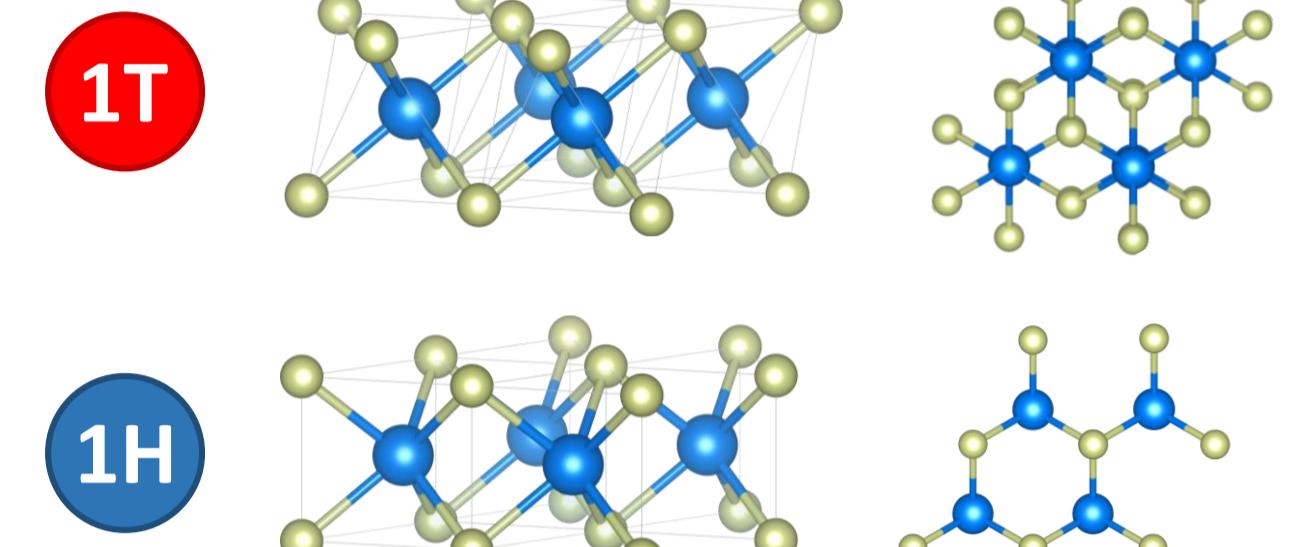
## Motivations

**Context:** TaSe<sub>2</sub> is a group V metallic transition metal dichalcogenide which also exhibits charge density waves (CDW), superconductivity and Mott insulating states. Since the occurrence of these properties largely depends on the polytype, understanding the phase formation in TaSe<sub>2</sub> grown by molecular beam epitaxy (MBE) may be required for applications. However, the selective growth of 1T and 1H-TaSe<sub>2</sub> monolayers has only been demonstrated on graphene [1] and the phase diagram of few-layers TaSe<sub>2</sub> remains scarcely explored yet.

**Goals:**

- Propose a commercially available III-V semiconducting substrate (gallium phosphide) which enables electrical characterisations.
- Investigate the growth of TaSe<sub>2</sub> multilayers and its possible use as high work function metallic contacts.
