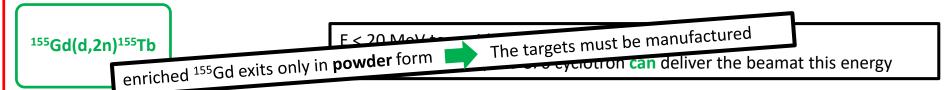

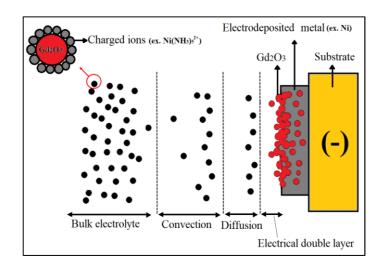
# Thin targets for cross section data in nuclear research

 $E^{\circ}(Gd^{3+}/Gd) = -2,279 \text{ V/SHE}$ 

=> To obtain metallic Gd by reducing Gd<sup>3+</sup> in aqueous solution is impossible due to very low standart hydrogen electrode of Gd<sup>3+</sup>/Gd

**Co-electrodeposition technique** 

 $Gd_2O_3$  particles are trapped in Ni deposit by electrodeposition technique. This method has been used to prepare targets to measure cross sections of  $^{155}Gd(d,2n)^{155}Tb$  nuclear reaction. To prevent the dissolution of  $Gd_2O_3$  particles, the pH of the solution must be **greater than 7**. The solution used in our experiments is **ammoniacal** solution.





Thickness = 13 µm (50-µm-thick gold substrat) m(Gd): 2-3 mg (ICP-OES analysis)

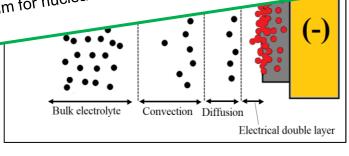

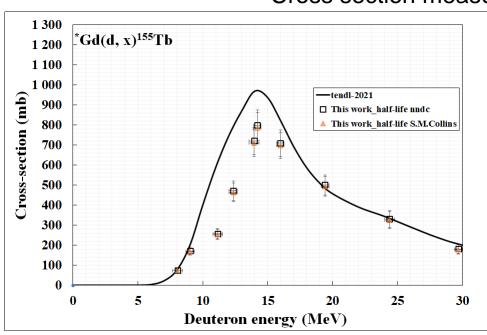

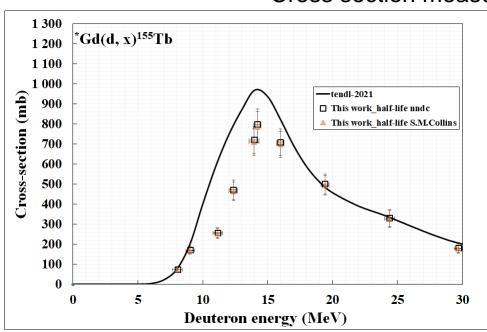


# Thin targets for cross section data in nuclear research

Cross section measurements: 155Tb



TENDL-2021 overestimates values at lower energies until 20 MeV and remains consistent at higher energies.

▶ Before 13 MeV, the <sup>155</sup>Tb production was produced from <sup>155</sup>Gd(d,2n)<sup>155</sup>Tb.

From 13 MeV to 19 MeV, <sup>155</sup>Gd and <sup>156</sup>Gd contributed to produce <sup>155</sup>Tb (maximum cross section = 800 mb at 14.5 MeV

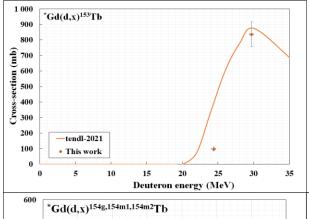

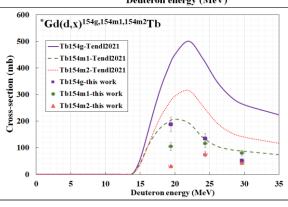


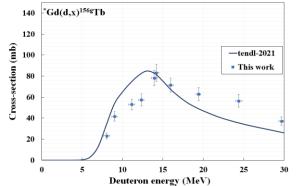
# Thin targets for cross section data in nuclear research

Co-electrodeposition cross section measurements: irradiation on <sup>155</sup>Gd with deuteron particles (direct route)



Isotope	Half-life	E <sub>threshold</sub> (MeV)
<sup>153</sup> Tb	2.34 d	20.17
<sup>154g,m1,m2</sup> Tb	21.5 h, 9.4 h, 22.7 h	13.16
<sup>156</sup> Tb	5.35 d	0





- □ <sup>153</sup>Tb and <sup>154</sup>Tb can be avoided at lower energy, < 20 MeV.
- □ <sup>156g</sup>Tb is inevitable.
- ☐ The half-life of <sup>156g</sup>Tb is similar to that of <sup>155</sup>Tb (5.32 d).

Important to study the <sup>156</sup>Tb cross section as well as the impact of <sup>156</sup>Tb impurity on images!

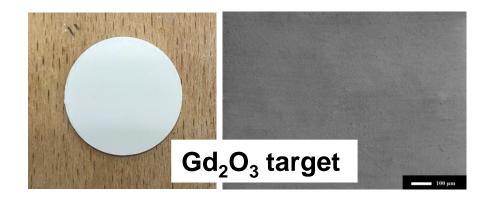


## Thick targets for large-scale production of <sup>155</sup>Tb

pelletizing technique











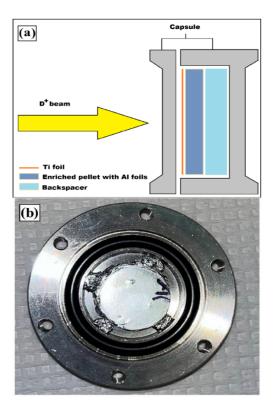




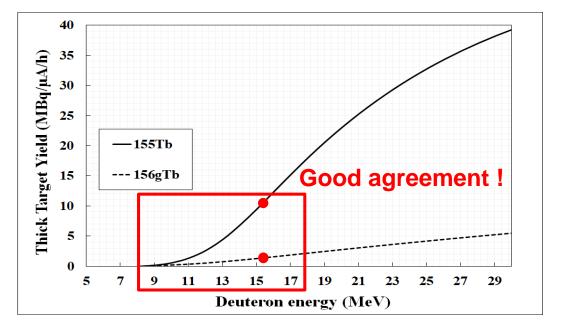
Mass = 0.6 g, diameter = 2 cm, thickness = **390**  $\mu$ m



# Thick targets for large-scale production of <sup>155</sup>Tb pelletizing technique



 $E_{incident}$  = 15.1 MeV,  $E_{out}$  = 8.6 MeV (maximum production of <sup>155</sup>Tb) 500 nA for 1 h



### **Experimental yield:**

• 155Tb: 10.2 ± 0.7 MBq/µA/h

•  $^{156}$ Tb: 1.3 ± 0.1 MBq/µA/h

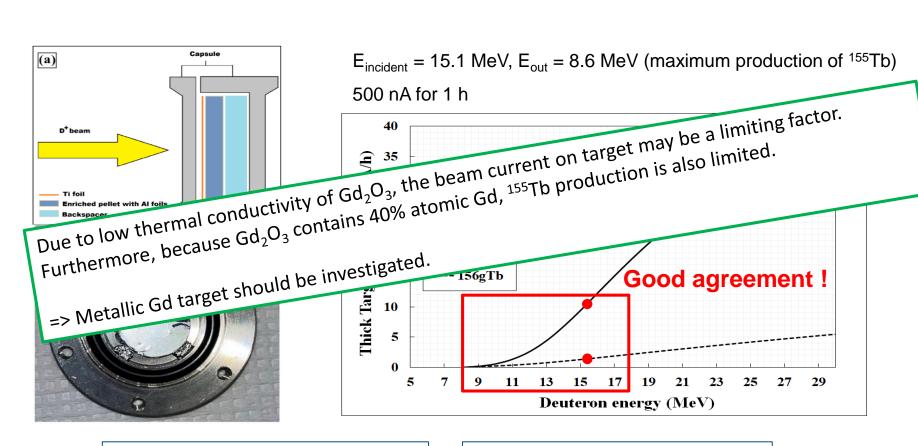

# Thick targets for large-scale production of <sup>155</sup>Tb pelletizing technique



## **Experimental yield:**

• 155Tb: 10.2 ± 0.7 MBq/µA/h

• 156Tb: 1.3 ± 0.1 MBq/µA/h

Purity of <sup>155</sup>Tb:

Experiment: 88% (9 d after EOB) Estimation: 89% (9 d after EOB)





## Conclusion

- ✓ We are able to manufacture thin targets for nuclear research : co-electrodeposition and molecular plating (Poster of Vanessa Rhoden)
- We are able to manufacture thick targets for production : a pellet of  $Gd_2O_3$  wrapped with Al. Perspective : obtain a metallic Gd -> molten salts technique?
- ✓ Cross section measurements have been studied with deuteron as particles Perspective : measure cross section with alpha particles (Vanessa Rhoden's PhD thesis).
- Knowing the values of cross section measurements allows us to determine which deuteron energy is optimal to produce <sup>155</sup>Tb with *good* radioisotopic purity (90% in this work): less than 20 MeV to avoid producing <sup>153</sup>Tb.

- ☐ Proton or deuteron irradiation? It depends on the acceptable value of <sup>156</sup>Tb.
- $\Box$  The radioisotopic purity of <sup>155</sup>Tb depends on the purity of <sup>155</sup>Gd.
- ☐ Alpha irradiation is interesting; however, only few cyclotrons can deliver this particle.
