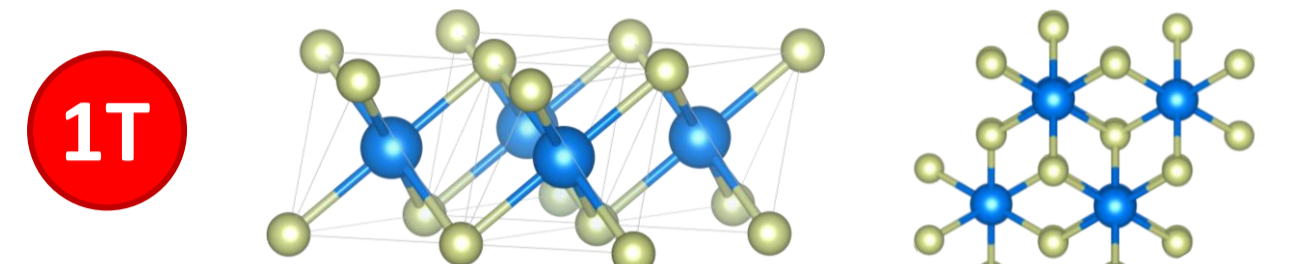
Motivations

Context: TaSe₂ is a group V metallic transition metal dichalcogenide which also exhibits **charge density waves (CDW)**, superconductivity and **Mott insulating** states. Since the occurrence of these properties largely depends on the polytype, understanding the phase formation in TaSe₂ grown by **molecular beam epitaxy (MBE)** may be required for applications. However, the selective growth of 1T and 1H-TaSe₂ monolayers has only been demonstrated on graphene [1] and the phase diagram of few-layers TaSe₂ remains scarcely explored yet.

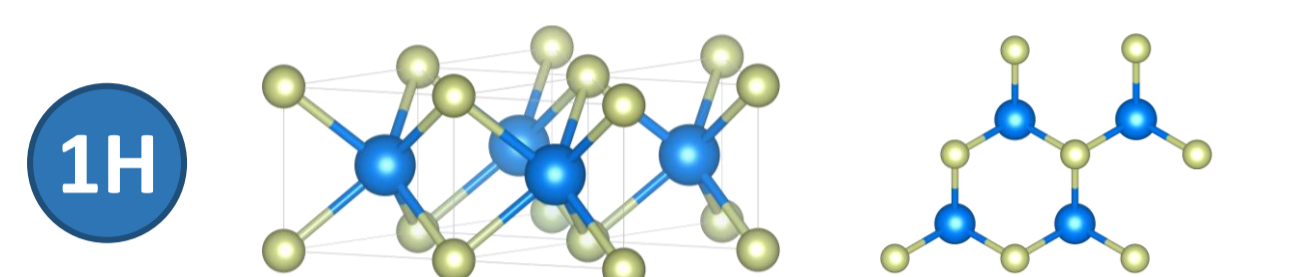
Goals:

- Propose a commercially available III-V semiconducting substrate (gallium phosphide) which enables electrical characterisations.
- Investigate the growth of TaSe₂ multilayers and its possible use as high work function metallic contacts.

Mott insulator in monolayer

1H-TaSe₂
Always metallic
CDW below 122K

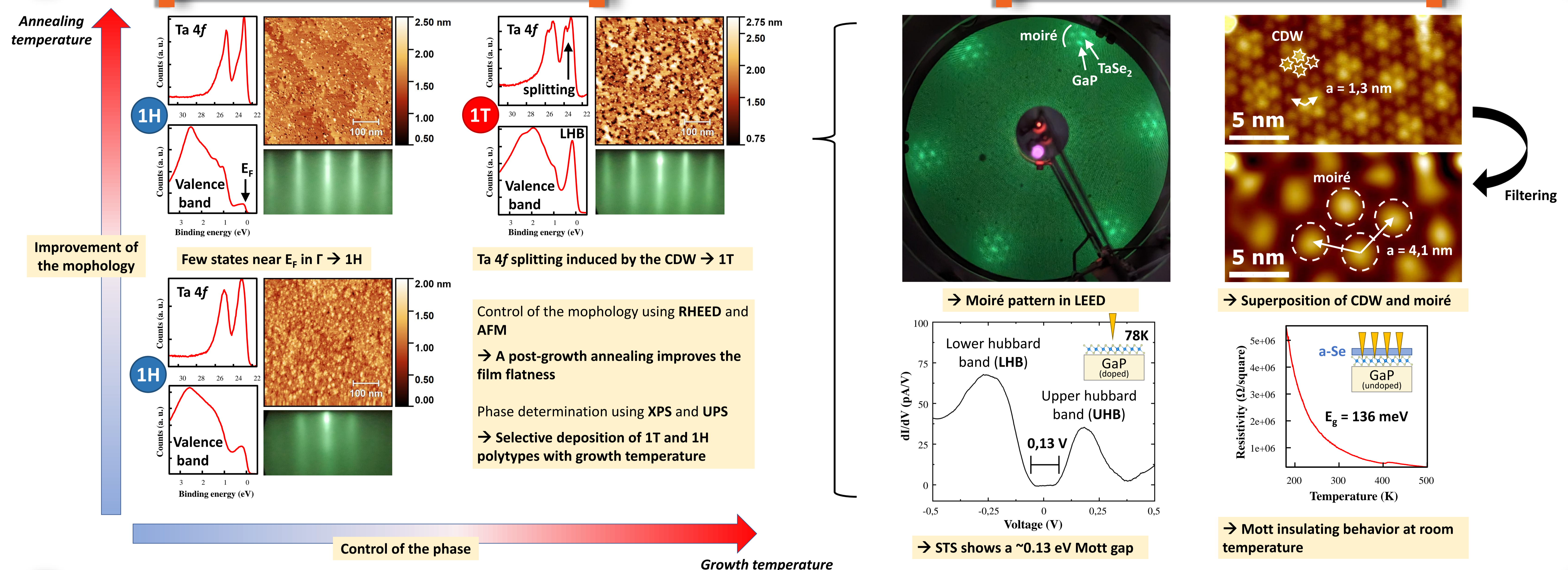
