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SUPERCritical CO₂-ASSISTED FLOW CHEMISTRY FOR PROCESSING SWITCHABLE MOLECULAR NANOMATERIALS

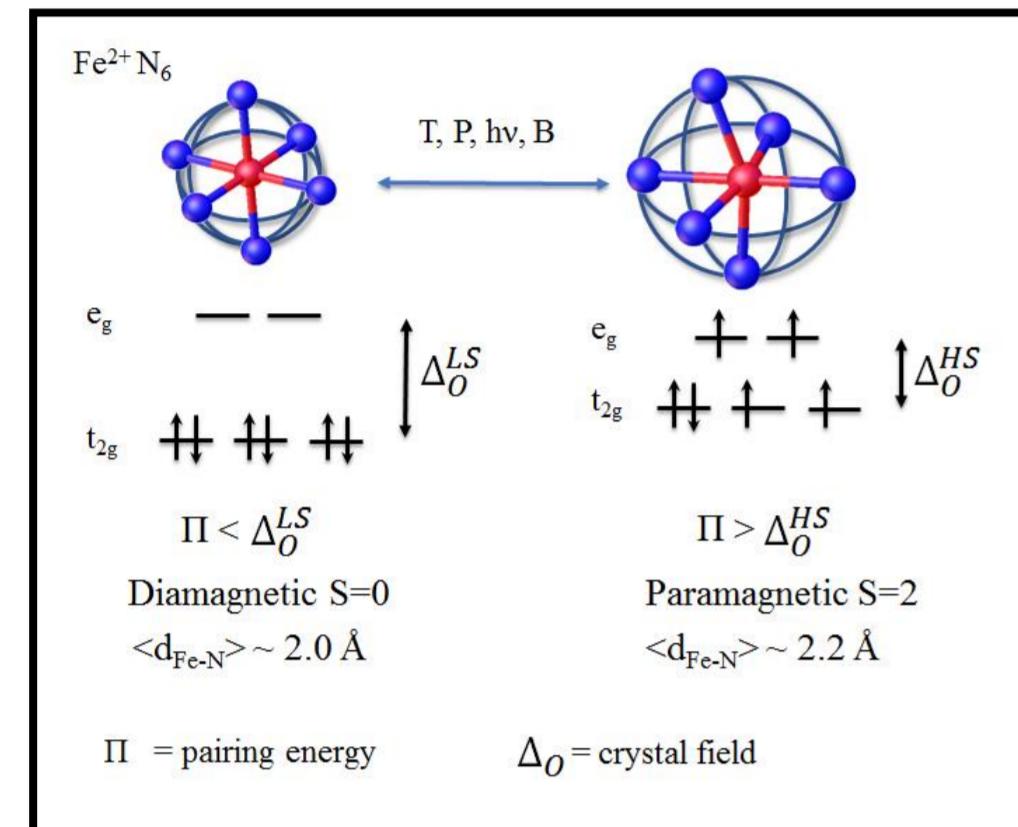
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Context

Molecular switches are getting increasingly implemented in functional materials for sensing applications and in molecular electronics. Among this family, the Fe(II) spin crossover (SCO) materials are studied with great interest due to their ability to change their electronic configuration. The material chosen for this study is an archetypal 1D-polymeric compound based on Fe(II) and triazole ligand. Such materials are close to applications and there is a need to obtain larger quantities of this product and more reliable processes. We address this challenge using an innovative approach based on flow chemistry to synthesize SCO nanoparticles in a reliable one-step process.

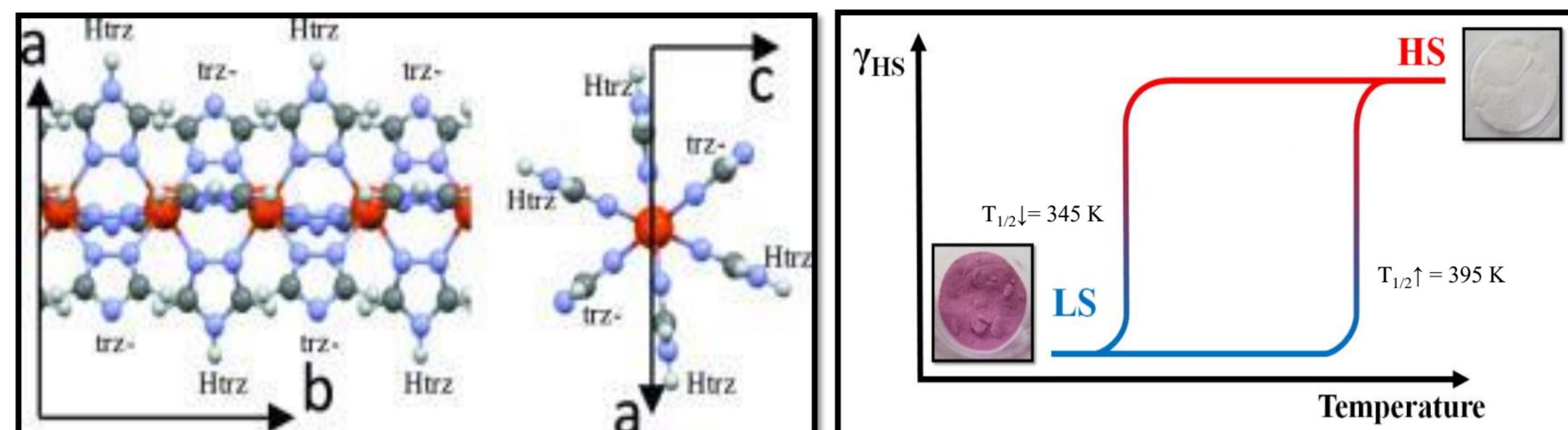
Objectives: Convert the classical batch synthesis method to a continuous system, coupled with a supercritical CO₂ (scCO₂)-assisted drying ; control the nanoparticles sizes ; synthesize heterostructures.

Spin-Crossover materials



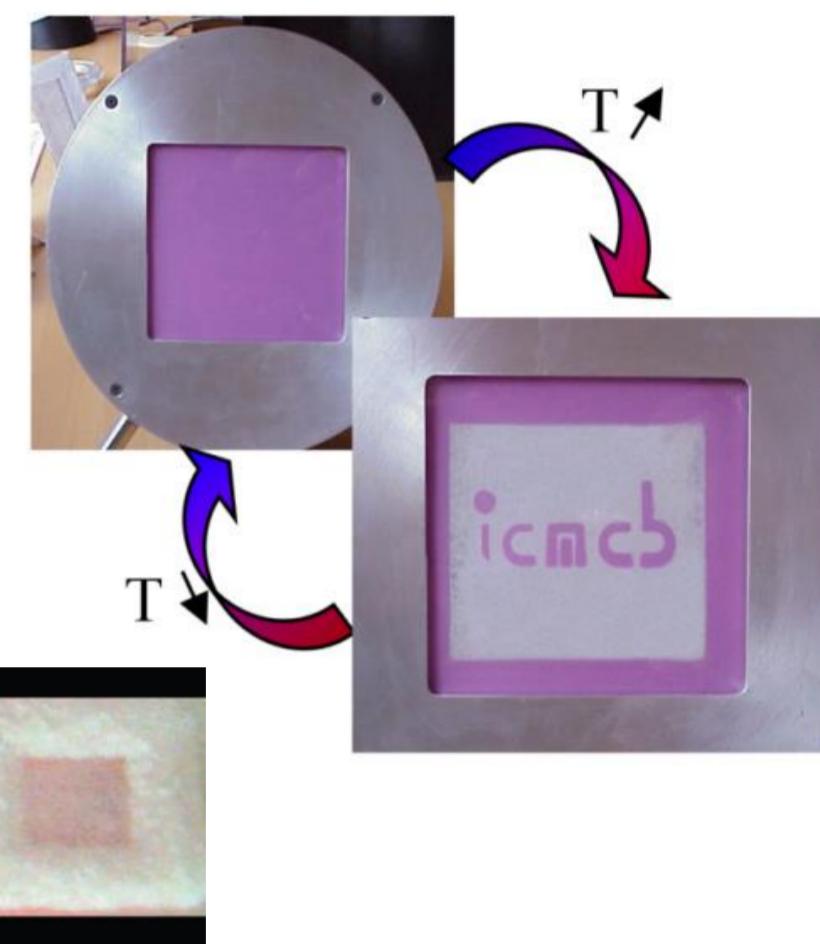
The case of the [Fe(Htrz)₂(trz)](BF₄)

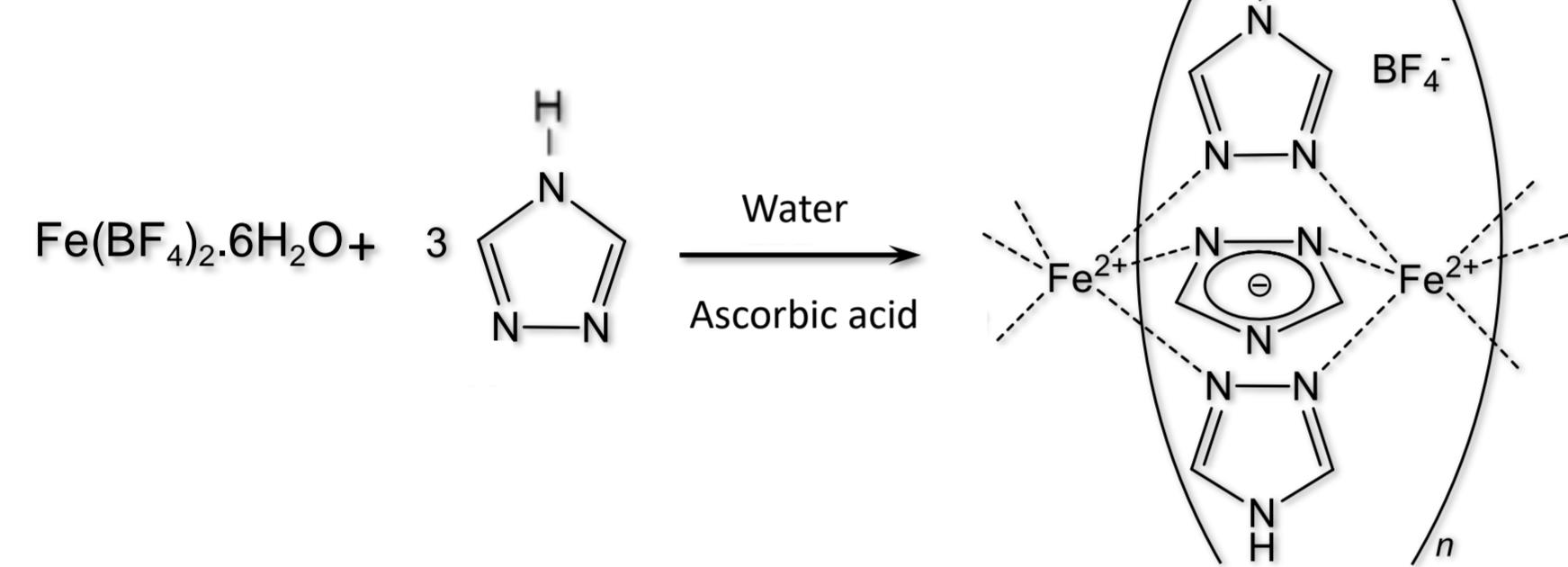

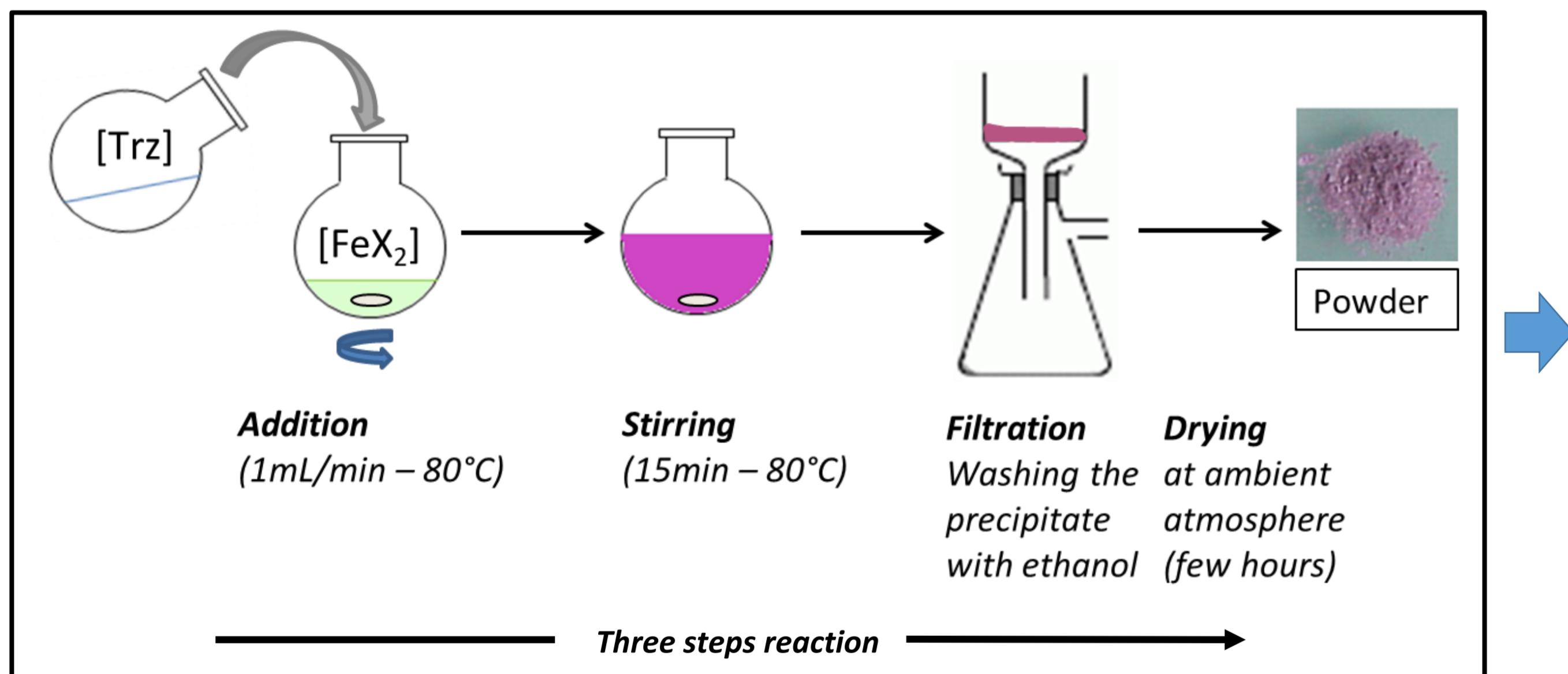
Temperature sensor [6]

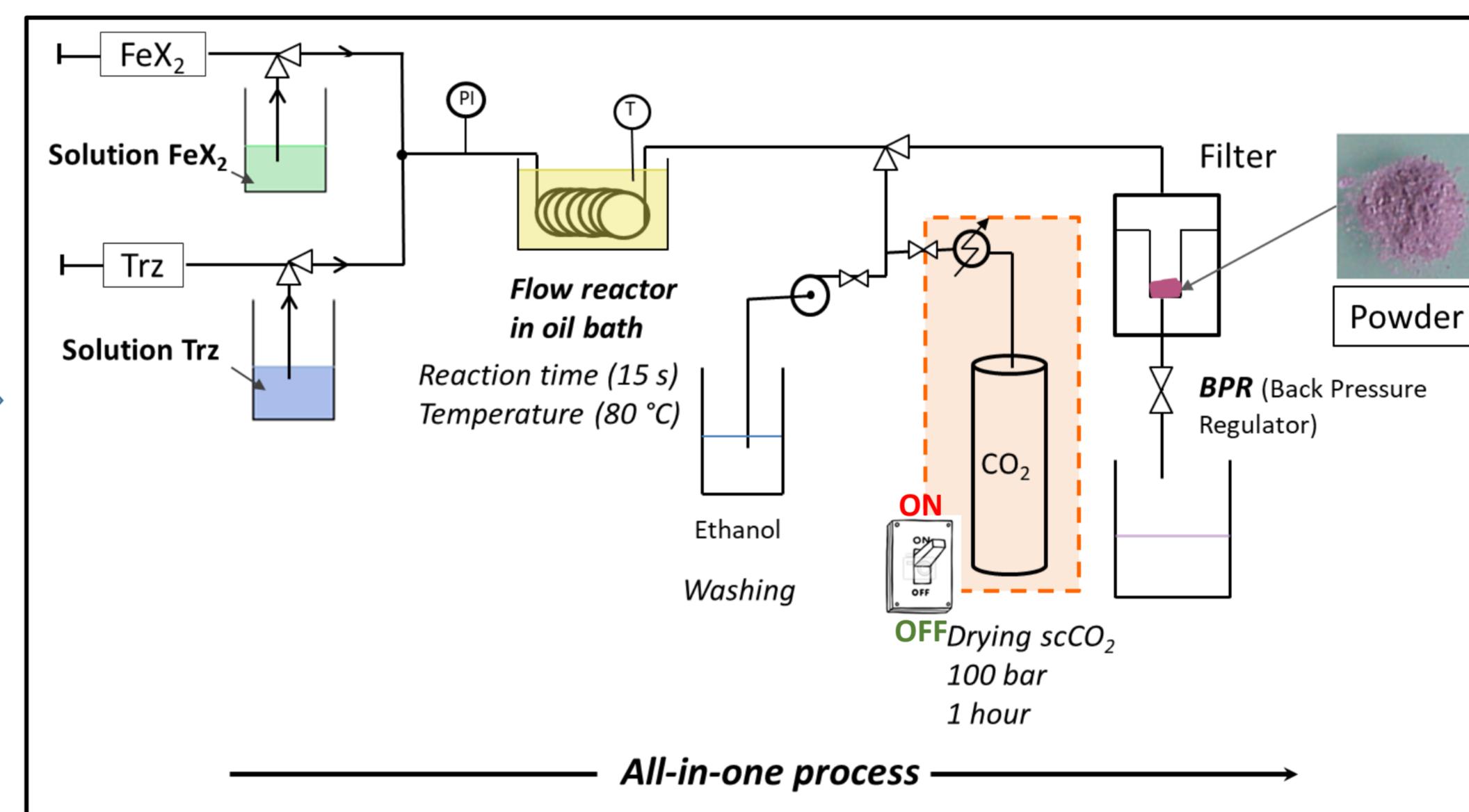


Batch synthesis of [Fe(Htrz)₂(trz)](BF₄)

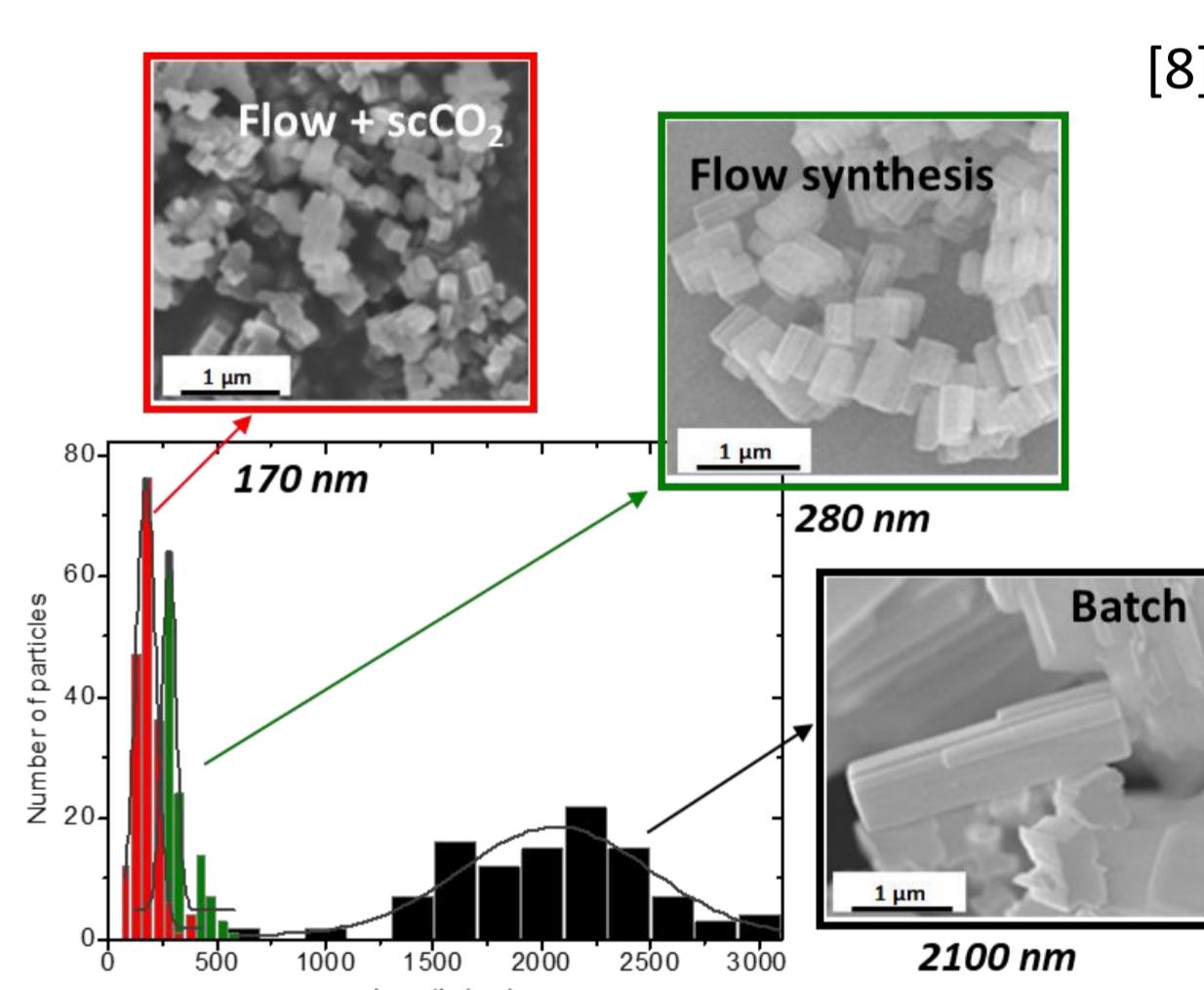
Parameters studied

- Temperature.
- Reactants concentration.
- Synthesis duration.
- Additives addition, pH of the solution.

Flow chemistry approach



Flow synthesis of [Fe(Htrz)₂(trz)](BF₄) with supercritical CO₂ drying OFF (3 steps) – ON (1 step)



Batch limitations

- Low quantities.
- Unreliable reproducibility from batch to batch.
- Long synthesis duration.
- Large sizes of particles.

Advantages of the flow process

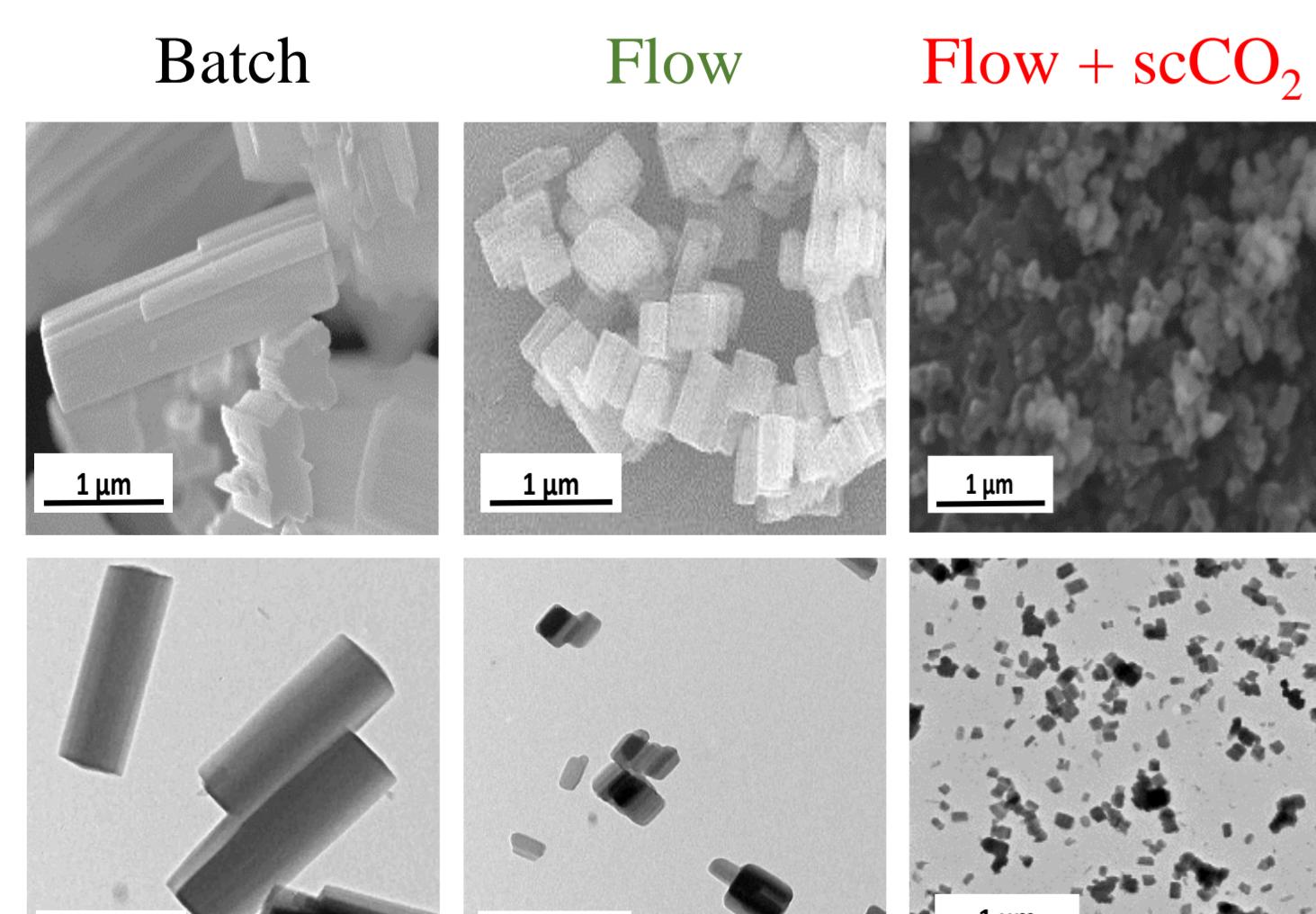
- Large quantities.
- Reproducibility.
- Short residence times.
- Small size and narrow size distribution.

Process flow

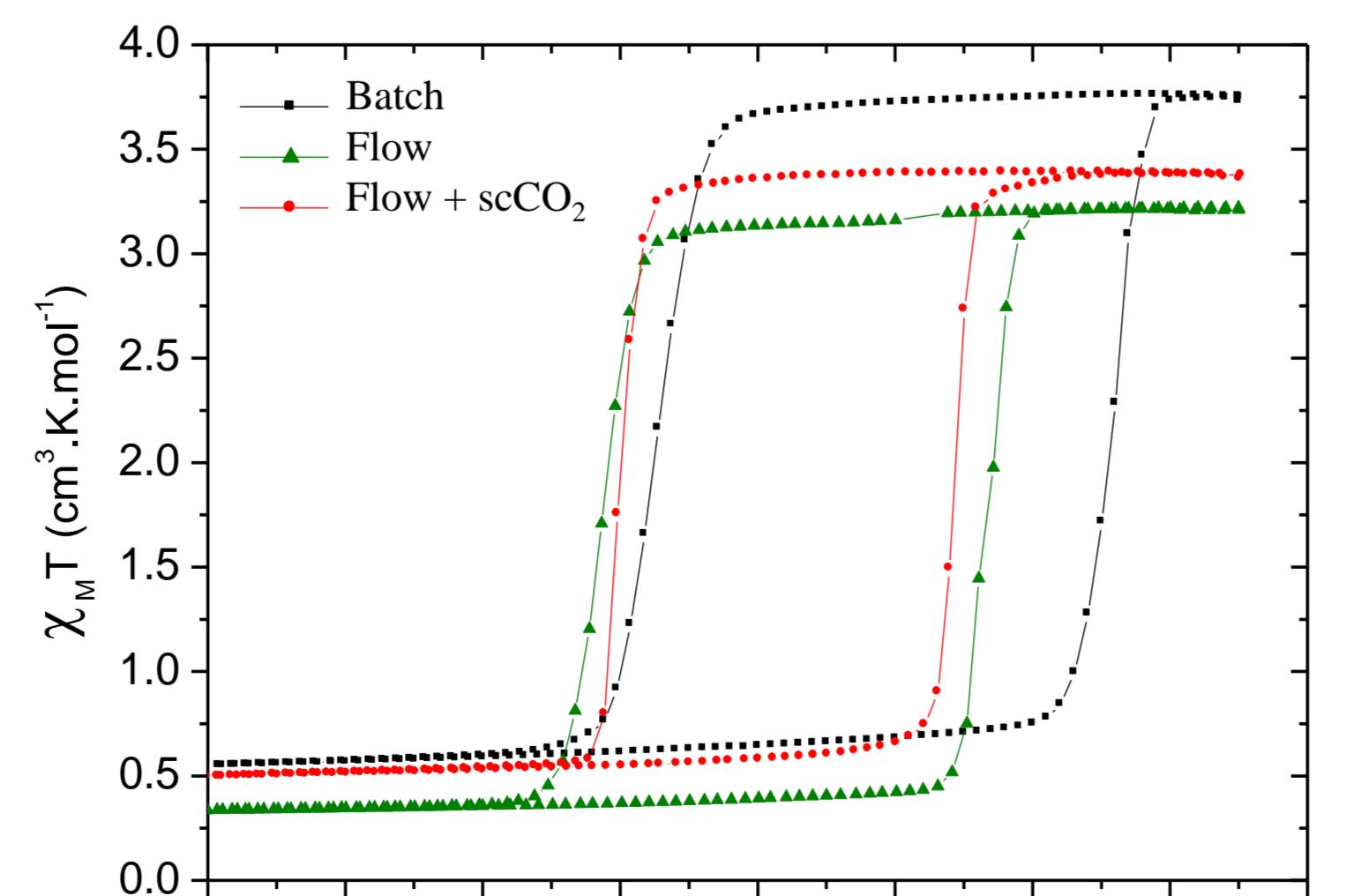
- Co-flow of scCO₂ and ethanol.
- Washing step with ethanol.
- Supercritical drying with CO₂.

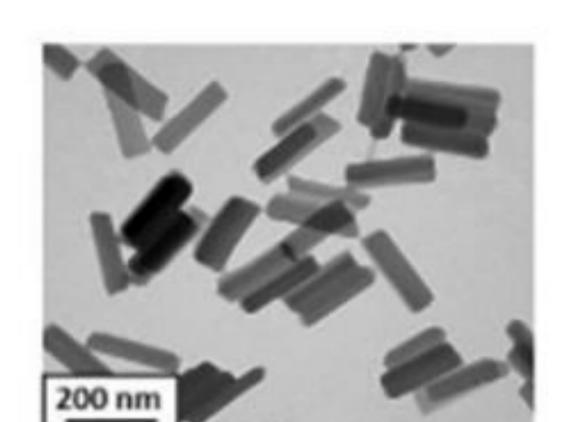
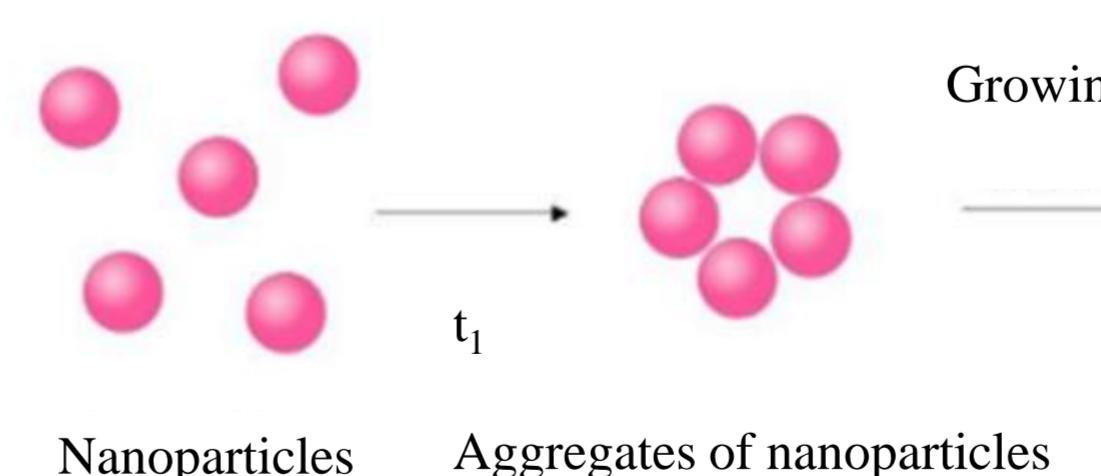

Control of the NP growth

- Solid solutions (of ligands or anions).
