Considering the physics governing system operation

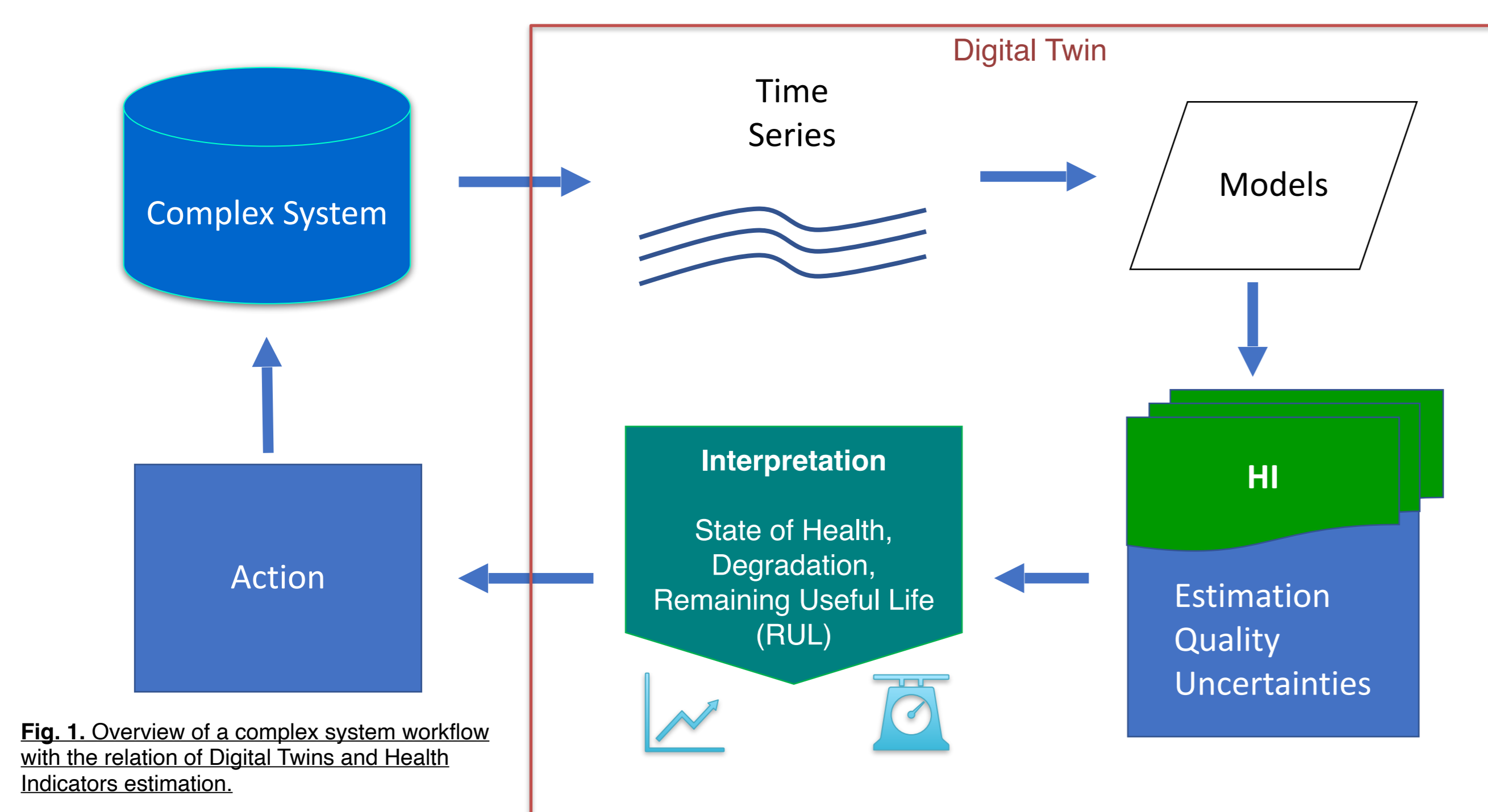


Fig. 1. Overview of a complex system workflow with the relation of Digital Twins and Health Indicators estimation.

2. Challenges and objectives

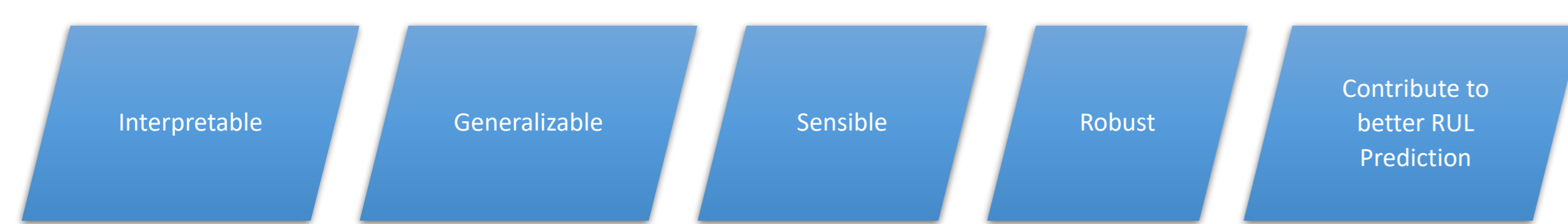
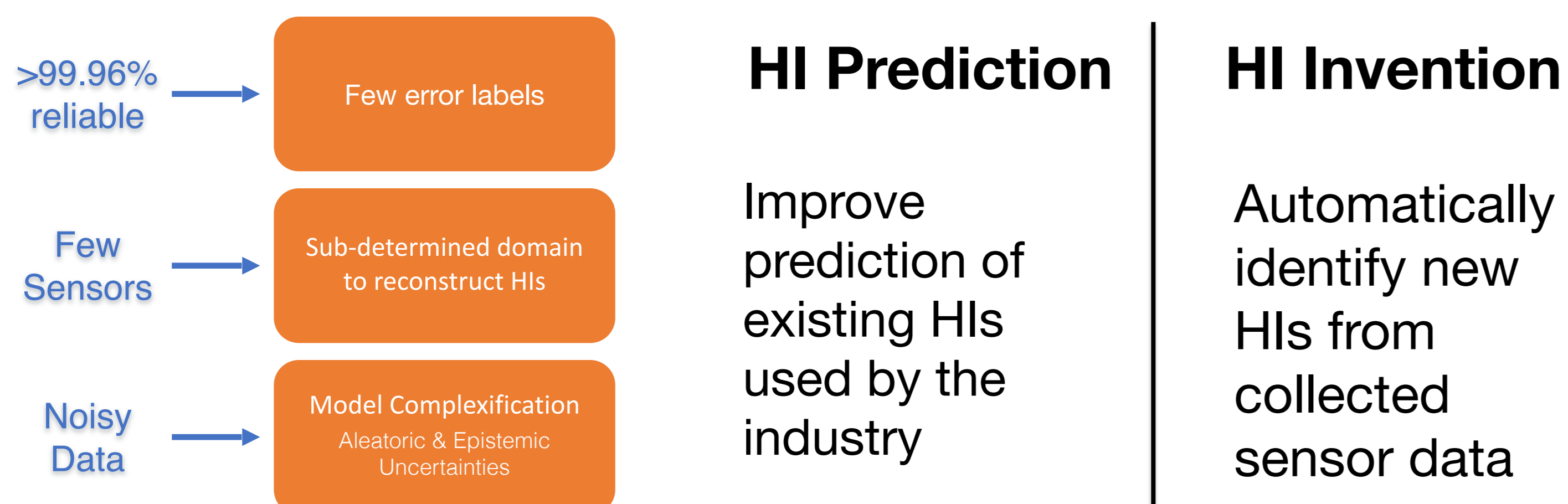


Fig. 2. Health Indicator (HI) Properties

- Incorporate physics-informed methods

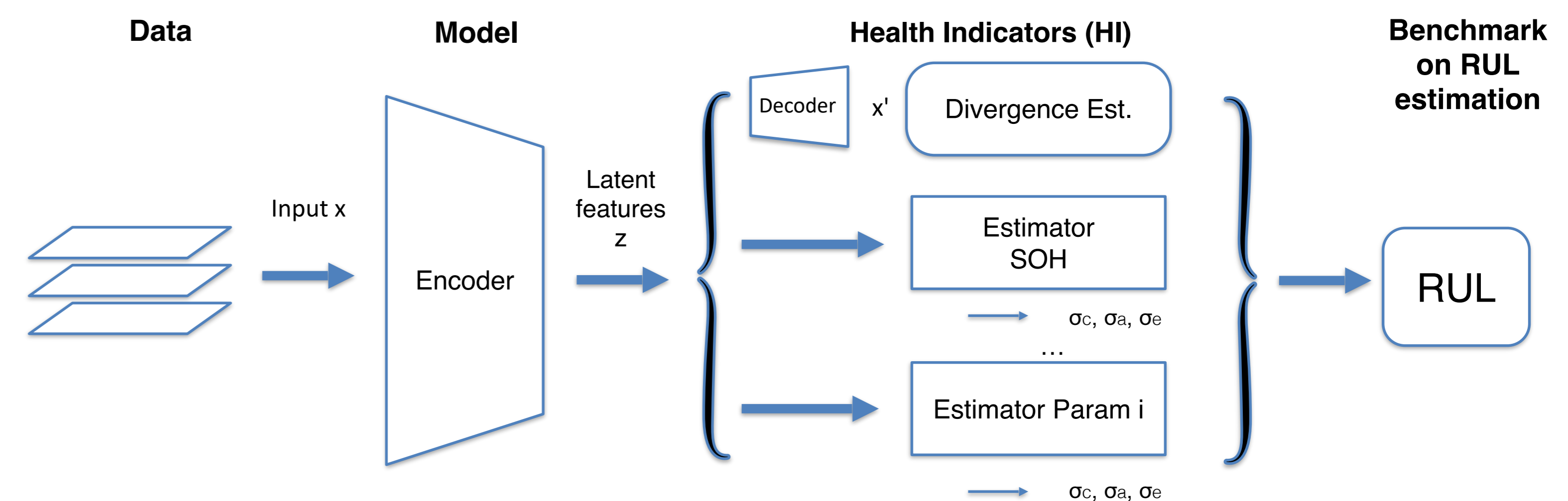
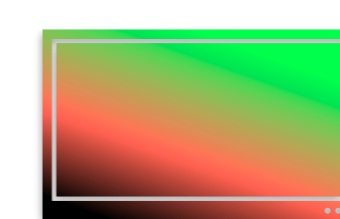


Fig. 3. Overview of the Expected Architecture

- Interpretable degradation maps

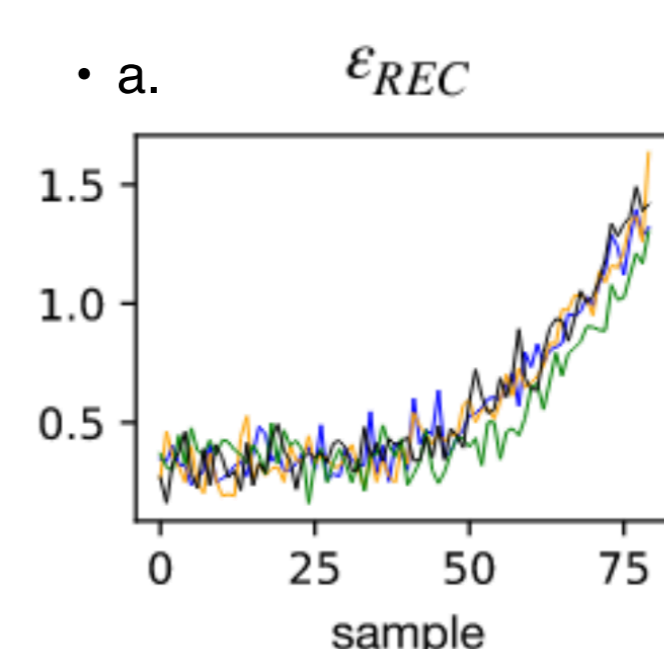


Fig. 5.a. HIs built on deep auto encoder residuals for a degradation profile belonging to FD001 dataset. [1]

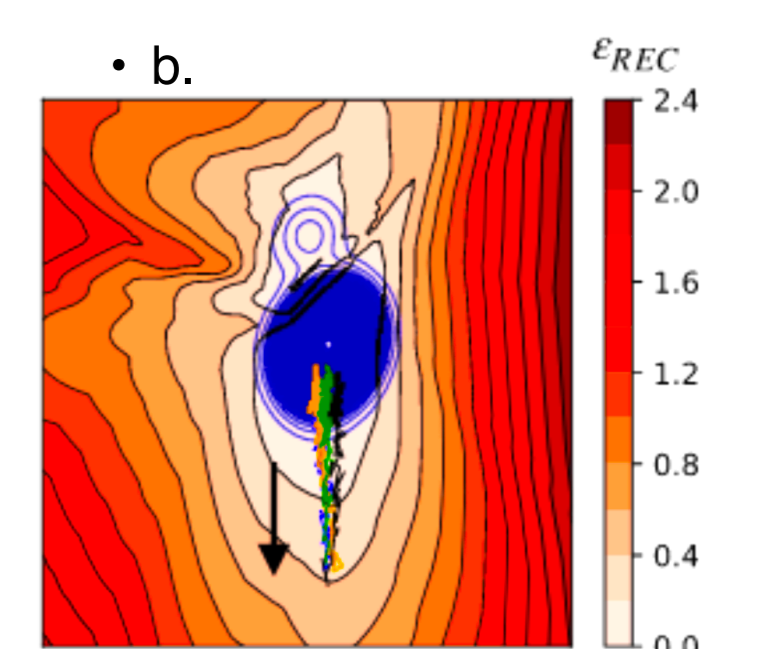


Fig. 5.b. Health Indicator representation in the latent space of the deep auto encoder for the FD001 dataset. [1]
