# Positive Electrofluorochromism of Bodipy-Ferrocene Monolayers on ITO.

To a 250 mL tricol flask was added hydroxyethoxybenzaldehyde (0.650 g, 3.91 mmol) in anhydrous DCM (50 mL). Argon was bubbled through the solution for 20 min, then kryptopyrrole (1.2 mL, 9 mmol) and TFA (8 drops) were added. The mixture was stirred for 2 hours. Chloranil (0.96 g, 3.9 mmol) was added and the reaction was stirred for 5 minutes. After the addition of DIPEA (4.8 mL, 27.6 mmol), the solution was kept stirring for 15 minutes, then boron trifluoride etherate (5.3 mL, 43 mmol) was introduced to the flask. The mixture was then stirred for 2 hours at room temperature. The DCM was evaporated. To a solution of Bodipy derivative **1** (100 mg, 227 µmol) in dry DCM under Ar were added a solution of 3-(triethoxysilyl)propyl isocyanate (225 µL, 909 µmol) in dry DCM and a solution of DIPEA (160 µL, 909 µmol) in dry DCM. The reaction was stirred at 40°C under Ar for 4 days. To a 25 mL flask under argon was added CuI (36 mg, 0.19 mmol), Pd(PPh<sub>3</sub>)<sub>4</sub> (110 mg, 0.095 mmol), and 4-bromobenzaldehyde (200 mg, 1.09 mmol) in a mixture of THF/Et<sub>3</sub>N (1:1, 12 mL). Argon was bubbled through the solution for 30 min. Ethynylferrocene (400 mg, 1.90 mmol,) was added. The mixture was heated overnight at 55°C under argon. The mixture was cooled to room temperature and concentrated under reduced pressure. To a 10 mL flask under argon was added compound **1** (50 mg, 0.13 mmol), compound **3** (143 mg, 0.45 mmol), and piperidine (0.1 mL, 1.0 mmol) in dry acetonitrile (4 mL). Argon was bubbled through the solution for 30 min. The mixture was refluxed overnight at 100°C under argon and in the presence of molecular sieves. The mixture was cooled to room temperature and concentrated under reduced pressure. To a solution of Bodipy derivative 4 (26 mg, 25 µmol) in dry DCM (3 mL) under Ar were added 3-(triethoxysilyl)propyl isocyanate (25 µL, 100 µmol) and DIPEA (17 µL, 100 µmol). The reaction was stirred in a sealed tube at 40°C under Ar for 3 days. Further isocyanate (25 µL, 100 µmol) and DIPEA (17 µL, 100 µmol) were added and stirring at 40°C continued for 4 days.
