Growing demands of phycoproteins
By-product accumulation



High value nonpolar metabolites
Free fatty acids (FFA), polyunsaturated
Pigments (carotenoids, chlorophylls)



FFA = natural antibiotics
Regulation of skin microbiome
Interesting for dysbiosis treatment like Atopic dermatitis



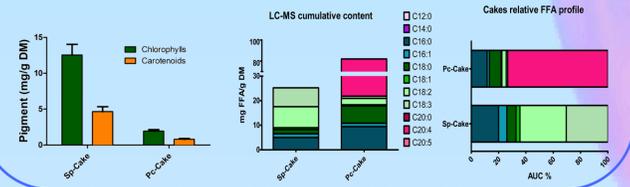
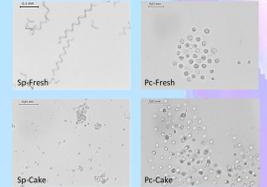
Use Natural Deep Eutectic Solvents

low pigment rate (*P. cruentum*)

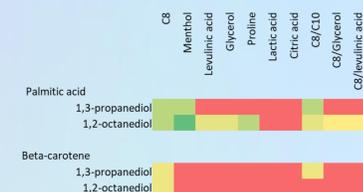

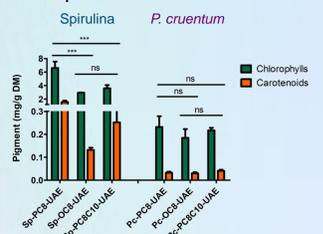
2. Reference solubilization test beta-carotene & palmitic acid heat map vs reference solvent



→ 3 NaDES highlighted
→ PC8, OC8 and PC8C10

3. Extraction screening

PC8 = singularity of FFA profile
PC8C10 = higher FFA recovery
OC8 = high rates
but difficult biomass/NaDES separation



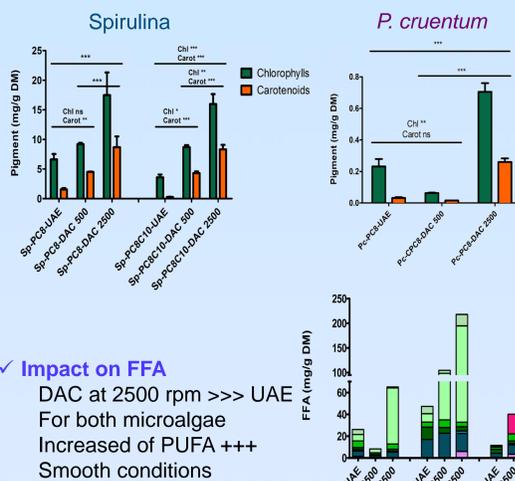
Process impact



✓ Ultrasound assisted extraction (UAE)
✓ Green process
✓ Enhanced solvent penetration
✓ Rising temperature up to 60°C

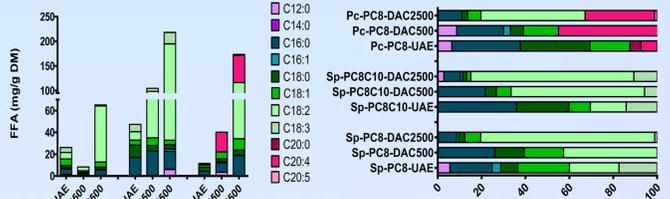


✓ Dual Asymmetric Centrifugation (DAC)
✓ Green process
✓ Room temperature
✓ Modulated speed 500 vs 2500 rpm



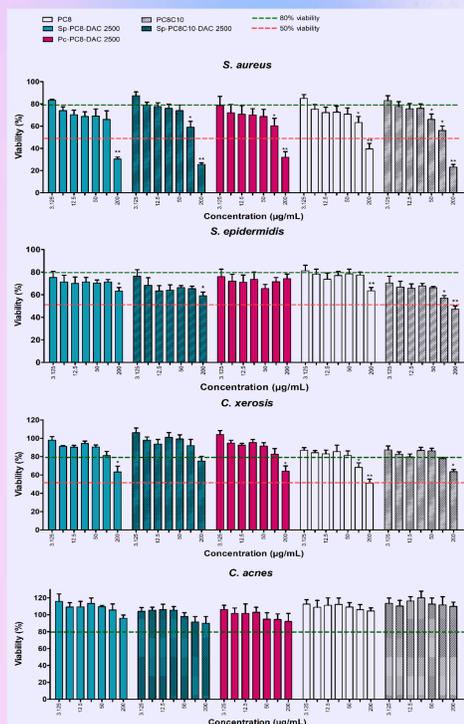
✓ **Impact on pigments**
DAC at 2500 rpm >>> UAE
For both microalgae
Enhanced transfer or preservation?

✓ **Impact on FFA**
DAC at 2500 rpm >>> UAE
For both microalgae
Increased of PUFA +++
Smooth conditions



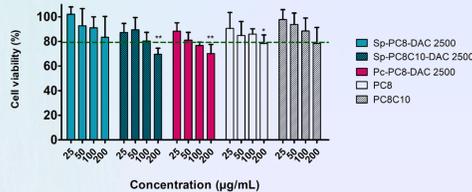
Impact on skin

✓ **Impact on 4 cutaneous strains**



✓ NaDESs decrease *S. aureus* viability
✓ PUFA enriched extracts boost commensal strains
✓ Combined effect of NaDES/PUFA

✓ **Impact on keratinocytes**

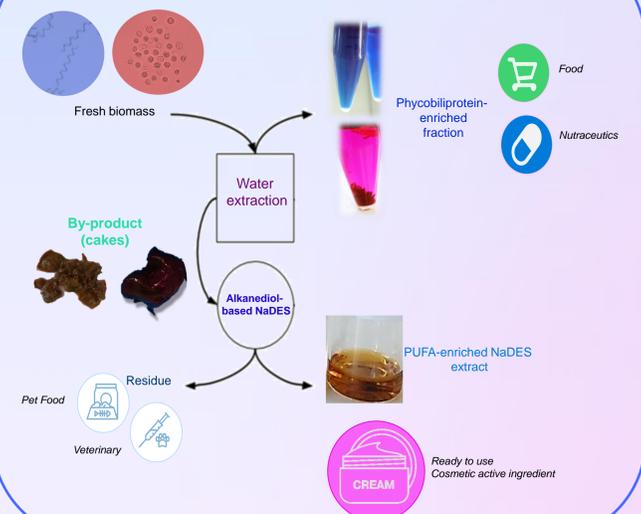


✓ No impact on cells viability at regular concentration

✓ Suitable innocuity for cosmetic use

Downregulation of *S. aureus*
Upregulation of commensals
