Remote group work

Methodology

Population : Master's degree students and teachers at the ISPED

Data collection : 2 focus groups with 7 students (1 hour), and 3 semi-structured interviews with ISPED's teachers

Situation analysis



Cultural, linguistic, and geographical differences



Professional and personal constraints

Diversity of skills and knowledge



Efficiency, communication, motivation

Stress, tensions, unequal contribution =

Teaching staff strategies



Strategic Team Formation:

By affinity, by interest, by profile, random

Proactive educational support:

Reminders of best practices for teamwork, Regular meetings, Interim submissions, Individual support throughout the year

Student strategies and goals



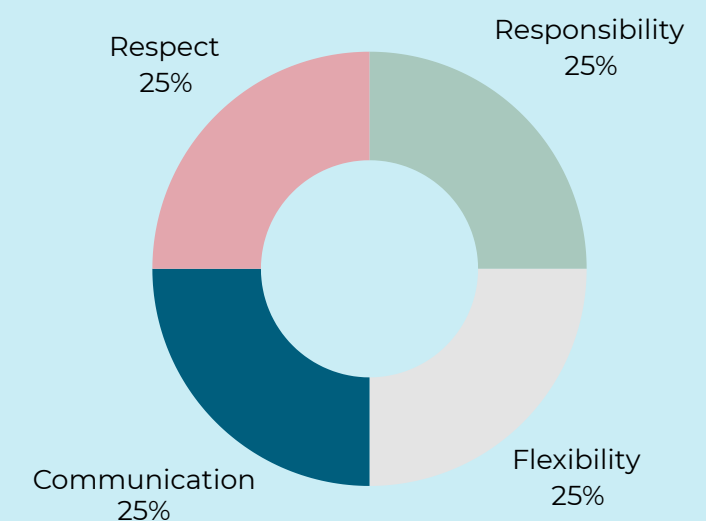
Organization:

Effective time management, fair distribution of tasks, shared leadership, Definition of clear goals, Regular follow-up meetings (and prompt problem resolution), Setting deadlines

Strengthening connections:

Humor: Creating a relaxed atmosphere, Informal moments, Icebreakers (e.g., mood of the day), Considering emotional states

Student's softskills reported



Sharing of experiences and learning

Sense of integration

Professionalization

Recommandations

Feedback, debriefing questionnaire, self-assessment.

Clarity of instructions.

Adjust strategies according to students's needs and **improve group dynamics.**

Diversify skills and profiles to stimulate exchange, creativity, value each individual's potential, and encourage idea confrontation by activating transactive memory

Tool suggestions

- Commitment charters
- Post-evaluation feedback



Limits of the study

- Limited number of participants
- Social desirability bias
- Time constraints
- Context specificity

Strengths

- Engagement of students and teachers
- Multidisciplinary cross-sectional view
- Quick implementation of recommendations
