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# Fast Sky to Sky Interpolation for Radio Interferometric Imaging

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## Introduction

- ➤ Sky image reconstruction from a large amount of radiotelescope data is computationally expensive. [1].
- ► The *Gridding* and *Degridding* interpolation operators are the main reasons for the computational cost of imaging algorithms.
- Our contributions:
  - Decomposition of the *Gridding* and *Degridding* operators.
  - ▶ Merge of these operators (S2S operator).
  - ▶ Reduction of the memory cost.
  - ▶ Reduction of the computational time to compute the gradient and the sky image reconstruction algorithm CLEAN.

## Radio Interferometric Imaging

► A radio interferometer is an array of antenna, and the Forward model is given by

$$v(u,v) = \iint x(l,m)e^{-2i\pi(ul+vm)} dl dm.$$
 (1)

$$v = SFx + n \tag{2}$$

► Image estimation is an III-posed problem. Algorithms aim to minimize the following equation

$$\widehat{x} = \underset{\sim}{\operatorname{arg\,min}} \|v - SFx\|^2 + \lambda R(x). \tag{3}$$

lterative algorithms need to compute the data fidelity criterion gradient  $\nabla J(x)$ , such as

$$\nabla J(x) = F^{\dagger} S^{\dagger} (v - SFx) \tag{4}$$

#### **Gridding and Degridding operators**

- ightharpoonup Interpolation of the data on an oversampled grid with a factor K to minimize the error.
- ► Convolution kernel used for the interpolation is similar to the one used for MRI imaging algorithms [2].
- ▶ Decomposition of the degridding operator S as a succession of sub-operators of Oversampling O, Convolution C, Mapping A.

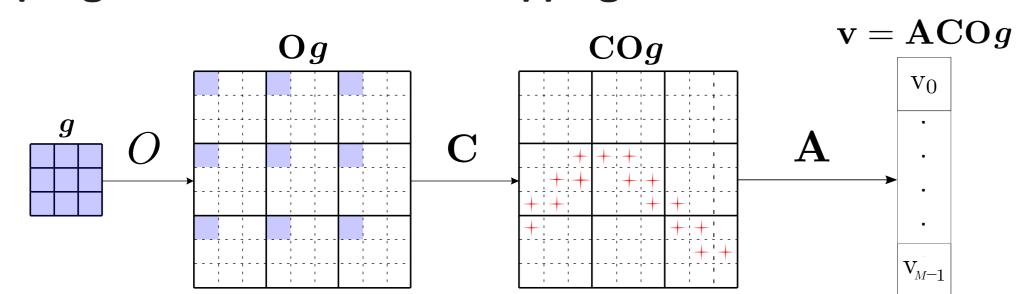


Figure: Degridding operator decomposition S.

▶ Decomposition of the gridding operator  $S^{\dagger}$  as a succession of sub-operators of Accumulation  $A^{\dagger}$ , Convolution  $C^{\dagger}$ , Sub-sampling  $O^{\dagger}$ .

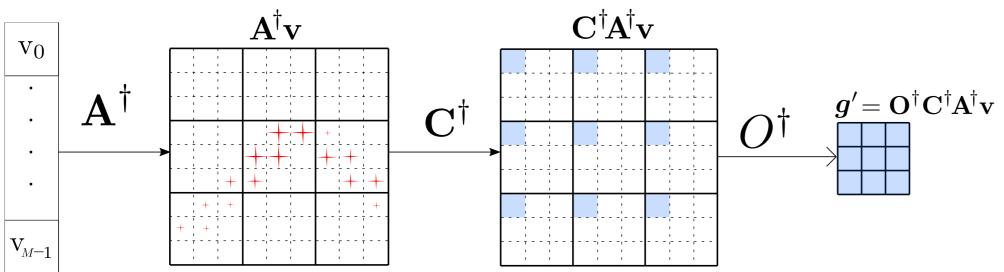


Figure: Gridding operator decomposition  $S^{\dagger}$ .

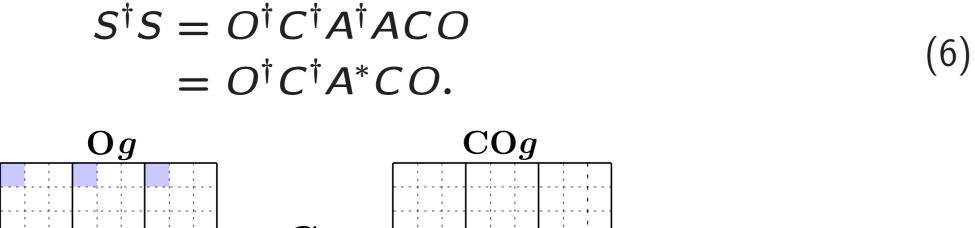
# Sky to Sky operator (S2S)

► Le calcul de gradient de la méthode standard (STD) peut être développé [3]

$$\nabla J(x) = F^{\dagger} S^{\dagger} (v - SFx)$$

$$= F^{\dagger} S^{\dagger} v - F^{\dagger} S^{\dagger} SFx.$$
(5)

Sky to Sky operator is the decomposition of  $S^{\dagger}S$  such as



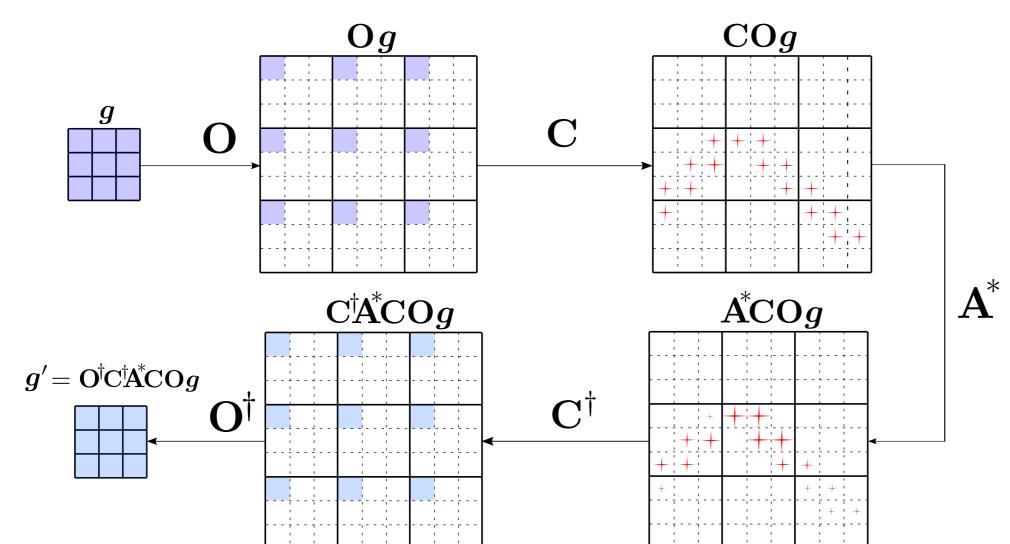


Figure: succession of Gridding and degridding operators  $S^{\dagger}S$  using S2S method.

## Sky to Sky operator (S2S)

- ▶ Merge of operators  $A^{\dagger}A = A^*$ , such as  $A^*$  is diagonal and sparse.
- ▶ If M' elements different of  $\mathbf{0}$  in  $diag(A^*)$  et M raw data, the computing cost of S2S method is lower than STD method when

$$M' < \frac{2MC_{supp}^2 + M - P}{2C_{supp}^2 + 1}$$
 (7)

## **Gradient Computation Results**

- ► Raw data can be averaged to reduce the total amount of data to process.
- Oversampling error

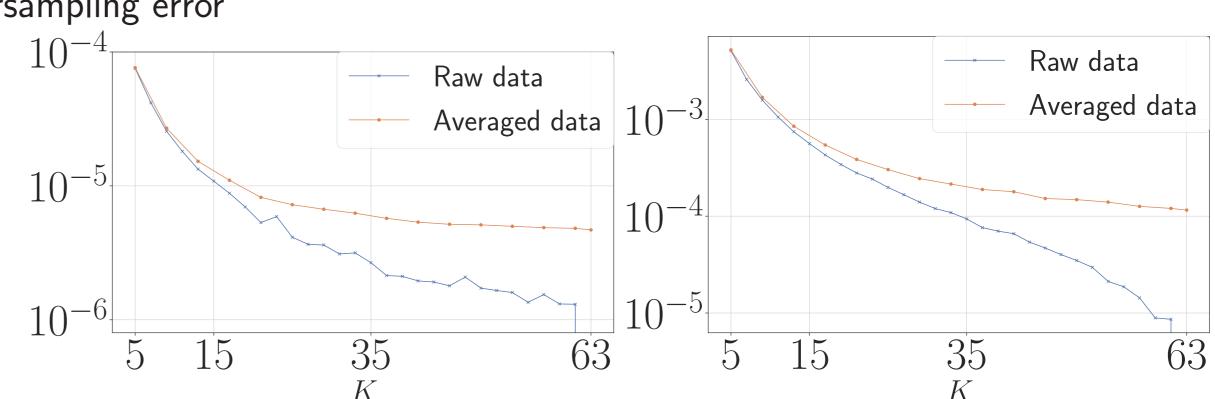


Figure: (Left) Mean Absolute Error. (Right) Maximum Absolute Error.

Computation time cost

K	STD (s)	S2S (s)	STD moy.(s)	S2S moy.(s)
5	242.9	14.8 $(\times 16.4)$	33.7	13.9 (×2.4)
15	242.9	$24.1 \ (\times 10.0)$	33.7	$22.1 \ (\times 1.6)$
35	242.9	$43.9 (\times 5.6)$	33.7	$27.0 \ (\times 1.3)$
63	242.9	71.8 $(\times 3.4)$	33.7	$28.5~(\times 1.2)$

Memory footprint cost

K	STD (GB)	S2S (GB)	STD moy.(	GB) S2S moy. (GB)
5	1.94	0.46	0.20	0.45
15	1.94	0.59	0.20	0.55
35	1.94	0.85	0.20	0.63
63	1.94	1.20	0.20	0.65

# Sky Estimation using CLEAN algorithm

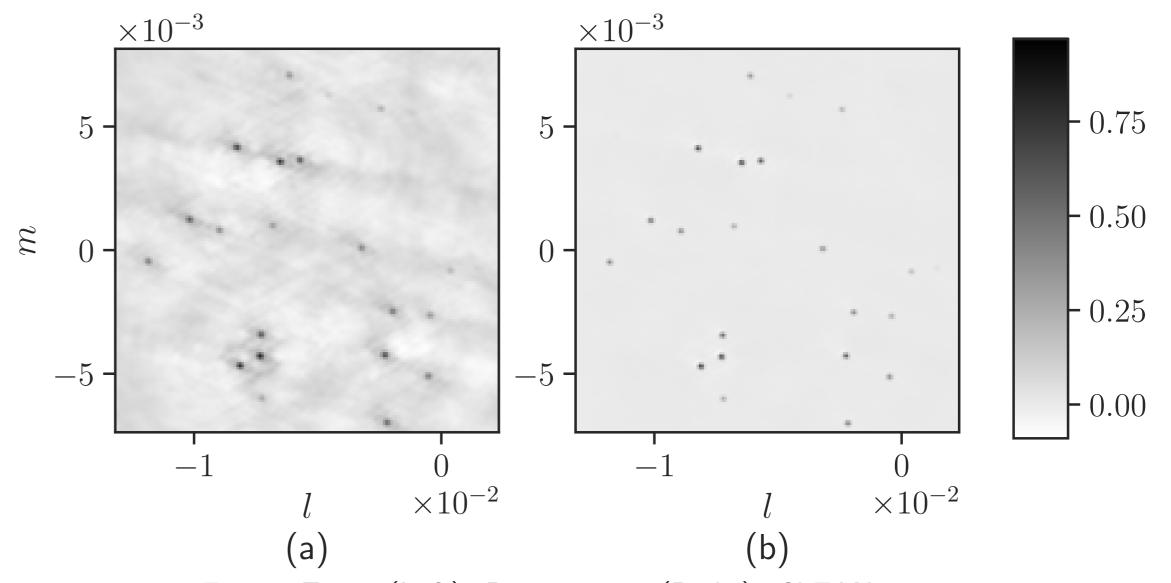


Figure: Zoom (Left): Dirty image. (Right): CLEAN Image

# Conclusion and future work

- ► We proposed the Sky to Sky method as a merge of the Gridding and Degridding operators for radio interferometric imaging.
- This method shows a reduction of the computing time as well as the memory footprint.
- ► We plan to take direction-dependent effects into account and propose an implementation on hardware acceleration platform.
