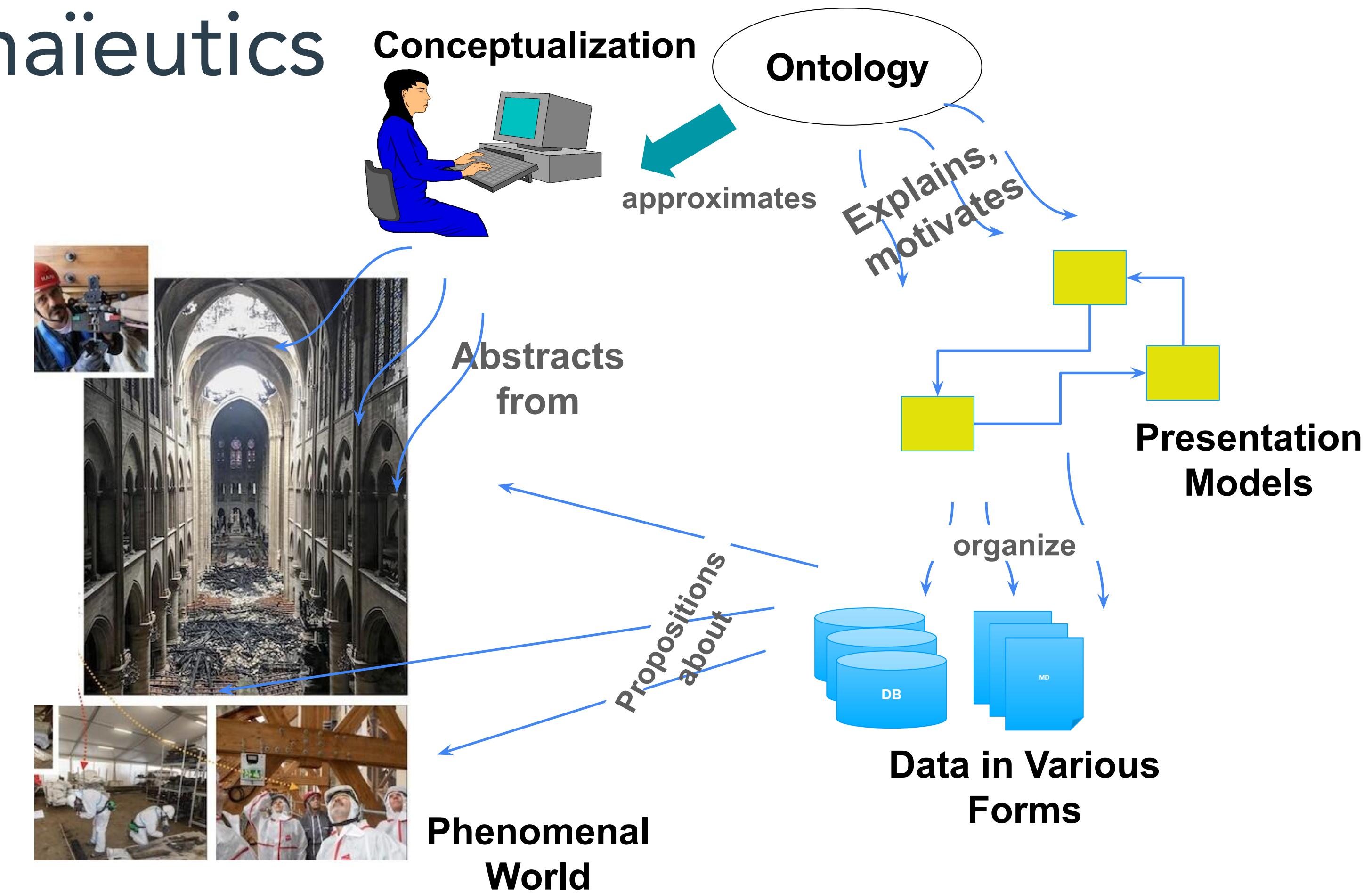
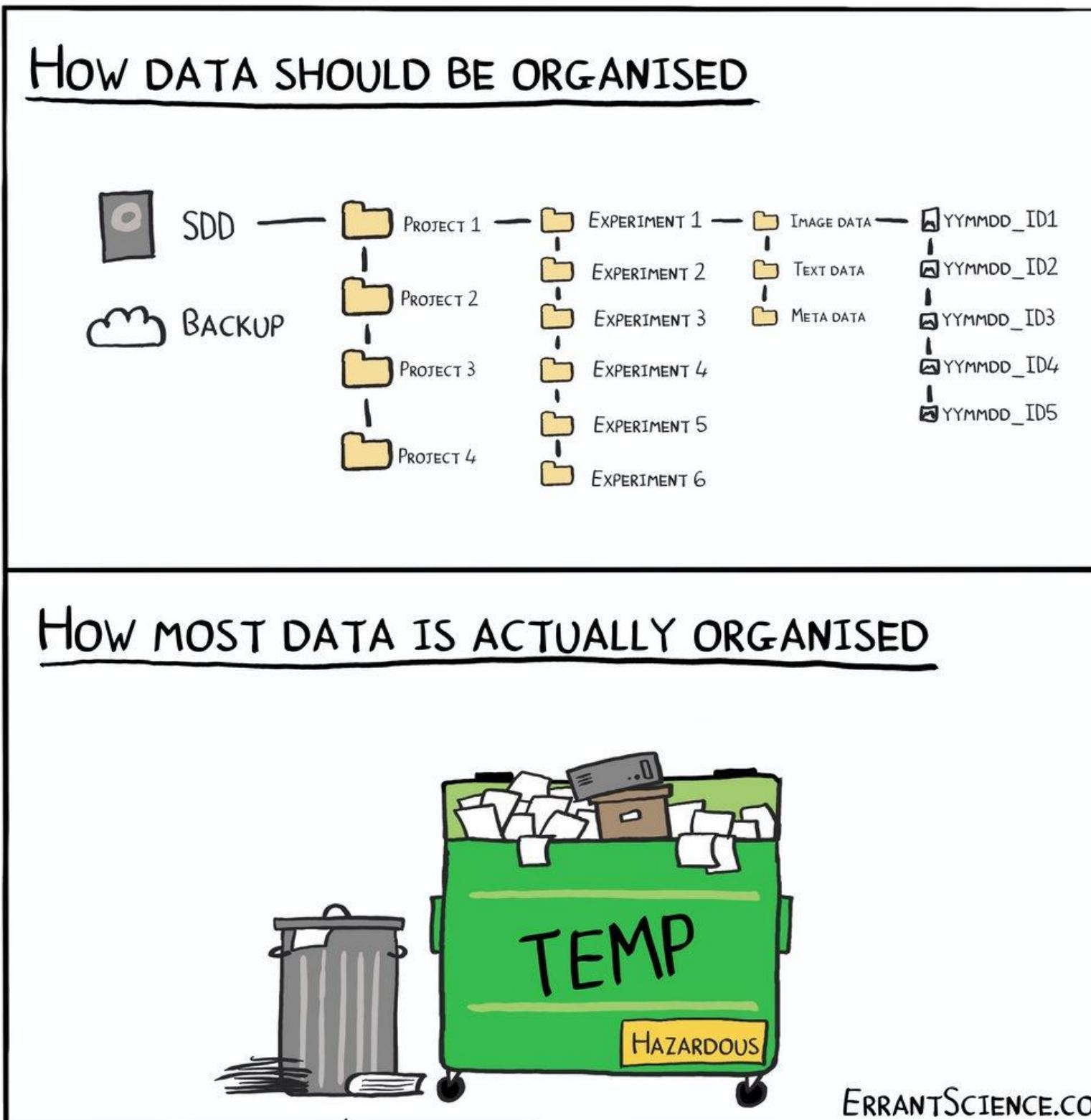


- ★ make your stuff available on the Web (whatever format) under an open license¹

- ★★★ make it available in a non-proprietary open format (e.g., CSV instead of Excel)³
- ★★★★ use URIs to denote things, so that people can point at your stuff⁴
- ★★★★★ link your data to other data to provide context⁵

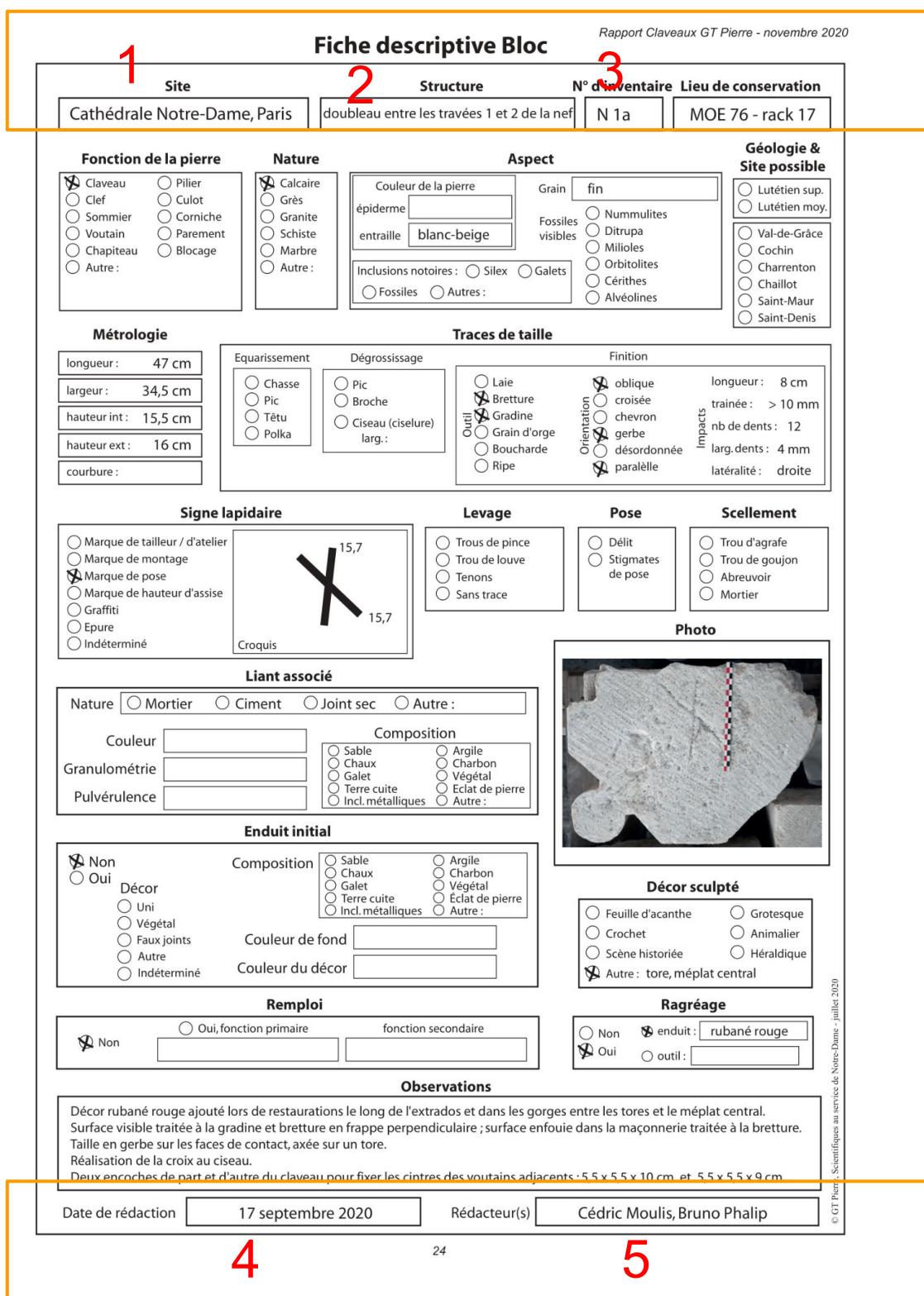

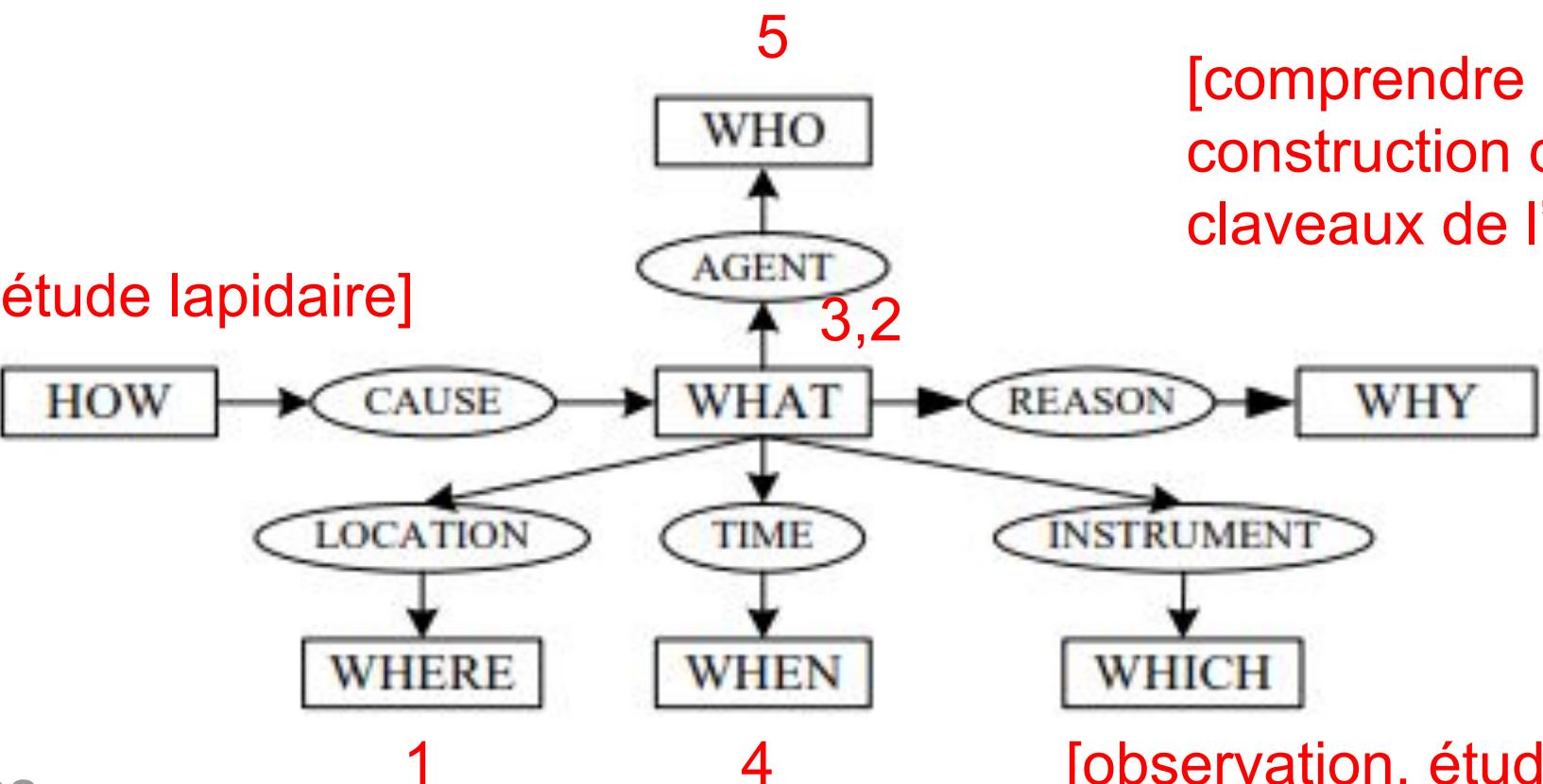

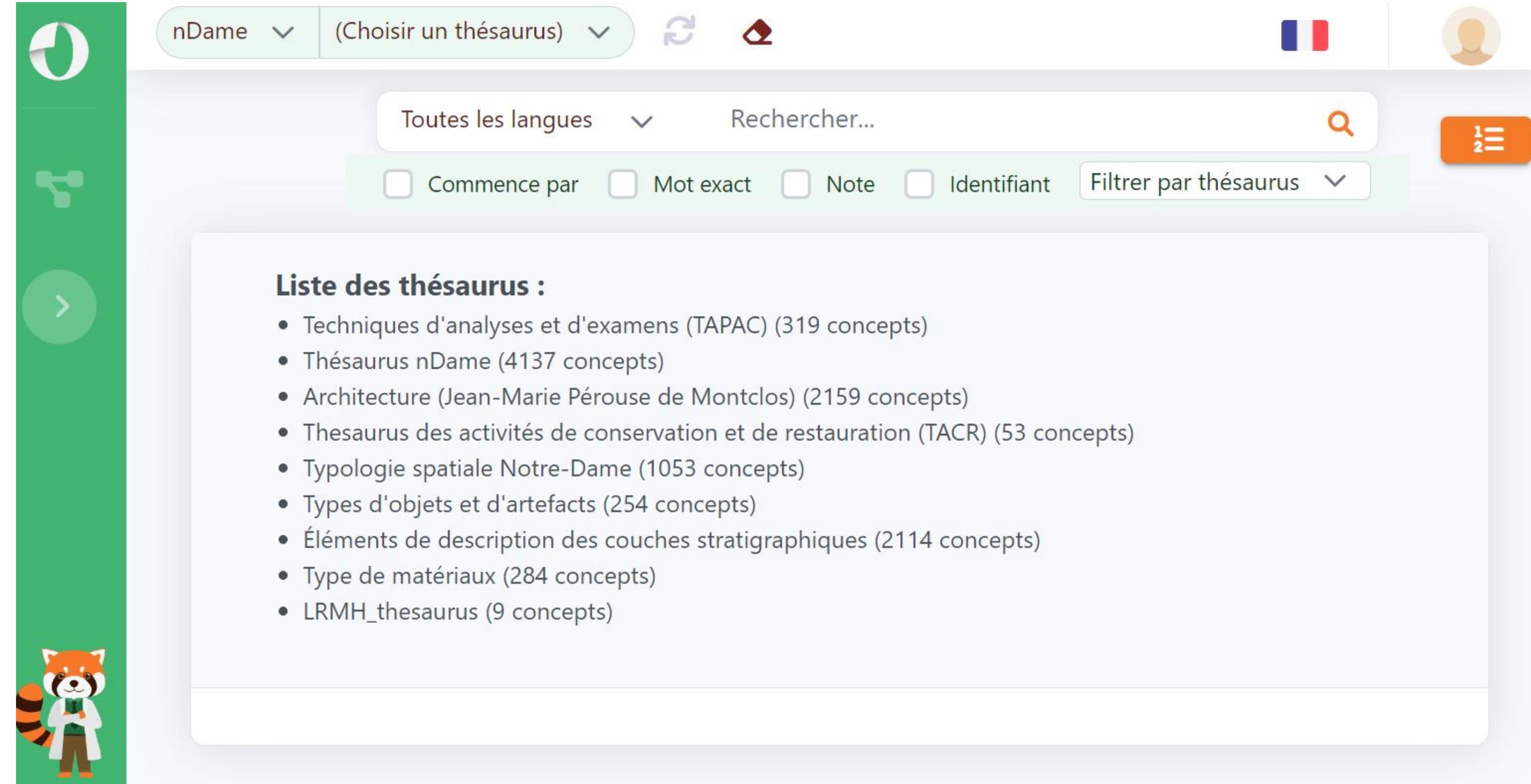

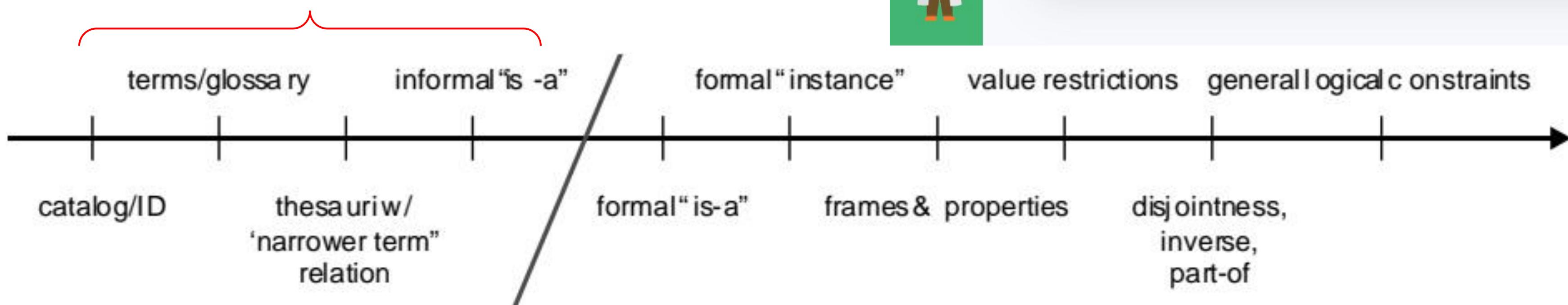

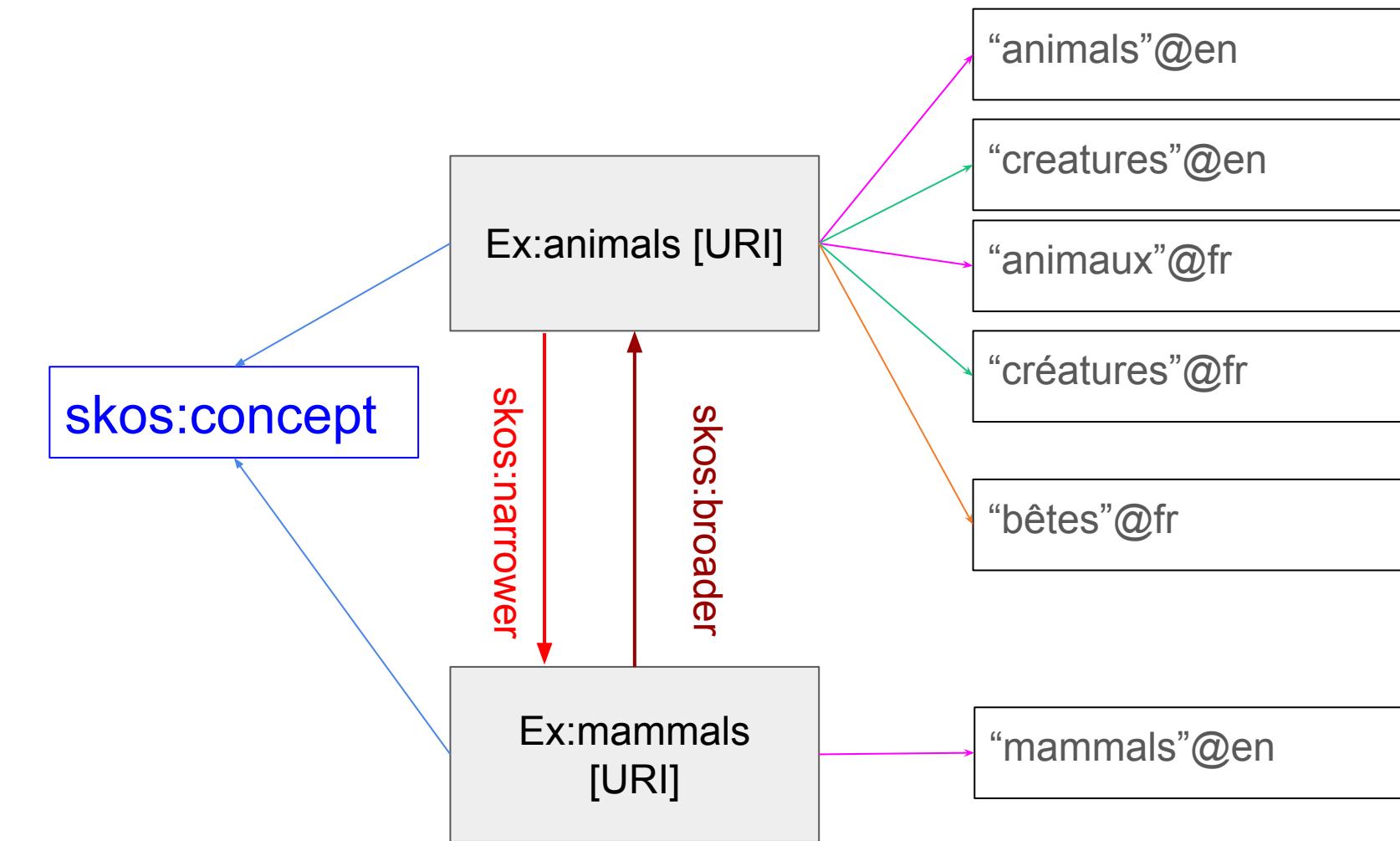
Simple Knowledge Organization System (SKOS) formalization

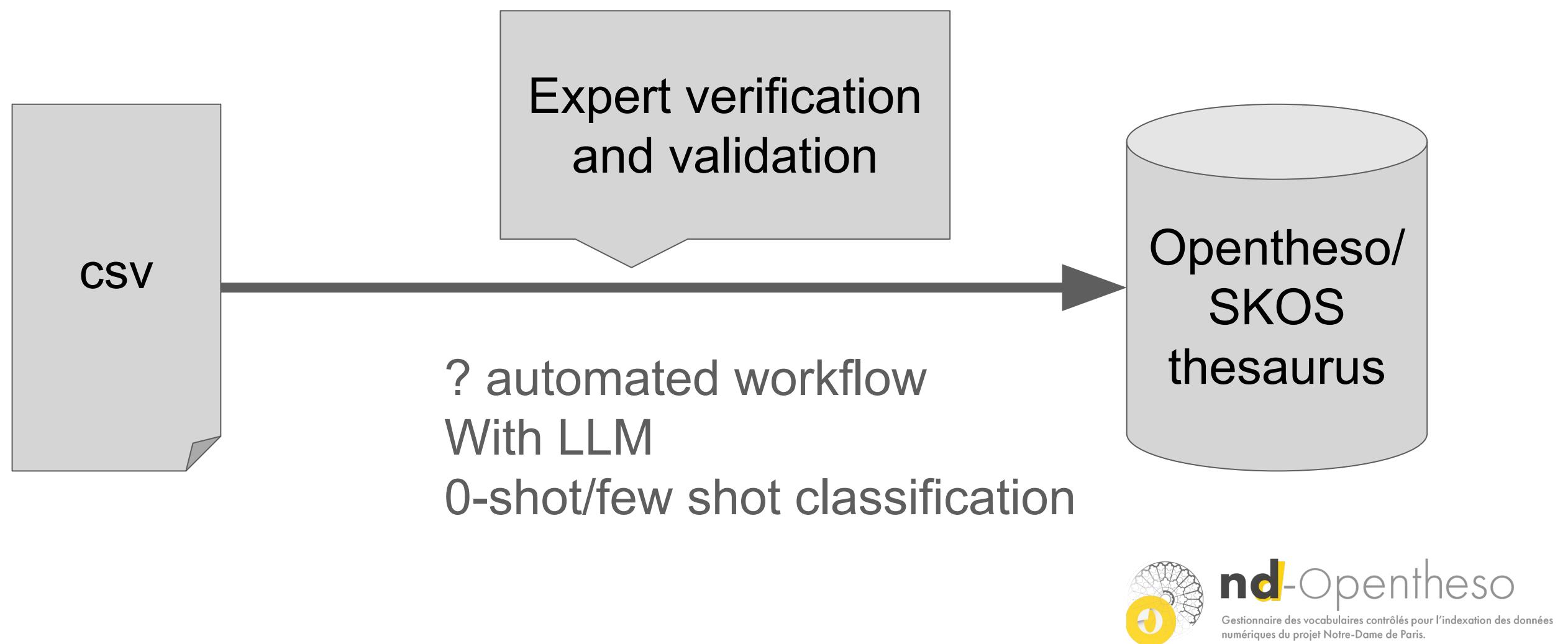

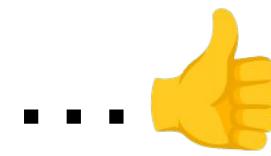

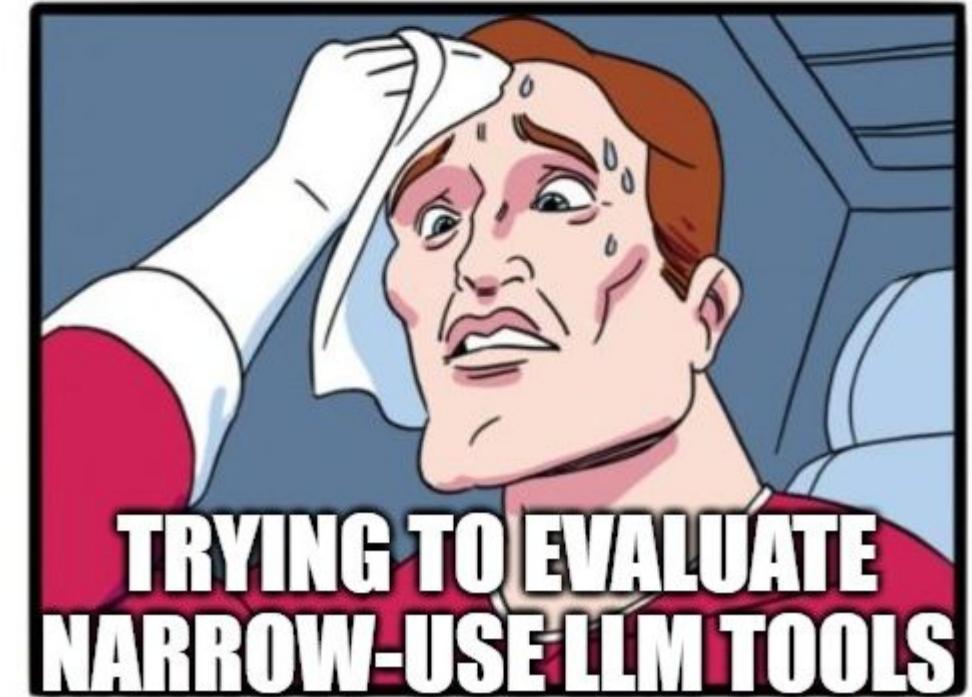

The **3rd Wave** as *neuro-symbolic or hybrid systems*: “Neuro-symbolic systems are the offspring of two very different parents, roughly speaking the fields of ‘knowledge representation’ and ‘machine learning’, and each of these parents has its own strengths and weaknesses” (vi).

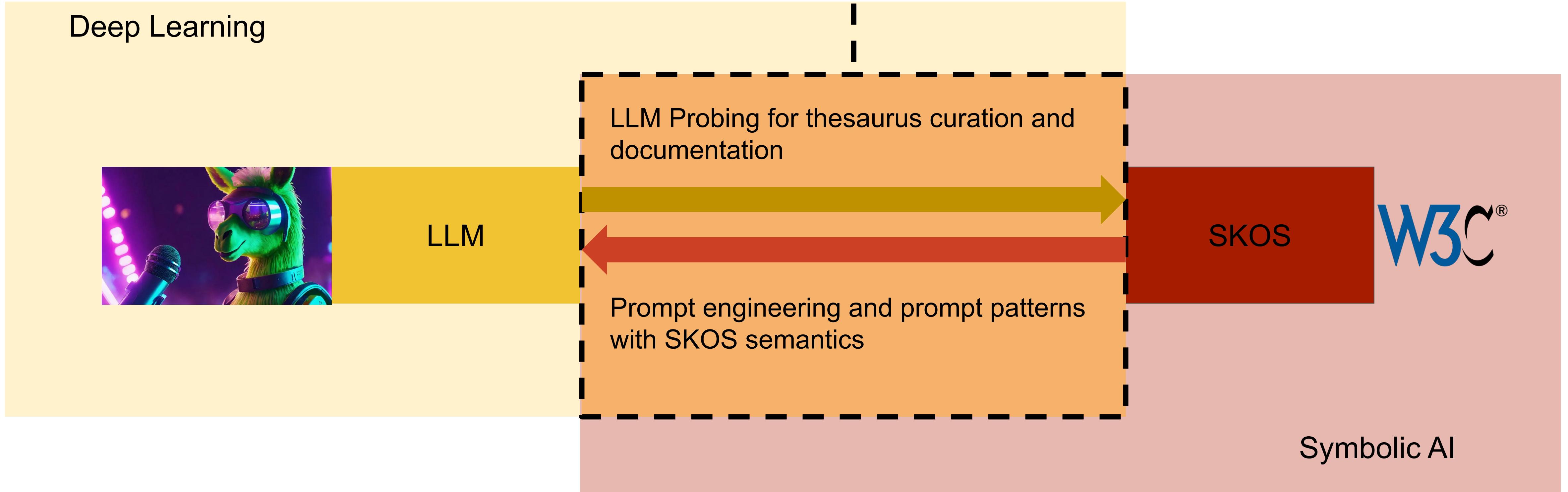

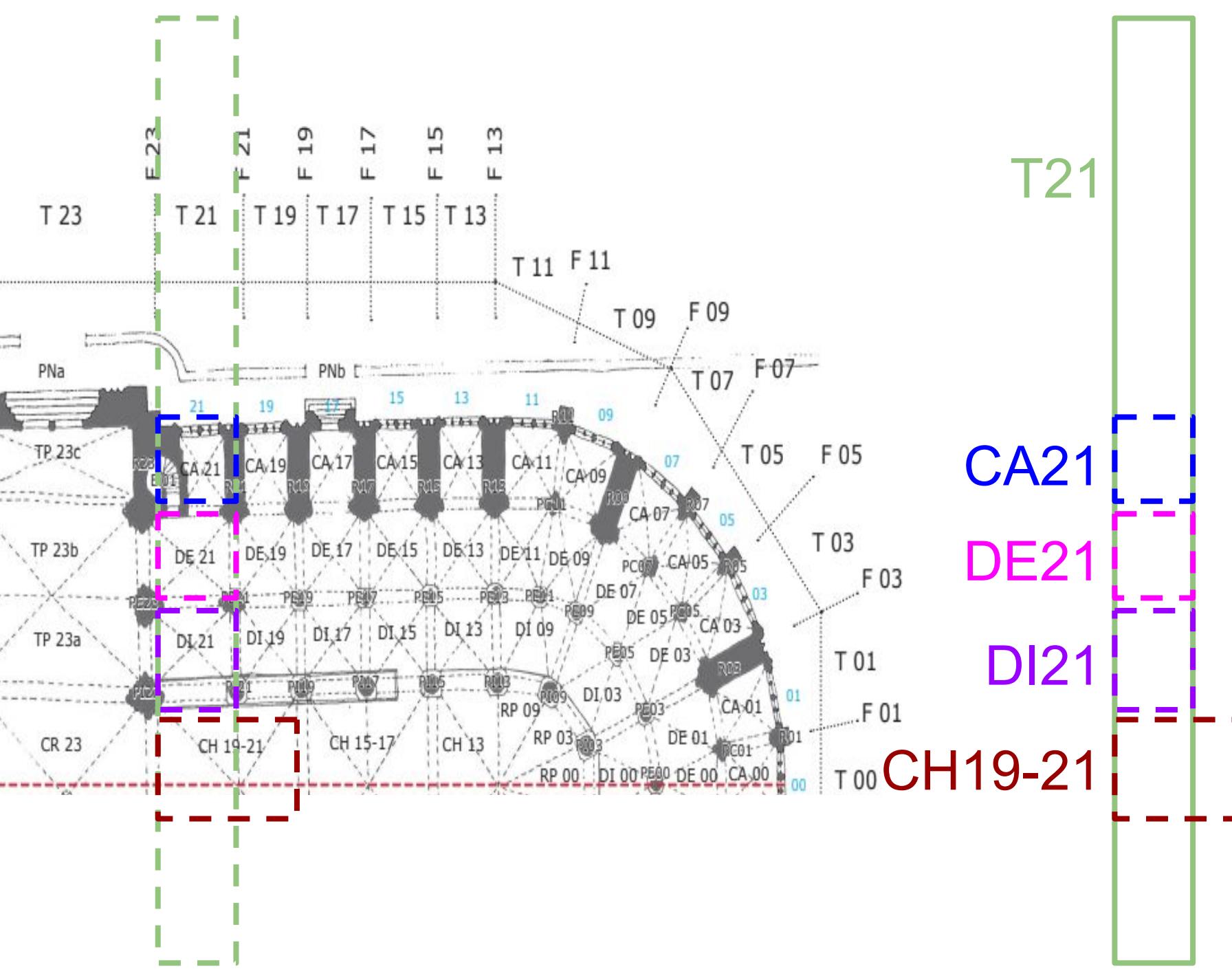

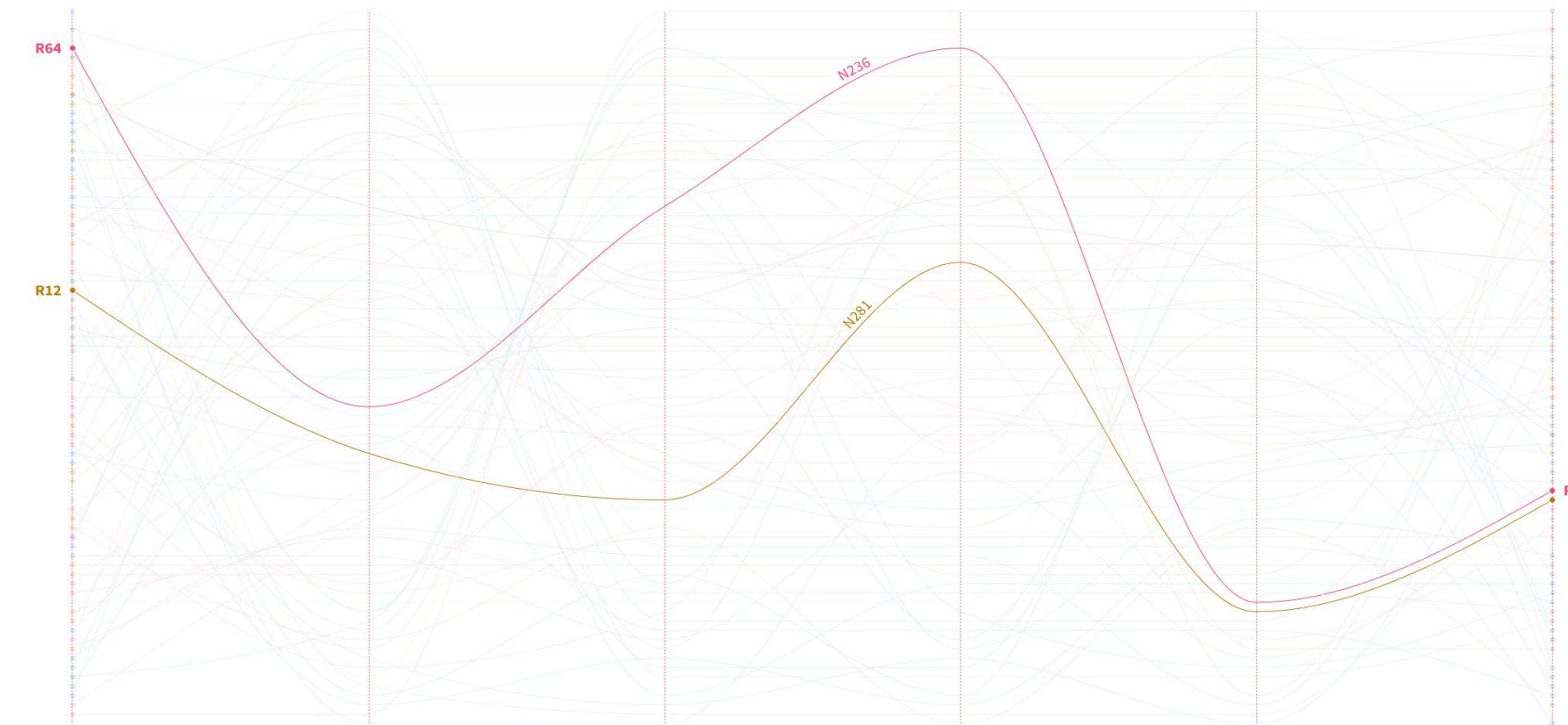

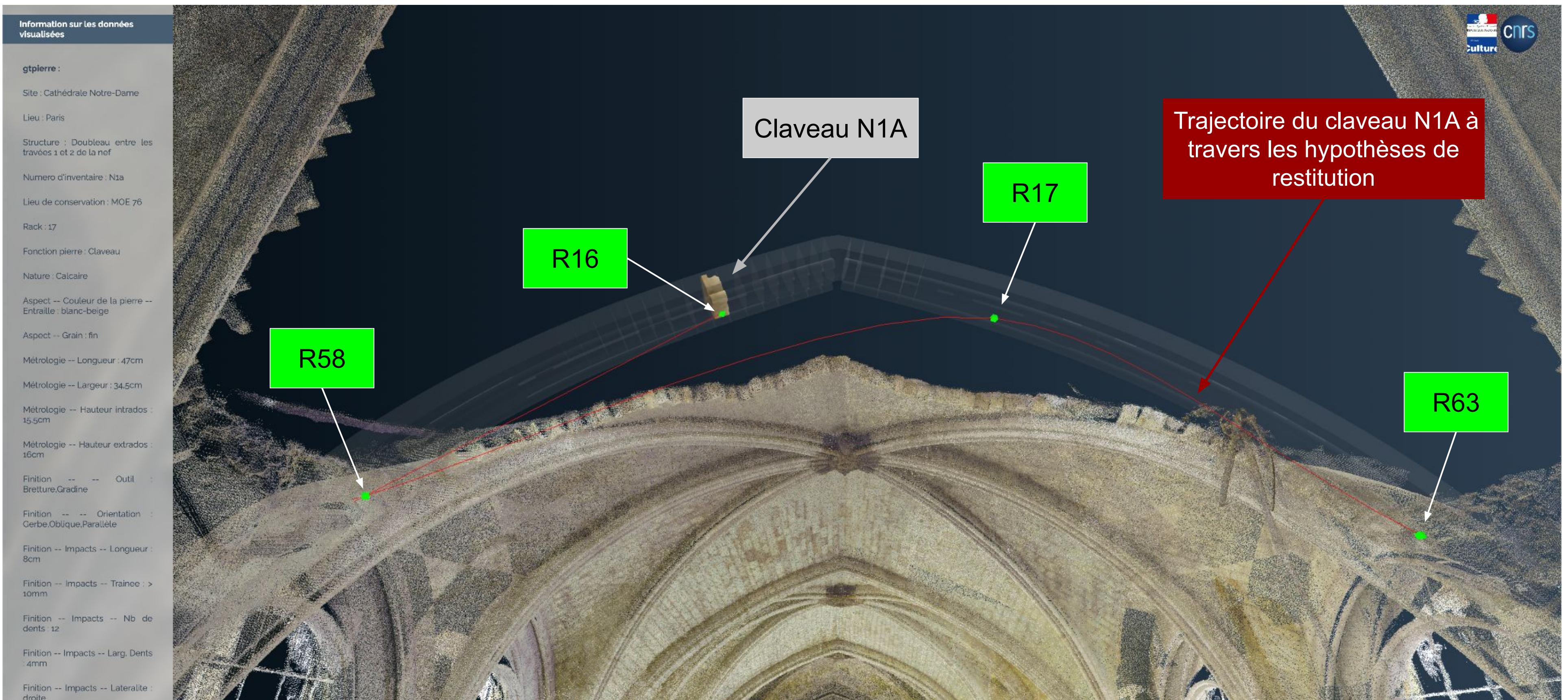
visualization of both N236 (pink)
and N281 (ocre) trajectories



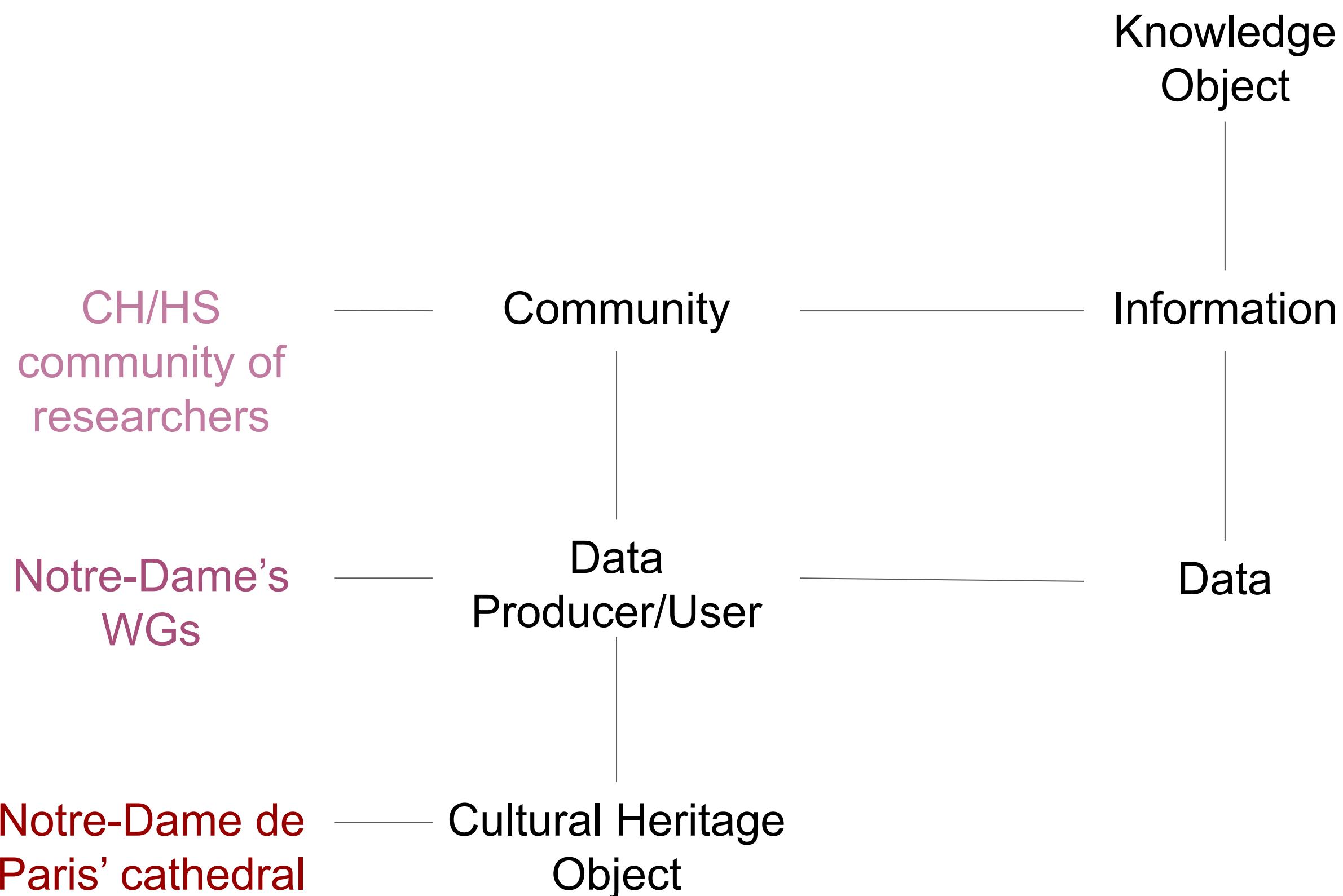
