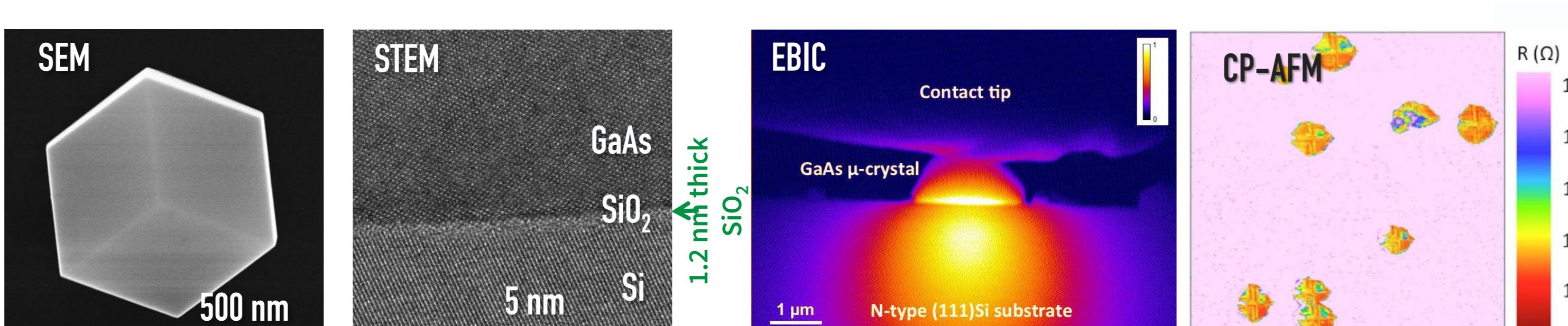
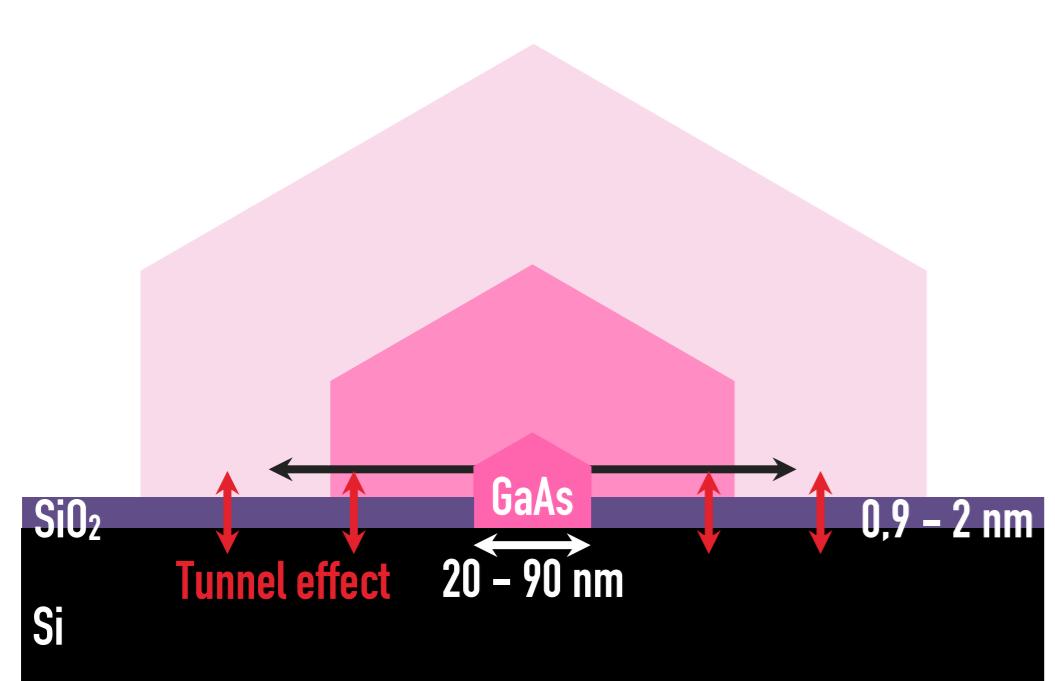

ELTOn GROWTH METHOD: Epitaxial Lateral overgrowth on Tunnel Oxide from nano-seed

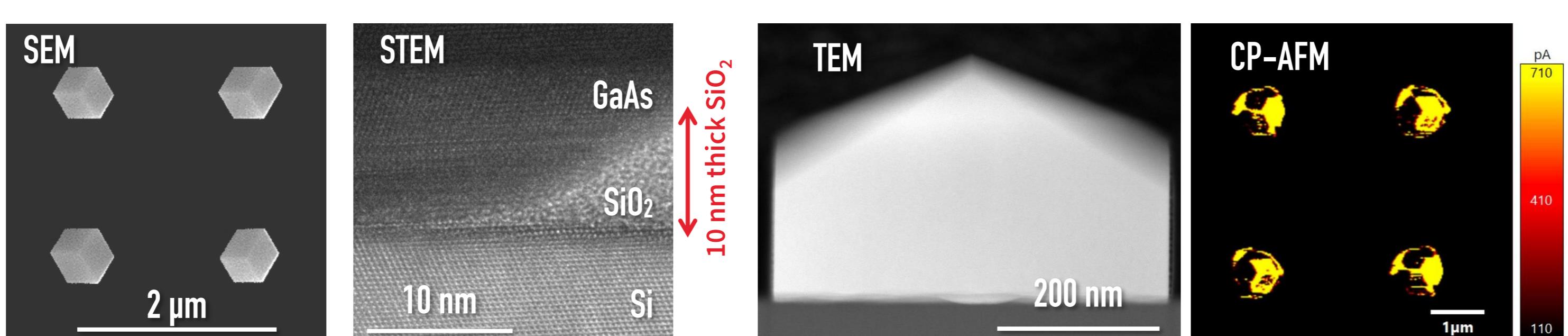


Conventional Lithography

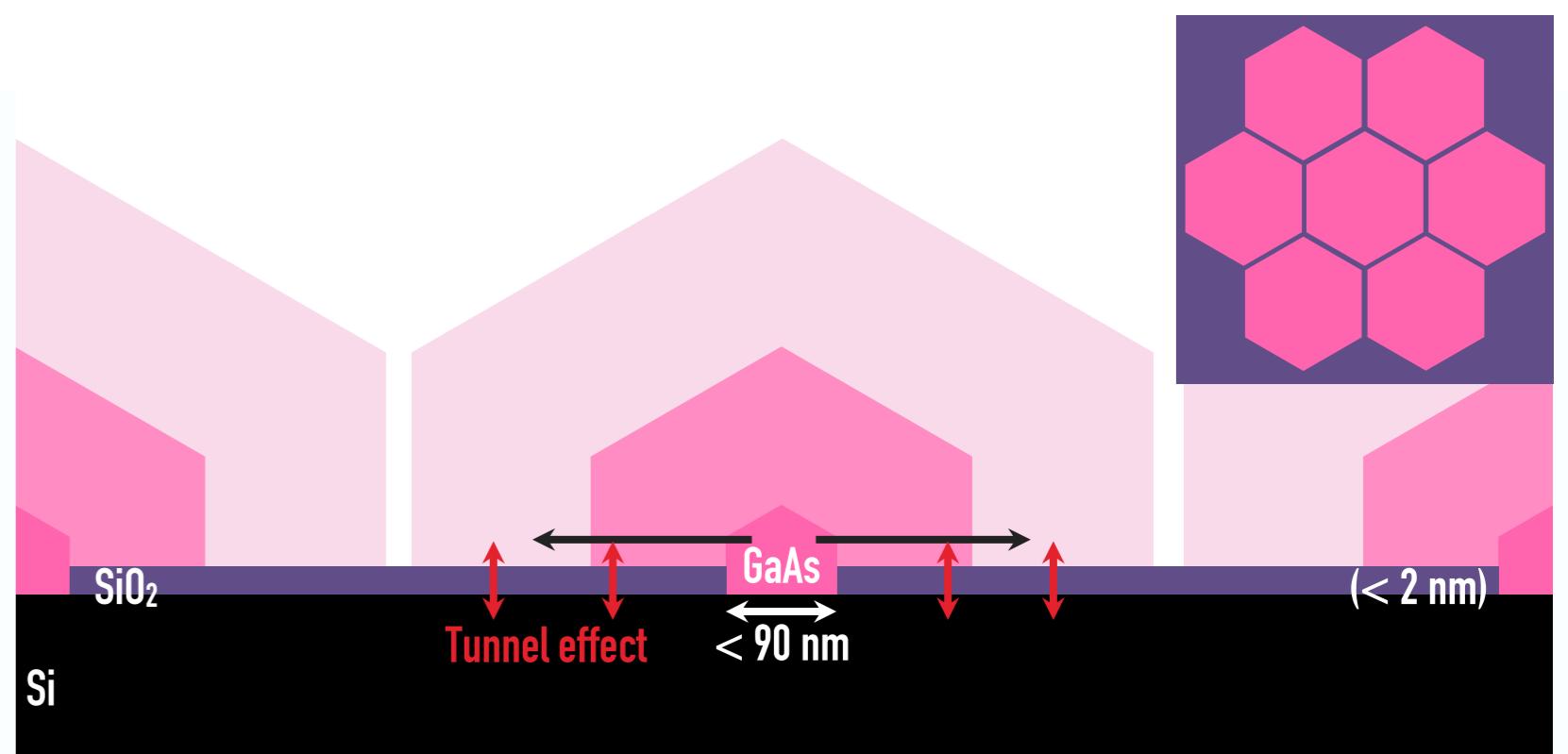


Ultra-thin $\text{SiO}_2 \sim 1.2 \text{ nm}$
Current passing through the entire cristal

Thick $\text{SiO}_2 \sim 10 \text{ nm}$
Current passing only through the opening

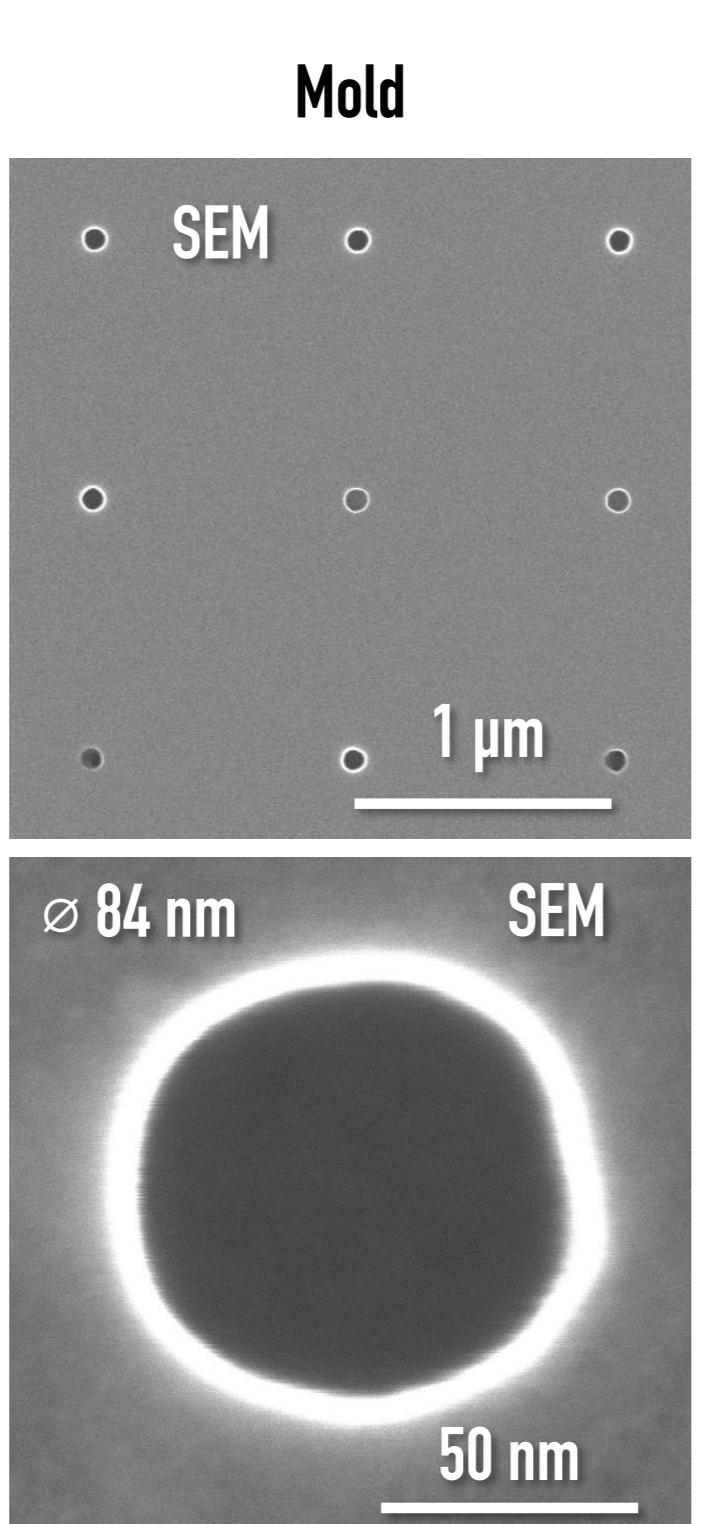
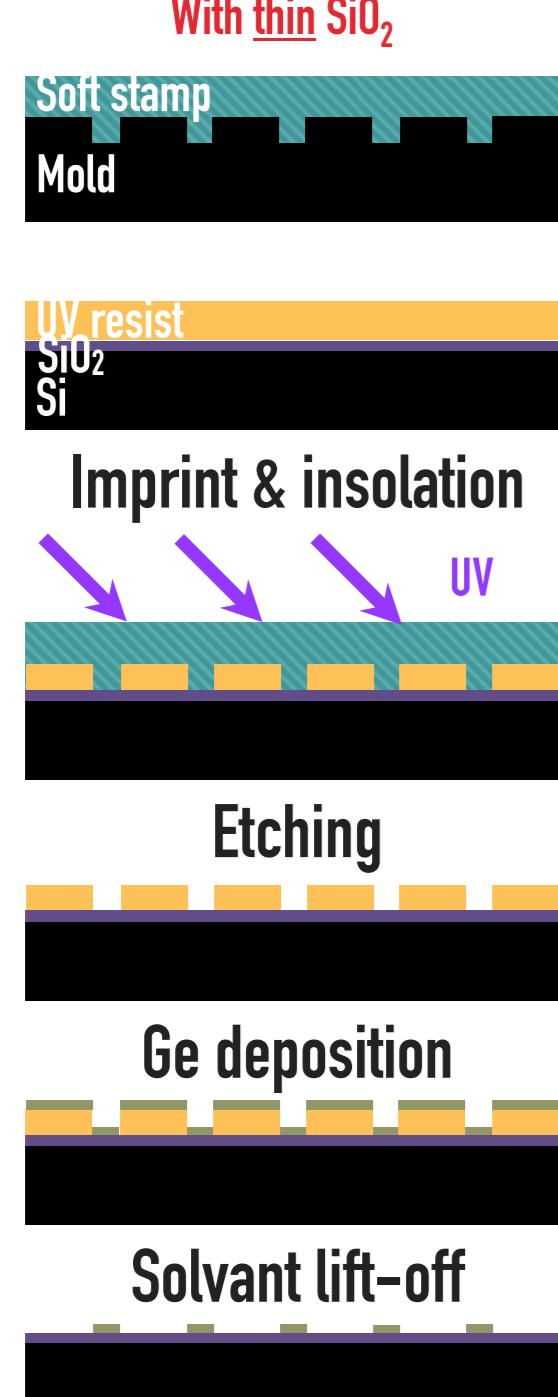
Openings in a ultra-thin SiO_2 Layer

 $< 90 \text{ nm} \text{ SiO}_2$ openings

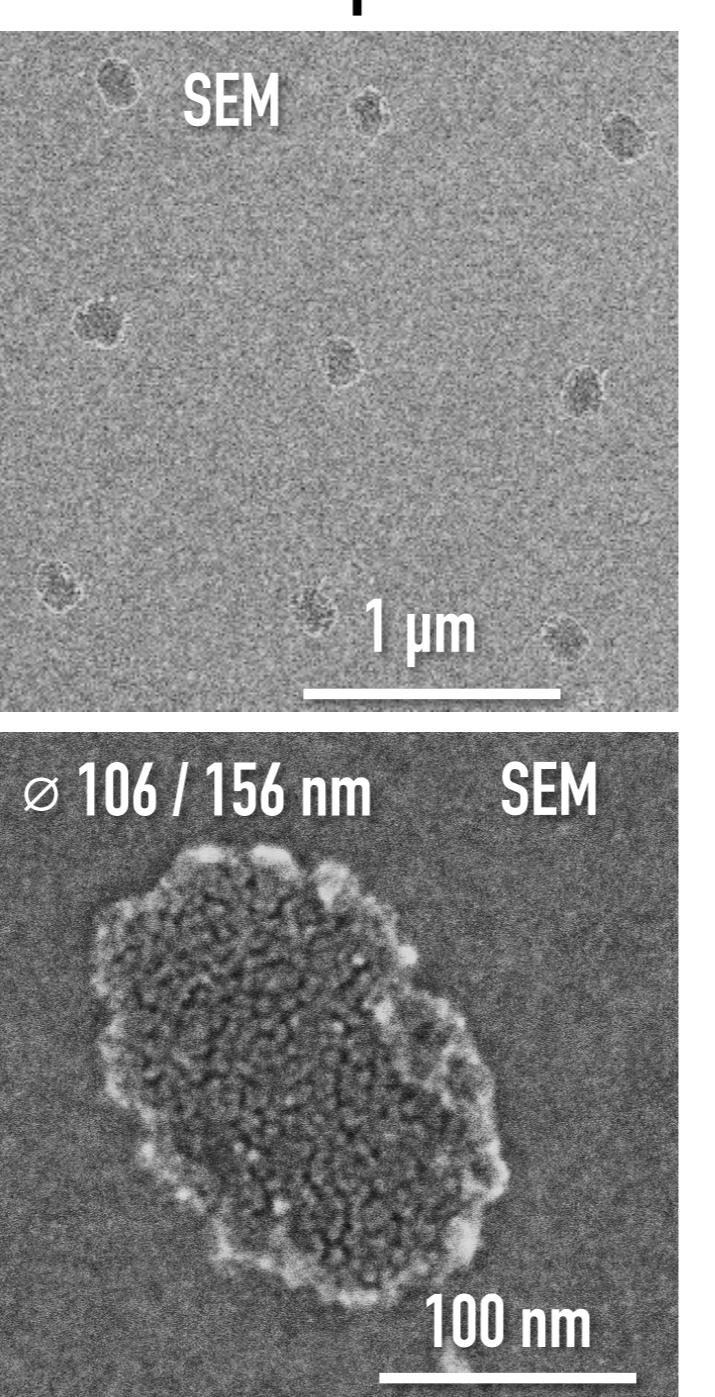
Tunnel-effect conductive interface:

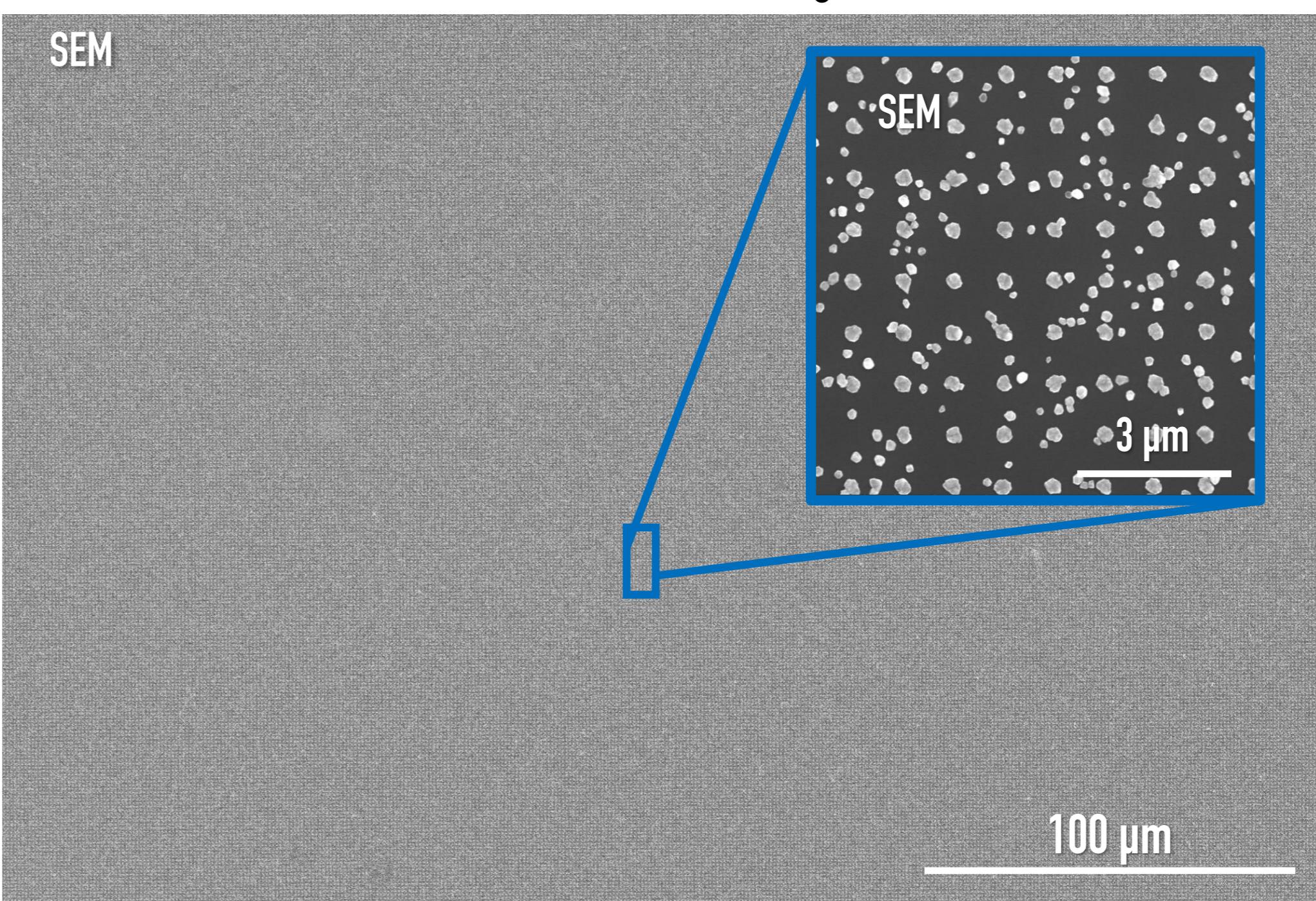

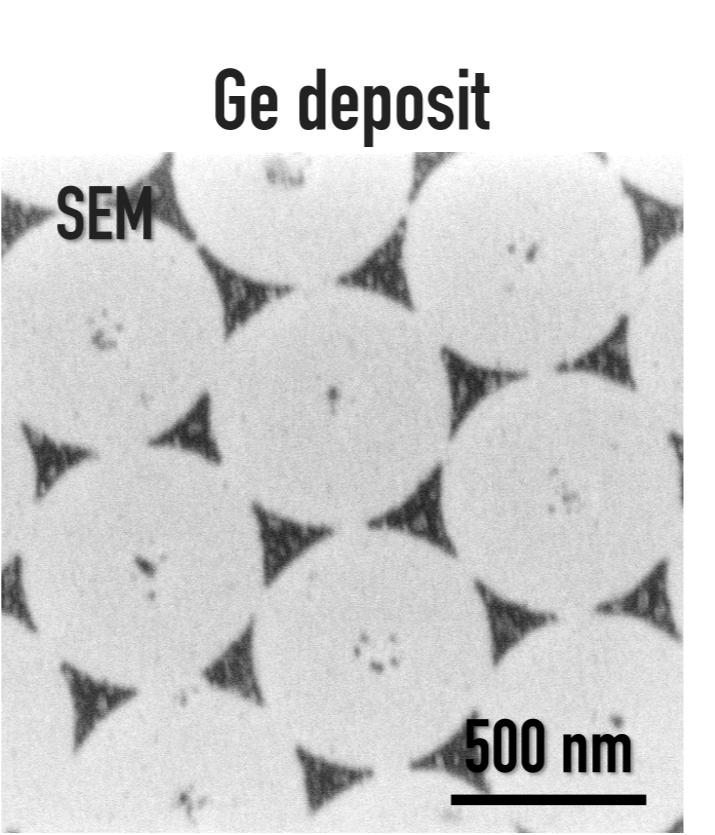
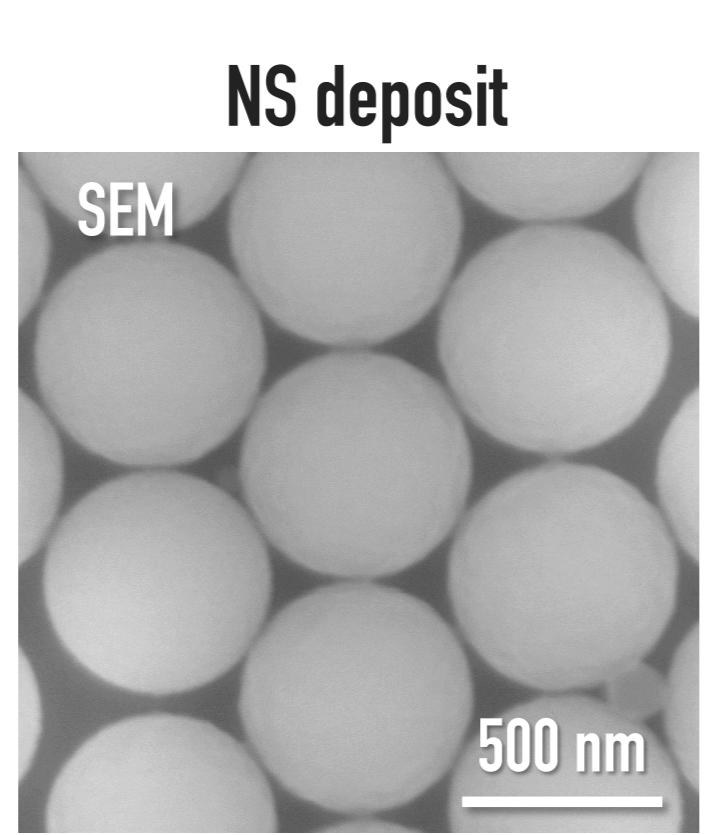
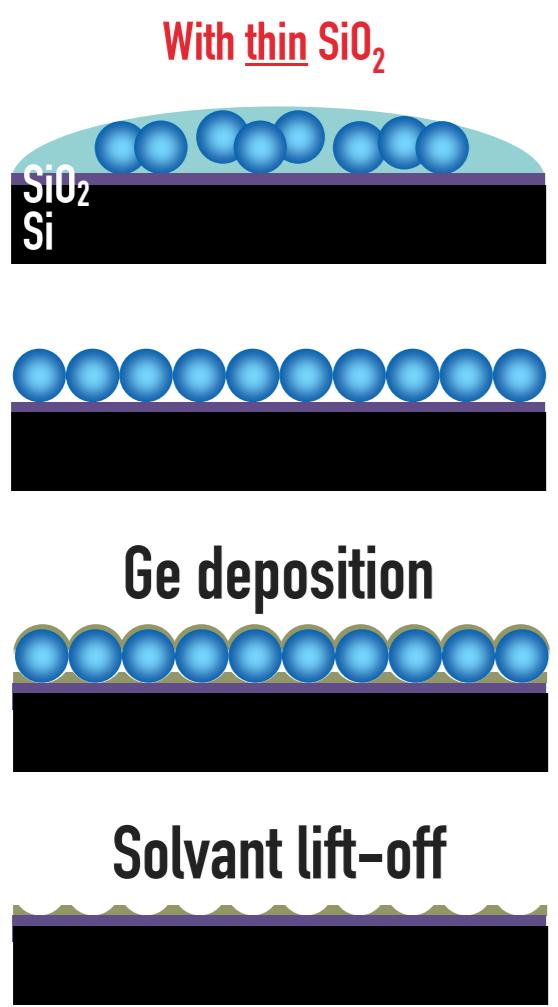
Growth after 1H15 annealing at 675°C



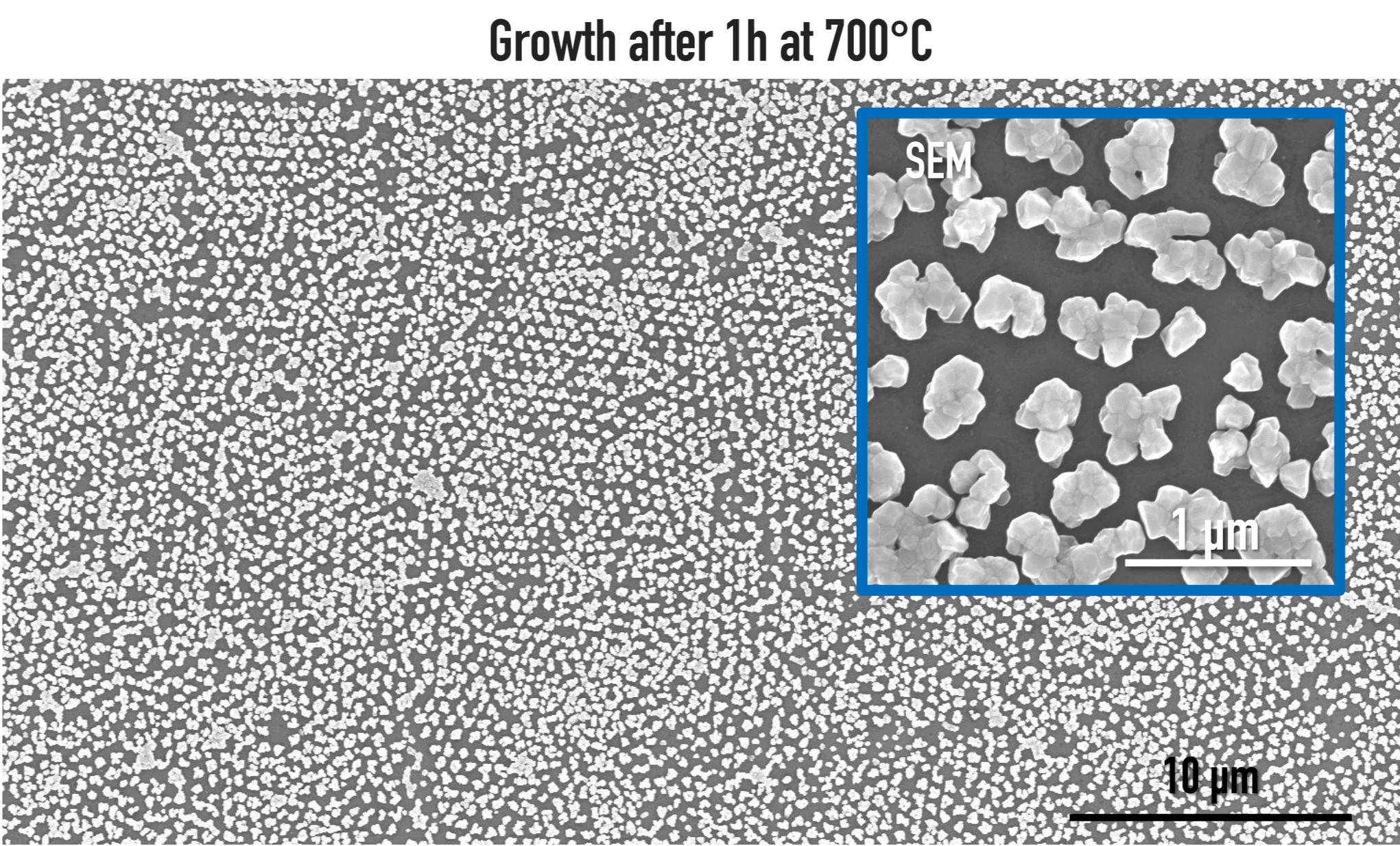
Soft-UV NIL & Nanosphere Lithographies

Nanosphere self-assembly into a compact hexagonal lattice

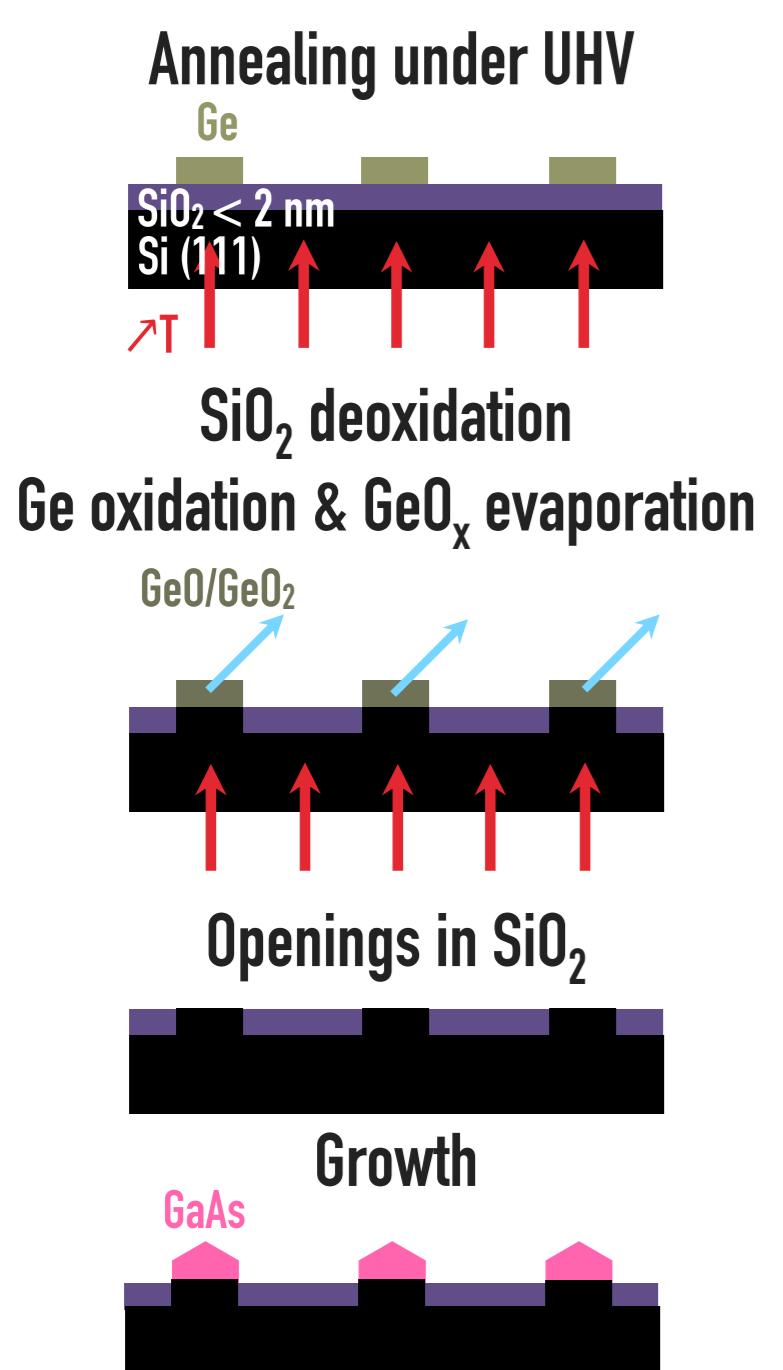


Some growth occurs

in SiO_2

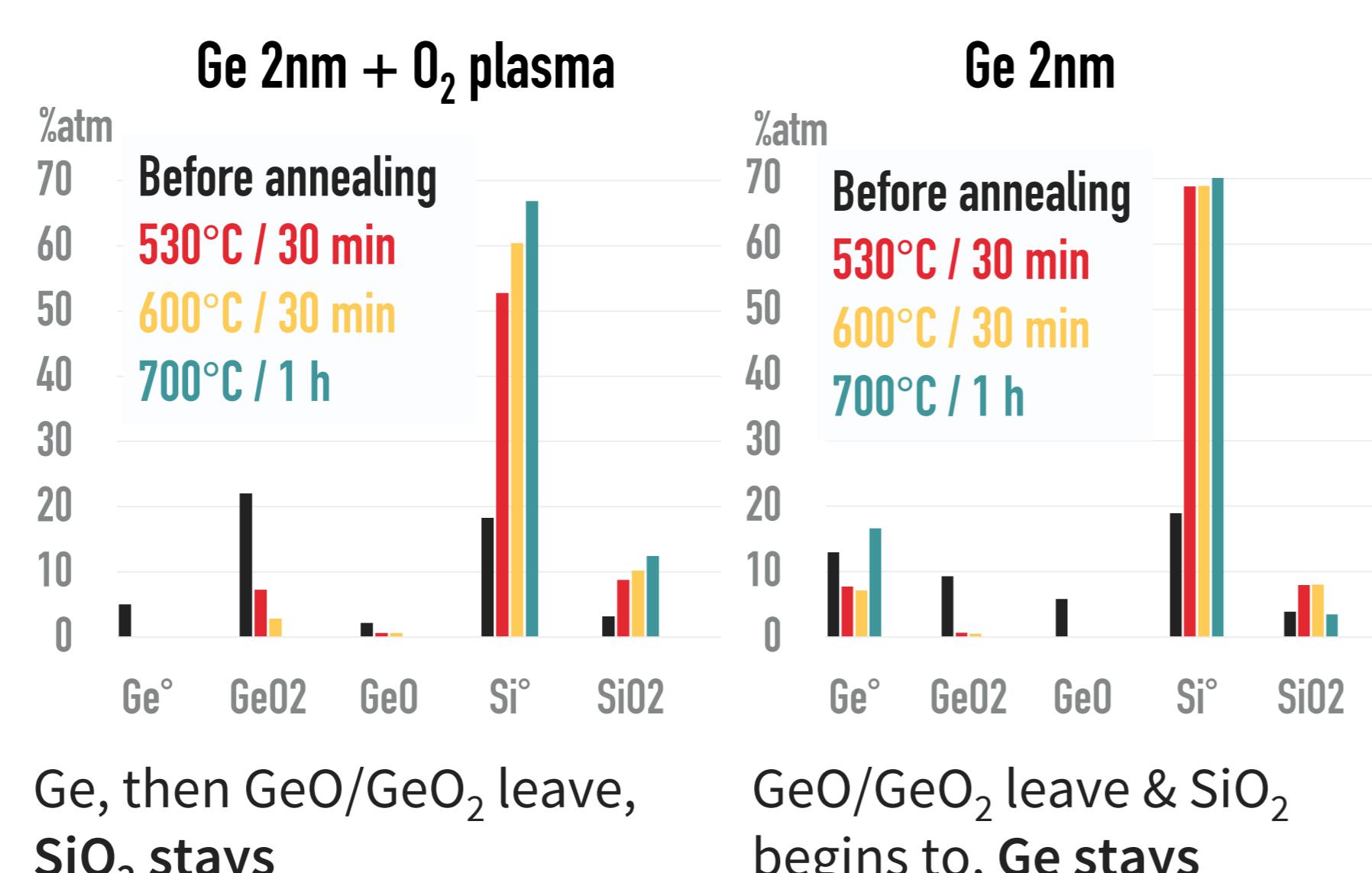
Polycrystalline

Germanium cannot open the SiO_2 layer

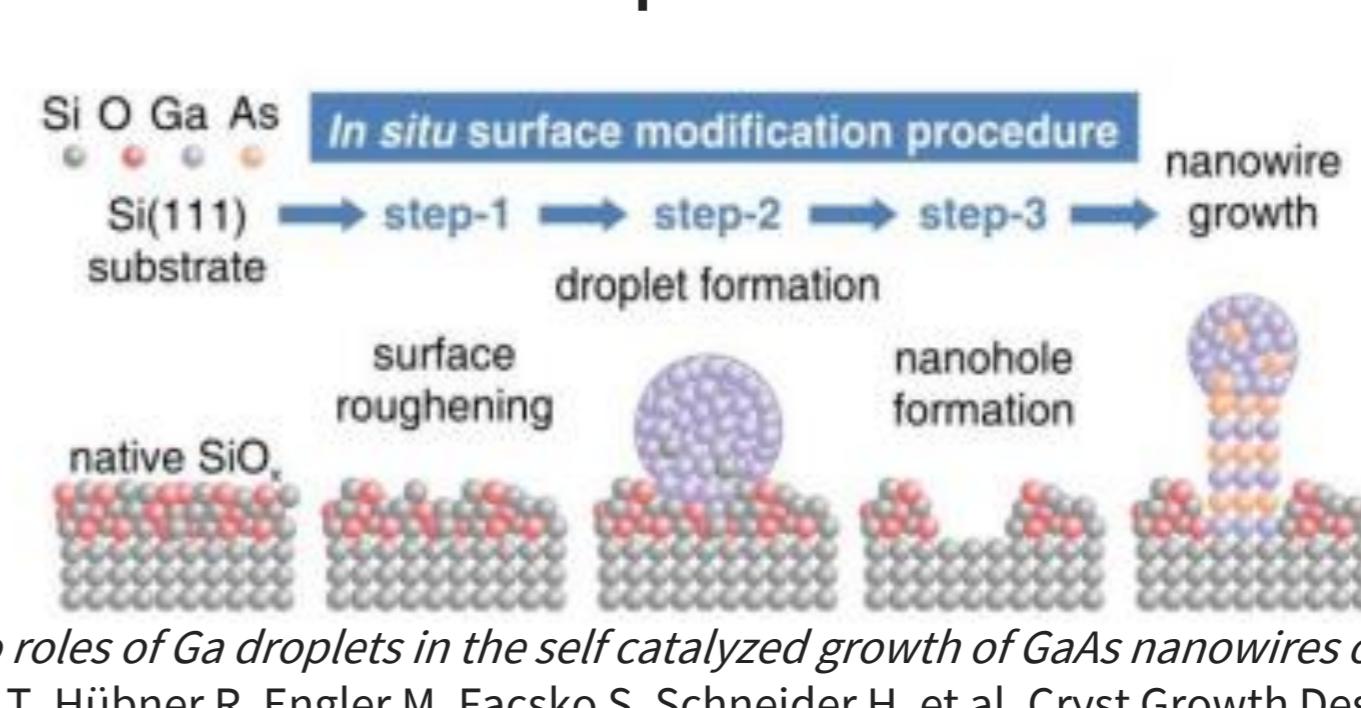
