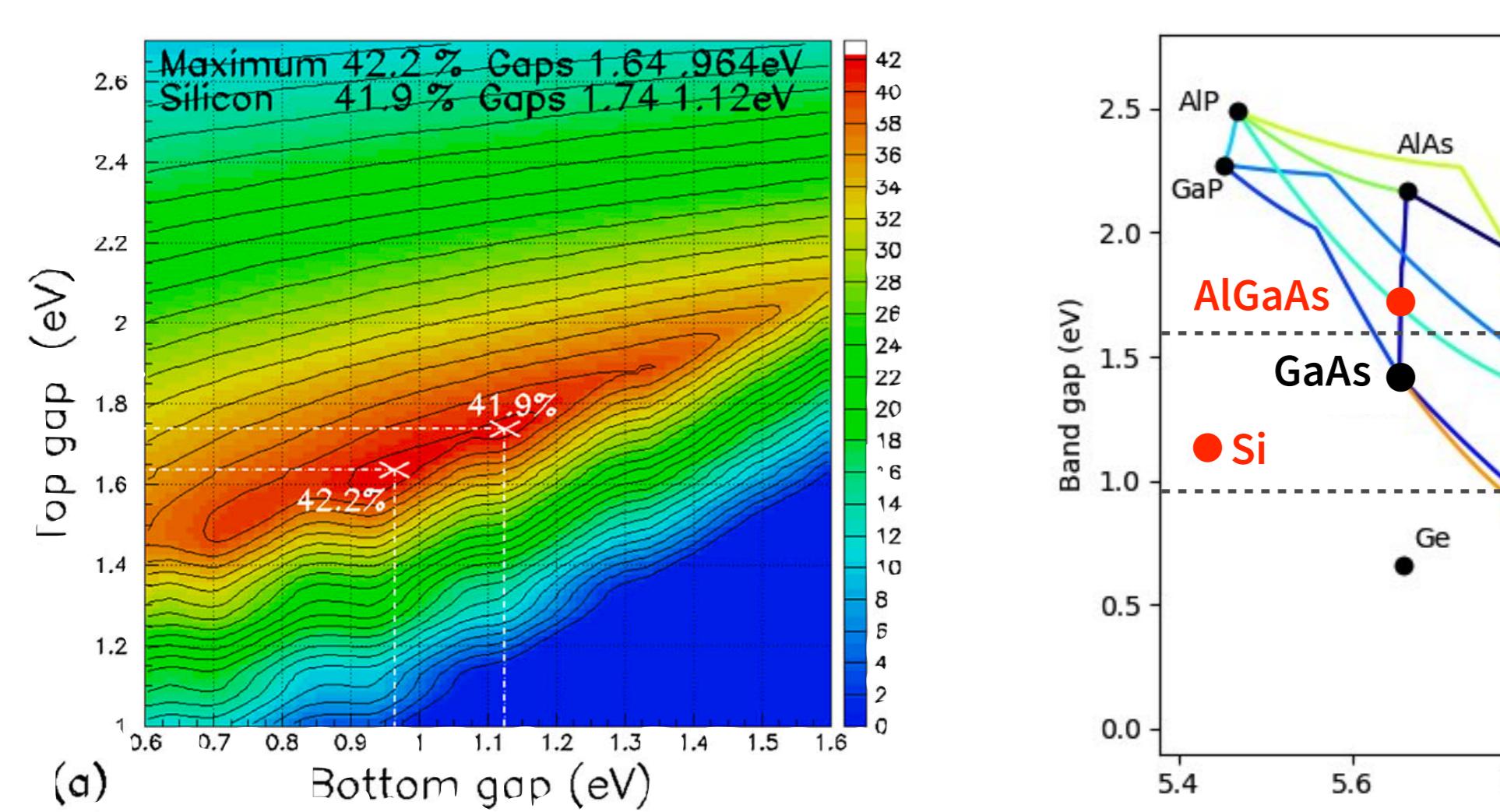

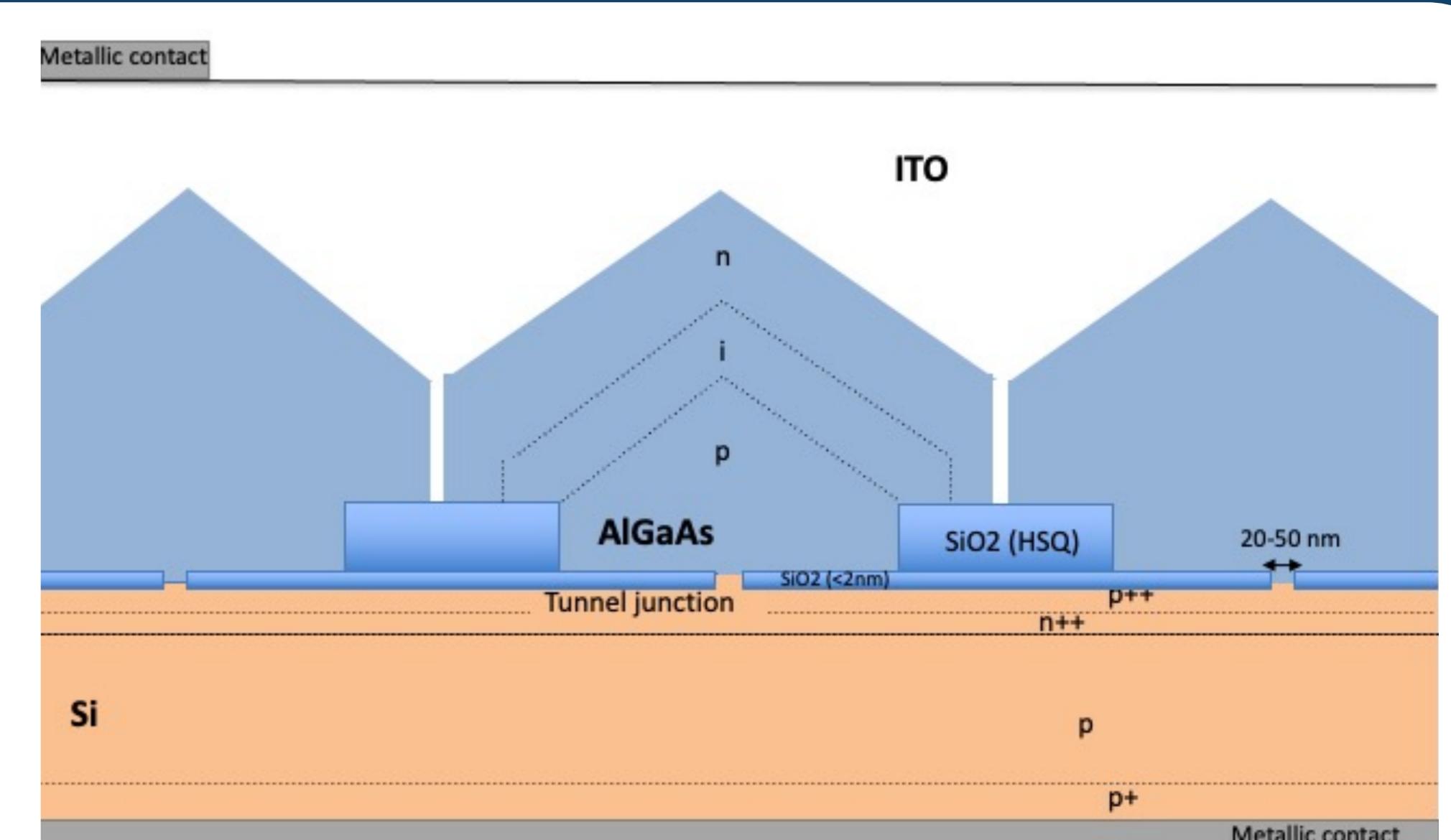
## Multifonctions solar cells

### GaAs on Si integration challenges

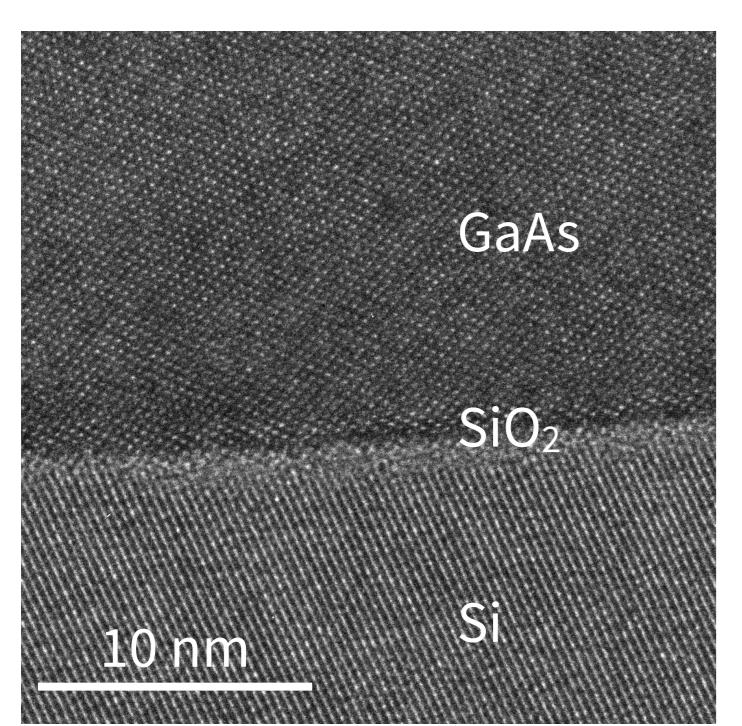
- High lattice mismatch 4.2%
- Different thermal coefficient
- Anti-phase domains

### Epitaxial Lateral Overgrowth (ELO)

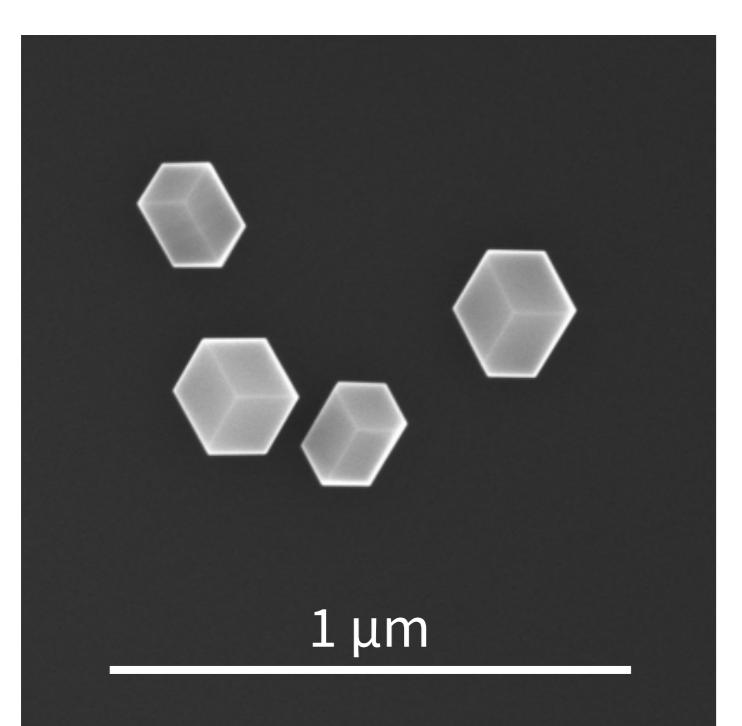
- Nano-apertures in ultra-thin SiO<sub>2</sub>
- GaAs growth, relaxed and defect free
- Conductive interface via tunnel junction



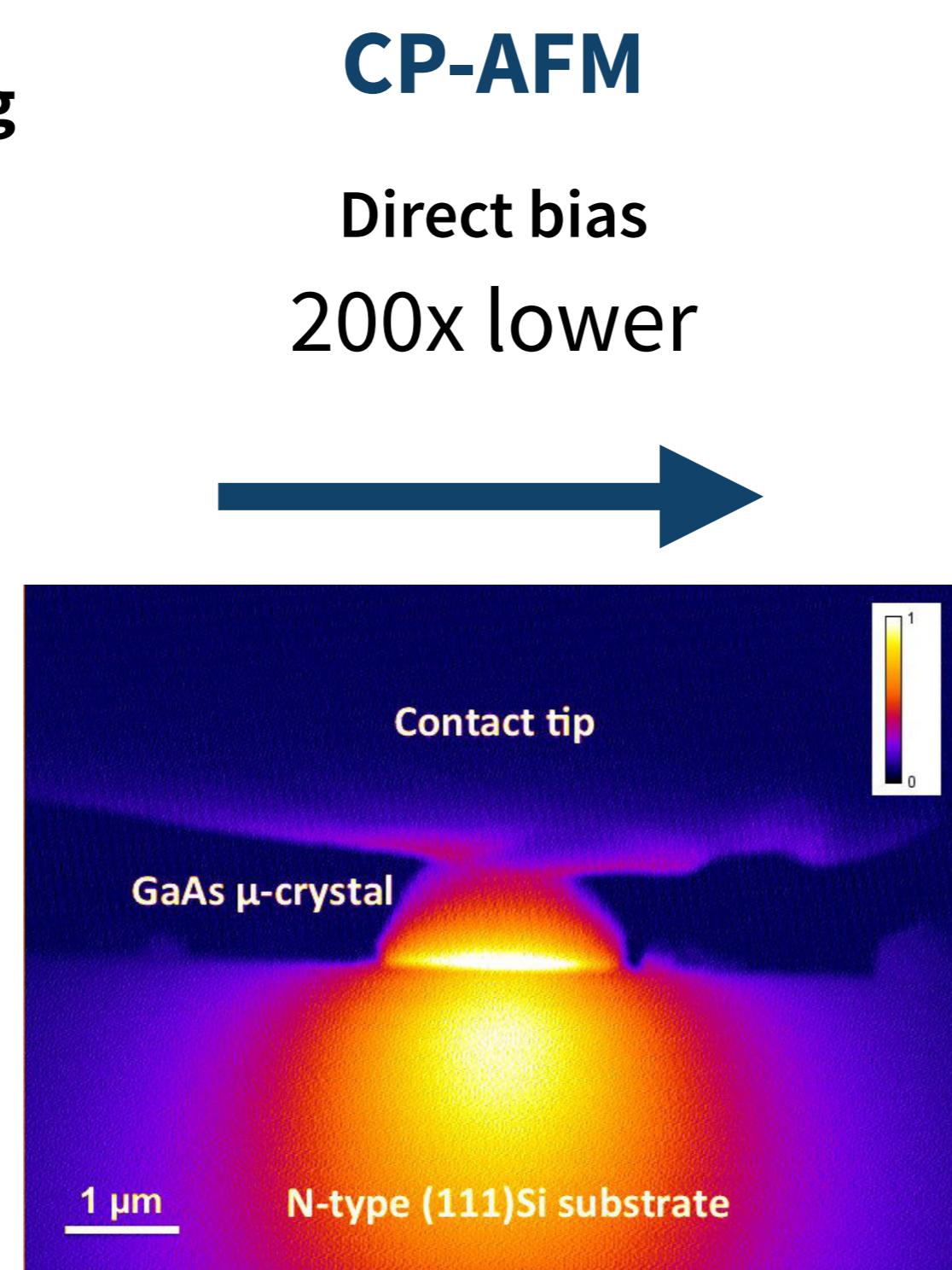
## GaAs/Si junction



**Random thermal opening**  
 $\text{SiO}_2$  ultra-thin  $\sim 1.2 \text{ nm}$

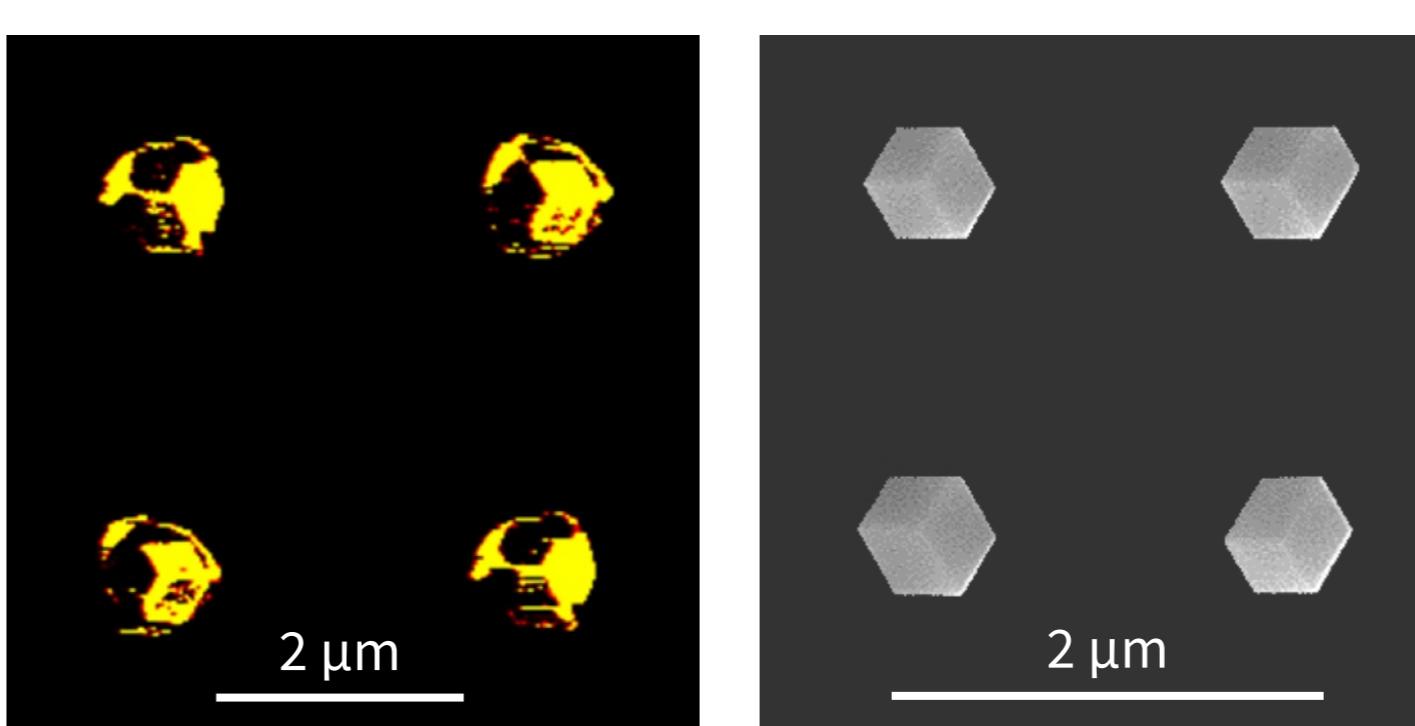


Direct Bias 4 V:  $4.2 \times 10^{-5} \text{ A}$   
Current passing across the entire surface  
 $10 \text{ kA.cm}^{-2}$



**Localized opening by EBL**  
 $\text{SiO}_2 \sim 10 \text{ nm}$

Direct Bias 4 V:  $7 \times 10^{-7} \text{ A}$   
Current passing only through the opening  
 $7 \text{ kA.cm}^{-2}$



## ELO GaAs μ-crystal requirement

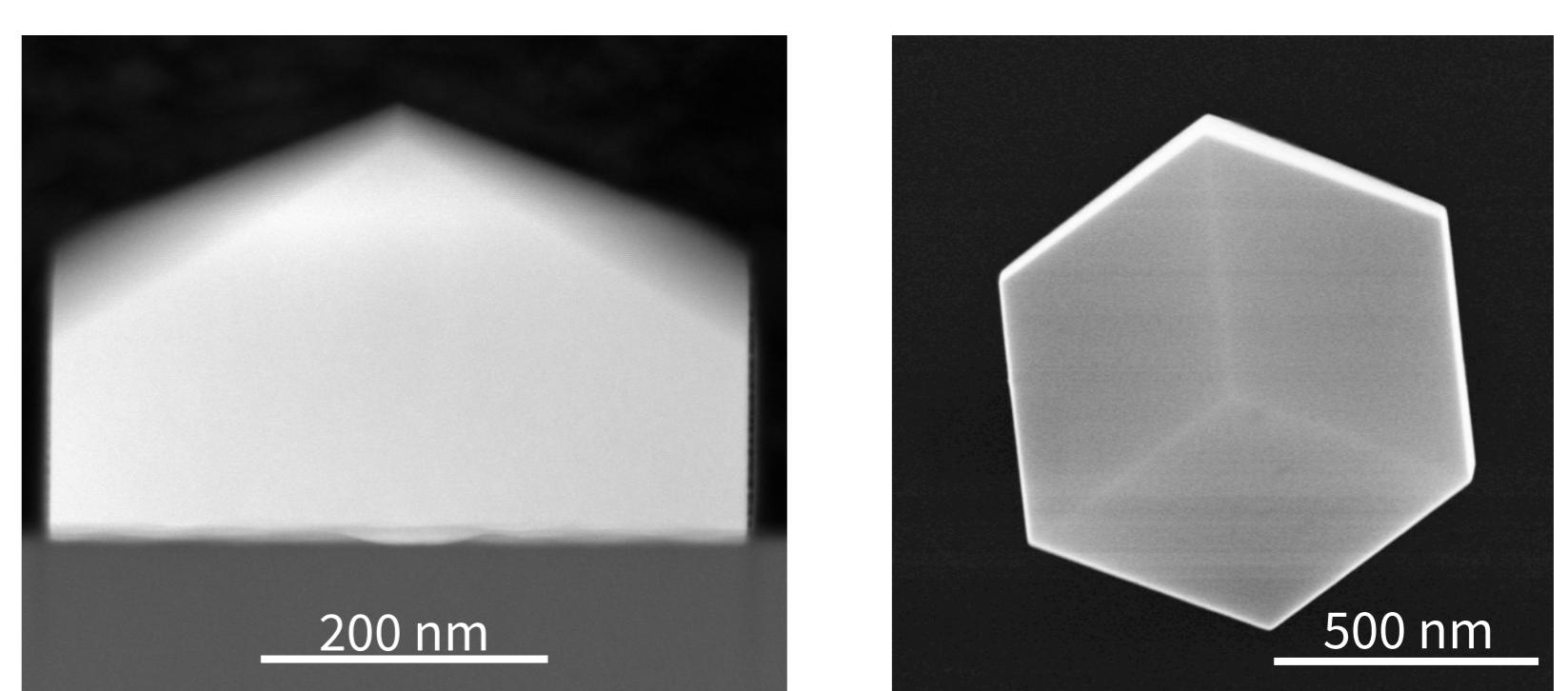
No defect at the GaAs/Si interface

Aperture diameter  $< 80 \text{ nm}$

Electrical integration via tunnel effect

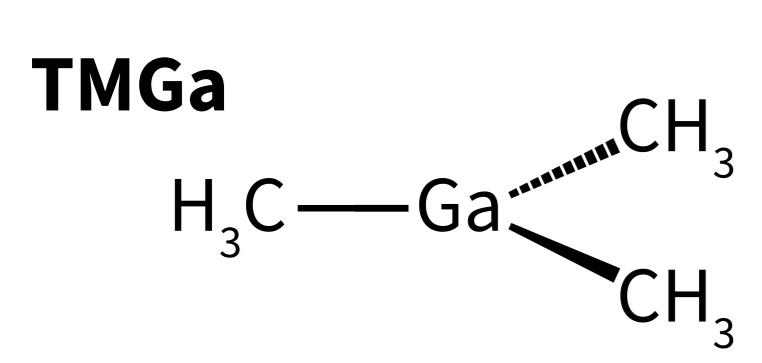
$\text{SiO}_2$  thickness  $< 2 \text{ nm}$

→ To localized in a ultra thin  $\text{SiO}_2$  layer

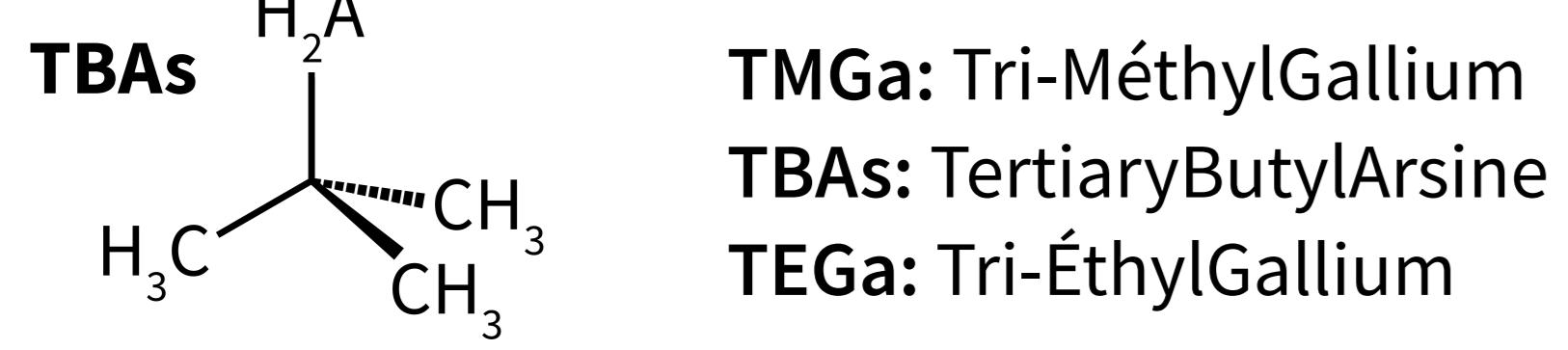

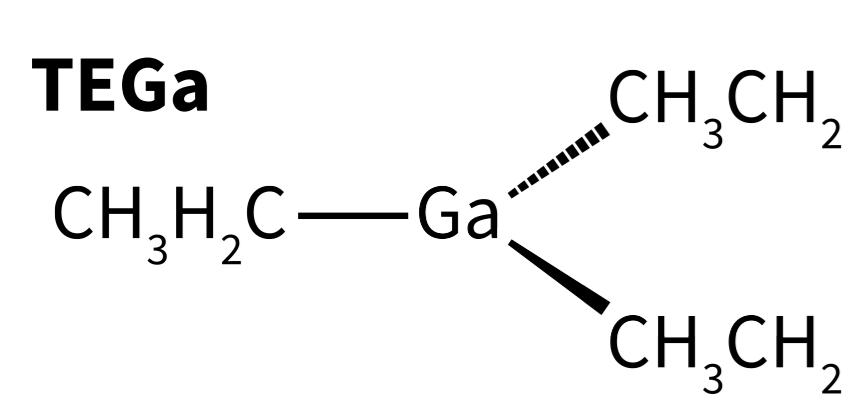

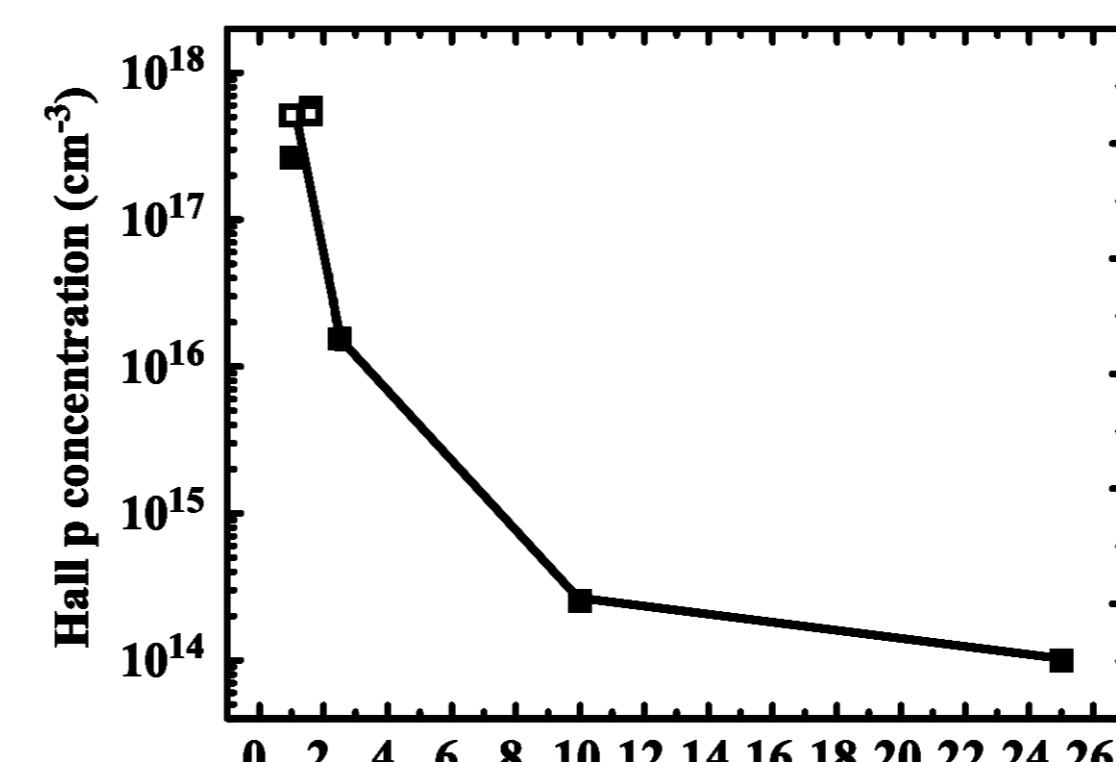
TMGa: Tri-MéthylGallium

TEGa: Tri-ÉthylGallium



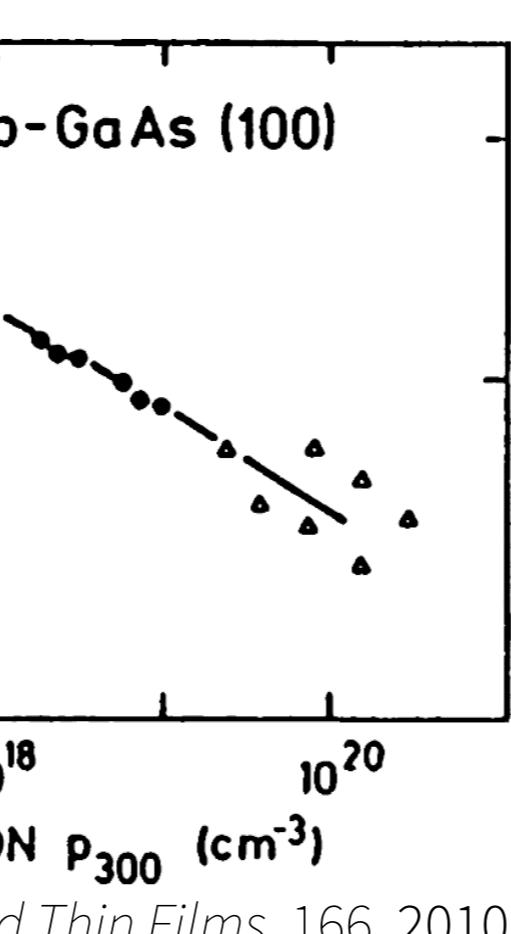
To avoid p-type doping by Carbon  
TEGa as Gallium gaz precursors

To avoid p-type doping by Carbon  
Increase V/III ratio

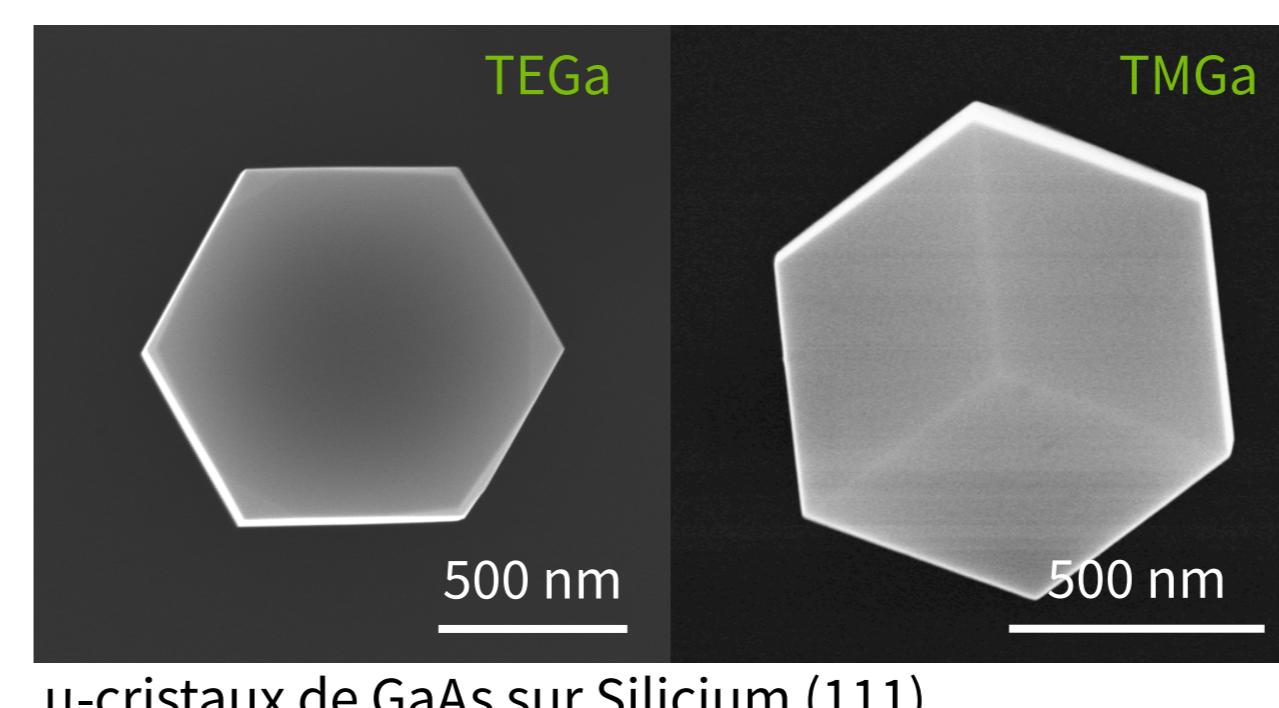
Enhancing TMGa decomposition  
Increasing TBAs → H release  
Volatile CH<sub>4</sub> formation



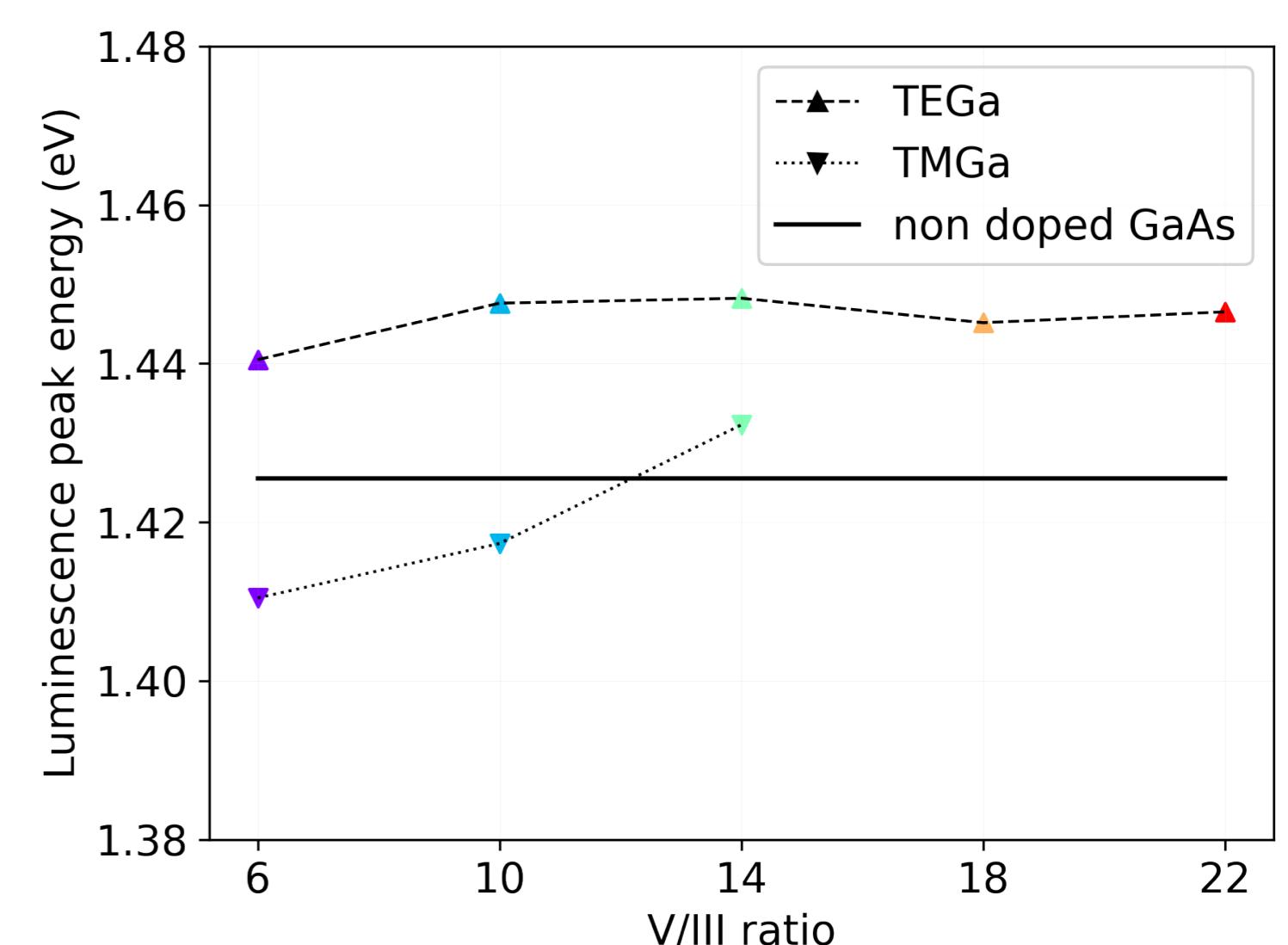

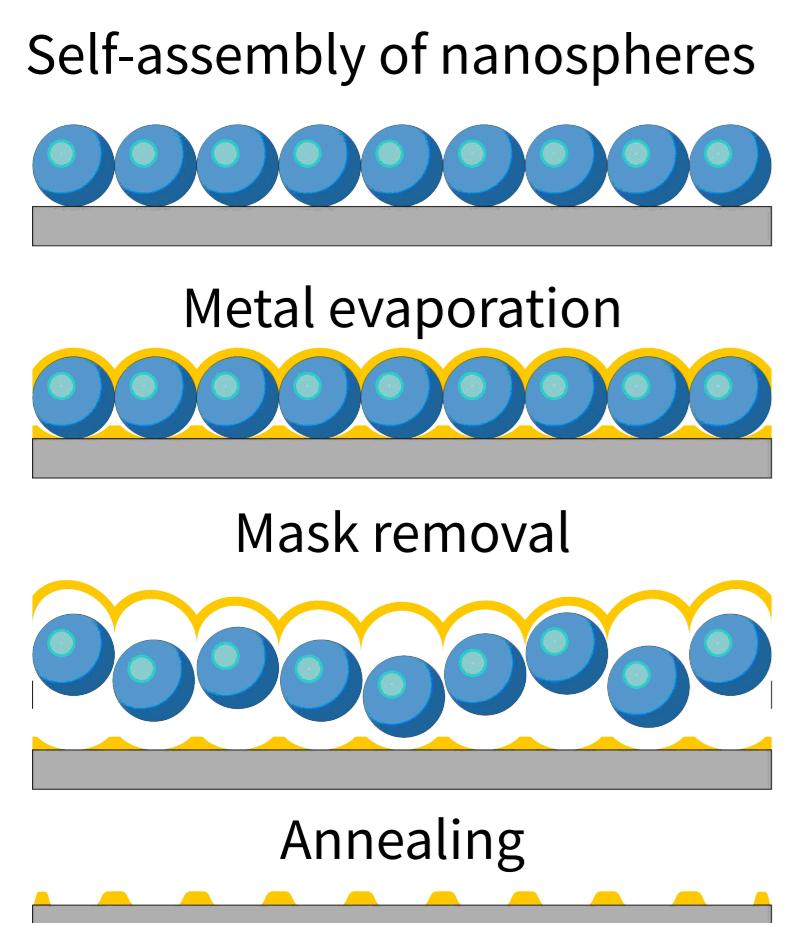
### Doping level determination By μ-photoluminescence



**TMGa**  
→ influenced by V/III ratio  
→ p-doped for low V/III ratio  
**TEGa**  
→ non-influenced by V/III ratio  
→ seems to be undoped

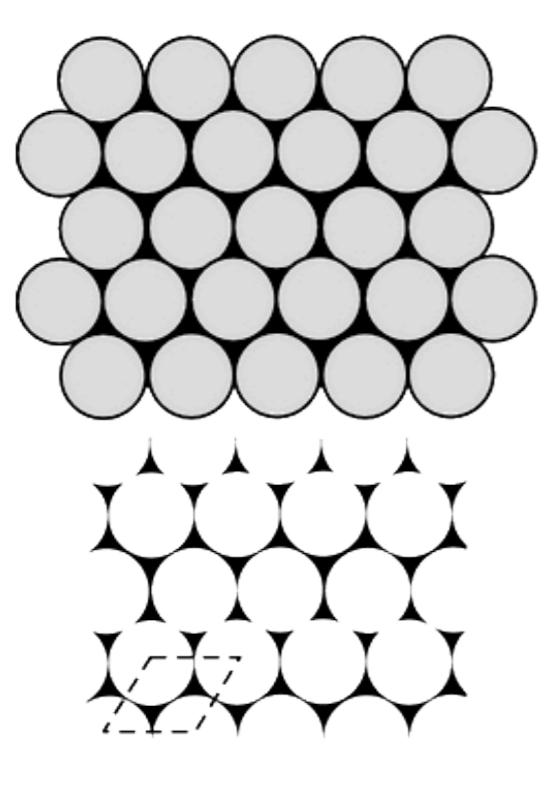

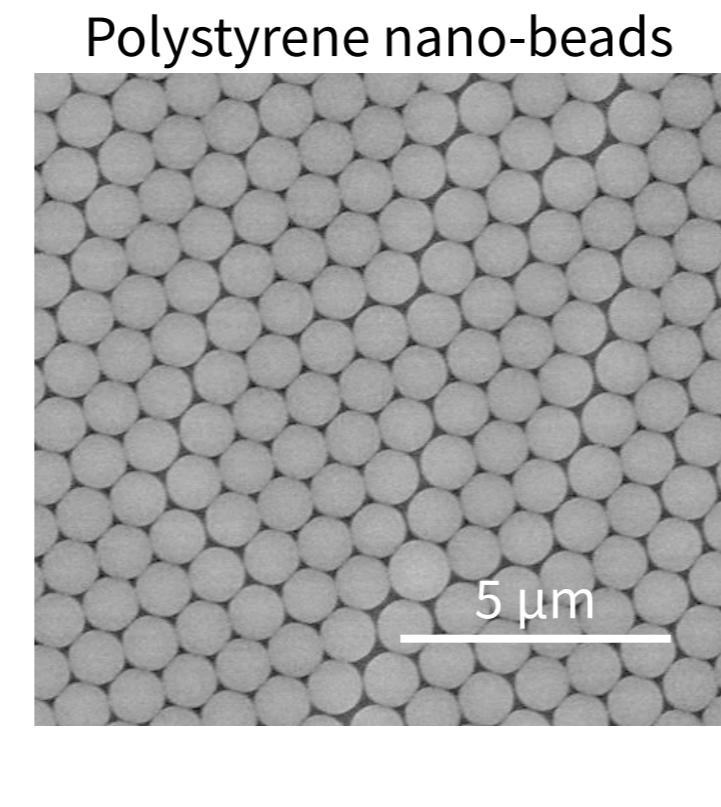

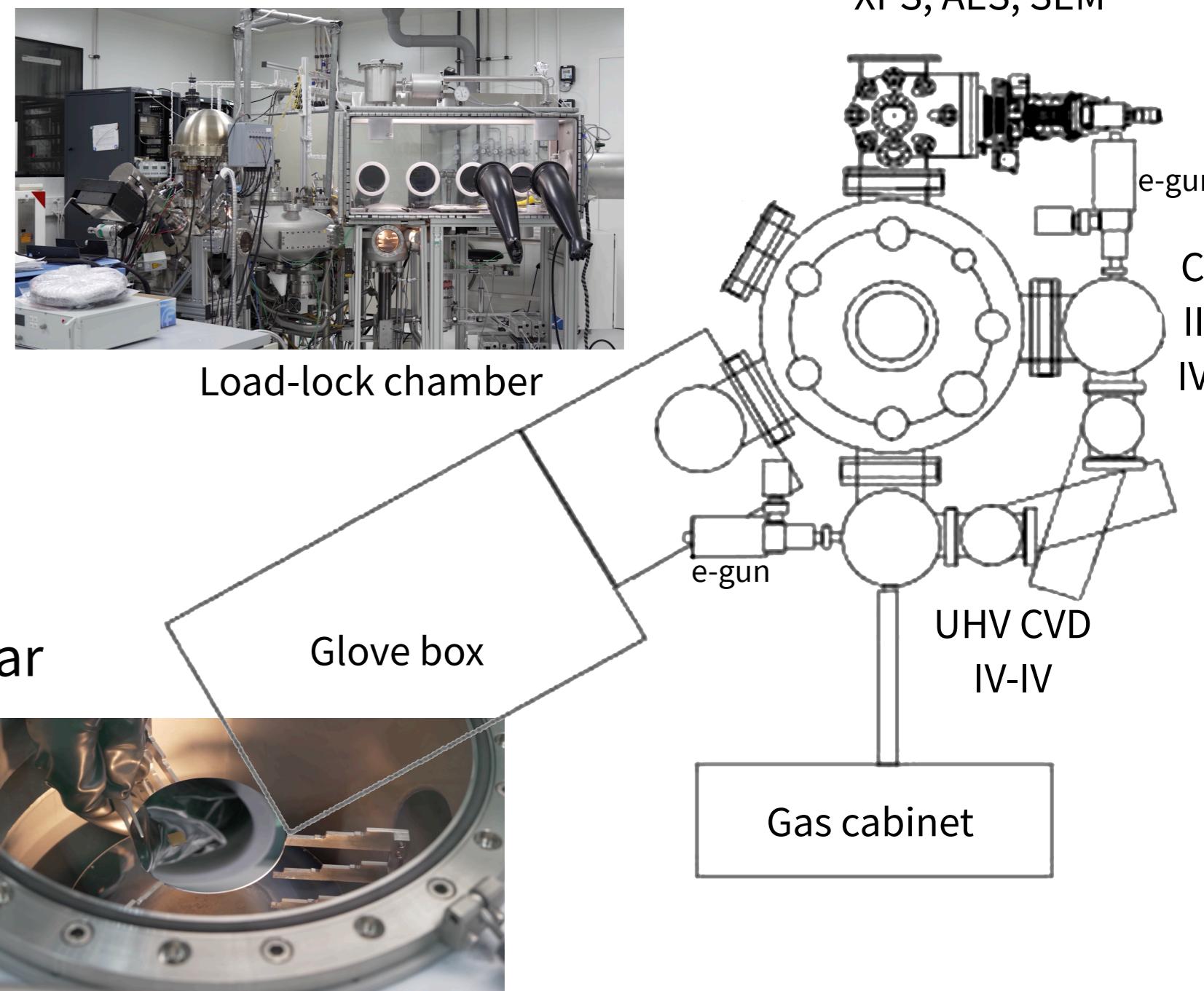

## Epitaxial Cluster Tool

1 UHV-CVD chamber  
IV-IV materials  
(with RHEED in situ)



1 CBE chamber  
dedicated to IV-IV and III-V materials  
(with RHEED in situ)  
→ 8" compatible, 4" in standard  
→ Growth chambers base pressure:  $10^{-10} \text{ mbar}$   
→ Working Pressure:  $10^{-4} - 10^{-1} \text{ mbar}$
