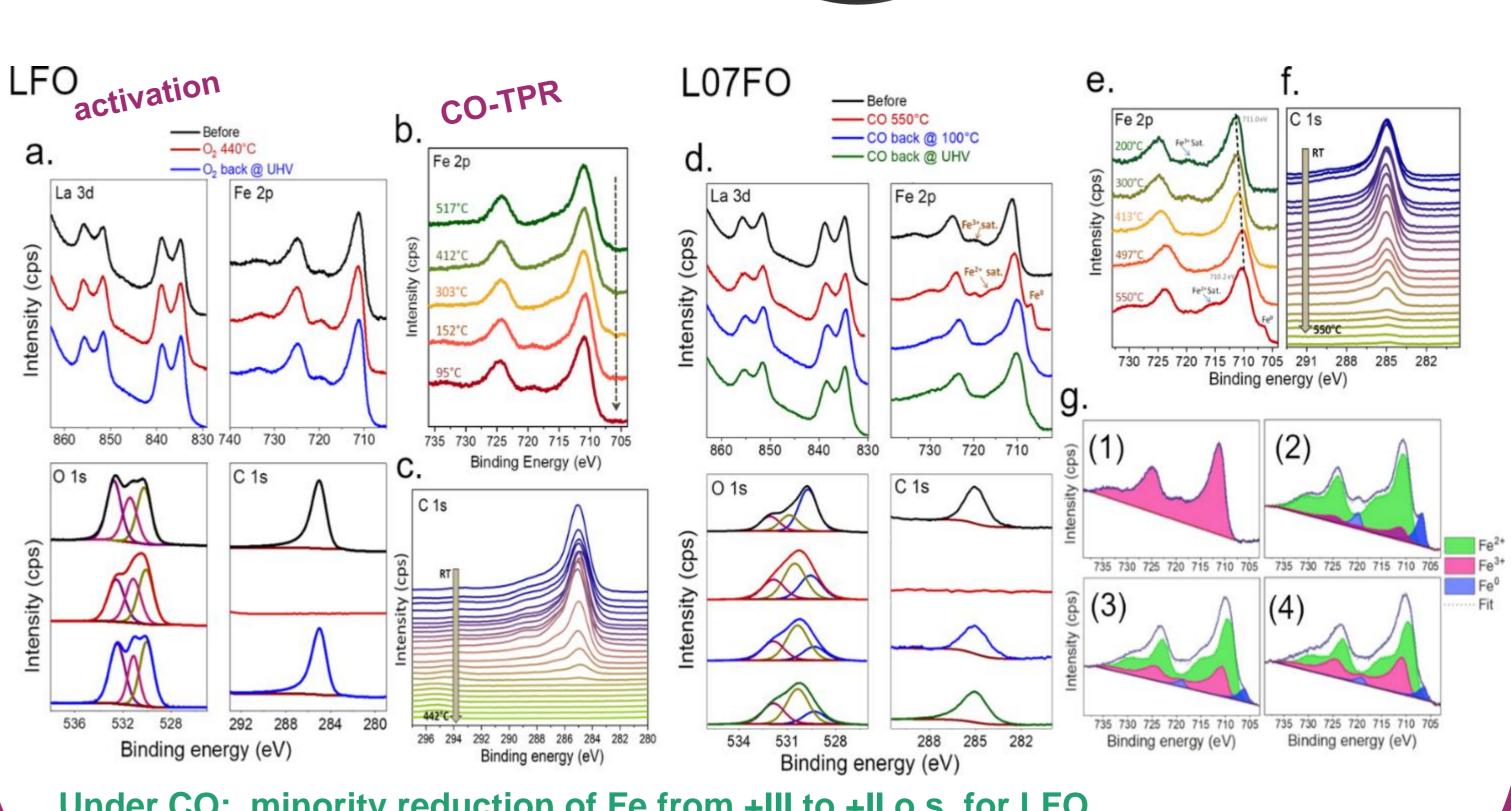


Follow-up of short range organisation of Fe species and of the oxidation state of Fe and La



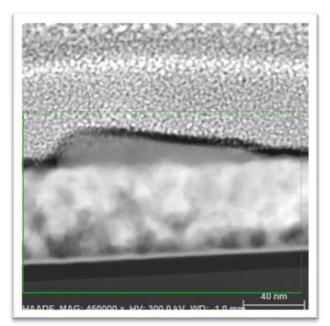

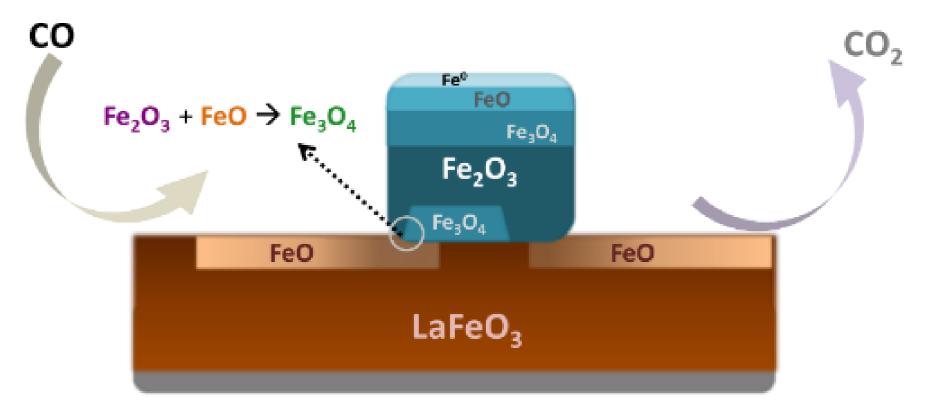


Under CO: minority reduction of Fe from +III to +II o.s. for LFO significant reduction from +III to +II and even 0 o.s. for L07FO La fully remains in the +III state

What have we learnt?



- The Fe₂O₃ phase is exsolved from the LFO forming flat islands with large contact surface
- Fe₂O₃ islands and the LFO get both reduced / re-oxidised upon redox cycling
- At the interface between the iron oxide and LFO phase stands the secret for closing of the cycle thanks to the formation of Fe_3O_4



LaFeO₃ is acting like a reservoir of FeO
