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The ICI Project: an individual-based epidemic propagation simulator based on a Digital Twin

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What is the ICI Project?



ICI couples a generator of **realistic digital twins** of large geographic zones and their **populations** of mobile individuals with an individual-based disease **contagion model**

Given the generated geographic zone and the sampled synthetic population, large scale Monte Carlo simulations allow to obtain precise statistical informations on, *e.g.*,

- the dynamics of the number of infected individuals within each population class (age, comorbidity, housing area, working place, etc.)
- the future saturation level of given hospitals
- the compared effects of varied sanitary policies

A modular approach

Digital twin generation

- Building land-use
- Synthetic population
- Housing of individuals

Dynamics

Movement of individuals between their hourly activities

Epidemic propagation simulations

- Probabilistic epidemiology model, 9 health statutes
- Digital implementation of sanitary policies
- Evaluation and comparison of sanitary policies by Monte Carlo simulations

Digital twin generation

Land-use and building interior model

Exhaustive detailed and geolocalized model with building **interiors**.

Two kinds of spaces:

Activities

- A type
- Open to public
- Frequency indicator
- Number of workers
- Opening hour
- Behaviour during past lockdowns

Housing units

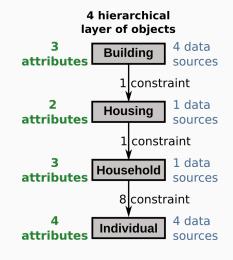
- Area and principal home status
- Linked to the synthetic



Four-layered hierarchical synthetic population

An original generator

- Heavily geolocalized and data-driven.
- Plausible and hierarchized configuration, respecting:
 - macro-statistics (general statistics),
 - meso-statistics (statistical aggregates),
 - household and housing constraints.
- Well-described individuals.



Dynamics

Locations of individuals

In and out fluxes

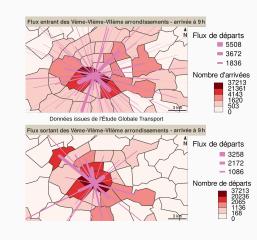
Fluxes based on surveys, mobile phone activity and common transportation counting

Agenda generation

Based on surveys, relatively to:

- Socio-demographic characteristics, place of living,
- Hour and day of the week

Modelled by a Markov chain between 8 activities.

Fluxes based on surveys, mobile phone activity and common transportation counting

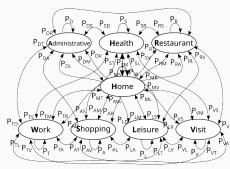
Agenda generation

Markov Chain

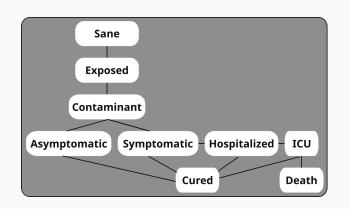


Epidemic propagation simulations



Probabilistic simulation at an individual scale:

- **Simulate the movements** of the individuals according to their agendas
- Locate individuals inside building's activities
- Sample the probability distribution of contamination between two individuals when they meet in the same place at the same time
- Run large scale Monte Carlo replications for the statistical study of epidemiological spreading



Probabilities to switch states depend on sex and age and other individual characteristics.



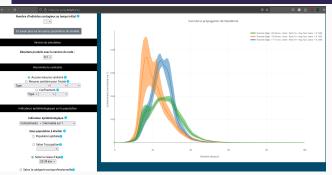
The **fine scale** of the digital twin allows the digital implementation of **various sanitary policies**, for example:

- School sanitary protocols
 - Close each class when a detected amount of student is reached.
 - Close every school when incidence rate is reached.
- Lockdowns:
 - Total, partial or targeted.
- Vaccination campaigns:
 - Random or on targeted population.

We use the OpenMOLE platform



- 1. To explore model behaviours and sensitivities
- 2. To deploy large scale Monte Carlo simulations over HPC clusters
- 3. To search optimal sanitary policies

Optimisation parameters:

- Duration of the policy.
- Activation threshold.

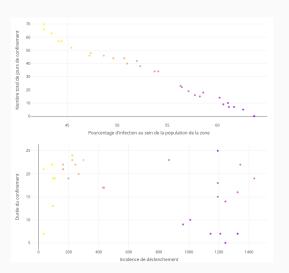
Optimisation criterion:

- Sum of total contaminations.
- Number of lockdown days, total missing days for students.

Illustration: Optimization of **lockdowns 19th** arrondissement of Paris

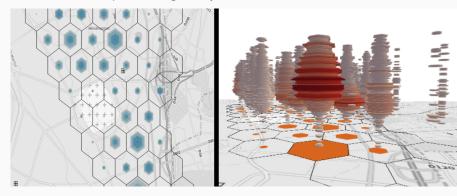
